Blood drive April 11 in Clearbrook

The Women of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church are hosting blood drive with Vitalant on April 11, 2019 at Wes Westrum Gym, Clearbrook Community Center to help ensure a safe blood supply in our community. With the hopes of recruiting 50 people to donate blood with goal 50 units to be collected, Vitalant encourages anyone feeling well and healthy to make their appointment for the blood drive. Donors can make a convenient appointment to give blood by calling Nancy Goudge at 218-

776-2777, at www.bloodhero.com or by calling 877-25-VITAL. With each donation, donors receive a free total cholesterol test and earn points in Vitalant's Donor Reward program. With your help, Vitalant is the only blood provided to nearly 70 hospitals across the region. The blood supply is dependent on selfless donations from volunteers to ensure the lifesaving needs of the region are met. Vitalant relies on 250 people to donate blood each day to

ensure the needs of our local hospitals are met. There is no substitute for human blood, so volunteer blood donors are vital to ensure a safe blood supply for our community. About 30 percent of Vitalant's blood supply goes to cancer patients across the region and one in seven people entering the hospital will need blood. Those relying on blood in the region receive that life saving blood from Vitalant. Vitalant strives to keep a 5-day supply of every blood

type on the shelf at all times to be able to meet the needs of patients across the region. Donations from O-negative donors, the universal blood type, are especially important this time of year due to increased accidents and trauma cases. Blood donation takes about an hour from check-in to refreshments. Donors can save about 20 minutes by completing their Health History the day they donate on www.vitalant.org.

Clearwater County History Center reopened April 2

After several months of being closed to build new exhibits, the History Center in Shevlin resumed its regular museum hours on Tuesday April 2. There are several new exhibits to view in the main museum gallery. "Three R's and one Room" is a changing exhibit about the county's rural schools. Each month, until December 2020, country school histories will be added to the exhibit. By the end of its run, all of the more than 60 country schools, will have been researched and an exhibit made about them. "Onward Maroon and Gold" is an exhibit about going to school in Bagley between 1899 and today. A large number of "Mystery Photos" are on display, asking the public to help identify the people, activities and dates of the photos. Large diploma's handed out near the turn of the century are on display, as well as several "Maroon and Gold" items from the Society's collection.

"Honoring the American Legion's 100 Anniversary" is an exhibit that looks at the American Legion Posts in Clearwater County and the people who do the many things the local legions are known for. A very short term traveling exhibit will also open on April 2. "Anything Can Happen" is a "micro exhibit" that introduces the Prose /Poetry of Norwegian Dag T. Straumsvåg. Straumsvåg is a contemporary writer and translator living in Trondheim Norway. Though he lives far away, he has a connection to Minnesota through his work with our state's established poets. The small exhibit presents his innovative language, that of "prose poetry" an unfamiliar form, clearly different from ei-

ther prose or poetry. Dag takes you on an adventure where you enter his world effortlessly and easily, inside the art, where "anything can happen". This tiny exhibit will end on April 12. The History Center is open

Tuesday- Friday 10-4 and by appointment. The Center will also be open Saturday April 6 from 10-2. Admission is free; donations are encouraged. The History Center is located at 264 First Street W in Shevlin. 218-785-2000

If you disagree with the valuation or classification after discussing it with your assessor, you may appear before the local board of appeal and equalization. The board will review your assessments and may make corrections as needed. Generally, you must appeal to the local board before appealing to the county board of appeal and equalization.

Farm By The Lake's Storytellers Series presents Wendell Affield "Reawakening Memory through our Senses" April 7, 2019 at Bagley Public Library, 3:00 - 6:00 pm.

Free and Open to the Public.

Wendell Affield, the third of nine children, grew up on a small farm 20 miles north of Bemidji. He was born in New York City in 1947 and moved to Minnesota as a toddler when his mother met his stepfather, Herman Affield, through Cupid's Columns, a singles publication. At sixteen, after going through a series of foster homes, Wendell dropped out of high school, left home, and rode the rails where he spent time in the Northwest living in hobo camps and bucking hay bales for an old rancher in western Montana. At seventeen he enlisted in the navy. In 1966, during his first Vietnam deployment, during down time, he earned his high school GED. In January 1968 Wendell returned to Vietnam on a second deployment as the cox'n of a river patrol boat with the Mobile Riverine Force. On August 18, 1968, he was wounded in an ambush and medevaced home.

After leaving the navy in 1969 he found work as a meat cutter apprentice in the Chicago area. In 1980 he and his family returned to northern Minnesota. After retiring from Luekens Village Foods in 2001 Wendell enrolled at Bemidji State University to learn the writing craft. Over the years, his Vietnam essays evolved into Muddy Jungle Rivers (2012). His memoir has been used in universities and reading clubs. The book led to reconnecting with men he hadn't seen in more than fifty years.

In 2010 Wendell's mother died. Locked in the chicken-house on the farm where he was raised, he discovered thousands of letters, dozens of diaries, scrapbooks, and photo albums documenting his maternal family history. He spent eight years unraveling his mother's past. In the process, he came to understand her struggle with mental illness.

WASHINGTON — Influenza significantly increased the risk of hospitalization for heart failure, according to a study of more than 450,000 adults, which was published in the March 27 issue of Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA)/Cardiology, and headed by a Minneapolis Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) researcher. Senior author Dr. Orly Vardeny, a clinical pharmacist and researcher at the Minneapolis VA Medical Center's Center for Care Delivery and Outcomes Research and an associate professor of medicine at the University of Minnesota, said this is the largest study to confirm the long-held notion of a connection between influenza, also known as flu, and heart failure. "The study's findings support VA's aggressive effort every year to provide Veterans with influenza vaccine," said VA Secretary Robert Wilkie. "Although the flu season is winding down, it's not too late for Veterans, and others, to get a vaccine." Vardeny and colleagues reviewed hospitalization data of adults ages 35-84 between October 2010 and September 2014 in four geographically diverse U.S. communities. Researchers correlated this information with reports of influenza activity from the federal Centers for Disease Control Surveillance Network. "We hypothesized that increased influenza activity would be associated with an increase in hospitalizations for heart failure and myocardial infarction among adults in a community cohort," Vardeny said. Indeed, that was the case. Influenza activity was related to an increase in heart-failure hospitalizations across four influenza seasons in the four communities. Communities studied included Jackson, Mississippi; eight suburbs of Minneapolis, Minnesota; and two rural communities, Forsyth County, North Carolina; and Washington County, Maryland.

Researchers found a 5 percent monthly increase in influenza activity was associated with a 24 percent relative increase in heart failure hospitalization rates. "Our study suggests that influenza may contribute to the risk of heart failure hospitalization in the general population," Vardeny said. "This is additional strong evidence that adults need to have an annual immunization against influenza to avoid potential complications that lead to hospitalization." Study co-authors were from Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, Toronto General Hospital, the University of North Carolina, the University of Wisconsin and the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute.

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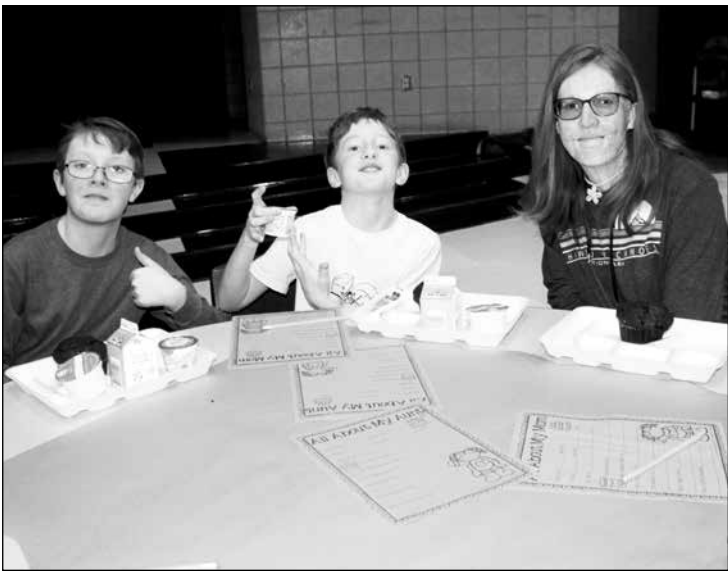

Combating Daycare & Other Fraud

Minnesotans deserve to know the hundreds of millions of dollars spent every year on public programs are being spent wisely. I have joined my House Republican colleagues in co-authoring a package of proposals to combat the fraud documented in a report from the nonpartisan Office of the Legislative Auditor that found fraud within Minnesota's Child Care Assistance Program to be widespread and pervasive.

The package introduced on Monday has five key goals:

1. Increased consequences for committing fraud: Increased penalties and consequences for committing fraud to send a strong message to fraudsters that the state will not tolerate this criminal behavior.

2. Provider controls: Provide

better controls on the front end to prevent fraud from occurring in the first place.

3. Investigations and prosecutions: Give additional tools to investigators to aid in their investigations, and to prosecutors to ensure fraudsters are brought to justice.

4. Eligibility reforms: Eliminate eligibility for those found to have committed fraud, require enhanced eligibility checks from the Department of Human Services, and direct savings from eligibility checks to the Health Care Access Fund.

5. mOversight: Make the Office of Inspector General become an independent entity as recommended by the legislative auditor.

This package will help stop the fraud, save the money and make sure our tax dollars are used as intended.
