Goodpasture syndrome was discovered in 1919, while studying the influenza pandemic, Ernest Goodpasture, an American pathologist and physician, recognized a disease affecting the lungs and kidneys.

Kids History Program September 8, “Voyageurs and the Fur Trade in Minnesota.”

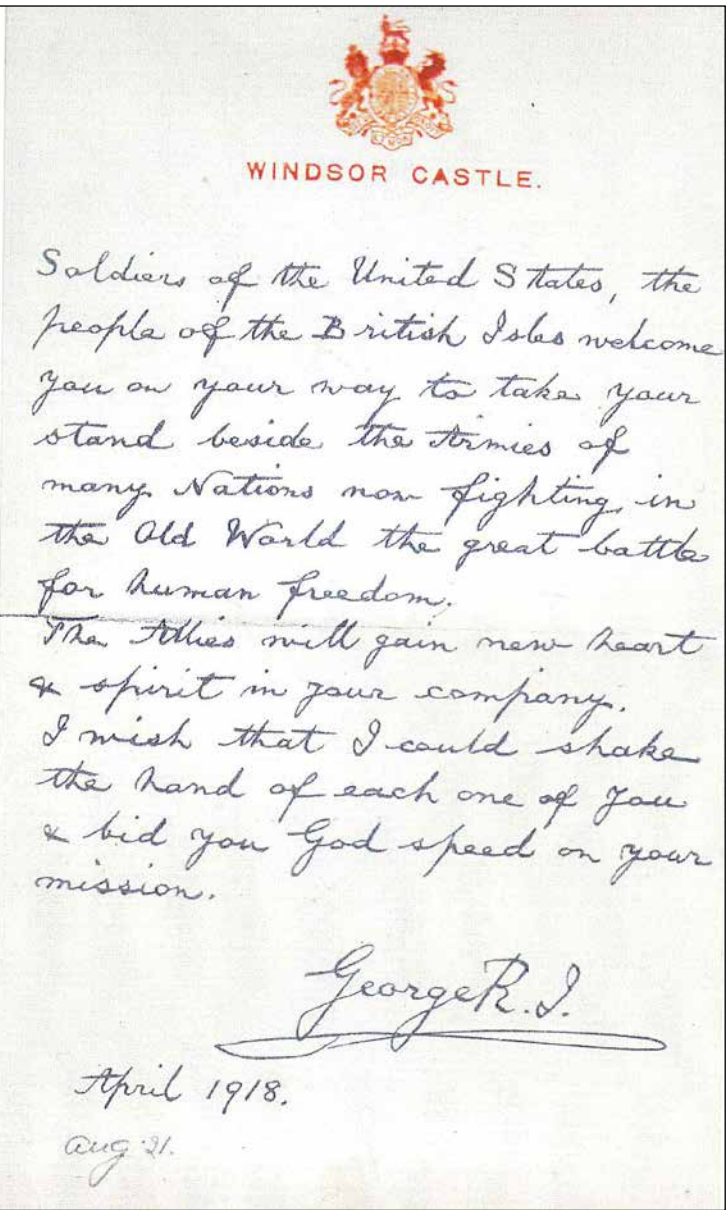

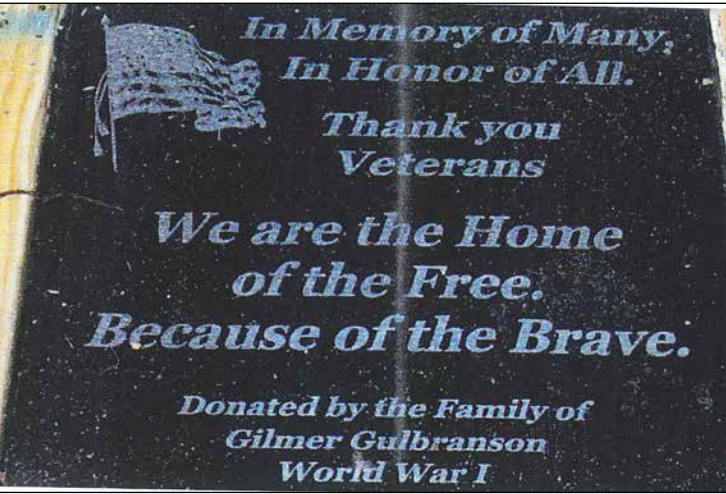

Norway Lake Cemetery has new flag

The Norway Lake Cemetery, near Leonard, has a new flagpole, plaque, and American flag honoring area veterans.

The family of Gilmer Gulbranson donated and erected the flagpole and flag, along with a granite plaque in honor of their father and all veterans.

Gilmer Gulbranson served his country in World War I. He was wounded in France on September 29, 1918, while fighting in the Battle of the Argonne Forest. After the war, Gilmer lived in Chicago for a time before returning to the family farm near Leonard. Af-



Gilmer Gulbranson was wounded in France on September 29, 1918, while fighting in the Battle of the Argonne Forest. The Battle was the final Allied offensive of World War I. It was fought from September 26, 1918 until the Armistice of November 11, 1918, a total of 47 days. It was the greatest American battle of the First World War. The Argonne offensive cost the Americans 117,000 casualties, the French 70,000 and the Germans 100,000. The American casualties represented 40% of their total battlefield losses during the war.

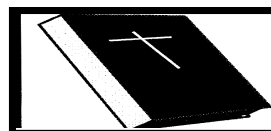

Historical Trekkers Tom Jessen and Steve Orr at History Center in Shelvin Sept. 9at 1:00 p.m.

In 2014, Tom Jessen and Steve Orr embarked on a 340-mile canoe trip, traversing 42 portages and some 37 lakes. They followed old fur trader routes along the Minnesota-Canadian border. What makes this journey unique is that they competed the journey wearing authentic clothing and using hand-carved canoe paddles, plus food and equipment from the 1740s.

Orr and Jessen are "historical trekkers." And to plan this trip they studied primary documents from fur traders, explorers and diarists of the era. More

than two centuries ago, rugged French Canadians traveled long distances through Canada and northern Minnesota to transport pelts to market.

Leaving from Crane Lake, Orr and Jessen recreated such a journey. They paddled to Rainy Lake, then east into the Boundary Waters Canoe Area and ended at Grand Portage.

Tom and Steve will share photos and stories of their Trek on Sunday September 9 at 1:00 at the History Center in Shelvin.

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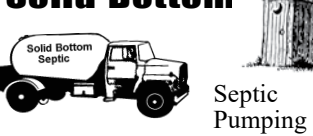

New starry stonewort infestation found

Over 225 volunteers across the state turned out on Saturday, August 18 to participate in Starry Trek, a statewide search for starry stonewort that was organized by the Minnesota Aquatic Invasive Species Research Center (MAISRC) and University of Minnesota Extension in partnership with Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. Here in Beltrami County, one volunteers participated. After being trained to identify starry stonewort and other aquatic invasive species, volunteers fanned out and checked three lakes across the county.

After volunteers searched over 225 public accesses on 187 water bodies statewide, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) confirmed the invasive algae starry stonewort in Wolf Lake in Beltrami County in the south end of the lake in Hubbard County. This is the third new confirmation of starry stonewort in a Minnesota lake in 2018. Volun-

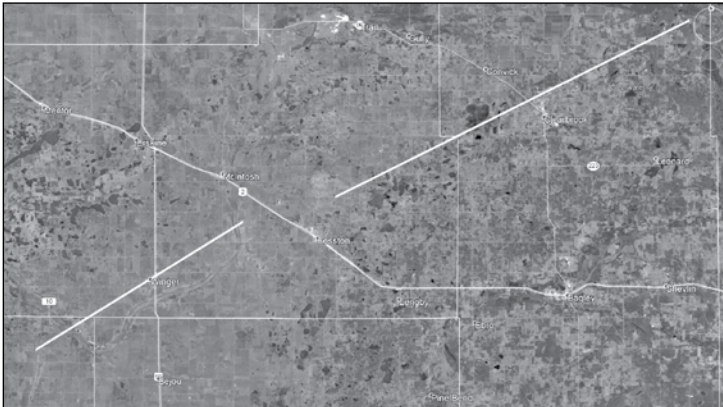
teers also discovered a new zebra mussel infestation in Lake Isabelle in Dakota County.

The lakes that were searched had been prioritized as potentially high-risk for a starry stonewort infestation based on a model created by MAISRC researchers along with local use information from Starry Trek local coordinators. "These discoveries by volunteers participating in Starry Trek highlight the importance of reports from members of the general public," said Megan Weber, MAISRC Extension Educator. "We need as many eyes on the water as possible to help identify new invasions and provide the best opportunities for response."

Starry stonewort is an invasive algae that was first found in Lake Koronis in 2015 and has since been found in 14 Minnesota lakes, including Wolf Lake. Research into control options is ongoing at the Minnesota Aquatic Invasive Species Research Center.
