Free entrance to Minnesota state parks and recreation areas on Friday, Nov. 25

Minnesotans encouraged to explore outdoors with friends, family over holiday weekend

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources will waive entrance fees to all 75 state parks and recreation areas Friday, Nov. 25 — the day after Thanksgiving.

This "Free Park Day" is one of four days each year on which the DNR waives the vehicle permit requirement to enter state parks and recreation areas. The goal of Free Park Days is to encourage Minnesotans to get outdoors and enjoy the health and wellness benefits of spending time in nature.

"Minnesota state parks and recreation areas are open year-round and provide places of peace and beauty to recharge during the hustle and bustle of the busy holiday season," DNR Parks and Trails Division Director Ann Pierce said. "It's a fantastic time to get out into nature with friends and family following Thanksgiving celebrations."

According to the American Psychological Association, spending time in nature is linked to improved attention, lower stress, reduced risk of psychiatric disorders and even increased empathy and cooperation.

There's a state park or recreation area within 30 miles of most Minnesotans. Free Park Days provide an opportunity to visit a state park or recreation area for the first time or return to an old favorite to discover something new.

Most state park offices and visitor centers will be lightly staffed on Nov. 25. Before and during their visit, visitors are encouraged to:

- Check visitor alerts and find directions on state park pages via the DNR website (mndnr.gov).

- Download GeoPDF maps (mndnr.gov/mobile/geopdf) before the trip. These maps will display a user's current location, like other map applications, but the user does not have to be connected to the internet or have cell service to use them.

- Visit the self-orientation signs near the park entrance for suggestions on what to see and do while visiting.

- Help protect these special places for the future by staying on trails and leaving no trace.

Apply for DNR grants that help children get outside

Public entities and nonprofit organizations serving people younger than 18 can apply for No Child Left Inside grants through 2 p.m. on Wednesday, Dec. 7. The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is offering the grants to help more children cast a line, study animal tracks, hike, bike, or simply learn more about nature.

The DNR is accepting applications for both mini grants (less than \$5,000) or larger grants (\$5,000-\$25,000). The request for proposals and more information about how to apply are available on the DNR website (mndnr.gov/No-Child-Grants).

Mini grants will be awarded by lottery, while larger grants will be awarded using a competitive review process. Funding can be used for outdoor recreation equipment, transportation, and natural resource education expenses.

The DNR hosted an informational webinar recently that reviewed grant requirements, discussed the application process and answered questions. This session was recorded and is available on the "Who should apply for No Child Left Inside grants" page of the DNR website (mndnr.gov/No-Child-Grants/Who-Should-Apply.html).

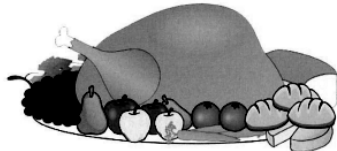

Soft Garlic Herb Cheddar Cheese Bread

The cheesiest swirled Soft Garlic Herb Cheddar Cheese Bread. Simple to make and even more delicious to eat! This light, doughy, and super soft bread is swirled with sharp cheddar cheese, Italian herbs, and hinted lightly with garlic. It makes for the most delicious companion to your dinner table or game day spread. It's easy yet impressive. And it's best served warm, right out of the oven, while it's still gooey and cheesy. You will LOVE this bread.

Ingredients
3/4 cup warm whole milk
2 1/4 teaspoons yeast
2 tablespoons honey
3 large eggs
3 1/2 - 4 cups all-purpose flour, plus more for rolling
1 teaspoon kosher salt
2 cups shredded cheddar
1 cup shredded mozzarella
1/4 cup freshly grated parmesan cheese

1/3 cup chopped Italian herbs such as sage, oregano, basil, and thyme
2 cloves garlic, grated

Instructions

In the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the dough hook, combine the milk, yeast, and honey. Let sit 5-10 minutes, until bubbly on top. Add the eggs, 3 1/2 cups flour, and salt. Using the dough hook, mix until the flour is completely incorporated, about 4-5 minutes. If the dough is still sticky, add the additional 1/2 cup flour, adding more as needed until the dough is smooth to touch.

Cover the bowl with plastic wrap and let sit at room tem-

perature for 1 hour or until doubled in size.

In a bowl, combine the cheeses, herbs, and garlic.

Punch the dough down and roll out onto a lightly floured surface, creating a large rectangle about 12 x 18 inches. Sprinkle the cheese mix evenly over the dough. Starting with the long edge closest to you, roll the dough into a log, keeping it tight as you go. When you reach the edge, pinch along the edge to seal.

Using a sharp knife, cut the log of dough in half lengthwise, leaving a small portion at one end intact (see above photo). Turn the halves out to expose the filling. Cross the dough ropes over each other, repeating the twisting until you have a long, twisted dough.

Coil the dough into a circle. Carefully transfer to a parchment-lined baking sheet. Cover and let sit 15 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 350° F. Bake the bread for 30-35 minutes, until the top is golden brown. Slice and serve warm.

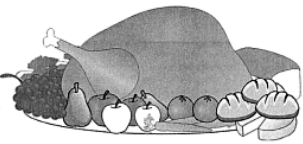
