Clearbrook-Gonvick School Board Approves Revised Building Plans

At the regular meeting of the Clearbrook-Gonvick school board, members approved revised building plans for the new early childhood addition. Other items on the meeting agenda included the school vehicle purchase, plans for prom, approving the tax levy and addressing the school board vacancy.

Luke Selken, the engineer from ICS, was in attendance at the meeting and reviewed the changes to the original plans for the school's addition. The major modifications were in the plumbing and heating systems. These changes will require a larger mechanical room than originally planned, resulting in a slight decrease to classroom, storage and office spaces. The need for a firewall, identified during a pre-construction inspection, was also addressed in the revised plans.

The schedule for the new construction project will kick off with a walk-through with contractors on January 7, 2020. Bids will be due by January 14, 2020 to allow for approval of contracts at the school board meeting on January 22, 2020. Construction is scheduled to begin in April, 2020 with project completion anticipated by the end of August.

Sarah Goudge presented the "Spotlight on Education" slide show featuring many of the students' academic and extracurricular activities during the past month. Students from preschool through high school have been preparing musical numbers for holiday programs. Fourth grade students are learning to play chess. Seventh grade STEAM students, with a lesson from Food Service Director Robin Proffitt, made pumpkin pies. A trumpeter swan, with an 8-1/2 foot wing span, now hangs in Sarah Goudge's science classroom. The swan was obtained through Conservation Officer Tim Gray with taxidermy costs covered by an \$800 donation from the Clearbrook Community Club. Several Bemidji State University students from the education program have been observing in classrooms to meet field experience requirements.

Principal Carl Dugstad encouraged everyone to attend the basketball games. He emphasized the leadership the athletes bring to the school. He also commented on the student leaders who are members of the school's growing FFA program.

He also addressed the new science standards. Sarah Goudge, high school science teacher, is providing guidance to other teachers as they implement the changes.

The Indian Policies and Procedures were approved by the board members. The changes to these policies included reducing the number of meetings from monthly to quarterly. Jenetta Weems, Human Resources, was also added as an authorized signer. The school has a budget of \$41,000 for Success for the Future funding that is used to support a teacher and paraprofessional for the program as well as an after-school activity bus. A survey of parents of students from Red Lake indicate that they are happy with their children's experiences at Clearbrook-Gonvick school.

School superintendent Jeff Burgess informed the board members that a pig welder and a CNC machine have been added to Ross Faldet's industrial technology classrooms. Both were purchased with grant money. Burgess also addressed a variety of building issues. The school is pursuing quotes to address gym floor maintenance. Refurbishing will not work with the current epoxy finish on the floor. The floors will be sanded and re-coated with a wax finish that school staff can then maintain with a re-furbisher. Bids are out for the purchase of updated technology equipment including servers and switches. The geothermal system has been tested for leaks everything appears to be running normally. The volleyball nets and standards will need to be replaced.

Burgess reviewed the school district's current financial status at the meeting. The general fund revenues are up a bit this year. This is due in part to a school population increase two years ago. The population is staying fairly steady. General fund expenditures have increased. The major causes of growth in expenses are insurance, transportation, and curriculum costs.

Teachers were surveyed regarding use of school vehicles. Burgess presented survey results to the board, along with a breakdown of vehicle costs, including insurance and the mechanic's certification required for continued use of the driver's education vehicle. He also presented three options for vehicles that could be pur-

chased. The board determined that the purchase of a 10-person van would best meet the needs of students and staff, allowing small classes and other groups to take field trips to the school forest and other community locations. The district's current car will continue to be used for the driver's education program. The transportation committee will be involved in the decision-making process for the purchase of the 10-person van.

Stacey Mendick, prom advisor, presented three options under consideration for prom night. A dinner and dance at the Fireside in Bagley with Grand March and after-prom party at the school is one option. Another option would be holding all prom activities at the school, with a dinner catered by Robin Proffitt and her staff. In the third option, activities would also take place at school, but would start later, with prom participants eating dinner on their own. Holding the events at school would allow students to enjoy the prom decorating for more than just the Grand March. Prom planners would work with the after-prom party planners to coordinate use of the school space. Board members did not foresee any problems with any of the prom options presented.

Jeff Burgess gave an overview of school property taxes. The board approved an increase of 2.5 % to the tax levy. The levy was certified without using the Q-Comp levy. Board members also designated the school as the polling place in case a special school election is required.

The board made a motion to appoint a member to take the place of Jim Galloway, whose term would have ended in 2022. Superintendent Burgess outlined the board's possible actions to fill the open seat. The board can leave the seat open, hold a special election, or appoint a new member to fill the term until the November 2020 election. Discussion of costs of special elections and the need to have a quorum at board meeting led the board to choose the option of appointing a new member to the board. The appointment will be approved at the January board meeting. In the meanwhile, a list of responsibilities and roles for the incoming member will

32-year Hwy. Department employee Jon Nelson to retire Road to Enbridge will be posted with 'No Parking Zone' signs to ensure safety

The Clearwater County Board of Commissioners met on December 17, 2019, beginning the agenda with opening of the two bids for first publication of County financial statement summary and board proceedings for 2020. The Leader Record located in Gonvick will be the official paper for 2020, with the low bid. The Farmers Independent in Bagley will do the second publication of the financial statement.

After a discussion regarding the current one-fifth term position of Agricultural Educator, the Commissioners terminated the position with the University of Minnesota, per the recommendation from the Clearwater County Extension Committee.

Auditor-Treasurer Al Paulson stated that the termination of this position saves the County \$20,000.

Commissioner Mark Titera expressed his knowledge that there are lots of other resources available with information to assist with Ag needs.

Commissioner Neal Illies asked if terminating this position would affect 4-H. Mr. Paulson responded that it would not affect the 4-H program.

The Commissioners approved the designation of the County Auditor-Treasurer's office located in the Clearwater County Courthouse as the polling place for the South Clearwater 143-36 and Red Lake Reservation precincts. A resolution was passed to authorize the Auditor-Treasurer to establish a Ballot Board consisting of the Auditor-Treasurer Office Staff effective for the 2020 Presidential Nomination Primary, Primary, and General Elections.

Engineer Dan Sauvé said that the new budget is looking good.

County employee Jon Nelson is retiring after 32 years, most of them in the Highway Department, as a heavy equipment operator. He also was an engineering technician for a few years and bridge inspector. He did leave the Highway Department for a short time to work at the Sheriff's Office. Commissioners were invited to a retirement gathering for him.

A No Parking Zone along CSAH 49 for the east 2,650 feet will be established (the road to Enbridge) by installing 10 signs. The reason to establish this No Parking Zone is for safety and to maintain emergency vehicle access to the pipeline terminal along this stretch of the road, especially during times when protesters are present.

"People do not want to move their cars for our emergency vehicles (fire trucks, police)," it was stated.

The Engineer received approval for payment of the Clearwater County Highway Department bills as presented in the amount of \$44,196.

The purchase of a new sign truck and equipment was approved. The Board accepted the quote from Boyer Ford Trucks to purchase of a new Western Star truck chassis for \$71,356, with trade in; they accepted the quote from Bert's Truck equipment for the sign truck body, cat walk, crane, hydraulic post pounder and post puller in the amount of \$110,975.

The Highway Department was authorized to purchase a semi-load of gap-filler material, primer, and needed rental equipment for use in spring.

The Engineer has certified

the Vogts Dirt Service aggregate surfacing work on various roads in Clearwater County. Total value of the work certified is \$306,664.

Tom Riggs, Ed Huotari and Brian Svor were authorized to attend Knapheides Plant Tour and meet about sign truck build in Quincy, Ill. leaving Jan 21, 2020 and returning the same day. Knapheide is covering the cost of the meeting and travel expenses.

The Clearwater County Commercial Drivers License Drug & Alcohol Policy was adopted. This policy updates and replaces the previous policy.

Environmental Services Director, Dan Hecht received approval to allow Al Spring and Tim Shamp, the part-time Demolition Landfill Operator to exceed 1,040 hours for 2019.

A County Roadside Spraying map of activity from 2018-2021 was distributed showing what has been and will be done through that time. Motions for the upcoming work will be forthcoming.

Resolutions for the Cities of Clearbrook and Gonvick regarding the administration of the Minnesota Wetland Conservation Act were adopted. The cities will implement the rules and regulations pertaining to wetland draining, filling and excavation. The same resolution was brought in November for Bagley.

MIS Technical Director, Stuart Lien was authorized to purchase an IBM I System Power 9 at a cost of \$44,242; and the integration of oblique images on the County website at a cost of \$1,100 to be paid from

the County Equipment Fund.

"This is so the public can have access to the images," he stated.

Assessor Jamie Freeman brought a statement showing clerical errors made by someone doing the work of a clerk, such as math, keypunch or coding errors, but not including errors of estimations. There were five such errors listed to date during 2019.

"According to Minnesota Statute, the Assessor must maintain a file listing clerical errors which is available to the public, and present it to the County Board by Dec. 31, 2019," the Assessor stated.

"Sometimes the people catch the error, or sometimes Eric or myself might catch them," she said.

The Assessor brought copies of training for the County Commissioners to consider. At this time, Commissioner Dean Newland is trained.

"We must have one trained commissioner for the Board of Appeal and Equalization. We cannot have a meeting unless there is one trained person present. The training is available on line," Ms. Freeman said.

"I recommend that both of the new commissioners take the training," Chairman John Nelson encouraged. Both Commissioners Mark Larson and Mark Titera will consider the training in the near future.

County Auditor-Treasurer Allen Paulson was authorized to pay the submitted invoices of \$77,423 for the County Revenue Fund and \$14,170 for the Nursing Service Fund.

Transfers of \$75,000 from the General Revenue to the Rural Signing Account; \$50,000 to Buildings & Grounds Account; and \$50,000 to Equipment Account were approved. An additional \$100,000 from the General Revenue will be transferred to the Landfill Development Account.

However, he remains a stalwart of South Carolina history. A state park and electronic combat range for military training south of Sumter both bear his name, while in Greenville, a bridge, highway, and hotel all are named for him. A statue of Poinsett is also a Greenville attraction.

The poinsettia has become a \$250 million industry in the United States, largely due to the efforts of Albert Ecke, a German immigrant in southern

California at the turn of the century who shared Poinsett's fascination with the flower. His son, Paul Sr., created a grafting technique to aid production, while his grandson, Paul Jr., helped launch the poinsettia into an American holiday fixture.

Today, the Paul Ecke Ranch near Encinitas, Calif. accounts for 70 percent of all American poinsettia purchases and half of worldwide sales. The best-selling potted plant in both the U.S. and Canada, poinsettias are usually bought by women, resulting in eighty percent of sales.

Some 100 varieties of poinsett-

tias are available today, though 74 percent of Americans still prefer red poinsettias, followed by eight percent white and six percent pink.
