New contract between County and Minnesota Teamsters Union approved

The Clearwater County Board of Commissioners met on October 15, 2019.

First on the agenda was the approval of the contract between Clearwater County and the Minnesota Teamsters Public and Law Enforcement Employee's Union Local 320, which is effective Jan. 1, 2019 through Dec. 31, 2021. The Board Chairman, John Nelson was authorized to sign the contract.

Salary schedule increases are as follows: New scale and .50% increase for 2019; 2.5% increase for 2020 and for 2021.

SWCD Chester Powell and Briell Prokosch, Program Technicians, brought an updated Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Plan for the Board's review. The total budget for the plan for 2020 is \$108,330, the comprehensive costs being for training, workshops, travel, 160 inspectors, performing lake and river sampling to identify presence of AIS, newspaper articles and advertising, staff and administrative costs.

Briell Prokosch said, "Funds come from the State, and DNR bases the amount on the number of lake accesses we have in the County."

The 2020 AIS Prevention Plan and Budget for Clearwater County was approved.

Engineer Dan Sauvé conducted the 2019 Road and Bridge Tour with all five Commissioners on Oct. 24. The primary purpose of the road tour is to look at completed and future road and bridge projects.

The tour included review of 2019 projects of mill and overlay of CSAH 27 from 25 to TH 92; pave CSAH 30 and 31; CSAH 35: replace pavement from TH 91 to 1,489 feet west; CSAH 2 from CSAH 40 to 270th Street

project will be held over winter to be finished in 2020; MCSAH 57 1st Avenue in Clearbrook reconstruction; MCSAH 42 Main Street in Clearbrook reconstruction; and MCSAH 5 in Clearbrook, to remove the pavement and replace with thicker bituminous surface to increase strength of the road. The last three are included with City of Clearbrook water and sewer project.

A draft of the 2020 through 2025 Road and Bridge Program Plan is done. After going through the draft the Engineer will have a public open house of the plan to get public input.

County Auditor-Treasurer Allen Paulson was authorized to pay the submitted invoices of \$64,027 for the County Revenue Fund and \$23,938 for the Nursing Service Fund.

At the October 29 meeting of the Board, the Clearwater County Board of Commissioners authorized the Clearwater County Sheriff to have a Bi-Directional Amplifier (BDA) installed in the Clearwater County Jail by MidStates Wireless of Fargo in the amount of \$13,499. Funds for the installation will come out of the Emergency Management Budget.

The Red Lake Watershed District 2018 Annual Report was distributed at the meeting.

Auditor-Treasurer Allen Paulson was present with Colleen Hoffman, AIP from Hoffman Phillip & Knutson to conduct an exit interview and the 2018 Audit.

"It was a good audit, and there were no problems," was reported regarding the Audit.

The Board Chairman was authorized to sign the Joint Powers Agreement with the State of Minnesota for the Anti-Heroin Task Force program. The County Sheriff is authorized to co-sign the agreement.

The purpose of the agreement is to provide overtime reimbursement to the governmental unit who investigates illicit activities related to the distribution of heroin, or unlawful distribution of prescription opioids or opioid-related overdose death.

Board Chairman was authorized to sign the State of Minnesota Snowmobile Safety Enforcement Grant Program for the period of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2021. The grant amount is for \$4,362 per year for a total of \$8,724. The County Sheriff is authorized to co-sign the grant.

The Board gave general consent for the Sheriff's pickup to be fixed with insurance money from another squad car.

Clearwater County Nursing Service (CCNS) will hire Emily Coyle as a Home Health Aid and Homemaker part time at Step 5. She will work more than 1040 hours per year. Emily has five years of working as a CNA (Certified Nursing Assistant) and TMA (Trained Medication Aide). She has been working at a local assisted living which has similar regulations.

CCNS will hire Sarah Anton as Registered Nurse part time at Step 7. She will work more than 1040 hours per year. Sarah has worked as an RN for the past five years as an Emergency Department RN.

Engineer Dan Sauve and Gerald Smith were present to discuss trees to be removed from the right of way on County Road 2. The Highway Department will replant some trees if it is a residence.

Come learn to spin, learn about needle felting taught by Karen Stormo or just come to visit and see what all the fun with fiber is about.

The next Fiber Gathering Under the Pines will be January 17, 2020 and take place in Gonvick as well.

The One Year One Garment Project is ongoing this year. The SSFC encourages anyone wanting to learn to make their own wearable fiber items to come to our Fiber Gathering Under the Pines events.

The One Year, One Garment Project promotes locally sourced materials handmade into garments of all kinds. Anyone can participate at any skill level. Each participant should decide on a garment or accessory they would like to make from natural fibers. Materials for the project should come from local producers, businesses and even your own closets. Garments can be

knit, crocheted, woven, felted, sewn or otherwise handcrafted and do not need to be from new materials. Participants can also source old wool garments from local thrift stores or storage and upcycle them into new and interesting items for wear.

The only thing needed to participate is an interest in making your own garment from

locally sourced natural fibers. At the end of our fiber year, participants are encouraged to show off their garments at the 2020 Farm to Fiber Festival Fashion Show in October where admission is free.

It seems that winter is already forcing it's will upon us early this year. We have been visited by snow and colder temperatures are greeting us as we venture outside. Each year when winter weather begins and the road conditions worsen, many motorists struggle with relearning how to drive on slippery or snow-covered roads. It doesn't matter if you are a seasoned driver or new to the road, winter road conditions will cause accidents. I want to remind everyone of some safety tips when driving this winter and also what to expect with winter weather watches and warnings.

If you are going to be traveling this winter, pay attention to any weather-related announcements. If you hear that a winter storm warning has been issued in the area you will be driving, reconsider your reason for going out. If it is not an emergency, stay home. A winter storm warning means that a winter storm is occurring or is going to occur usually within 36 hours. The criteria for a winter storm are snow fall between 4-7 inches or at least 3 inches of snow with a large accumulation of ice and winds less than 35 miles an hour. If the same inches of snow occur with winds in excess of 35 miles an hour, a blizzard warning will be issued. If your travel plans can be delayed during one of these events, delay them. It is not worth getting stranded and having to spend countless hours in a cold car waiting for help to arrive.

If you become stranded, stay with your car. Help will come. Plan ahead and have a winter weather survival kit in each vehicle you own. The kit could include a flashlight with extra batteries, high energy foods such as dried fruit or candy, a first aid kit, blanket or sleeping bag, disposable hand warmers, a tow rope, booster cables and a small shovel or something similar to keep snow cleared from your exhaust pipe.

If you have a cell phone, be sure it is charged before leaving and inform your family or friends of your destination and approximate time or arrival. That way, hopefully you can reach someone if you go into the ditch and in turn, someone will know where to start looking if you don't show up at your

destination. Don't assume your cell phone will work at all times, as cell service can be intermittent in rural areas and storms can make signal strength worse.

If you decide to keep your travel plans despite the winter weather conditions, always buckle up. The law states that you must be buckled up at all times while traveling in a motor vehicle and driving on slippery roads makes it that much more important that you are. Drive with reduced speed if the roads are covered in snow or ice. Just because the speed limit may say 55 miles per hour, doesn't mean you should drive at that speed. You must always drive with due care and caution.

Greater speeds on icy roads is a recipe for disaster. Your chance of going into a skid is much higher. If your vehicle does go into a skid, remain calm, ease your foot off the accelerator and steer in the direction you want the front of the car to go. Never use cruise control on slippery roads as you are more likely to lose control if your car begins to skid.

Another concern when driving in winter is stopping. You must allow a greater distance between vehicles if you are on icy roads. If your vehicle has an anti-lock braking system (ABS), use that feature as it was intended. Apply a steady and firm pressure to the brake pedal. Do not pump the brakes. The system is designed to do all the work and you will feel a vibration in the brake pedal and hear what sounds like a grinding noise. This is all normal. You may think that you are not stopping when the ABS system is activated, but you are. Don't panic. Let the computer in your car do its job.

As a last precaution, be alert to snowplows. Leave at least five car lengths between yourself and the snowplow. They are trying to clear the roads and make them safer for us and they cannot always see you. Be sure to keep your windows clear of snow and ice and also make sure your taillights and headlights are clear of snow. If others cannot see you, you are much more likely to be involved in an accident.

I hope this is a safe winter season for everyone. Be alert to the weather and use common sense. We all need to do our

part to keep the roads safe.

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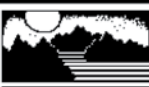

SECOND HALF AGRICULTURAL PROPERTY
SECOND HALF MOBILE HOME TAXES
DUE NOVEMBER 15, 2019

The second half of AGRICULTURAL TAX and MOBILE HOME TAX is Due NOVEMBER 15, 2019. A special provision of the law permits owners of agricultural property to pay their second half property taxes on their agricultural property by NOVEMBER 15, 2019, without a late payment penalty. Penalties will apply as shown below on November 16th, 2019.

Therefore, all mail must be postmarked by **NOVEMBER 15, 2019**, to avoid penalty on the second half of agriculture property taxes.

The Second half of the Mobile Home Taxes are also due NOVEMBER 15, 2019.

Have you purchased or moved into a property in the past year?

Contact your county assessor to file a homestead application if you or a qualifying relative occupy the property as a homestead on or before December 1, 2019.

What is a qualifying relative?

For agricultural property, a qualifying relative includes the child, grandchild, sibling, or parent of the owner or owner's spouse.

For residential property a qualifying relative also includes the owner's uncle, aunt, nephew, or niece.

When do I apply?

You must apply on or before December 15, 2019.

Once homestead is granted, annual applications are not necessary unless they are requested by the county assessor.

Contact the assessor by December 15, 2019 if the use of the property you own or occupy as a qualifying relative has changed during the past year.

If you sell, move, or for any reason no longer qualify for the homestead classification, you are required to notify the county assessor within 30 days of the change in homestead status.

Post NASA Internship Reflections with UMN Crookston Student Christopher Lang

CROOKSTON, Minn. — Wake up and shoot for the stars, literally. Senior Christopher Lang, software engineer student is always looking up. Graduating from Kenyon-Wanamingo high school, Lang traveled 6 hours from home to attend the University of Minnesota Crookston which little did he know would bring him to intern at NASA. From a young age, Lang has always been intrigued by the work and research that NASA conducts. Lang immersed himself with projects and initiatives at UMN Crookston to build the perfect resume. When it came time, Lang applied to an internship at NASA Armstrong Flight Research Center located near Los Angeles, California.

Rather than waking up in northern Minnesota, Lang woke up two time zones away in sunny California. Lang was joined with 30 other interns working in various positions, where Lang was a computer systems intern working specifically with a flying aircraft. Lang dove into programming, designing and investigating a program, specifically the aircraft model, PRANDTL-3c. The PRANDTL-3c is an unmanned experimental glider-aircraft being developed by NASA, with a 25 wing span. The program he worked with was the Preliminary Research Aerodynamic Design to Lower Drag, also known as PRANDTL-D. Lang worked specifically with the Flight Data Acquisition Unit (DAQ), which hooks onto various sensors of the aircraft to collect data, such as flight characteristics for research use.

Reflecting on his internship, Lang couldn’t have enjoyed the experience more. Everything

from his base location, to visiting a variety of other NASA sights, Lang couldn’t help but be grateful to be surrounded by an amazing industry and endeavor with great people behind it. Lang stated, “Everything that goes through for development is touched by 100s of people at different sites, so everyone plays a role in a greater endeavor and the betterment of mankind. The environment is meant to help people and improve technology. It’s something great to be a part of.”

Moving forward, Lang plans to attend grad school with the end goal to return to NASA. When asked what advice he would give to students entering his field he said, “Make sure you do independent projects like integrated systems and microcomputers and that’s how you got the experience. Tailor them to what you want to do.” The University of Minnesota Crookston couldn’t be more proud of Lang and what he has accomplished so far.
