Results for School District No. 2311 - Clearbrook-Gonvick School Board Member (ISD #2311) (Elect 3)

Results By Precinct 20 precincts in contest. 20 of 20 precincts reported.

Tracy Imle, 855, 33.38%; Corey Petterson 891, 33.48% and Jim Galloway 729, 28.54%. There were 79 write-in votes.

School district question 1 - (ISD #2311)

Approval of School District Bond Issue.

Shall the school board of Independent School District No. 2311 (Clearbrook-Gonvick) be authorized to issue its general obligation school building bonds in an amount not to exceed \$1,845,000 to provide funds for the acquisition and betterment of school sites and facilities, including the construction and equipping of an addition to the existing site and facility that includes early childhood/elementary classrooms, and office, storage and mechanical spaces; and the construction of associated site improvements?

Vote to go ahead was approved 675 Yes to 492 No.

School district question 2 - (ISD #2311)

Approval of School District Bond Issue

If School District Question 1 is approved, shall the school board of Independent School District No. 2311 (Clearbrook-Gonvick) also be authorized to issue its general obligation school building bonds in an amount not to exceed \$3,290,000 to provide funds for the acquisition and betterment of school sites and facilities, including the construction of gym and weight room additions to the existing site and facility; and the conversion of the existing weight room in that facility to be used as a visitor locker room?

Vote was not approved 563 Yes to 606 No.

IMPORTANT PROPERTY TAX HOMESTEAD NOTICE
This will affect your 2019 property taxes and eligibility for Property Tax Refund.
Have you purchased or moved into a property in the past year?
Contact your county assessor to file a homestead application if you or a qualifying relative occupy the property as a homestead on or before December 1, 2018.
What is a qualifying relative?
For agricultural property, a qualifying relative includes the child, grandchild, sibling, or parent of the owner or owner's spouse.
For residential property a qualifying relative also includes the owner's uncle, aunt, nephew, or niece.
When do I apply?
You must apply on or before December 15, 2018.
Once homestead is granted, annual applications are not necessary unless they are requested by the county assessor.
Contact the assessor by December 15, 2018 if the use of the property you own or occupy as a qualifying relative has changed during the past year.
If you sell, move, or for any reason no longer qualify for the homestead classification, you are required to notify the county assessor within 30 days of the change in homestead status.

Soup day at United Lutheran Church at Berner will be Sunday, November 18 from 4:30 to 6:30 pm. Several times of soup will be served along with home-

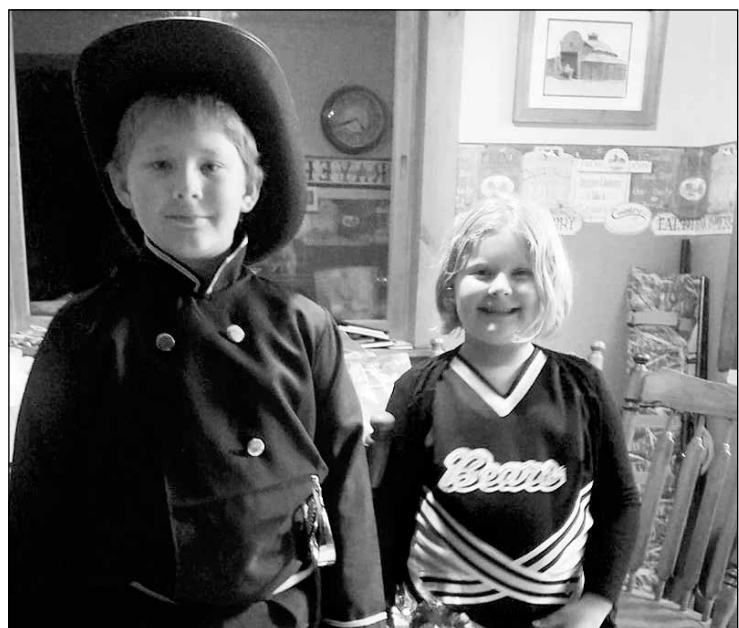
made Wild Rice Craisin Bread and Strawberry shortcake.

Farmers and Ranchers,

It's that time of year again. The 2018 Farm Service Agency's (FSA) county committee elections are officially underway and we're asking for your help. Please take a few minutes to vote in your local county committee election. FSA county committees are a vital and direct link between our farm community and the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Earlier this summer, we put out a call for nominations for individuals who would be willing to serve on the committee. Elections are held annually in every county when FSA accepts nominations for a certain Local Administrative Area (LAA). The area up for election rotates each year. Nominations have been made and now it's time for you to decide who will fill this role.

Ballots were mailed out the week of Nov. 5 to eligible voters. If your LAA had a committee seat open this year, and you are an eligible voter, you can expect to receive a ballot in the mail. Producers who did not re-

ceive a ballot can pick one up at the local FSA office.

The individuals you elect to serve on your behalf operate within official federal regulations so that local input is provided on federal programs such as:

- Income safety-net loans and payments, including setting county average yields for commodities;
- Incentive, indemnity and disaster payments for some commodities;
- Emergency programs, and
- Payment eligibility.

Our FSA county committees make a difference and if you won't take it from me, I encourage you to check out stories from county committee members from around the nation. Read their testimonials at www.fsa.usda.gov/elections. While you're there, you can find other information about the elections.

Ballots must be returned to your local FSA office by Dec. 3, 2018. Ballots returned by mail must be postmarked no later than Dec. 3.

Don't miss out on this opportunity to make an impact in your local community.
