School board passes resolution to proceed with the vote

The Clearbrook-Gonvick School board held a special meeting on Wednesday, August 8, 2018 to adopt a formal resolution calling for vote on the addition to the school building. The members present agreed to proceed with the project.

That would be an addition on the east side of the building to the elementary wing which includes a Kindergarten room and two four - year - old rooms. The old 4 - year - old room would be for ECFE 3 - year - olds. The other kindergarten room could be used for a flexible classroom. Cost for that addition would be \$1,815,320.

The second part of the question would be a request to proceed with the gymnasium project, and would be contingent upon the first question being approved.

On the west side of the building is the other project. That includes a weight room and visitors locker room for \$746,980. The other area to the west of the present elementary gym would be another gym with seating area for a cost of \$2,559,336.

Brenda Cassellius, Commissioner for the Minnesota Department of Education, will have time to issue a review and comment to the district. Both Polk and Clearwater County would then have time to get the information on the ballots for the general election in November.

Construction and detours on Highway 92 from Brooks to Trail begin next week

BEMIDJI, Minn. — Motorists on Highway 92 between Brooks and Trail will encounter detours, lane closures and delays as construction begins on Monday, August 13. The project includes culvert work, resurfacing 19 miles of pavement, and construction of a combined by-pass and right-turn lane.

The road will be closed in stages to minimize traffic impacts:

- Stage 1: Beginning August 13, Highway 92 will be closed from Brooks up to the intersection of Highway 222. This stretch of the roadway will be closed to thru-traffic for four days, weather permitting. Traffic will be detoured to County Road 7 and Highway 222.
- Stage 2: Highway 92 will be closed from the intersection with Highway 222 up to the intersection with County Road 7. Weather permitting, this stretch will be closed to thru-

traffic for five days. Traffic will be detoured to County Road 7 and Highway 92.

- Stage 3: Highway 92 will be closed from the intersection with County Road 7 to Trail. This section of the roadway will be closed to thru-traffic for eight days, weather permitting. Traffic will be detoured to County Roads 5, 6, 7 and 8, and Highway 92.

Upon completion of each stage, motorists will encounter loose gravel on the roadway until paving for the entire project is completed under traffic.

Knife River is the prime contractor for the \$2.9 million project, which is expected to last through September.

Beginning August 16 until completion of the project, public meetings will be held every Thursday at 11 a.m., at the Oklee City Hall, 301 Main Street. The meetings will provide opportunity to ask questions and stay up-to-date on the project's schedule.

Sheriff Halverson announces scholarship information

Sheriff Darin Halverson of Clearwater County announced today the commencement of the Law Enforcement Scholarship Program for 2018. Sheriff Halverson proudly announced that the MSA Board of Directors has established a scholarship fund for the awarding of up to 15- \$600 scholarships for this year. These scholarships are due to the coordinated efforts of the 87 Sheriffs of the State of Minnesota.

The Members of MSA gives special recognition to the financial needs of students attending the peace officer skills course, or one of the two or four year law enforcement degree colleges. "The Board of Directors feel peace officers in our democratic society have complex duties to perform" said Sheriff Halverson. MSA recognizes the importance of pre-entry training for people considering law enforcement as their career choice. MSA recognizes some students need outside help in meeting the costs of such training, even though they excel academically.

The Scholarship Committee, in making its selection of awards, intends on achieving representation from all geographical areas of the state. Scholarship awards will be announced by December 28th of the same year. Application forms and a statement of procedures are available at the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office. Scholarships are only available to students currently enrolled in one of the following three categories:

1. Mandated POST Skills Program
2. In their second year of a two year law enforcement program.
3. In their third or fourth year of a four year college criminal justice program.

In order to qualify, students must have completed at least one year of the two year program or two years of a four year program. Students meeting these criteria are invited to obtain a scholarship application form from their local sheriff's office or online at www.mn-sheriffs.org.

Thoughts from the Sheriff

Clearwater County Sheriff Darin Halverson



A frequent topic for discussion our office receives this time of year has to deal with all-terrain vehicles (ATVs). It seems that this time of year there is a lot of ATV traffic on roads and in the woods. Whether it is joy riding and taking in the fall colors or hunting, questions often arise. Whatever the reason, I want to answer some of the common questions that we are asked and make the public more informed about ATV laws.

The most common question has to do with the difference between a Class I and Class II ATV. In order to answer that question, I will first define what an ATV is. Beginning on July 1, 2015, the classification system for ATVs changed. To be classified as an ATV, the vehicle must have a dry weight less than 2,000 pounds, have three to six low-pressured tires and have a total width that is less than 65 inches measured from outside of rim to outside of rim. A Class I ATV has a width of 50 inches or less and a Class II is defined as having a width greater than 50 inches, but less than 65 inches. Any motor vehicle with a width greater than 65 inches is classified as an off road vehicle (ORV). Other examples of common recreational vehicles that are not considered an ATV include golf carts, dune buggies, go carts or a vehicle specifically used for lawn maintenance, agriculture, logging or mining purposes.

Where can Class I and Class II ATVs be driven? The answer to this question depends on which one you are riding. A Class I ATV can be operated in the ditch or the outside bank or slope of trunk, county state aid, or county highway. You can apply for and receive a permit from our office that will allow you to operate on the shoulder or extreme right side of township or county roads. The permit is free and the only thing you must provide is proof of insurance and current registration.

A Class II ATV can be operated on the shoulder or extreme right side of any township or county road without a permit. State law allows for this type of operation. You can also ride on the bank, slope, or ditch of any trunk, county state-aid, or county highway if you are accessing a business or making a connection to a trail. You cannot operate a Class I or Class II ATV on any Minnesota trunk highway. Trunk highways in our county include MN Hwy 92, MN Hwy 223, MN Hwy 200 and US Hwy 2.

One thing to note with these laws is that if your ATV is licensed for private use and is being used for agricultural purposes, you are allowed to operate your machine on a public road right-of-way of any trunk, county state aid, county highway or township road if you are on the extreme right hand side of the road regardless if it is a Class I or Class II. Another thing to remember is some former Class II ATVs (side by sides) may now be classified as a Class I due to the width, but are grandfathered in and can be operated just as any Class II ATV as long as they have a steering wheel, seat belts, and roll-over protection.

With this said, if you are operating an ATV on or within a public road right of way, you must have a valid driver's license, unless the right-of-way encompasses a trail administered by the commissioner and is designated for all-terrain use or multiple use.

Another common question we get is, "Can youth legally operate an ATV?" Youth age 12-15 can operate an ATV in the ditch, bank, or slope of a public road right-of-way if they possess a valid ATV safety certificate and are accompanied by a parent or legal guardian that is on a separate ATV. The youth rider must

abide by all the riding requirements mentioned above. Any person under the age of 15 cannot operate a Class II ATV on either a public road right-of-way or private property.

A few other safety reminders are that any person under the age of 18 must wear a helmet if they are operating an ATV or riding as a passenger. Additionally, a person under the age of 18 is also required to wear a seat belt if operating or riding in a Class II ATV. If you are operating an ATV and are 21 years of age or older, remember that you cannot have an open container of alcohol with you on the machine if you are on any public road or land. DWI laws are applied just as if you were operating a car.

There are many other laws related to ATVs that can be found in Chapter 84 of the Minnesota State Statutes or on the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources website, www.dnr.state.mn.us. I would encourage you to check them out. Remember, these laws are meant to keep you safe and reduce accidents and injuries. It is up to you to keep the image of ATV riders positive. Using common sense, being courteous to others and respectful of the roads and lands on which you ride are ways to accomplish that image. If you are out riding, have fun and be safe.

Do you have concerns about your child's development?

All children grow at their own pace, accomplishing certain tasks like beginning to talk or walk. There are certain concerns regarding a young child's development often called "red flags".

Some Red Flags include:-
No babbling, pointing, or other gestures by 12 months (1 year).
-No single words by 16 months.
-No two-word phrases by 24 months (2 years).
-Speech is hard to understand for the child's age or compared to other children who are the same age.
-Delays in meeting developmental milestones such as not walking by 18 months.
-Lack of eye contact.
-Poor balance, clumsiness or weakness.
-Atypical muscle tone, such as too tight or too floppy in arms, legs, or trunk.
-Poor attention span compared to other children who are the same age.
-Diagnosed physical, cognitive or mental health condition or disorder that has a high probability of resulting in developmental delays, regardless of whether the child has a demonstrated need or delay.
