ATV Safety Training offered

The Minnesota DNR Youth ATV Safety Training Course will be offered in Bagley to interested ATV operators, age 11-16 who wish to obtain a safety certificate. Anyone born after July 1st, 1987 must have an ATV safety certificate in order to operate an ATV in Minnesota.

The ATV course includes two parts:

Part 1: Complete the online courses on your own and print the completion certificate: AT-Vcourse.com (fee for the online course is \$29.95)

Part 2: Bring printed certificate to the field day on Saturday 5/18/2018 at 9:00 AM at Bagley High School.

A review session and written exam will be given and then we will be walking to the Clearwater County Fairgrounds for an operations exam.

Students must have a helmet and proper riding attire (no loose clothing, boots preferred and no loose laces, gloves and eye protection). We will provide an ATV to use.

Ending time will be around 11:00 AM.

A Parent or Guardian is required to attend the first part of the field day fill out and sign the registration form.

There is no cost to attend the class; a course fee is paid online to the DNR after passing the class to obtain a safety certificate.

No pre-registration is necessary.

Students must be at least 11 years old by the class date (certificate not valid until 12 years old)

Danielle Zittel, Long-Term Substitute Teacher (6th Grade) at Clearbrook-Gonvick

Interview Questions,

Tell us about yourself and your background-where did you grow up, what schools did you attend, who is in your family?

I grew up just south of St. Paul in the city of Cottage Grove. I attended and graduated from East Ridge High school in Woodbury, Minnesota in 2013. I then attended Inver Hills Community College. Two years later I transferred to Concordia, St. Paul where I graduated with my Bachelor of arts in Elementary Education as well as an endorsement in Early Childhood Education. I would have not made it through school without my very supportive parents (Patrick and Tracy Zittel). I am a middle child. I have an older brother and younger sister. After graduating from college, I decided to uproot and leave my family and move to Clearbrook, Minnesota to live with my grandmother (Mary Pond); to pursue my career in a smaller town.

Besides teaching, have you had any other jobs?

I spent a lot of summers and weekends throughout high school as a nanny. However, I eventually ended up working at Walmart and have been with the company for five years. It was only supposed to be a temporary job to get me through school. However, I have stuck around because they have done a fantastic job of working with my crazy schedule going through school and working as a substitute teacher. When I was in college I also spent a year as a Children's Minister Associate in my focal church in Cottage Grove. As much as I loved that job I parted ways to make sure I was fully focused on school and one job. I went with my job with Walmart because it allowed for more schedule flexibility. Another job that I picked up for a few summers was working for kids club in my local school districts down in Cottage Grove. I absolutely loved working for Kids Club and would probably still be doing it had I not made the choice to move away.

Why did you choose teaching as a profession?

I choose to become a teacher because I have always had a passion for working with children. I have been involved in many volunteer opportunities most of which involved working with children. I have known that I have wanted to be a teacher since I was very young. No other career path has ever crossed my mind.

Have any of your own teachers been especially influential or inspiring?

When thinking about teachers that have inspired me two teachers come to mind. First was my kindergarten teacher. Not only was she my kindergarten teacher but I actually had the opportunity to work with her in high school and college for some education classes. She has always been one of my favorite teachers. Somebody who I aspire to be like when it comes to teaching. Her passion for teaching always shined through

in each thing she taught. She cares deeply about each of her students and remembers every one. When I came back to her classroom in high school she knew exactly who I was and could still tell me different stories from when I was in kindergarten. She really got to know each of her students and strived to build that trust with each one. The other teacher that comes to mind taught me to never give up on myself. I was a student that really struggled in math. However, I was just passed from grade to grade and never got the help that I truly needed in math. This math teacher didn't give up on me even when I had given up on myself. He helped bring back my confidence when it comes to math. He pushed me to be my best. I went from getting really low grades in math to earning all A's because he had given me the time, patience, and commitment that I needed. This is something I want to give my students. I want them to believe in themselves and try their best.

What did you like most about school when you were a student? What were your favorite classes or activities?

When I was in school I really liked band. I played clarinet I enjoyed band itself, as well as pep band, and marching band. I played in band from fifth grade through 10th grade. I also liked getting involved in many volunteer programs around the school and community.

What has been most challenging about your new position? The most challenging thing about my new position is watch-

ing the transition for the 6th graders. I am coming in as a new teacher at the end of the school year and that is a struggle for the students that need consistency. They have adapted pretty well though.

What has been most rewarding?

The most rewarding thing about my job so far has been working with such a great group of students. They all work really hard and have been a pleasure to teach.

What do you especially enjoy about teaching 6th graders?

The thing I really enjoy about teaching 6th graders is getting to know each one and their personalities. The students all have unique personalities and they always have stories to share making the days really enjoyable. They also are at the age where they like to take initiative of things which makes for some very fun learning.

What do you like to do when you are not teaching?

When I am not teaching I like to spend time with my family. I also really enjoy spending time outside with my german shepherd and husky.

What do you like the best about the Clearbrook-Gonvick school?

Clearbrook-Gonvick school has an great community. I have had amazing support from the staff and other teachers, and they have all been very welcoming. I also like the small school setting. It makes it easier to get to know the students in the school.

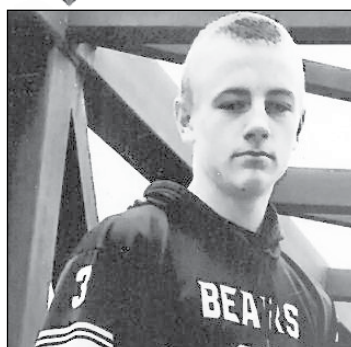

STAR MARKER FLAG HOLDERS: The Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs (MDVA) supplies a Star Marker Flag Holder to identify the grave of a veteran who is buried in any cemetery in the state that allows placement of this type of marker. The marker may be issued for a veteran whose military service terminated Honorably. Markers are furnished to mark the graves of veterans who died during the previous calendar year. The Star Marker Flag Holder is free of charge and may be requested by a family member of the deceased veteran. Orders are accepted year-round and shall include the following information: A copy of the Military Discharge Record, a copy of the Death Certificate and the name and location of the cemetery in that county. The Star Marker Flag Holder marker features a fitting at the top to affix an American Flag. NOTE: Only one marker can be issued by the MDVA.

Teacher of the Month

May Teacher Feature:
Education is the key to success in life, and teachers make a lasting impact in the lives of their students. ~Solomon Ortiz

Kendall Nordlund is in her fifth year of teaching in the elementary at Clearbrook-Gonvick.

She was originally from Central Illinois, but became familiar with the area when her dad lived up here many years ago. After college she moved up and has lived here for twelve years now! In 2015 she married Sam and they live outside of Clearbrook on the farm. Kendall teases him all of the time that she went the wrong direction when she got done with college, but now she is stuck here in the frigid Nort! In 2018, they had Rhett and Reid and life has been crazy and wonderful ever since!

Why did you choose to teach? One of my favorite parts of teaching is when I have a super engaging lesson and the students are just loving every minute of it. When I look around the room and the students are working together, asking each other questions, and sharing their experiences- that is just the best feeling. Watching kids enjoy learning new things is one of the best parts of teaching and I believe that is why I wanted to become a teacher. I wanted to be a part of that learning and discovery with them.

What did you do before coming to Clearbrook-Gonvick? Prior to getting my elementary education degree I earned an associates degree in veterinary technology. When I graduated with that I got a job at Clearwater Veterinary Services in Gonvick and that's how I ended up here! I worked at the clinic for five years and loved working with animals, but knew I would eventually go into elementary education.

What is the best part of your

Letter to the Editor

In the early hours of May 5th Republic Representative Matt Grossell of 2A was arrested by the police in St. Paul after he refused to leave the Regions Hospital. Grossell was arrested then transported to the Ramsey County Jail.

This incident started at the Best Western Plus Capital Ridge Hotel around 1 a.m. on Saturday May 5th. The hotel security called the police and advised them that there was a person in the bar area intoxicated and acting disorderly.

By the time officers arrived at the Hotel Representative Grossell had made it back to his room. The police wanted to check on Grossell to make sure that he was Ok. Upon the officers talking to Grossell they believed that he could not take care of himself as he could not answer the question they were asking him. Paramedic were then called and Grossell was transported to the Regions Hospital for further evaluation by medical staff.

After Grossell was checked by medical staff he was told that he was free to leave and must leave the hospital. It was at this time that Grossell became argumentative with hospital staff. Hospital security was called and they advised Grossell that he had to leave the hospital or be arrested for trespassing. Grossell refused to leave as ordered by the security staff so they placed Grossell under arrest for trespassing and transported to Ramsey County Jail.

Grossell was released after being held for around 2 hours and was given a citation for misdemeanor trespassing and released on the promise to appear in court.

It was further stated that it was a good thing that Grossell only shoved hotel security and only was argumentative with hospital staff.

Representative Grossell wrote a bill in January 2019 that was passed and signed into law that amended 609.2231. This was HF421. The law goes into effect August 1st 2019. This bill increased the penalties for assaulting Fire Fighters, EMTs and Medical Staff. If this criminal law is violated it is a felony and a person if found guilty, they would face a time in jail up to 3 years and or a fine of up to \$6,000.00.

As mentioned in some of the news releases people were wondering if the tax payers were paying for Representative Grossell lodging at the hotel as it is used by legislators that live more that 50 miles from the legislator when they are in session. People were also wondering at his behavior being a retired deputy sheriff from Clearwater county and who should have been aggregable toward emergency staff instead of being aggressive toward the emergency staff who were performing their duties.

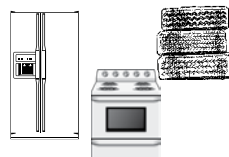

Thoughts from the Sheriff

On April 12th of this year, Minnesota Governor Tim Walz signed a new hands-free bill that will become law on August 1, 2019. This bill will require drivers of motor vehicles to not use their cell phones while operating their vehicle unless it is done by voice command or single-touch activation without holding the phone. This will certainly be a change for all of us, as cell phones have become such a part of our lives. It is sometimes hard to imagine how we ever got by without them. Nonetheless, times are changing and we all need to start preparing for this, as August 1st will be here before we know it.

Each year it is estimated that one in four crashes in Minnesota is due to distracted or inattentive driving. There are many distractions that can occur while driving, such as eating food, reaching for something, changing radio stations, disruptive people in the

car or even daydreaming. The use of cell phones is just another distraction and it has become more and more apparent that the use of these are causing people to lose focus on driving and resulting in accidents which sometimes are fatal. The new law will make it illegal for drivers to read/compose/send text and emails and to access the web while the vehicle is in motion or part of traffic, such as stopped at a stop sign or stop light.

People can lose focus while driving through visual, mechanical/physical and/or cognitive distractions. A visual distraction is looking away from the road for any reason. Mechanical/physical is taking your hands off the wheel to pick something up, change the radio station or dialing a cell phone. Cognitive distraction occurs when people become engrossed in a conversation whether with a person in the
