On this week's report, fall is fast approaching. This past week has had a slight feel of fall with temps in the low 50's and upper 40's. It has me thinking forward to September 3 and the opener of early goose season, but it's still a month away.
Sorry, there was no report last week. I was gone camping with the family at Long Lake and then to Black Duck.
Long Lake was once again good to us; plenty of trout and numerous crappie off the dock. If you have never camped at Long Lake, it's well worth it to go, but make sure you book your dates in advance and I would recommend during the week.
Lake of the Woods has been consistent, maybe on the slower side, but fish being caught. The south shore 25' and in has been producing fish. I believe the casino access and the estates are the only launches open. Swift and Springsteel maybe as well, but I haven't heard for sure. The trick has been trolling spinners and plugs. I know if you are wanting to travel out to the deep flats, a jig and shiner has been doing pretty well.

Red Lake has been doing good as well. For the most part it's spinner with a leech out there and try various depths. I have heard a consistent depth that they have been at.
This coming week my buddy and I are going to think ahead and get our goose hunting stuff together and for once be ready for opening morning instead of being up till 1am getting everything ready and packed, and catching 2 hours of sleep before heading to the field. Good luck this coming week and stay safe.

Explore an old Iron mine 2,341 feet below the surface on this train ride in Minnesota

There is no shortage of wonderful attractions in Minnesota. You'll find beautiful nature areas, interesting art displays, delicious restaurants, and unique attractions. There's a train ride at northern Minnesota's Lake Vermilion-Soudan Underground Mine State Park that is unlike anything else you'll find in the state. Hop on board, and you'll be taken more than 2,000 feet below ground into an old iron mine. Read on below to learn more about this fascinating attraction that goes almost 1/2 mile underground!

Lake Vermilion-Soudan Underground Mine State Park is a park in northern Minnesota's Iron Range. It's about 225 miles north of the Twin Cities, or 90 miles north of Duluth.

The park covers around 300 acres, offering lovely hiking trails with lake and forest views. But the most famous attraction is the Soudan Mine. Guests can take tours of the old mine's operating



equipment. It's a great way to explore Minnesota's mining history. There's also a tour that takes visitors underground to see the mine for themselves. Once you arrive, you'll strap on a hardhat, climb onto an old mine cart train...

...and go whizzing through the mines, just like a miner would have when the mine was in operation over 100 years ago!

The tour will take you down to the lowest level of the mine, where you'll be 2,341 feet below the surface of the earth. Your tour guide will help you understand how the mine worked, pointing out equipment that was really used and shedding insight on what it was like to be a miner here.

The train ride is 3/4 mile and lasts 90 minutes. You'll gain insight into this fascinating era of Minnesota's history, and you'll catch a glimpse of what it is like more than 2,000 feet underground.

12th Annual NCH Trails To Treatments Cancer Benefit & Ride

(Submitted) The 12th Annual NCH Trails to Treatments Cancer Benefit and Ride will be held over the Labor Day Weekend in Middle River, Minnesota, with all activities located in or beginning in town. Mark your calendars for Friday and Saturday, September 4th & 5th and join in the fun all for a great cause!

Trails to Treatments (TTT) is a grant program administered by the North Country Horsemen (NCH), a non-profit organization based out of Middle River, Minnesota. The North Country Horsemen Trails To Treatments grant program offers financial assistance to patients receiving cancer treatments. Grants are prioritized and intended for residents of Minnesota in Marshall, Pennington, Roseau, Kittson, Polk, and Red Lake counties.

TTT's Mission Statement: Our mission is to assist those in need of funding during their treatment of cancer. We believe most people are not fully prepared for the out of pocket expenses cancer treatment requires. Our volunteers are dedicated to the long-term success of this grant program through ongoing donations and fundraising efforts.

It was in October of 2011 that Trails to Treatments issued its first grant of \$300. Since that time and as of July 25, 2020, TTT has awarded 1,018 grants that have financially assisted patients dealing with cancer. The total amount awarded to date is \$581,900! This would not have been possible without the amazing support of businesses, organizations, individuals, and teams throughout TTT's six focus counties.

Throughout the year there have been several teams, with-in TTT's 6-county focus, that are involved with fundraising activities and are working extremely hard to contribute to TTT's mission. The TTT committee is grateful to all that organize and/or participate in team activities.

Because there has been a feeling of friendly competition between teams, in 2018 the TTT committee started a "Traveling Trophy" award. This award is presented to the one team that raises the "largest

est team dollars". So, in 2018, the Gently Rocky Ridge Riders was the first team to receive TTT's Traveling Trophy. Then in 2019, the TRF EAGLES Aerie #2368 won this coveted award. The 2020 winner of the "Traveling Trophy" award will not be announced until October when all team totals are tallied and compared. Stay tuned!

Yes, these are uncertain times for us all, but the TTT committee is optimistic while getting ready for their Annual Cancer Benefit and Ride. The Labor Day weekend's schedule of events for 2020 starts off with ride registrations on Friday at 4 p.m. at The Wheel. This a great time to sign up for Saturday's trail ride and the Horse Fun Run that will take place on Friday from 4-8 p.m. with a \$10 donation. This will also be an opportunity to drop off auction items, purchase luminaries, raffle tickets, clothing, caps, etc. (Auction donations prior to the event are encouraged and can be dropped off at the American Legion in Middle River after 2 p.m. on Sept 2nd & 3rd or contact Shirley at 218-686-4163 to arrange for pick up.)

Also, on Friday at The Wheel from 6-8 p.m., there will be a Best Chili Contest and Chili Feast with a free will offering. Prizes for Best Chili will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, & 3rd places as well as a People's Choice prize. Bring a crock pot of chili to share or just come and enjoy the food and vote for your favorite chili!

The next scheduled activity will be the ever-popular Goat Milking Contest at 7 p.m. on Friday. You do not want to miss out on this competition, it will take place at the Davidson Construction Parking Lot and is always good for a laugh or two!

Following the Goat Milking Contest, there will be a Karaoke Contest at 8 p.m. at The Wheel, with accompaniments provided by Jason Rominski. This event premiered in 2014 and is a good time whether you compete or just come to enjoy the music. Call Jason at 218-686-3830 to pre-register for the competition.

Saturday morning kicks off at the Middle River American Legion with a hot breakfast served from 8-10 a.m. by Norie

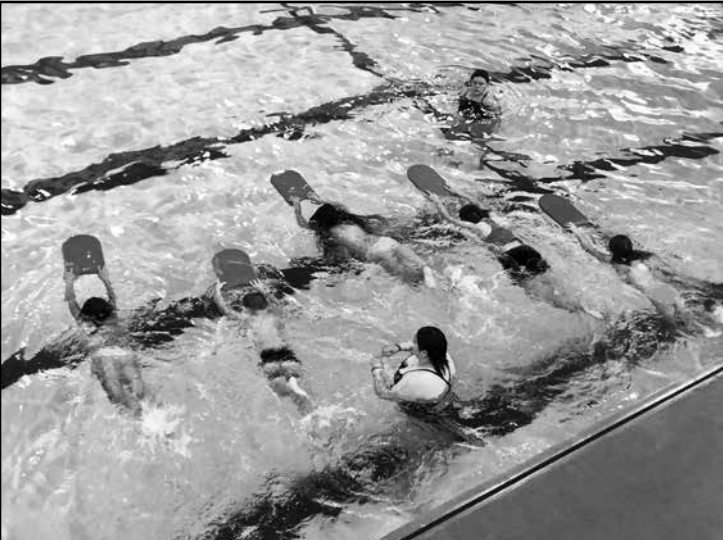
