



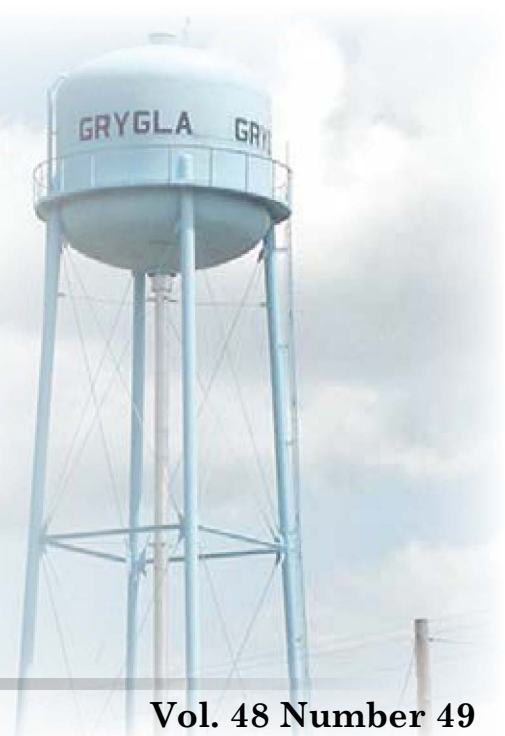

Goodridge/Grygla 500 cancelled

Cor PowerSports Race Series, along with our local reps that coordinate the Goodridge-Grygla 500, both announced the cancellation of the snowmobile race that was scheduled for February 8-9, 2025.

This is the second year in a row that the Goodridge-Grygla 500 Snowmobile Race has had to be cancelled due to a lack of snow. The crew is still selling raffle tickets. If there's no race, the proceeds will go to the Grygla and Goodridge EMS and Fire Departments.

Cor PowerSports released this statement on Monday:

We have been working closely with the Goodridge-Grygla snowmobile clubs the past year planning for the Goodridge-Grygla 1-500 with course routing and logistics, but like last year, we once again find the region very thin on snow.

Currently, there is barely enough snow in the Goodridge-Grygla area to cover the grass. Some ditches are drifted in, but many fields and ditches are bare. The snowmobile clubs have not been able to get out and groom yet, so there is no base in the snow and many hazards are barely covered.

When it comes to making decisions on the event, we have to not only look at this year's event but the future for the trail system and the relationship with these groups and individuals for gaining access for races.

Looking at the current conditions in the region, along with the extended range forecast, there is unfortunately nothing positive in the long range for cold temperatures or snow forecasted.

Decisions that we have to make do not come easily, but at the end of the day, we need to do what is best for all the parties involved, so the vote was to cancel the 2025 race due to the conditions.

The entire Cor PowerSports staff, sponsors, and manufacturers want to express our gratitude for the Goodridge and Grygla snowmobile club members for all their work and dedication to keep the 1-500 tradition alive.

We look forward to working with the snowmobile clubs for the 2026 Goodridge-Grygla 1-500 February 15-16, 2026.

Provide input on 2024 deer populations, observations

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is seeking public input via an online survey on 2024 deer populations and observations. The survey includes questions about experiences hunters had during the deer hunting season; issues related to damage deer might have done to crops, landscaping or gardens; and other deer-

related issues. People can also share their input on proposed boundary changes for deer permit areas 101, 111, 183, 208 and 268.

The Minnesota DNR will use the feedback to shape regulations for the 2025 hunting season. The survey is open through Monday, Feb. 10 and available on the DNR deer management webpage (mndnr.gov/deer).

GG to host Snowflake League again this Sat.

Goodridge AD Tomas Loberg said that Grygla and Goodridge Schools will each host Snowflake League basketball again this weekend. He said, "In the past we used to host only one snowflake league Saturday and an elementary basketball tournament, but it was a lot of work to find teams to come to our tournament. We decided it was easier to host 2 snowflake league Saturday's instead, because the date is set and the teams participating

are set for us. The snowflake league is always looking for additional host sites for Saturdays. This way we get 2 home events for snowflake league, additional fundraising opportunities for student groups, and our families don't have to travel as much."

This Saturday, the sites are swapped for the boys and girls. Grades 3-6 boys will play in Grygla while grades 3-6 girls will play in Goodridge. Games begin at 9am.

This weekend: Glow in the Snow candlelight snowshoe

Each winter, candlelight events at Minnesota state parks, recreation areas and trails encourage people to get outdoors and warm up to winter. The events feature trails lit up at night with candles, lanterns and other luminaries. Depending on the location of the event and the amount of snow cover, visitors can hike, snowshoe or cross-country ski along the lighted trails.

"Winter candlelight events are a magical way to experience Minnesota's state parks, recreation areas and trails," said Ann Pierce, director of Parks and Trails Division at the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. "There's something truly special about walking a snowy trail under the glow of candlelight, where the quiet of the night and the sparkle of the snow create a peaceful escape. It's a chance to slow down, connect with nature, spend time with friends and family and find beauty in the stillness of winter."

This winter, 19 candlelight events at 17 different locations are planned between Jan. 3 and Feb. 22. The schedule—including dates, times and other details—is available at the candlelight events webpage (mndnr.gov/candlelight).

Candlelight trails are suitable for beginners of all ages. In some locations, snowshoes and skis can be rented or checked out at the ranger station or visitor center. Call the park in advance to confirm the availability of equipment.

In the event of severe weather, check alerts and notices on the park website or call the park office. Park web-

sites are listed on the DNR website (mndnr.gov/parklist) and phone numbers are listed on each park website.

Save time: Get vehicle permits online before event. While there is no participation fee for the candlelight events, a vehicle permit is required to enter Minnesota state parks and recreation areas. The DNR recommends buying permits in advance at the state park vehicle permit website (mndnr.gov/permit). The cost is \$7 per day, or \$35 for a year.

The closest events near Grygla happen at either Itasca State Park or Lake Bemidji State Park. There is a Glow in the Snow Candlelight Snowshoe happening at Lake Bemidji State Park this Saturday, January 25th, from 5:30-8pm.

There's also good news when it comes to these temps, by this weekend it should be back up to the 20's again!

Event details
(10 miles north of Bemidji, off Highway 71 N.)

Step into a winter wonderland on a twilight snowshoe adventure lit by the soft glow of candlelight. Follow the paths through snowy landscapes, experiencing the peaceful serenity of nature in the stillness of night.

Stop by the Lavinia Group Camp to warm up around a cozy campfire and at the Visitor Center for live music, hot cocoa and other refreshments.

Bring your own snowshoes or a limited quantity will be available to rent at the park office at \$6 per pair. If there is not enough snow depth, it will be a hike instead.

Embrace the magic of the season on this unforgettable evening!
