NW Minnesota Sixth Grade History Contest

The NW Minnesota Sixth Grade History Contest was held on April 27th. Six area schools participated by taking a Minnesota history test at the Roseau City Center, including three students from Grygla High School: Emma Sundberg, Caitlyn Rath and Gus Jones.

The contest has taken place for 41 years and is compiled by the Roseau County Historical Society. Trophies and cash awards were presented to the top six students. The cash awards are sponsored by Border Bank – Roseau County area, Citizens State Bank – Roseau, and Security State Bank of Warroad.

Students from Badger, Greenbush-Middle River (GMR), Grygla, Marshall County Central (MCC), Roseau, and Warroad Schools participated in the test. Three students from each school are chosen by the teacher to compete in the history contest.

Red Lake School District Starting Online School open for any student in grades 9-12

The Red Lake School District is currently in the process of putting together an online school for Red Lake Band members in grades 9-12, as well as any students that are currently not enrolled with the district.

As a result of COVID-19, ISD 38 has been out of school for a significant amount of time, and they had to re-think how they wanted to provide school for their students, which lead to the idea of online schooling.

Red Lake School Secondary Complex 6-12 Principal Tracy Olson said that online schooling is beneficial for students, especially when some traditional schooling is not the best way for some kids to learn.

Students will be provided

with a computer and will also receive directions on the learning management system. Olson added that students will have material labs sent to them in order to get hands on experience with certain classes.

Olson says that one thing the school has learned that is so important for their students is that kids need to have strong roots. The district's goal is to make sure kids are given those strong roots so they can continue to lead and serve each other in the Red Lake Nation.

The Red Lake School District hopes to start online schooling for grades 9-12 this fall and possibly expand it for middle schoolers in the near future. More information is available on the district's website.

Wednesday, we boated one 33" sturgeon and saw a couple others boated as well. Thursday, I landed a skinny 66" and my uncle Dave landed his biggest sturgeon at 61". And Friday not a bite.
It was nice to get some action and my first sturgeon in 3 years. In all, it was a good time and had the best weather of 2022 while we were out there.

The ice was out about a 1/3 of a mile past Pine Island and then it went as far as the eye could see. So, the river may be a busy place this coming weekend for the much-anticipated walleye opener.
I hope to get out somewhere that is not crowded with lots of people. Most of the lakes are opening up finally and with more wind, rain, and warmer temps coming up, will free the lake of more ice. Good luck this coming weekend.

Looking for Marshall SWCD Supervisor

SWCDs are local units of government that manage and direct natural resource management programs at the local level. Minnesota's 90 SWCDs cover the entire state and generally follow county lines. Responsibilities of the supervisor during their four-year terms consist of:

KNOWLEDGE:

- Some of the fundamentals about the environment and how it works.

- The relationship between land use decisions and the environment.

- The effect environmental decisions have on other aspects of our lives.

- Local concerns, attitudes and needs.

CONCERNS:

- Our environment and natural resources.

- Maintaining and improving water quality.

- Protecting our soil.

LEADERSHIP:

- Setting local conservation priorities.

- Educating friends and neighbors about the environment.

- Working with other local units of government, state and federal agencies and other elected officials.

- Setting an example.

- Balancing economic needs with environmental concerns.

Being a supervisor involves one regular board meeting a month. Supervisors receive no salary, although they do receive per diem and are reimbursed for expenses, such as mileage. Those individuals who are elected to the position of

SWCD supervisor file a Statement of Economic Interest with the Campaign Finance & Public disclosure Board within 60 days of the beginning of their term. The supervisor term is 4 years.

This year the Marshall Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) will have three supervisors' openings:

Area 3 include the Townships of Alma, Foldahl, Marsh Grove, Nefolden, McCrea, McCrea Strip, Comstock, Comstock Strip, Viking, Viking Strip, New Solum and New Solum Strip

Area 4 include the Townships of Huntly, Como, Spruce Valley, Cedar, Holt, East Valley, Mud Lake, Excel, Excel Strip, Agder, Agder Strip, Grand Plain and Grand Plain Strip.

Area 5 include the Townships of Thief Lake, Moose River, Linsell, Whiteford, Rollis, Veldt, Eckvoll, Valley, Moylan, Moylan Strip, Espelie and Espelie Strip.

Interested supervisors must live in the particular area that you apply. If you wish to be on the ballot you must file for the election between May 17 and May 31. SWCD supervisor positions are filled through general elections in November. You need to file a Minnesota Affidavit of Candidacy (available from the County Auditor's Office), along with a \$20 filing fee. 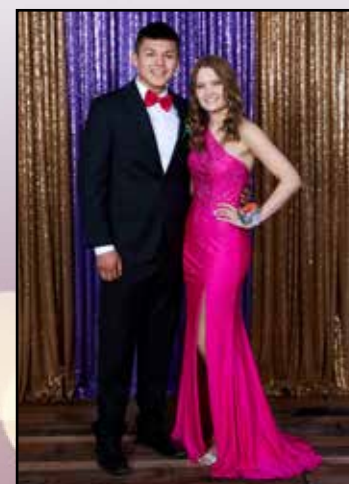
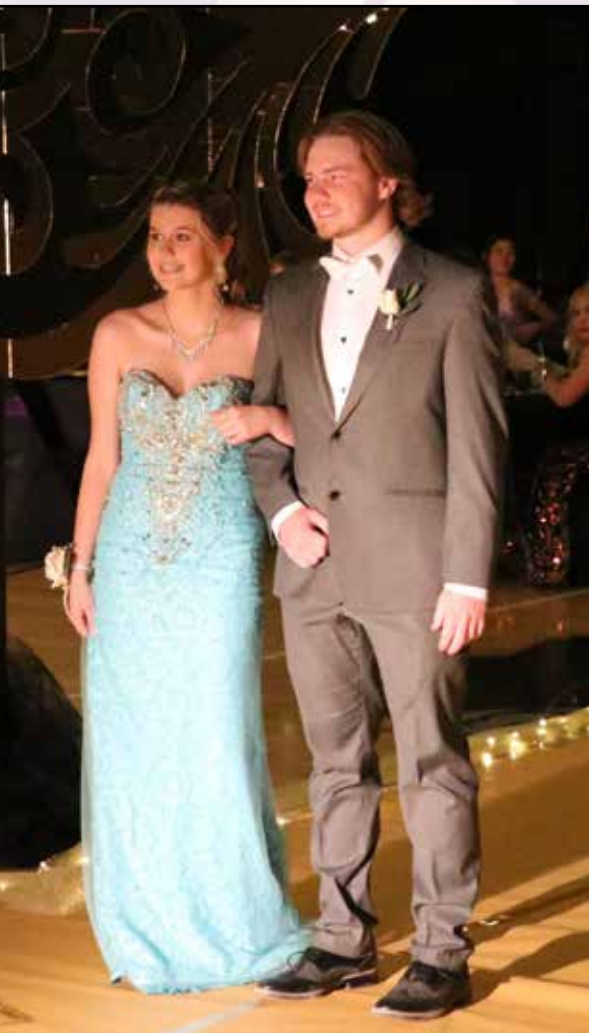
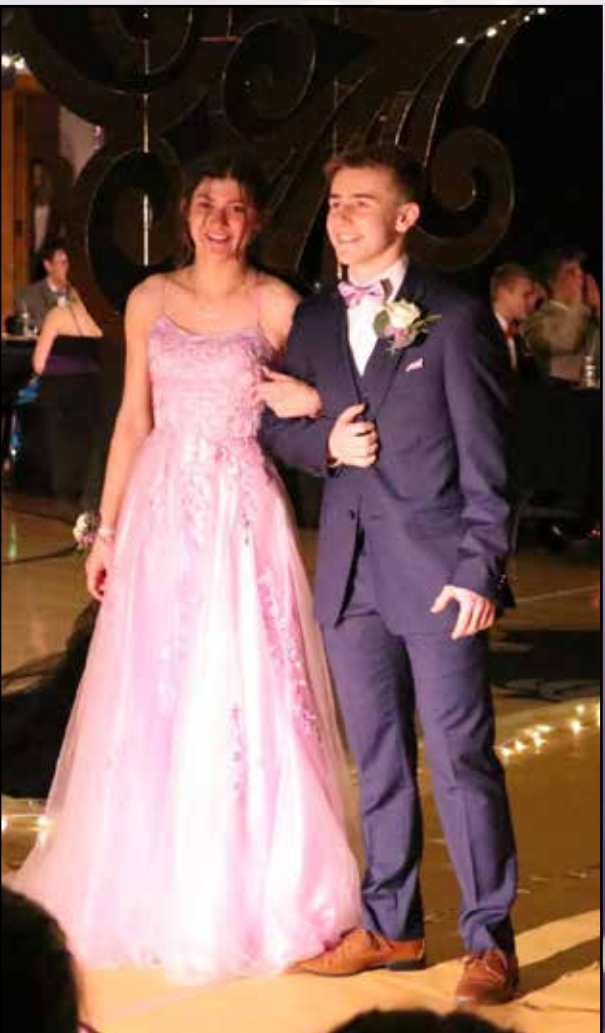
