Clearbrook Fire Department Fall Banquet

The Clearbrook Fire Department Fall Banquet is returning this year with an evening of food, fun, games, and prizes. The event will take place on Saturday, October 26th at the Clearbrook Community Center. Doors will open at 5:00 p.m. and a meal will be served starting at 6:00 p.m. The purchase of a \$20 raffle ticket donation will include both admittance to the event and the meal.

The funds raised at this banquet will help the fire department update their obsolete radio equipment. The Clearwater County Sheriff Department and EMS service have updated their radio system to comply with state goals. The Clearbrook Fire Department also needs to upgrade their equipment in order to be able to communicate with the other county agencies. Effective communication, especially

during emergencies, is essential to the safety of residents as well as to the safety of those who serve as volunteers for the fire department.

Various games and raffles will take place during the fundraiser event. Many great prizes will be available, including guns, a portable fish house, and Yeti coolers. A cash bar will be provided by the Clearbrook Liquor Store.

The fire department received positive feedback for their 2018 banquet. They hope to take that experience and have an even bigger event this year. After appeal, final Enbridge and Southern Lights property values decrease by \$16 million

A decrease in property values of Enbridge-owned pipeline-related properties led the agenda when the Clearwater County Board met on October 8.

Assessor Jamie Freeman informed the commissioners that the final Enbridge and Southern Lights property values were reported in September, and the values decreased by \$16 million.

Freeman explained that Enbridge and Southern Lights (also owned by Enbridge) made an administrative appeal to the Minnesota Department of Revenue after receiving their state-assessed property valuations earlier this year. Freeman said the legislature passed a law two years ago to help prevent lawsuits over valuations, as had been done by Enbridge in the past. This law allows for administrative appeals of valuations.

Enbridge's state-assessed value was set at \$190,017,200 and after the appeal was set at \$175,127,300. For Southern Lights the numbers were originally \$18,637,500 and \$17,452,900 after the appeal.

"This is a binding agreement," she said. This means that Enbridge cannot come to the courts with an appeal.

Sheriff Darin Halverson received authorization to order two 2020 Dodge Durangos at a cost of \$29,671 each from Westside Motors of Thief River Falls. Total cost to purchase and equip them will not exceed \$88,500; they will be delivered

A 'Resolution Approving Notice of Intent Not to Reappoint Hutchens as Veterans Service Officer' was approved at the October 8 Board meeting; Neal Illies made the motion; Mark Titera seconded. Passed by the 4 that were present (John Nelson absent).

in 2020 and funds used for this purchase will come from the 2020 budget.

Environmental Services Director Dan Hecht was authorized to proceed with publication and schedule a public hearing for adoption of an amendment to the Clearwater County Subsurface Sewage Treatment Ordinance of 2014, to modify sections 9.10 and 9.20 for local ordinance compliance. This is to establish a time frame of 24 months for the systems receiving a notice of noncompliance to be upgraded, repaired, replaced or abandoned.

Engineer Dan Sauvé received approval for payment of the Clearwater County Highway Department bills as presented in the amount of \$29,055.

A motion to purchase two Dump-Lok dump box locking mechanisms for safety concerns was approved; one for Clearbrook and one for Bagley. They will be from Northern Engine & Supply of Fargo in the amount of \$2,489.

The Highway Department

will hire Les Janssen Construction of Shevlin to make necessary repairs to the Bagley Shop in the amount of \$4,335.

The commissioners' roadwork tour will tentatively be conducted on Thursday, Oct. 24.

Attorney Al Rogalla requested authorization to hire and pay a transcription service to transcribe all the necessary documents on the Tristan Kilde case. With other pending cases to be done, the anticipated cost to create these documents will be over \$1,000.

"It is all done over the internet, and is confidential," Rogalla reported, after which the board approved a motion to authorize the expenditure.

An meeting for Unorganized Township 143-36 was opened by Commissioner Dean Newland for the purpose of entering into an agreement for the county to perform road maintenance.

A motion was passed authorizing the Unorganized Township Board Chairman, Dean Newland, to sign the agreement.

The Auditor-Treasurer was authorized to pay the submitted invoices of \$95,971 for the County Revenue Fund and \$13,975 for the Nursing Service Fund.

Commissioners present at the meeting: Neal Illies, Dean Newland, Mark Titera, and Mark Larson; John Nelson was absent.

On the Saturday, August 31, 2019, there was a motorcycle ride, the "RIDE FOR STONES"; that also honors the Veterans of Clearwater County. This motorcycle ride was originated by, and continues to be promoted by, both Jeff Schermerhorn, Bagley, MN; a Vietnam Era Veteran, and Neal Illies, Bagley resident. The 2019 ride raised approximately \$7,054 in donations. These donations were donated to the Clearwater County Veterans Memorial to provide 37 etched field stones honoring Clearwater County Veterans.

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month so I thought I would take the time to give some insight on this issue and what victims go through because of it. Domestic violence has a profound impact not only on families, but on entire communities as well. Many suffer in silence while others find their courage to stand up and say enough is enough. Domestic violence can come in different forms. It can be physical abuse or threats of it, mental or emotional abuse and sexual abuse. Many abusers do not hit their victims, but control them with their words and actions. They make their victims feel worthless and dependent on them. These actions can lead the victim to feel like there is no way out. It is estimated that domestic violence is the leading cause of injury to women. Not all victims of domestic violence are women, but nearly 85% are. Nearly ¼ of all women will experience domestic violence sometime during their lifetime. One-half of all homeless women are fleeing this abuse and have found no other way to escape than to leave their home. On average, 20,000 calls for help are made nationwide to hotlines every day from people struggling with domestic violence. Every minute, 20 people are physically abused by their partner, translating to nearly 10 million men and women victims every year. This results in approximately 8 million days taken off from work because of the physical abuse. Only around 34% of victims actually seek medical attention for their injuries they sustain. Many just disguise their injuries to hide the realities of their abuse. Victims suffer beyond the physical injuries. They are more likely to suffer from depression and have suicidal thoughts. High blood pressure, cancer and other cardiovascular diseases are also thought to be associated with domestic violence. Some victims turn to alcohol or drugs to dull their pain and in turn, become addicted.

The scary thing about domestic violence is that it can be a learned behavior. Young boys are twice as likely to commit domestic violence acts on their partner when they grow up if they have witnessed this abuse in their home. Girls that witness this abuse can often grow up thinking it is normal to be abused and never come forward to report it. This is where we need to work to change this perception. The Clearwater County Sheriff's Office takes reports of domestic violence very seriously. Last year there were 64 reports made involving domestic violence reported in the county. This year, we have received 84 to date. We work with local advocates to help the victims in these cases find the strength they need to navigate the criminal justice system and to find relief from the abuse. Many times, the victims do not wish to press charges or they change their statement the next day about what happened. This is where advocates come into play. They are knowledgeable about the process and have resources to assist victims. You do not need to go through this alone. This issue is not something that will go away on its own. As a community, we need to offer the support to victims and their families and hold those who commit these acts accountable. Last year I was fortunate to be a part of a panel at a public forum where this issue was discussed and important information was shared. As a community we need to continue to talk about this issue and work together to reduce these incidences. No one should have to live in fear.
