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USDA funding available to help buy or repair homes

USDA Rural Development has funding available for low-income individuals and families seeking to purchase or repair a home in a rural area. The Direct Home Loan program offers financing to qualified very-low and low-income applicants that are unable to qualify for traditional financing. No down payment is required, and the interest rate could be as low as one percent with a subsidy. Applicants must meet income and credit guidelines and demonstrate repayment ability. The program is available in rural communities of generally 35,000 people or less.

The maximum loan amount is \$40,000 at a one percent interest rate, repayable for a 20-year term and can be used to improve or modernize homes and do essential repairs. Grants of up to \$10,000 are available to homeowners 62 and older and must be used to remove health or safety hazards, such as fixing a leaking roof, installing indoor plumbing, or replacing a furnace.

Time is limited to receive funds for the current fiscal year. Contact a USDA Rural Development Housing Specialist in your area today, to see if you qualify 218-681-2843 x4.

USDA Rural Development loans and grants provide assistance that supports infrastructure improvements; business development; housing; community services such as schools, public safety and health care; and high-speed internet access in rural areas. For more information, visit www.rd.usda.gov/mn.

• SIMPLY DELICIOUS

Maple Brown Sugar Cookies

With big flavor, crisp edges, and mega chewy centers, these maple brown sugar cookies are a definite favorite. Top with maple icing for the ultimate fall cookie. Note: Chilling the cookie dough is imperative, so set aside 2 hours or prepare the cookie dough the day before.

Ingredients
2 and 1/3 cups all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon baking soda
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup butter, softened to room temperature
1 cup packed brown sugar
1 large egg
1/3 cup pure maple syrup*
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 teaspoon maple extract
1 cup chopped pecans*
MAPLE ICING
2 tablespoons butter
1/3 cup maple syrup
1 cup confectioners' sugar
pinch salt
Instructions
Whisk the flour, baking soda, and salt together in a medium bowl. Set aside. Using a hand mixer or a stand mixer fitted with a paddle attachment, cream the butter and brown sugar together on medium speed until smooth, about 1-2 minutes. Add the egg and beat on high until combined, about 30 seconds. Add the maple syrup, vanilla extract, and maple extract, then beat on high speed until combined.

Pour the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients, then mix on low until combined. Add the pecans, then beat on low speed until combined. Dough will be creamy and soft.

Cover and chill the dough for 2 hours in the refrigerator (and up to 3-4 days). If chilling for longer than a few hours, though, allow to sit at room temperature for at least 30 minutes before rolling and baking because the dough will be quite hard.

Preheat oven to 350°F. Line 2-3 large baking sheets with parchment paper or silicone baking mats. Set aside.

Roll cookie dough into balls, about 1.5 tablespoons of dough per cookie. Bake each batch

for 12-13 minutes until lightly browned on the sides. The centers will look very soft.

Remove from the oven. If your warm cookies look puffy, lightly bang the pan on the counter when you remove it from the oven. That will help slightly deflate the cookies, creating lovely cracks as you see in the pictured cookies. Cool cookies on the baking sheets for 5 minutes before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.

Make the icing: In a small saucepan over low heat, melt the butter and maple syrup together, whisking occasionally. Once the butter has melted, remove from heat and whisk in the sifted confectioners' sugar. Taste. Add a pinch of salt, if desired. Drizzle over cooled cookies. Icing will set after about 1 hour.

Cookies stay fresh covered at room temperature for up to 1 week.

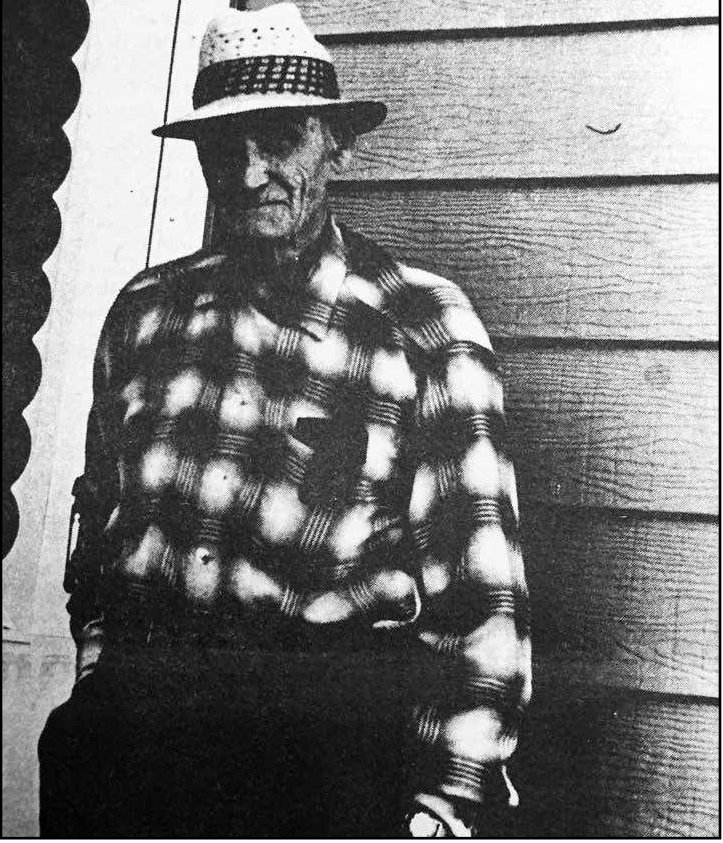
Recipe notes
Maple Syrup: Avoid "breakfast syrup" which doesn't have the same robust maple flavor that pure syrup contains. Grade A is good, but Grade B is darker and more flavorful because it's produced later in the season. You can't go wrong with either in these cookies.

Maple Extract: Pure maple syrup isn't enough to guarantee mega maple flavor. Without the crutch of maple extract, the cookies were lacking. It's recommended to use McCormick maple extract. You can find it in the baking aisle.

Pecans: The pecans are optional, but add wonderful flavor and texture.

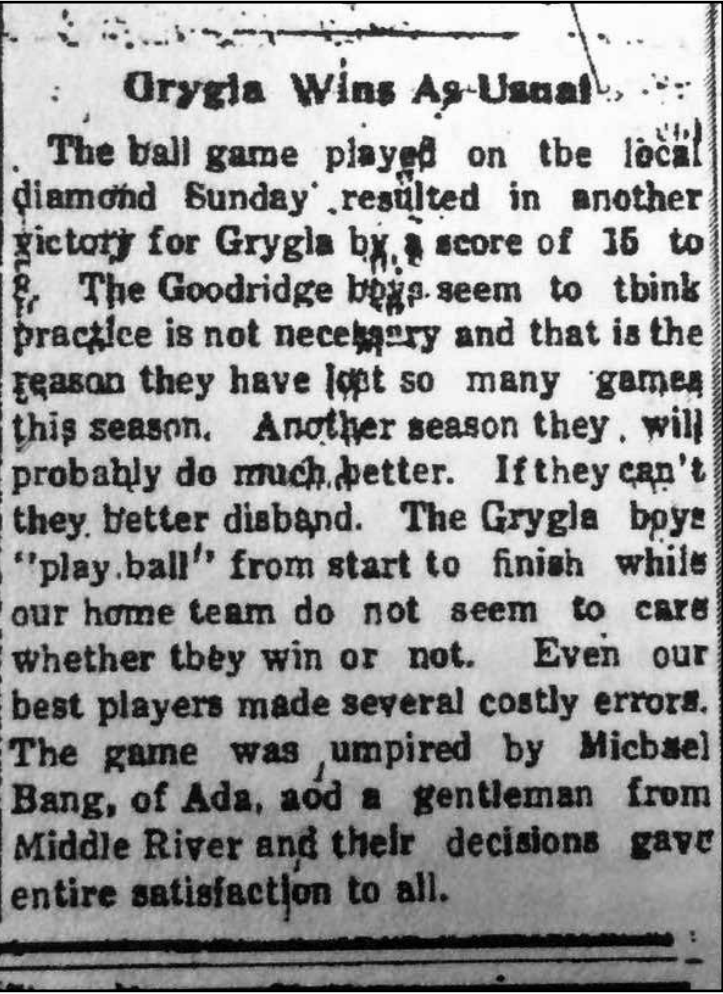

Grygla Eagle Newspaper: January 2000

Wesley and Kate Sandmark are pictured in their home near Grygla. Wesley returned home about two weeks ago, after several months at the Fairview University hospital in Minneapolis, where he had a heart transplant. After having heart troubles for year, Wesley suffered a massive heart attack in the spring of 1999 and wasn't expected to live through it, with only 7% of his heart working. Miraculously, he pulled through but would need a new heart. After an artificial heart was implanted, and he was put on a heart transplant waiting list, a donor was found November 4th. On November 5th, 1999, Wesley underwent heart transplant surgery and wasn't released from the hospital until January 4th, 2000.

U of M Extension to host webinar series for cattle owners with a day job

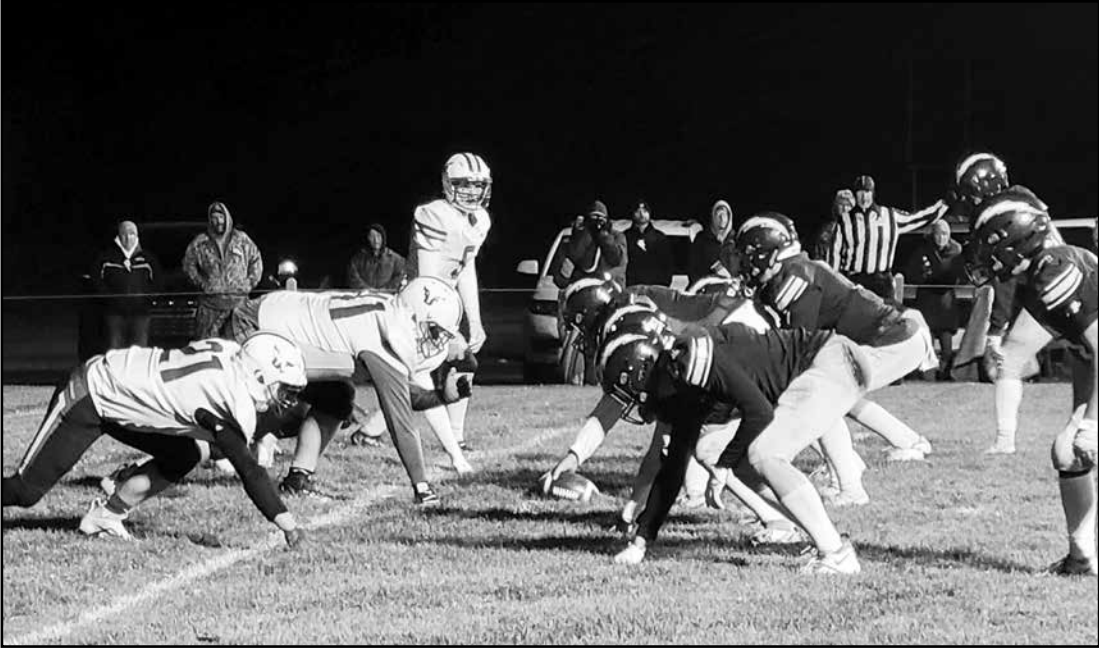

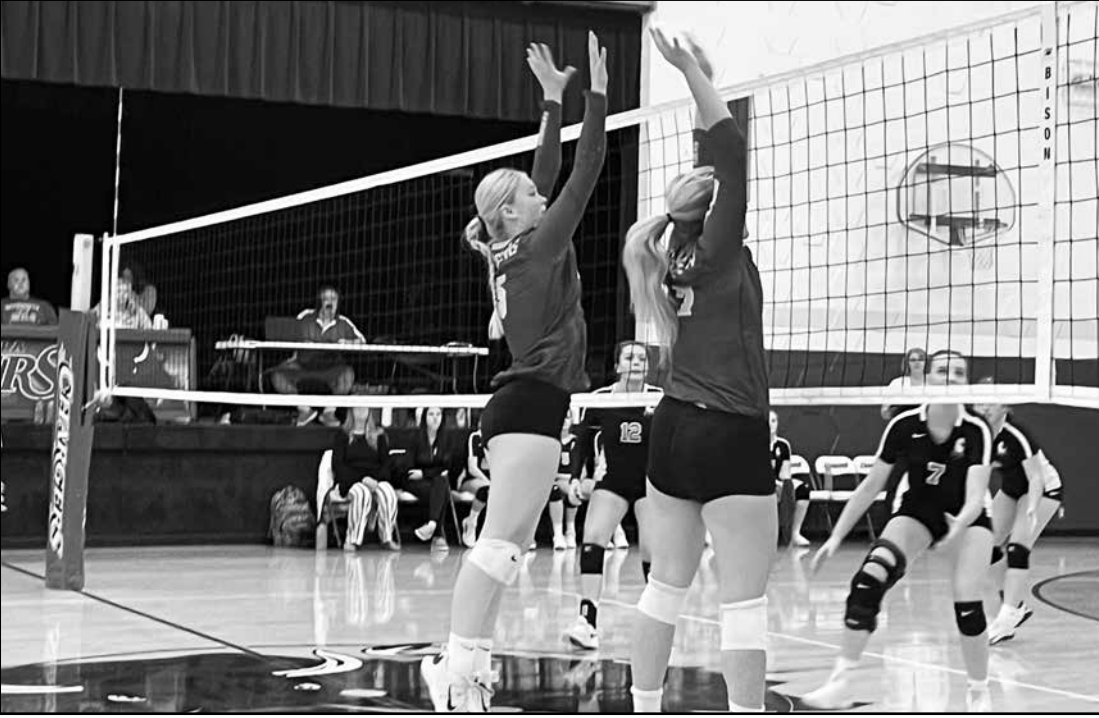
