Congratulations to former Goodridge School graduate Dana (Wiseth) Dean, who is being inducted into the Mayville State University Athletic Hall of Fame. Dana is a 1999 graduate of Goodridge School, and a 2003 graduate of Mayville State University, where she excelled in volleyball and basketball. Dana, along with the rest of the Alumni award recipients, will be honored during the Mayville State University Homecoming/Farmers Bowl events on September 15th

& 16th. Dana, her husband Rich, and their four children currently live in Maple Grove, MN. She is a 5th and 8th grade Skills teacher at Breakaway Academy. She is the daughter of Vance & Lori Wiseth, of Goodridge. **Honoree Biography** For four years as a Comet, Dana (Wiseth) Dean lettered in both volleyball and basketball. Especially talented in volleyball, she earned all-conference recognition as well as offensive

and most valuable player honors. Described as a great leader and teammate, she is fourth on the Comet all-time leader board with 1,219 kills and third with 1,703 digs. She was the team captain in her senior year. Before and since graduating from MSU she has coached multiple club volleyball teams and teaches character skills at Breakaway Academy, a hockey school. She graduated in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in Elementary Education.

Slow Cooker Tomato Tortellini Soup

Simply delicious! Just dump everything into the slow cooker and let it work its magic.

1 lb Italian sausage
1 (32-oz) container chicken broth

1 (28-oz) can petite diced tomatoes

2 (10.5-oz) cans tomato soup

2 (8-oz) containers chive and onion cream cheese spread, softened

1 (18-oz) package refrigerated cheese tortellini, uncooked

In a skillet, cook Italian sausage until browned. Transfer cooked sausage to slow cooker. Add chicken broth, tomatoes and tomato soup to slow cooker. Cover and cook on LOW 6 to

8 hours. Stir in cream cheese and cheese tortellini. Cover and cook on HIGH for 15 to 30 minutes, until tortellini is cooked.
