Casey Dahl-New Student Teacher at Clearbrook-Gonvick School

Casey Dahl is taking the next step in preparing for his career as an educator by student teaching at Clearbrook-Gonvick Schools. He began in Mrs. Laura Dahl's fourth grade classroom on January 2, 2019. Although the two share the same last name, Casey Dahl and Laura Dahl are not related. Mr. Dahl grew up near Lake Itasca and has one brother, Zach. He graduated from Bagley High School in 2005. He has attended Northwest Technical College and is currently enrolled in on-line classes at Western Governors University. One of his favorite memories from his own school experiences is a 6th grade overnight trip that included visits to

the Minnesota Zoo and the Museum of Natural History. While he attended Bagley High School, he enjoyed athletics and was on the football, basketball, and baseball teams. During his high school years, he also enjoyed hanging out with his friends. Prior job experiences for Mr. Dahl include being a contractor, doing tile work, logging, and working in a restaurant. His decision to enter the field of education was long-coming. Mr. Dahl has always liked the classroom setting and working with young people. But it was his experiences in coaching, first as a flag football coach for 5th and 6th graders and now as a high school baseball coach that really directed him into the teaching field. Mr. Dahl credits coaching for making his transition into education easier than it might have been. Because Mr. Dahl has worked as a coach and as a paraprofessional in the Bagley School District, he hasn't encountered too many surprises as a student teacher. One thing he didn't realize is how difficult classroom management can be for an educator. He feels teachers make managing behavior and the many activities going on in a classroom look effortless and he gives them a great deal of credit for their skills in managing a class. While classroom management can be a challenge, Mr. Dahl truly enjoys working with the fourth grade students. He appreciates being with them and relating to them as young adults. The best part of Mr. Dahl's experience in his first month of student teaching is being with the kids and building relationships with them. Mr. Dahl's wife Cassie teaches 5th grade at Bagley Elementary. Their daughter Emersyn will be 2 years old in April. As a student teacher, he doesn't have a lot of free time. But when he does, he especially enjoys spending it with his family. Jumping on the trampoline or hanging out by the pool, floating with little Emersyn are some activities he likes to do with family. He also does some deer hunting. When he completes his education, Mr. Dahl would like to teach in Clearwater County or the surrounding area. Jeff Basinger retires as Clearbrook Fire Chief-January 25

Jeff Basinger has retired from his position as Clearbrook's fire chief, a position he held for 19 years. He will continue to volunteer for the department, where he has devoted much of his time over the last 29 years. While serving the department, Jeff responded to many emergency calls and received a wide range of training. He is also a recipient of an award for saving the life of a child during a drowning accident. Jeff's instruction for this position includes Firefighter I and II as well as HazMat training. He is trained as an Emergency Medical Responder. He has attended special classes designed to prepare emergency responders for situations involving railroads, natural gas, and

ice rescues. He has also participated in special pipeline training with Enbridge. Over the years, Jeff has spent hundreds of hours in these classes in order to be able to deal with potential emergencies in our community. There are nineteen volunteer firefighters in the Clearbrook Fire Department. Each volunteer is on call at all times and answers every emergency call if they are able to do so. The Clearbrook fire department responds to 90-140 calls per year. As the fire chief, Jeff has had the additional responsibility of overseeing these calls and the volunteers who respond to them. Making decisions on issues such as when to call for mutual aid are also the chief's responsibility. In addition, Jeff has handled extra calls, such as carbon monoxide checks that can occur at any hour of the day. Jeff has seen many changes in the fire department over the years he has served, especially in technology and equipment. Technology has greatly changed how information about emergencies is transmitted to the volunteers. For example, when Jeff started with the department, only four or five houses had fire phones. If one of these phones would ring, a message would be taken and the city's siren would be blown to summon the firefighters. Upon hearing the siren, the firefighters would meet at the fire hall. Only then would they receive details about the emergency. When pagers first came into use, their range was limited and calls could be easily missed. Now pagers have a wider range and are used along with firefighter's cell phones that can provide much more detailed information about locations of both the emergency and the responders. One of the most notable changes in equipment is the vehicles used by the fire department. Jeff remembers when each of the Clearbrook fire trucks could hold only two people. The new truck holds eight people, a change that allows for much faster response to a fire once the truck gets to the scene. Over the years that Jeff has served as fire chief, the amount of mutual aid between fire departments has changed. The Clearbrook and Gonvick fire departments have seen a great increase in how much they support each other. The ease of these departments working cooperatively and sharing resources has been improved by the fact that they train together.

When asked what was most challenging about being fire chief, Jeff said that dealing with fatalities, especially suicides and drownings, was extremely difficult. Coping with emergencies affecting children is particularly stressful for the firefighters. Because Clearbrook is a small community and Jeff has served so many years, he knows most of the people he encounters. When the pager goes off, it could easily be a friend or family member who needs help, adding to the stress of his job. Jeff said that the main thing he would like the public to know about the fire department is the amount of time the volunteer firefighters give up attending classes and responding to emergencies. Family plans such as suppers or special events like birthday parties can be interrupted by an emergency call. So serving on the fire department not only affects the volunteers, but their spouses and children as well. Emergency calls during the evening can interrupt sleep, and often more than one call occurs in a single night. The responders never know how long they might be at a call. During the Enbridge fire, Jeff was gone for two days straight. Jeff said he avoids getting too hungry, because he never knows when he will be called out and miss a meal. Because Jeff will continue as a volunteer at the fire department, he will probably not have too much extra free time even though he isn't the fire chief. If he has any extra hours, he and his wife Wendy will probably spend it with their children and grandchildren. He is a member of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church where he serves on the council and property committees and sings in the choir. He also runs a business, Clearbrook Collision Center. For Jeff, the best part of being the Clearbrook fire chief has been helping people, and knowing that his work is making a difference in the community. He has found that many county agencies rely on each other, and he values the relationships he has developed with these groups. Connections with his fellow department members are also important and he feels they are close, like family. Jeff says he has found being the fire chief and serving with the Clearbrook Fire Department very satisfying. Adam Krog will be new fire chief for Clearbrook.

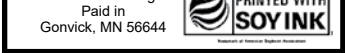

I hope that everyone is staying safe and warm while we ride out this harsh winter. Spring cannot come soon enough. This month, I want to write about our D.A.R.E. program that the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office conducts in our schools. Even though D.A.R.E. stands for Drug Abuse Resistance Education, the program is so much more than just teaching young students to say no to drugs as you will see in this article.

In 1996, I began teaching the D.A.R.E. program in Bagley when I worked for the Bagley Police Department. I continued teaching the program in Bagley and, in recent years, at the Clearbrook/Gonvick school until 2017. I decided it was time to turn the program over to someone else, as I did not want to see the program end. Deputy Neil Dolan, who is the school resource officer in Bagley, recently completed the training to become a D.A.R.E. instructor and will be taking over the program starting this school year. This summer, we hope to send Deputy Andy Anderson, who is our school resource officer in the Clearbrook/Gonvick school, to the training so he can conduct the program in the Clearbrook/Gonvick school.

Law enforcement officers have to go through an 80-hour training course to become certified to teach the program. All officers are taught to deliver the lessons exactly as they are written to ensure the D.A.R.E. program is being taught the same nationwide. Officers, however, will often give real life examples that they have witnessed, or been a part of, to make the lessons more relevant.

The D.A.R.E program began in 1983 in Los Angeles California to combat the rampant

drug use that was going on in their communities. The police department collaborated with the Los Angeles School District in an attempt to try to curb the epidemic. The thought was to start educating the youth about the dangers of drug abuse and how not to get involved in it. When it began, there were only ten officers teaching the program. Today, more than 50,000 law enforcement officers are teaching the program in approximately 75% of schools across the nation. In addition to being taught in the United States, the program in being taught in 43 different countries.

As I stated earlier, the D.A.R.E. program has evolved from just teaching kids to say "no". The program teaches students how to be more confident and how to make healthy and wise decisions. The decision-making skills that the students learn are beneficial in every aspect of their life. Thinking about the consequences to their actions and how those consequences can affect their life now and in the future are talked about and they learn how to process situations thoroughly before making a decision. The goal of the program is to create healthy, confident young adults. If we can teach these young students the skills necessary to succeed in life at a young age, they will be set up to become successful, productive members of our society in the future.

There are always people that believe the program is a waste of time and does not work. I have heard this negatively over the past twenty years that I taught the program. My opinion on the matter is this. If we can reach only a handful of at risk students and help them not make the mistakes that friends, or others in their family, may have made it a success. Doing nothing to educate our youth would be the biggest failure.

I want to thank Deputy Dolan and Anderson for taking the D.A.R.E. program over and continuing the education that many in our community have been through. Without your commitment, there would be a large void to fill. If law enforcement, schools and parents can all work together in this endeavor, there will be success stories. I believe we all want what is best for our children.
