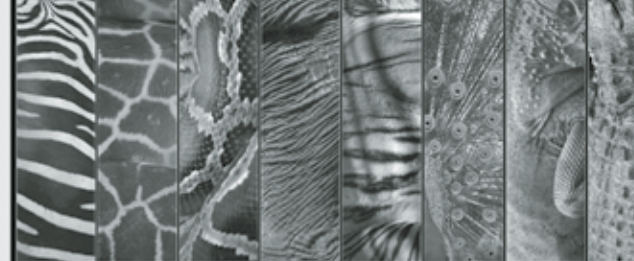

AND THE PROPOSAL TO ADOPT A CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN THEREFORE
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Board of Commissioners of Marshall County, Minnesota (the "County"), will hold a public hearing at a meeting of the County Board beginning at 10:30 A.M. on August 15, 2023, to be held at the Marshall County Courthouse, 208 E Colvin Avenue, in the City of Warren, Minnesota, on (a) the intention to issue general obligation capital improvement plan bonds in an amount not to exceed \$8,130,000 and (b) the proposal to adopt a capital improvement plan therefor. The proceeds of the bonds will be used to finance the remodeling and additions to the existing jail facility within the County pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 373.40. All interested persons may appear and be heard at the time and place set forth above. If a petition requesting a vote on the issuance of the bonds is signed by voters equal to five percent of the votes cast in the County in the last general election and is filed with the County within thirty days after the public hearing, the bonds may only be issued upon obtaining the approval of the majority of the voters voting on the question of issuing the bonds. All interested persons may appear at the public hearing and present their views to the County Board orally; or if in writing contact the County Auditor-Treasurer's office at 208 E Colvin Avenue, Suite 11 and 12, Warren, MN 56762. Both the Freedom Fest events and the GAHS events that are held in conjunction with each other on this day are great for locals. All of the hard work by all is so appreciated. Planning committees are encouraged to send in their press releases, advertisements, and all other items they wish to inform the public about. We are always happy to print these great events and give credit where it's due when we are informed about it.

Fall sports approaching

Volleyball and football practice for Charger athletes in grades 7-12 will begin on Monday, August 14th. Parents may drop off the required forms at the school office in August during regular business hours of 7:45 to 3:45, Monday through Thursday. Parents may also pick up/drop off forms during the fall sports registration night. This will occur on Mon-

day, August 7th, from 4-6pm at each site. Coaches will be available to ask any questions. There will NOT be a combined sports meeting this year and parents are able to sign up their athletes at their own site. If you have any questions, please call the office. Links to sign up and to the required forms are found under each school website.

Medical Assistance deadline extended

Minnesotans whose Medical Assistance renewal forms were originally due July 31 will have an extra month to turn in their paperwork. People affected by this extension are urged to send in their renewal forms and any required documentation as soon as possible to keep insurance coverage. "If your renewal is due, please send it in as soon as you can," said Interim Assistant Human Services Commissioner Julie Marquardt. "Help with paperwork is available through trained MNsure navigators, who are ready to assist in multiple languages." Find a navigator near you at mnsure.org/free-help. Minnesota provided a similar extension to people whose Medical Assistance forms were originally due June 30. The state and its partners have been using the additional time to redouble outreach efforts and help more people through the renewal process. That group still faces a July 31 deadline to submit their forms. The federal government is supportive of states seeking to keep eligible people insured

longer to avoid ending Medicaid coverage if they still qualify but need more help to renew. Medical Assistance is Minnesota's Medicaid program. In the group with the newly extended deadline, people already determined ineligible for Medical Assistance will still lose coverage on Aug. 1, but have been referred to other insurance options if they don't already have coverage from another source such as an employer. Some now qualify for MinnesotaCare. Others can get help finding insurance options through MNsure, Minnesota's health insurance marketplace. For more information about Medical Assistance and MinnesotaCare renewals, including how to get free help filling out forms, visit mn.gov/dhs/renew-mycoverage.

USDA Funding available to help buy/repair homes

USDA Rural Development has funding available for very low- and low-income individuals and families seeking to purchase or repair a home in a rural area. The Direct Home Loan program offers financing to qualified very-low and low-income applicants that are unable to qualify for traditional financing. No down payment is required, and the interest rate could be as low as one percent with a subsidy. Applicants must meet income and credit guidelines and demonstrate repayment ability. The program is available in rural communities of generally 35,000 people or less. The maximum loan amount is \$40,000 at a one percent interest rate, repayable for a 20-year term and can be used to improve or modernize homes and do essential repairs.

Grants of up to \$10,000 are available to homeowners 62 and older and must be used to remove health or safety hazards, such as fixing a leaking roof, installing indoor plumbing, or replacing a furnace. Time is limited to receive funds for the current fiscal year. Contact a USDA Rural Development Housing Specialist in your area today, to see if you qualify 218-681-2843 x4. USDA Rural Development loans and grants provide assistance that supports infrastructure improvements; business development; housing; community services such as schools, public safety and health care; and high-speed internet access in rural areas.
