March Food Shelf Campaign

The Grygla-Gatzke Food Shelf is once again participating in the Minnesota Food Share March Campaign for Hunger Awareness. The fundraising campaign will run from Saturday March 1st through Sunday, April 6th. During this time, any donations, whether food (number of pounds) or monetary, will be eligible to receive funding pro-rated compared to other Minnesota campaign participants.

This is the food shelf's big fundraiser of the year as the ability to generate some matching funds makes it all the more worthwhile.

The Grygla-Gatzke Food Shelf is run on individual donations and any grants they may receive. They are able to use donated funds to buy food items through the North Country Food Bank at a greatly reduced rate which allows them to stretch their food dollars even more.
