Fire Department holds open house



The Grygla Fire & Rescue Department held an open house last week where the public could come and visit the fire station, take a tour, watch multiple demonstrations, visit with the crew and take a night off from cooking as the firemen grilled up brats for all the visitors, which were plenty!

Community members were able to get a close-up look at all of the equipment that belongs to the fire station. The original fire station was built in 1979-80. In 1992, a 40x44 addition was added on to the north; another addition was built on in 2012, which measured 44 x 55 to the west.

The station houses numerous pieces of rescue equipment, which includes Unit 1 – the 1st response truck that carries majority of the rescue tools, and Unit 2 – a pumper engine that pumps 1000 gallons of water per minute and carries the fire fighting equipment. Also belonging to the department are two water tenders that carry 3,000 gallons of water each, two grass rigs

for wildland fires – each pickup carries 250 gallons of water and has its own ranger it pulls, and a 2006 ambulance, which just recently replaced the 1991 unit on October 27th. The new ambulance was made possible by various donations, fundraisers and Beltrami/Marshall County Con-Con funds.

The department also owns a snowmobile and rescue sleigh, which has a wheel kit for summer use in response to hunting or ATV accidents. Polaris owns the snowmobile, but donates the machine for a 2-year usage period; the crew can then return it for a new one. This is the 3rd snowmobile that Polaris has donated a sled to the Grygla Fire & Rescue Department.

At the open house, community members enjoyed seeing numerous items on display, along with a few demonstrations from crew members. Vehicle extrication equipment was demonstrated, along with lift bags, which are placed under vehicle tires in case it needs to be lifted off of a victim. The bags were demonstrated lifting the fire

truck that weighed approximately 30,000 pounds! Visitors also got a chance to look at the Coffey Dam equipment, which is used to extricate a victim in a grain emergency.

Currently at 20 members, the Grygla Fire & Rescue Department is always looking for new volunteers to join. If you are interested, please get in touch with Fire Chief Bob Thompson.

Thompson has also provided a first responders report below.

January 1 – October 30th, 2016

Total calls: 41

Of those calls, 18 were medical, 8 wildland/grass fires, 3 structure fires, 3 motor vehicle/ATV accident, 1 search assist, 4 alarm activations and 4 weather watch calls.

Departmental training included a First Responders training for new certification and a refresher course for the experienced, along with a Sky Warn training and local trainings/meetings.

IMPORTANT PROPERTY TAX HOMESTEAD NOTICE*

* This will affect the amount of property tax you pay in 2017, and it may affect your eligibility for a property tax refund.

Please contact your county assessor to file a homestead application on or before December 15, 2016, if one of the following applies:

- You purchased a property in the past year and you, or a qualifying relative, occupy the property for homestead purposes on December 1, 2016; or
- You, or a qualifying relative, occupy a property for homestead purposes on December 1, 2016, and the property was previously classified as non-homestead.

A qualifying relative for homestead purposes depends on the type of property. For residential property, a qualifying relative can be a parent, stepparent, child, stepchild, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, nephew, or niece of the owner. This relationship may be by blood or marriage. For agricultural property, a qualifying relative can be a grandchild, child, sibling, or parent of the owner of the agricultural property or of the spouse of the owner.

Once you have been granted the homestead classification, no further applications are necessary unless they are specifically requested by the county assessor.

You must also contact the assessor by December 15, 2016 if you are the property owner, or a qualifying relative of the property owner, and the use of the property has changed during the past year.

If you should sell, move, or for any reason no longer qualify for the homestead classification, you are required to notify the county assessor within 30 days of the change in homestead status. Failure to notify the county assessor within this 30-day period is punishable by recalculation of tax as non-homestead, in addition to a penalty equal to 100 percent of the homestead benefits.

Important Property Tax Agricultural Homestead Notice**

Legislation provides for homestead of un-occupied and non-contiguous farmland under the following conditions:

- (1) agricultural property consisting of at least 40 acres;
- (2) the owner, the owner's spouse, grandchild, child, sibling, or parent of the owner of the agricultural property or of the spouse of the owner, is actively farming the agricultural property, either on the person's own behalf as an individual or on behalf of a partnership operating a family farm, family farm corporation, joint family farm venture, or limited liability company of which the person is a partner, shareholder, or member;
- (3) the owner and operator is a MN resident;
- (4) neither the owner nor their spouse may claim another agricultural homestead in MN; and
- (5) the owner and operator do not live farther than four townships or cities, or a combination of four townships or cities, from the agricultural property.

The applicant can live in their own home, an apartment, a rental home, a manufactured home park, a condominium or a cooperative and still qualify for homestead.

Actively farming includes participation in the day-to-day labor, administration and management of the farm. They must assume all or a portion of the financial risks and they must participate in any profits or losses.

An additional provision extends homestead treatment to detached agricultural land that is owned/leased by a family farm corporation, joint farm venture, limited liability company, or a partnership operating a family farm, if there is a shareholder, partner or member actively farming the land.

Homestead application: This special homestead provision is only available to qualified individuals that make application by the filing deadline of December 15, 2016. In order to monitor this homestead provision, the owner is required to make annual application accompanied by form 156EZ from the FSA office and proof of filing a Schedule "F" on income taxes.

Reforming the DNR

There were some very good ideas put forward regarding reforms related to the DNR. Local legislators like Dan Fabian, Deb Kiel and Steve Green fought for provisions that would have required the DNR to have open public hearings again. Additionally, they also advocated for a proposal that would have required our local county boards to approve any land purchases by the DNR before that sale could take place. Sadly, these provisions were stripped out of the legislation by DFLers in conference committee.

Another proposal by Rep. Steve Green would have greatly limited the rule making authority of the DNR. This proposed legislation would have sunset the existing rules of the DNR and would have required new rules to be evaluated by the legislature. This proposal would have allowed voters to have more say in DNR rules and regulations effecting our communities because the rules

Farmland rental meetings take place through mid-December

A series of 42 meetings on fair farm rental agreements begins in early November and continues for five weeks throughout the state. The program is free and designed to help meet the needs of farmers, landlords, agribusiness professionals and others. “Farmland rental rates have never been higher,” says David Bau, Extension educator in ag business management. “Following earlier records, the prices for corn and soybeans in recent years are significantly lower. Determining a fair, profitable farm rental agreement is a challenge in today’s economy.” Bau will examine several ways to negotiate fair rental agreements that satisfy the landowner and farmer. Examples and factsheets will be pro-

vided, along with worksheets that look at 2017 input costs and crop prices to determine affordable rent, rate of return to the landlord and flexible rental agreements. The meetings begin in early November and end in mid-December. Locations are: Ada, Albert Lea, Alexandria, Benson, Blue Earth, Buffalo, Caledonia, Chaska, Cologne, Elko New Market, Faribault, Farmington, Foley, Gaylord, Hutchinson, Jordan, Le Center, Litchfield, Little Falls, Long Prairie, Madison, Mankato, Melrose, Moorhead, Morris, Newfolden, Olivia, Owatonna, Park Rapids, Pipestone, Preston, Red Lake Falls, Rochester, St. Charles, St. Peter, Slayton, Sleepy Eye, Waseca, Wheaton, Willmar and Worthington. 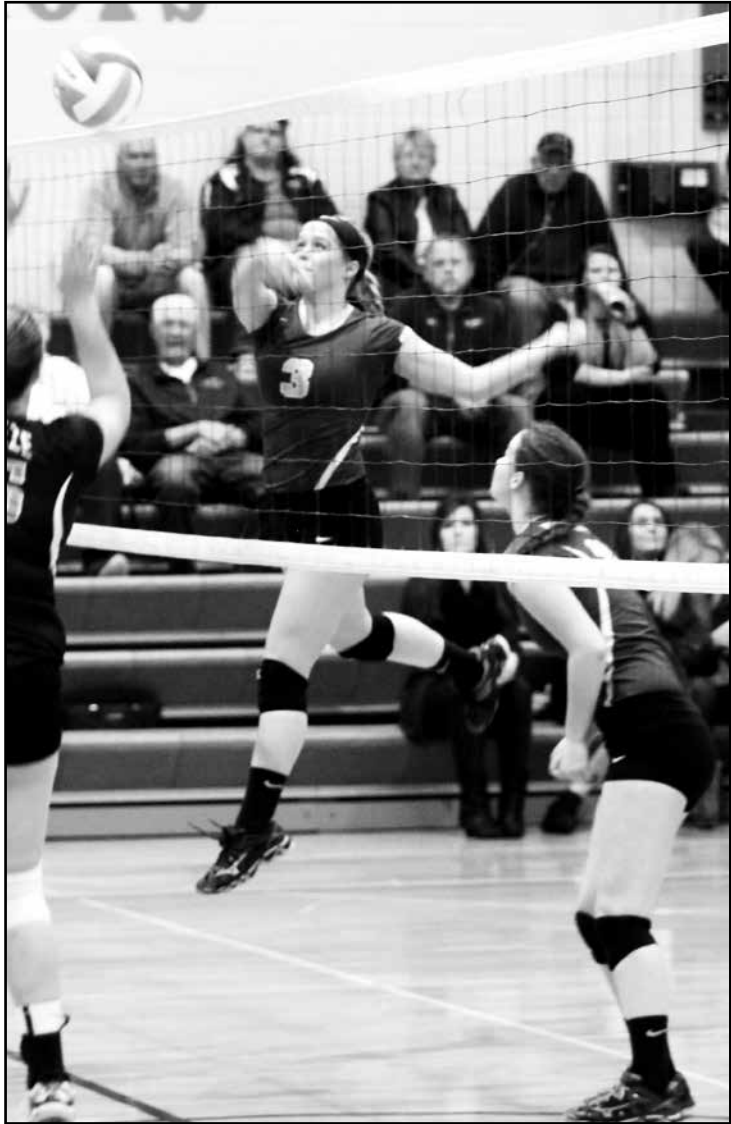

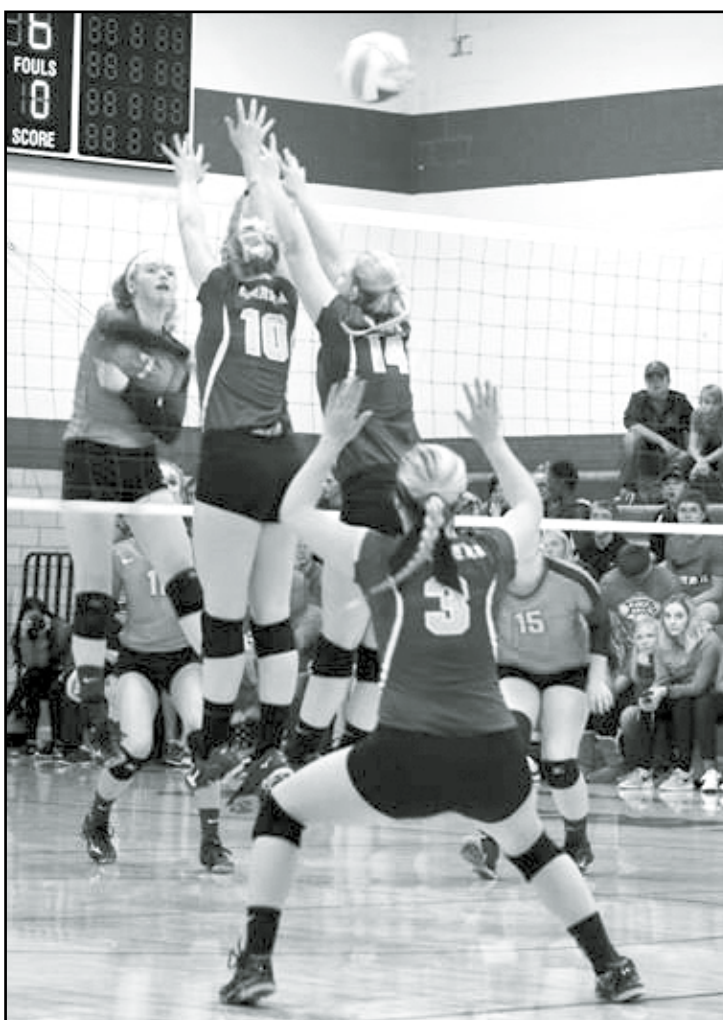
