In honor and memory of George “Shorty” Wikert, United States Navy 1955-1957



Every year, the Grygla Eagle Newspaper features a local veteran in honor of Veterans Day. This year's story has a bit more meaning. We have chosen to feature George “Shorty” Wikert, who served in the U.S. Navy in 1955-1957. Shorty was living at the Greenbush LifeCare Center; he passed away peacefully last Friday, November 4th, at the age of 89. The service to celebrate Shorty's life will be held on Friday, November 11th, at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in rural Grygla at 1pm. Visitation will be one hour prior to the service.

In honor and memory of Shorty, we bring you his service story below. George was born to Fred & Frances (Holthusen) Wikert on the family farm in Thorhult, MN, on June 4th, 1933. He attended the Sand Ridge Country School in Thorhult from 1st through 8th grade, and later attended 1-2 years of high school in Goodridge, MN. George was ordered to report to the Armory in Bemidji, MN, for an Armed Forces Physical Examination for the Selective Service on January 22nd, 1953. He was later drafted into

the U.S. Navy. George attended Basic Training at the U.S. Naval Training Center in San Diego, California. He did not know how to swim when he entered the serviced. He stated that they were pushed off of a very high ledge into the water and pulled out until they eventually learned how to swim; it wasn't a very pleasant way to learn, but George learned how after just a few pushes. George's time in the Navy was from 1955-1957. He served in California, Alaska and Hawaii. George served as a deck-hand and then onto a full sea man, which is 3 stripes. He served on two different ships. The first one was Eldorado, which was an officer's and communications ship. The second one was USS Oak Hill, which was a very large ship used to transport heavy equipment such as drag-lines, backhoes, dozers, etc. It was large enough to transport up to three smaller ships inside of it. In Hawaii, George was a member of the building crew that constructed the first air force base there. While stationed in Alaska, he was also on a construction crew and worked with heavy equipment. George made many new friends during this time in his life. He enjoyed seeing new places and learned much. He spoke fondly of these memories and experiences. George entered the Reserves on September 10th, 1957, and served until December 1st, 1961, when he was then honorably discharged. After returning home from

the service, he started working for Holthusen Construction as a heavy equipment operator. George continued to work for Herb Holthusen until his retirement. He also raised Hereford beef cattle and sheep. In the spring of 1989, he had a Hereford cow deliver triplet calves. They all survived with a little extra TLC from him. George married Carol (Kujansan) Wikert on February 4th, 1969; Carol passed away on October 5th, 2004. After the passing of his wife, and being retired from Holthusen Construction, George started working for the City of Grygla. He very much enjoyed this job for a number of years. In June 2019, George moved to Valley Home in Thief River Falls. In April 2021, he then moved to Greenbush LifeCare Center. Shorty was a member of the Fourtown/Grygla Sportsman's Club. He served as Chairman for Steenerson Township in Beltrami County for 20 years. He was also a member of Our Savior's Lutheran Church, and a veteran whom we honor and remember. He is survived by his sister, Lorraine Finden, of Champlin, MN; brother Billy (Phyllis) Wikert, of Grygla, MN, and several nieces and nephews. He is preceded in death by his wife, Carol; parents; grandparents; sisters, Arlene (Bud) Froseth, and Darlene (Bob) Phillips; brother-in-law, George Finden; and a great nephew, Billjack Boyer. Shorty will always be remembered as a very quiet and kind man with a warm smile.

Disabled Veterans' Homestead Property Tax Exclusion

Who is eligible? This program provides a property tax exclusion for the homestead of:
1. An honorably discharged veteran who has a service-connected disability rating of 70% or higher.
2. Surviving spouses of certain qualifying veterans and service members.
3. Primary family caregivers of qualifying veterans.
How do you apply?
Applications are available in your County Assessor's office. You must apply by December 31, 2022, to qualify for the exclusion on the current year's market value for taxes payable next year (except for manufactured homes assessed as personal property, which are taxed in the same year they are assessed).

****IMPORTANT PROPERTY TAX NOTICE – SPECIAL AGRICULTURAL HOMESTEAD****

Do you own agricultural land but do not have an agricultural homestead?
Homestead is available on farmland as long as all the following conditions are met:

- The owner must live within four cities towns or a combination thereof from the farm;
- The owner or qualifying relative must actively farm the land;
- The owner and operator must be a Minnesota resident;
- Neither the owner nor their spouse claim another agricultural homestead in Minnesota; and
- The farm consists of at least 40 contiguous acres

What is a qualifying relative?
For special agricultural homestead, a qualifying relative includes a spouse, child, grandchild, sibling, or parent of the owner, either on the person's own behalf as an individual or on behalf of an entity.

When do I apply?
You must apply on or before December 31, 2022. This is an annual application accompanied by your 156EZ from the 2022 crop year. Contact your county assessor for applications

****IMPORTANT PROPERTY TAX NOTICE – AGRICULTURAL & RESIDENTIAL HOMESTEAD****

This will affect your 2023 property taxes and eligibility for Property Tax Refund.

Have you purchased or moved into a property in the past year?
Contact your county assessor to file a homestead application if you or a qualifying relative occupy the property as a homestead on or before December 31, 2022.

What is a qualifying relative?
Qualifying relatives for both agricultural and residential homestead include parent, steparent, child, stepchild, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, nephew, or niece of the owner, by blood or marriage.

When do I apply?
You must apply on or before December 31, 2022.

One homestead is granted, annual applications are not necessary unless they are requested by the county assessor.

Contact the assessor by December 31, 2022 if the use of the property you own or occupy as a qualifying relative has changed during the past year.

If you sell, move, or for any reason no longer qualify for homestead classification, you are required to notify the county assessor within 30 days of the change in homestead status

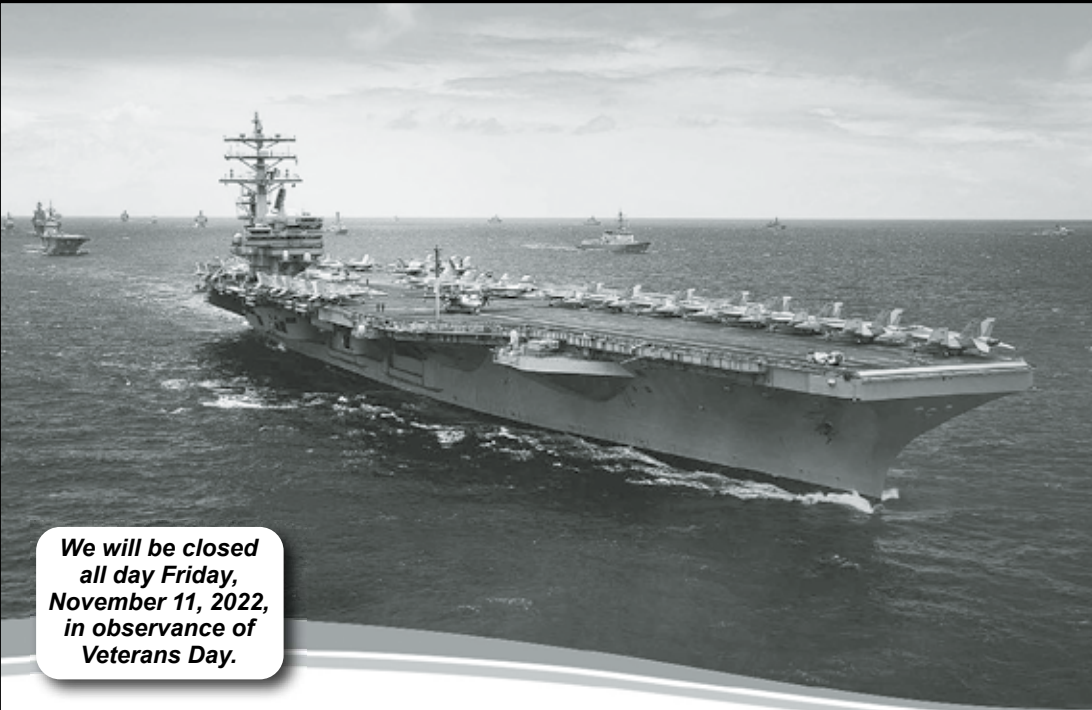

Goodridge School: Planning for the future

The Goodridge School Board has recently started the process of creating a long-range facilities plan for the Goodridge Public School District. The School Board has taken steps to ensure that all voices are heard, and all bases are covered to create the most comprehensive and inclusive plan possible. At the July 2022 school board meeting, the board approved hiring ICS, an experienced K-12 planning and construction firm, to aid in developing a plan that takes into account all of the different facets of the Goodridge School community.

The planning process goes through a four-phase approach that focuses on communication through each phase. Currently, the district is in the Phase I assessment portion which includes completing enrollment and demographic projections to further understand our students and families now and into the future, a thorough facility assessment to provide detailed information about the physical needs of our building, an educational adequacy assessment to compare our educational spaces to the guidelines set by the Minnesota Department of Education (MDE), and listening sessions with our staff, students, and community members to gather feedback, define and prioritize our needs, and build consensus among stakeholders across various groups.

The stakeholder listening sessions are currently taking place to gain a broad understanding of the needs and vision of the Goodridge School District from the community's point of view. In the coming weeks there are two opportunities for district residents, parents, and community members to provide input. The listen-

ing session consists of the ICS staff asking attendees a variety of questions relating to the needs of the district and the attendees voice input by providing a brief hand-written response. All of the responses are anonymous and every response that is provided is shared with the Goodridge School Board.

These are the dates of our upcoming listening sessions; we hope you can make it:

Wednesday, November 2nd, 1pm – Goodridge School District listening session for the Farmers and members of the Agricultural Community at the Goodridge Cenex Café. Lunch will be provided by the Farmers Union Oil Fertilizer Plant at 12pm. *(This session date has passed by time of newspaper print.)*

Tuesday, November 22nd, 6 p.m. – Goodridge School District open community session (district residents and parents) at the Goodridge Community Center. There will be a free meal provided for everyone in the community center at 6pm and the listening session will follow at 7pm. Parents can stay for the listening session at 7pm and there will be supervised entertainment for children in the gyms, such as bounce houses and other entertainment for children, courtesy of the National Guard.

Please attend one of these sessions as it will aid the district as they move into the next phase to begin developing solutions to the needs that are outlined in the Stakeholder Listening Sessions. For any questions, please call Goodridge School Superintendent Tom Loberg at 218-378-4134.

Arts grants funding available

Individual Artist Grants have a November 15 deadline for \$1,500 and an ongoing deadline for quick turnaround grants for \$500. These grants are awarded to performing artists, visual artists, media artists, and creative writing artists from our seven county Minnesota service area including Kittson, Marshall, Norman, Pennington, Polk, Red Lake, and Roseau counties.

Individuals must be out of high school and at least 18 years of age to be eligible. College tuition is not an eligible expense. This is the main category that individuals use to support their artistic business or advance their technical skills. This category is for non-hobby artists who make substantial yearly income from their art. Grants are awarded annually with \$1,500 going to four individuals. Support for this program comes from The McKnight Foundation.

Nonprofits and government organizations can apply for one arts project at a time. Upcoming grants deadlines for these are November 1 and March 1. Grants are between \$500 and \$10,000. Funding sources for these grants are Clean Water, Land and Legacy funds and general allocation funds from the State of Minnesota.

Organizational arts activities funded through these two very important grant opportunities include festivals, community theatre projects, folk music entertainment, sponsorship of visual demonstrations, creative writing workshops and many other activities that improve the quality of life of

people in our communities. This is a great way to bring arts experiences to your community.

Schools in our seven-county region can also apply now for an Artist Residency grant of \$2,600 plus an additional \$400 if the residency needs supplies. Our teaching artist roster is a great resource to view artists available to teach in our area and is available on our website at www.NorthwestMinnesotaArtsCouncil.org under the artists tab. Another resource to view artists available to enhance curriculum is COMPAS.

Schools can initially apply for one residency. Then based on remaining funding, can request up to three additional residencies into spring and summer. Funding for residency activities comes from the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment in Minnesota.

Schools can also apply for Arts Equipment for their school by November 1 each year. Grants are for up to \$3,000 with a 25% cash match requirement. Funds for this arts equipment in schools grant program come from the general fund of the State of Minnesota.

Slow Cooker White Wine Chicken Stew

This White Wine Chicken Stew is filled with a wonderful blend of flavors. It's thick and creamy without being too heavy, and it's deliciously cozy for these colder months ahead.

Ingredients
1 tablespoon olive oil
1 ½ pounds boneless skinless chicken thighs, cut into 1 inch pieces
Salt and pepper
2 cups chicken broth
1/2 cup dry white wine*
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
1 teaspoon balsamic vinegar
2 teaspoons chopped fresh rosemary (fresh is best!)
2 teaspoons chopped fresh thyme (fresh is best!)
½ teaspoon dried oregano
1 teaspoon salt, plus more to taste
Ground black pepper
6 garlic cloves, finely minced
1 large yellow onion, cut into chunks
3 large carrots, peeled and cut into slices
1 pound potatoes, diced into ½ inch cubes
¼ cup flour
1/2 cup unsweetened almond milk (or heavy cream or regular milk will work)

2/3 cup frozen peas

Instructions

Add 1 tablespoon olive oil to a large skillet and place over high heat. Add chicken pieces and generously season with salt and pepper. Cook for about 5-6 minutes. You do not need to cook all the way through, we just want these nice and browned. Transfer to a large 6 or 8-quart slow cooker.

Next add the following to the slow cooker with the chicken: chicken broth, dry white wine, Worcestershire sauce, balsamic vinegar, thyme, rosemary, dried oregano and salt and pepper. Stir together with the chicken until combined, then add in garlic, onion chunks, carrots and diced potatoes. Cover and cook on low for 7-8 hours or on high for 4-5 hours.

Next, remove 1/2 cup of chicken broth from the slow cooker and transfer to a medium bowl, then stir in ¼ cup of milk and whisk in ¼ cup flour until there aren't any lumps remaining. Add mixture back to the slow cooker and stir to combine. Stir in frozen peas and cook uncovered on HIGH for 15-20 more minutes until chicken stew thickens up a bit. Taste and season with more salt and pepper, if necessary. Serve immediately with fresh thyme, toasted french bread, cornbread, crackers, or even buttermilk biscuits. Serves 4.

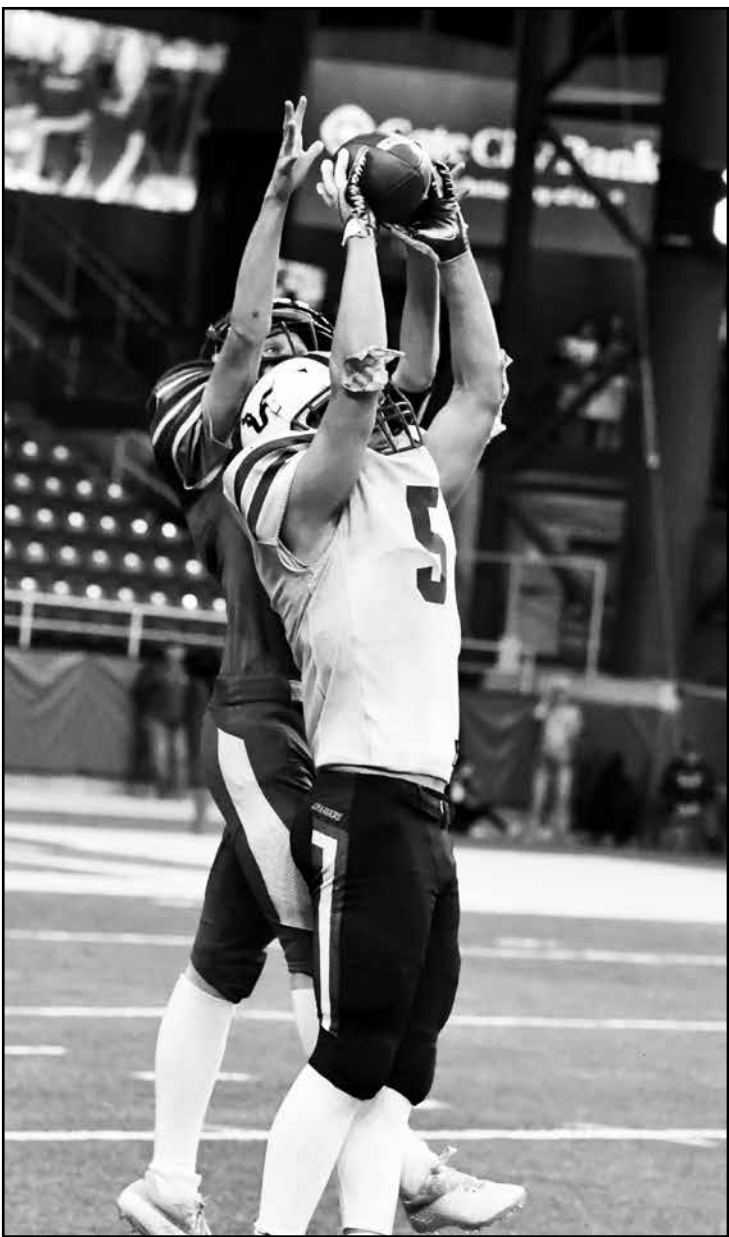
