Clearbrook City Council holds regular monthly meeting

Clearbrook City Council held their regular meeting on Monday, April 11. No petition and concerns by council members and citizens was given.

Police Chief

Ryan Solee, Police Chief gave his Report. He will be losing one part time employee but one will be coming back. He would like to develop a mentor program for seniors from the school who might be interested in police work. They could be working towards getting accredited in the future.

He gave the incident report with a total of 47. They included: Alarm 1; Animal Related 2; Animal Related; City Ordinance 1; Disorderly 1; Disturbance 1; Harassment 2; Juvenile Miss. 2; Lost/Found Property 1; Medical 6; Noise Complaint 1; Property Damage 1; Suicide Related 1; Suspicious Activity 5; Theft 1; Traffic /Complaint 2; Traffic Stop 11; Trespass 4; Warrant Arrest 1; Attempt to Arrest 1; Welfare Check 2.

Fire Department

Nick Rankin gave the report for the fire department. They had 11 calls in March with 5 Medical, 1 Fire Alarm, 3 Structure Fires and 2 Lift Assists.

Training sessions included: Paradigm Pipeline training in

Bemidji March 9; DNR Wildlife Training held at the fire hall; The annual fish fry is set for May 14 at the Community Center. The sentencing hearing for Brandon Larson is set for April 27 at 8:30 a.m.

Liquor Store

Karra Weems, Manager of the Municipal Liquor Store gave her report with a profit for the month of March at \$8,589.68. They will be having Karaoke on Friday, April 29th. There are six wedding dances scheduled for this summer with the first one in May.

Utilities and Maintenance

Nick Rankin and Mark Snobl are concerned about the potholes in the streets and what should be done to them. There is going to be a lot of heavy equipment going over the roads when they start the project. The kickoff meeting is set for April 20 at 10 am with the engineers and Wideseth. They are looking at putting in some filler in the time being until the project gets done.

Nick Rankin passed his Class D water Operators exam and will be working on the rest in the next few weeks.

The Fosston Coop meter has

been replaced. There is a sewer backup on Pine Street. Johnson company came in and cleaned it out. A reminder not to throw wipes or other products down the sewer as they get clogged. Tim Stebe is done installing all the LED lights that were requested. He is working with City Clerk Lucie Thompson to get the rebates that they will be getting which will amount to around \$3,000.

City Clerk

Lucie Thompson informed the board that Neil Lewis is interested in a lot on main street to put up an apartment building. They will be getting more information on building codes, parking possibilities and other information and maybe having a special meeting.

City Wide Clean up week is set for April 19-26.

The council discussed the RV Park Rates and will do some more checking on that as well.

The council passed resolution 2022-08 to approval the donations from the Clearbrook Community Club for \$250 for the Veteran's Memorial Beautification.

Monthly Claims were approve for \$47,935.08 and Additional Claims of \$116,369.39.

Spring clean-up week set for Gonvick

The Gonvick City Council at their meeting on Thursday, April 14 set the day for spring clean-up. The week will be held April 27 to May 7. Only items placed at the curb will be picked up. Residents are reminded that the following items will be picked up at no charge: furniture, rechargeable batteries, various metals (bikes, trikes, swing-sets, etc.), mattresses/box springs, building materials, carpet, appliances (fridges, stoves, water heaters, humidifiers, tubs and sinks).

The following items will not be picked up: paint/chemicals, waste, pesticides, tires, computer monitors, florescent bulbs and TVs.

The clean-up is restricted to the residents of Gonvick only!! The council had an inquiry on the sale of some more lots in the Railroad addition. No action was taken.

The council is looking at a new lawn mower for the season. Companies are sending trial ones to see how they will work, especially in the ditches.

Health insurance for employees was discussed. City workers will be receiving the same amount to be used for the insurance of their choice.

Fire Chief Cody Rude brought his report to the council. They had 9 medical call. One fire call in the city of Trail for a shed fire. There were one

meeting held with 13 firemen in attendance. They had 5 work activities. They responded with one mutual aid to Clearbrook for a garage fire.

Five firemen attended the Detroit Lakes fire school. Tommy Lewis, Austin Kindem and Logan LeClair took the intro to fire fighting course. Dan Johnson and Cody Rude took strategies and tactics for

company officers. Both courses were 12 hours over the course of two days.

The fire department did a tornado siren test on April 7, one at 1:45 and the other at 6:45 pm.

Bills were paid for \$12,078.67 for Water and Sewer, \$27,933.41 for General, \$6,031.72 for Fire for a total of \$46,043.80.

The Board of Appeal and Equalization for township of Gully will meet on Monday, April 25th, 1:00 pm, at the Gully Township Hall. The purpose of this meeting is to determine whether property in the jurisdiction has been properly valued and classified by the assessor.

If you believe the value or classification of your property is incorrect, please contact your assessor's office to discuss your concerns. If you disagree with the valuation or classification after discussing it with your assessor, you may appear before the local board of appeal and equalization. The board will review your assessments and may make corrections as needed. Generally, you must first appeal to the local board before appealing to the county board of appeal and equalization.

Bear hunting license applications available

Deadline is Friday, May 6
Prospective bear hunters have until Friday, May 6, to apply for a bear hunting license from the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. Applications for the 2022 season can be submitted online, at any license agent or via telephone at 888-665-4236.

A total of 3,605 licenses are available in 14 permit areas for the season, which opens Thursday, Sept. 1, and closes Sunday, Oct. 16.

The number of permits available is based on Minnesota's bear population, which has stabilized and started to increase during the past nine years because of more conservative permit quotas. Populations in nearly all bear permit areas are stable to increasing. Several permit areas in northern Minnesota require additional permit reductions to stabilize their populations.
