USXC Racing on Pine Lake this weekend

The USXC - United States X-Country Snowmobile Race will be held on Pine Lake on December 15 and 16.

The traditional USXC Gerald Dyrda Memorial Pine Lake race will kick off the USXC's season on beautiful Pine Lake south of Gonvick.

Racing starts at 9 am each day on Saturday and Sunday.

Race Headquarters will be at Sportsman's Lodge on Pine Lake 218-487-5295.

The best terrain racers in the country will be competing for year end points and cash awards. The course is a 10-mile lemans style with long straights and many left and right corners. With speeds in excess of 100 mph with the addition of the Pro Open 600 class, it should be an event worth watching.



Itasca State Park to host winter bird count December 17

Monday, December 17, 2018

23rd Annual Itasca State Park Winter Bird Count

From 8 a.m.-3:30 p.m.

Meet at the Jacob V. Brower Visitor Center Lobby between 7:30 and 8 a.m. for assignment of count areas.

This holiday season take part in the annual winter bird count at Itasca State Park. This year marks the park's 23rd year of participation in the nationwide Audubon Christmas Bird Count (CBC).

Explore Itasca's count area in search of our winter bird residents. Stay a few hours or spend the whole day. Information collected is used to track migration patterns and

changes in winter bird species abundance throughout North America. To learn more about this nation-wide bird survey go to: <http://birds.audubon.org/christmas-bird-count>

Meet at the Jacob V. Brower Visitor Center lobby between 7:30 and 8 a.m. for assignment of count areas. Bird count will run from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

You can ski, snowshoe or hike in the park or participate by driving the roads around Itasca State Park within the 15 mile diameter circle that is our count area. Started in the 1970's the count has regularly had Black-backed Woodpecker, crossbills, redpolls and other winter finches. As with the

Bemidji CBC there is no fee to participate so come join us.

Come out and participate in citizen science. You need not be an expert in bird identification as we will try to team up with less experienced folks with more seasoned birders. Join us in this fine tradition.

NOTES: Entire program is held outdoors. Dress warmly for outdoor winter conditions. Bring your lunch if staying for the entire day. The group will gather at the visitor center at Noon for a lunch break. For questions and further details, call 218-699-7259. If weather is bad, the alternate date will be Tuesday, December 18. Check with the park to confirm

The Beltrami County Historical Society presents Coming of Age

The exhibit explores the self-expression, upheaval, change and sounds of the 60s and Vietnam War.

Rep. Grossell Statement on Minneapolis Issuing ID Cards to Illegal Immigrants

CLEARBROOK – State Representative Matt Grossell, R-Clearbrook, issued the following statement after the Minneapolis City Council voted to issue identification cards to residences regardless of immigration status: “We cannot have cities circumventing the state and ignoring the rule of law by issuing

official identification cards to residents,” said Rep. Matt Grossell (R-Clearbrook), a retired law enforcement officer. “Immigration policy is not something we should be deciding at the city level. I plan to introduce legislation during the upcoming session that will stop municipal and local units of government from issuing identification cards to illegal immigrants.”
