Local General Election results



City of Grygla election results
Grygla's current city council was made up of the following members: Richard Mosher (mayor), Gavin Nordby, Lindsay Oslund, Devin Ruud and Karla Byklum (council members).

Mayor
The mayoral position was up for election. Current mayor, Richard Mosher, did not run again. Mayoral candidates were Dave Dunrud and Devin Ruud. Devin Ruud was elected the new mayor of Grygla. His position will officially start in January. Since he was a current city council member, the council will appoint someone to fill Ruud's position in January, which will then remain in effect until the next election.

Winter Hazard Awareness Week

Minnesota's Winter Hazard Awareness Week takes place November 14-18th, 2022, as Emergency Management collaborates with partners to remind Minnesotans to minimize the risks of winter. Each day of the week has a winter hazard topic to familiarize ourselves with hazards that come with the season.

Monday, November 14: Winter Storms. Minnesota experiences a variety of dangerous winter weather including heavy snowfall, blizzards and extreme cold temperatures. Know what alerts and warnings mean. A WATCH indicates winter storm conditions are possible in the next 36-48 hours, pay attention to the forecast. A WARNING means life-threatening severe winter conditions are expected within the next 24 hours. An ADVISORY indicates impactful winter weather is expected and could cause inconveniences.

Tuesday, November 15: Outdoor Winter Safety. Frostbite and hypothermia can be painful, have lasting injuries and can even be fatal. Make sure you dress appropriately for the weather conditions when outdoors. If you are ice skating or ice fishing, make sure the ice meets the recommended thickness. Four inches of new clear ice is recommended for walking and a foot of ice is recommended for a small truck. Clear sidewalks and walkways for safety, especially for those with access and functional needs.

Healthy meals pop-up event

LSS (Lutheran Social Services) is offering a healthy meals at a pop-up event in Grygla for any senior age 60+. Pre-registration is required and needs to be made in advance. Date and time of distribution will be announced when/if there is interest in the program.

Any senior age 60 and over can receive 10 frozen meals at each pop-up event. These meals are available at no cost, however, donations are accepted and appreciated.

The homestyle meals are produced at the Heritage Senior Center in Thief River Falls, MN, and are individually sealed and proportioned with a balance of proteins, carbohydrates, vegetables/fruits and spices.

The Grygla-Gatzke Food Shelf has agreed to use their food shelf site for distribution, but they will not be taking registrations; that needs to be done with Shannon.

This program is made available through the efforts of LSS meals, Dancing Sky Area Agency on Aging and the Grygla-Gatzke Food Shelf.

Winter Hazard Awareness Week

fires increase during the winter months as we participate in more cooking, lighting of candles, holiday decorations and heating our homes. Keep flames away from flammable materials and do not overload outlets with holiday lights. Don't use alternative heating sources that are not intended for inside heating, such as gas grills.

Thursday, November 17: Indoor Winter Safety. During the winter months we seal up our homes to keep the cold air out and the warm air in. In that process we also reduce ventilation. Have your furnace serviced and make sure you have a carbon monoxide detector installed. Carbon monoxide is an odorless and colorless gas that can be fatal. Also be aware of chemical and environmental exposure. Check for asbestos and be familiar with radon.

Friday, November 18: Winter Driving. If you must travel during impactful winter weather, make sure to travel with a winter survival kit and a cell phone. Make sure you have a charger if you become stranded and tell family and friends your expected travel route and time. If travel advisories are issued, listen to them and do not travel. Make sure your vehicle is equipped for winter driving conditions including a tune up and appropriate tires. Snowplow trucks are huge compared to your car. Last year there were 72 crashes with plows. Give them space and be prepared for them to maneuver back and forth as they clear shoulders and turn lanes. Do not pass a plow if it is not safe. Check 511mn.org for road conditions.

****IMPORTANT PROPERTY TAX NOTICE – SPECIAL AGRICULTURAL HOMESTEAD****

Do you own agricultural land but do not have an agricultural homestead?
Homestead is available on farmland as long as all the following conditions are met:

- (1) The owner must live within four cities, townships or a combination thereof from the farm;
- (2) The owner or qualifying relative must actively farm the land;
- (3) The owner and operator must be a Minnesota resident;
- (4) Neither the owner nor their spouse claim another agricultural homestead in Minnesota; and
- (5) The farm consists of at least 40 contiguous acres.

What is a qualifying relative?
For special agricultural homestead, a qualifying relative includes a spouse, child, grandchild, sibling, or parent of the owner, either on the person's own behalf as an individual or on behalf of an entity.

When do I apply?
You must apply on or before December 31, 2022. This is an annual application accompanied by your 156EZ from the 2022 crop year. Contact your county assessor for applications.

****IMPORTANT PROPERTY TAX NOTICE – AGRICULTURAL & RESIDENTIAL HOMESTEAD****

This will affect your 2023 property taxes and eligibility for Property Tax Refund.

Have you purchased or moved into a property in the past year?
Contact your county assessor to file a homestead application if you or a qualifying relative occupy the property as a homestead on or before December 31, 2022.

What is a qualifying relative?
Qualifying relatives for both agricultural and residential homestead include parent, stepparent, child, stepchild, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, nephew, or niece of the owner, by blood or marriage.

When do I apply?
You must apply on or before December 31, 2022.

Once homestead is granted, annual applications are not necessary unless they are requested by the county assessor.

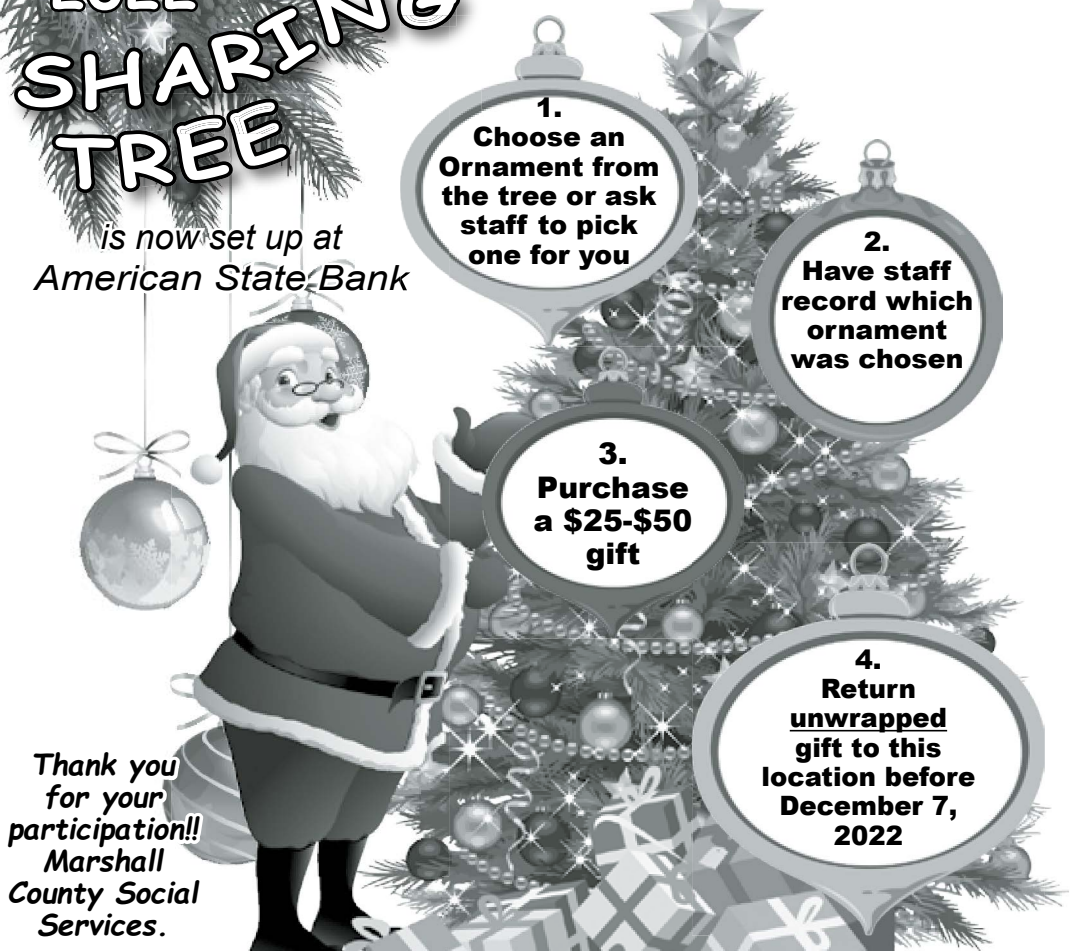
Contact the assessor by December 31, 2022 if the use of the property you own or occupy as a qualifying relative changed during the past year.

If you sell, move, or for any reason no longer qualify for homestead classification, you are required to notify the county assessor within 30 days of the change in homestead status.

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Only in Minnesota: a weekly feature in the Eagle

Minnesota Hwy 1 practically runs through all of Minnesota and it's a beautiful drive

Hwy 1 is the longest road in the state highway system, and it's one of the most beautiful drives in Minnesota. It spans the widest section of the state, from Lake Superior to the Red River, traversing national forests, skirting state parks, crossing Native American reservations, and treating drivers to some of the Bold North's most majestic scenery.

Scenic Hwy 61, on the North Shore of Lake Superior, is Hwy 1's eastern terminus. It begins at Illgen City - a near ghost town - within the boundaries of Tettegouche State Park.

Continuing west, Hwy 1 passes through the Superior National Forest and the small communities of Finland and Isabella. Keep your eyes open - this stretch of road rolls through some of Minnesota's prime moose country.

After a little more than 60 miles, the road passes through Ely. The charming town started as a fur trading post but gained permanence during a mining boom in the late 19th century. Today, it's a gateway to the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness.

Traveling south and west from Ely on Hwy 1, you'll pass near Bear Head Lake and Lake Vermilion-Soudan Underground Mine State Parks. Past Tower, the road skirts the southern shore of Lake Vermilion, through Cook, and across the Bois Forte Band of Chippewa reservation.

A stop at Scenic State Park - voted one of the country's best - is

a must. The highway traverses the Chippewa National Forest and passes near The Lost 40. The Lost 40 is a stand of old-growth white and red pine trees that weren't logged due to a surveying error. The grove is co-managed by the Minnesota DNR as a scientific and natural area and the U.S. Forest Service.

Leaving Chippewa National Forest, Hwy 1 approaches State Hwy. 72 just north of Blackduck. Blackduck is the northern terminus of the Lady Slipper Scenic Byway. The byway passes through some of the state's most orchid-friendly landscapes and offers drivers ample opportunity to enjoy the flowers when they're in bloom.

As you travel westward, Hwy 1 will bring you to Red Lake, the largest lake completely within Minnesota's borders. Hwy 1 skirts Lower Red Lake and passes through the Red Lake Ojibwe Nation. But consider a detour north, along the east side of the lake, to Big Bog State Recreation Area, where you'll find the largest peatland bog in the Lower 48 states and many other recreational opportunities on Upper Red Lake.

Moving away from the Red Lake area, Hwy 1 crosses into the aspen parklands biome of northwestern Minnesota, where elk herds have been reintroduced. One of the best places to spot elk is near Agassiz National Wildlife Refuge, just north of Hwy 1. It's a perfect final stop on your journey, and it's only about 60 miles from Hwy 1's western terminus in the town of Oslo on the Red River.



Iron Chargers expand their Drone Division

We expanded the Drone Division of our robotics program to have 2 teams attend and compete in the 2022-2023 Aerial Drone Competition: Black Out, which was held at the TRF Airport on November 5th. Our two teams' numbers are 4149D and 4149F.

4149D consists of 3 students: Dane Arveson, Reece Sundberg, and Chelsie Nelson. 4149D consists of 4 students: Anthony Englund, Jordan Scheving, Matthew Brown, and Caydun Dybedahl.

During the tournament on November 5th at Northland's Aerospace campus, 4149D finished the day with a record of 4-1 and was ranked first! 4149F finished with a record of 2-3, placing fifth.

Team 4149D advanced to the finals and won with a score of 46 to 10. During the normal game play, there is also an autonomous skills challenge which they took 2nd with a score of 20.

4149F lost out in the semi-finals to a score of 20 to 30. 4149D took home the trophy for Tournament Champions.

Looking forward, we have now ordered and received our own field set up so we can practice more and advance our program even further. Our next Drone tournament is December 17th at the Aerospace campus again.

Robotics is busy; we have our first Tournament in Fisher this Saturday, the 19th, a tournament at Northland in Thief River on December 3rd, and we are also signed up for a tournament in Bemidji February 11th. We also plan on attending Win-E-Mac's Tournament and East Grand Forks Tournament.

While turkey is the center of attention at most Thanksgiving dinners, the side dishes are just as important. With this simply delicious cheesy broccoli casserole on the table, your guests are sure to forget about who burned the bird or who's going vegan yet again. This casserole is cheesy, tasty, and 100% necessary to serve up this holiday season.

Cheesy Broccoli Casserole
(6-8 servings)
Ingredients
2 10.5-oz. cans condensed cream of mushroom soup
8 oz. sharp cheddar, grated (about 2 cups), divided
Zest of 1 lemon
1 tsp. pepper
1 tsp. garlic
¼ tsp. cayenne pepper
2 large heads of broccoli
4 Tbsp. unsalted butter
1 medium onion, chopped

Kosher salt
2 sleeves crushed Ritz or other buttery crackers (about 3 cups)
Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Whisk two cans of soup with 1 cup grated cheese, lemon zest, pepper, garlic, and cayenne pepper in medium bowl.
Trim your broccoli, separating from crowns. Slice and cut into florets.
Melt your butter over large ovenproof skillet with a lid over medium-high heat. Add onion and salt. Cook, stirring occasionally, until onion is softened, about 5-7 minutes.
Add broccoli and ¼ cup water. Cover and steam until broccoli is bright green and tender, about 2 minutes. Add mushroom soup mixture and toss broccoli gently to coat. Scatter 2 sleeves of crushed Ritz on top, along with remaining cup of shredded cheese. Bake until golden brown and bubbling, about 20 minutes.
