When it comes to that caption, all that can be said is, “If you know, you know.” Sure, the song actually says he’ll “walk” 500 miles, but in this case, we’re going riding and it’s 500 miles to be exact!

The Goodridge-Grygla 500 Snowmobile Race is coming up on February 11-12 with lots of fun events taking place over the weekend, beginning Friday, February 10th. The official race maps haven’t been finalized yet, but will be released by next week’s Eagle print date. The track will be very similar to last year, but the crew hasn’t decided which direction they will go on which day due to the TRF Knights of Columbus having their fishing derby on Sunday; the track goes right through there. More information to come soon, but racers will put on 250 miles each day, Saturday and Sunday, for a total of 500 miles. Volunteers from both the Goodridge and Grygla communities have been busy with meetings and planning and will be running the track & signing this weekend, making sure everything is ready to go. The green flag will wave in Goodridge at 9am both days, February 11th & 12th, with the race being broadcasted on 94.1 “The Falls.”

Baker Street is doing all the food over the weekend, starting Friday the 10th, and running through Sunday the 12th. The Goodridge Municipal Liquor Store will also have a bar set up on site.

KC Pro West will be racing the mini 500 in Goodridge that weekend also. They are included each day and will have awards in the evening; lots of kids will be racing in that this year.

Only in Minnesota: a weekly feature in the Eagle

The story of a 1979 UFO sighting in Minnesota still lives on today

Here in Minnesota, there are enough stories of supernatural happenings and paranormal experiences to make you think twice about venturing too far into Minnesota's remote areas. For example, northern Minnesota is home to many bigfoot sightings. And all around the state, rumors of haunted roads, hotels, and cemeteries abound. Today, we want to introduce yet another creepy story, this

one involving a terrifying UFO encounter.

The story takes place in Marshall County, Minnesota, in 1979. One night in late August of that year, Deputy Sheriff Val Johnson was on patrol near the small town of Stephen.

At about 2 a.m., he spotted a beam of light ahead on the road. He drove his squad car towards it and was soon surrounded by light. At this point, Johnson heard the sound of glass breaking. But what happened next, no one knows.

Johnson lost consciousness for 39 minutes. When he woke up, he realized that his watch and the car's clock had both stopped for 14 minutes. When he surveyed the car, Johnson found that the windshield was broken. Other damage included broken lights and a bent antenna. It wasn't only the car that was damaged. Johnson himself sustained some unusual injuries. He had bruises and strong eye irritation.

The story made nationwide headlines, and Johnson even

appeared on a popular morning talk show to discuss the incident. The legacy lives on, too. The incident was included in season 2 of the Hulu show Fargo.

Many have likened the even to a UFO encounter. But others believe it to be a hoax. No matter what you believe, you can still visit the squad car involved in the incident. It's found at the Marshall County Historical Society Museum.

The Northwest Minnesota Arts Council is pleased to announce their latest "Call for Entries" for the 2023 Annual Art Exhibit. The deadline to submit your artwork is February 28, 2023!

This year, the annual Art Exhibit will be in Middle River at the Legacy Center in March and April. Adult artwork will be dropped off starting on Monday, March 6 and student artwork later that month. Detailed information will be announced soon on our website.

Artists and creatives from our 7 county- service region are invited to enter into this art exhibit and will be competing for \$2,300 in cash awards. Artists must reside in Kittson, Marshall, Norman, Polk, Pennington, Roseau, or Red Lake counties to be eligible.

Both adults and students are encouraged to enter. Exhibit cash award winners will be chosen while the exhibit is on display by a qualified juror. They will be recognized and receive their check at the Artist Reception at the Middle River Legacy Center on Sunday, April 30. Artists are welcome to have their work in the exhibit available for sale.

Arts grants funding available

Applications are open for Project Grants for nonprofit arts organizations, communities, schools, and other nonprofit organizations from our seven county Minnesota service area including Kittson, Marshall, Norman, Pennington, Polk, Red Lake, and Roseau counties.

Nonprofits and government organizations can apply for one arts project at a time. Upcoming grants deadlines for these are March 1. Grants are between \$500 and \$10,000. Funding sources for these grants are Clean Water, Land and Legacy funds and general allocation funds from the State of Minnesota.

Organizational arts activities funded through these very important grant opportunities include festivals, community theatre projects, folk music entertainment, sponsorship of visual demonstrations, creative writing workshops and many other activities that improve the quality of life of people in our communities. This is a great way to bring arts experiences to your community.

We are offering a grant writing workshop online or in person to assist you with your application. You are welcome to come to our office in Warren for the workshop or to work on your grants in our new setting. RSVPs are required for grant writing sessions – please email [director@nwartscouncil.org](mailto:director@nwartscouncil.org).

The session will be held Tuesday, February 14 at 11:00 am. You can also set up a time to work one-on-one with our director on the grant writing process.

Schools in our seven-county region can also apply now for an Artist Residency grant of \$2,600 plus an additional \$400 if the residency needs supplies. Our teaching artist roster is a great resource to view artists available to teach in our area and is available on our website at [www.NorthwestMinnesotaArtsCouncil.org](http://www.NorthwestMinnesotaArtsCouncil.org) under the artists tab. Another resource to view artists available to enhance curriculum is COMPAS.

Schools can initially apply for one residency. Then based on remaining funding, can request up to three additional residencies into spring and summer. Funding for residency activities comes from the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment in Minnesota.

Also available on a first come-first served basis are Quick Turn-around Grants for \$500. These grants are awarded to performing artists, visual artists, media artists, and creative writing artists from our seven county Minnesota service area including Kittson, Marshall, Norman, Pennington, Polk, Red Lake, and Roseau counties.

Baked Crunchy Hot Honey Chicken

Ingredients  
6 cups cornflakes  
1/4 cup grated parmesan cheese  
1 teaspoon paprika  
1/2 teaspoon onion powder  
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder  
2 large eggs, beaten  
2 tablespoons hot sauce  
2 pounds smaller boneless chicken breasts or thighs  
Extra virgin olive oil, for drizzling  
Hot Honey  
1/2 cup honey  
2-3 tablespoons hot sauce  
1-3 teaspoons cayenne pepper

3/4 teaspoon chili powder  
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder  
1/2 teaspoon onion powder  
Sea salt  
Fresh parsley, for serving  
Instructions  
Preheat the oven to 425°F. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. In a food processor, combine the cornflakes, parmesan, paprika, onion powder, garlic powder, and a pinch of salt. Pulse until you have fine crumbs. Alternatively, you can crush the crumbs in a ziplock bag by stepping on them. Dump the crumbs into a shallow bowl.  
Beat the eggs in a bowl, add

the hot sauce and chicken, and toss well to coat. Dredge the chicken through the crumbs, covering fully. Place on the prepared baking sheet. For a thicker coating, dip the chicken back through the eggs, then through the crumbs a 2nd time. Place on the prepared baking sheet. Drizzle with olive oil. Bake for 35-40 minutes, until crisp all around.

Just before the chicken is done cooking, make the sauce. In a sauce pot, warm together the honey, hot sauce, cayenne, chili powder, onion powder, and garlic powder, plus a pinch of salt.

Drizzle the warm sauce over the chicken. Top with parsley or any herb, for serving.
