Bennie goes on a vintage snowmobile ride

Bennie Erickson of Leonard has been riding snowmobiles for most of his life. At the age of 92 he had the opportunity to ride a vintage Arctic Cat Puma that he raced many years ago. The Buzzle Lake Vantage Snowmobile Association with members

from many towns including Thief River Falls had a ride and Bennie's son Shane mentioned to them that his dad had ridden the same snowmobile several years ago. They decided that on their next ride they would go to Leonard and invite Bennie to come and see. The sled was like his and he took one for a ride on the railroad tracks. He said it was really a joy to get back and ride like he used to. He opened it up as fast as he could go.

The ride will be a memory that he will always remember.

Bennie had a garage where he did engine work and he owned a Panther Arctic. In 1968 he ran his first race that started in Bagley. It went to Shelvin and north into the swamp. The bigger sleds made the going tough and they made many holes in the trail. He ran out of gas but he was lucky that he carried a quart

can of gas along and he still finished in the money in the 297 class of snowmobiles.

He sold Arctic Cat Snowmobiles for Thorsten Taylor who had his business in what was the Ford Building in Bagley. Bennie bought a 1971 Arctic Cat Panther and he raced in several races with his one cylinder Hurt Engine. He was still able to hit 75 miles per hour. Which he said was pretty good back then. Most of the races did not have trophies instead they paid out money. When he did start winning trophies he had to leave them in Bagley for people to see as they came in to look at Arctic Cat Snowmobiles.

Bennie was one of 8 boys and 4 girls in the family and they all had to go out working after they finished 8th grade as soon as they could.

He liked to have horses and he broke some himself. He and some of his neighbors like Orville Erickson and Warren Halverson would race them. They did it mostly in the winter as that was when they had more time with less work to do on the farm. Bennie found a 1929 Essex 4 door sedan and he overhauled it for his use. His father, Emil, had a 1919 Baby Overland with no top. He was always interested in fixing things.

His love of fixing things came in handy when he went in the military. He was sent to school to work on tanks and anti aircraft. He was shipped to Germany after spending time in Fort Knox, Kentucky where he was in the Armored Tank Division. After that he and Aileen Swanson were married and worked in Illinois for several years before coming back to Minnesota.

He worked in several garages including Lundmark's in Clearbrook and Allen's in Gonvick before he purchased property west of Clearbrook and made a wrecking yard and started a garage in the vacant creamery building in Clearbrook. He did that for several years selling the building to Churness and Hetland Fertilizer Company. He was busy also with his farm in Clover Township.

He and his wife Aileen live on farm where he has been a township officer for 49 years.

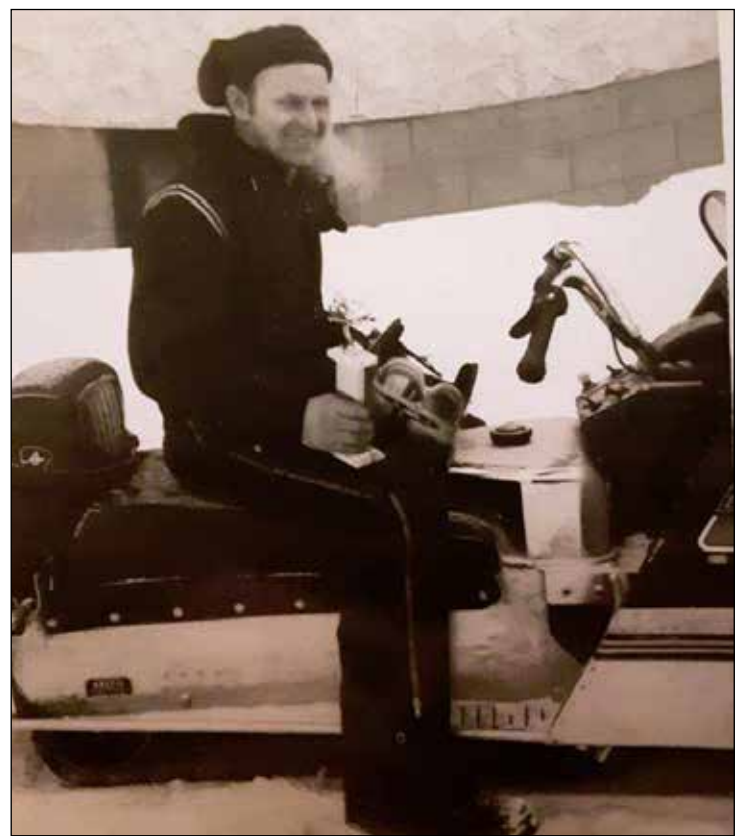

United Way brings Dolly Parton's Imagination Library to Clearwater County

The United Way of Bemidji Area announces the expansion of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library program to Clearwater County.

The Dolly Parton Imagination Library is a nonprofit organization that promotes early childhood literacy by giving free age-appropriate books to children from birth to their fifth birthday. Educators stress that reading with your pre-school child is the single-most important activity to prepare a child for school. The Imagination Library was created to guarantee access to books and to inspire parents to read to their children as much as possible.

"There is a wealth of research showing the benefits of reading aloud to young children, beginning at infancy," Denae Alamano, Executive Director of United Way of Bemidji Area shares. "We are excited to prepare children for success in reading and learning by reading and sharing books together

in the years before they start school."

This program is available to all children who reside in Clearwater County and parents and guardians can enroll children from birth up to their fifth birthday by completing a registration form at <https://imaginationlibrary.com>. Children will receive their first book within eight to ten weeks after enrollment and will continue to receive a book each month until the age of five as long as they reside in Clearwater County. While Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is free to participating families, it does directly cost the United Way of Bemidji Area \$30 per child each year, due to the cost of the books and postage.

Enrollment in Imagination Library is open to everyone; however, funding is limited, and United Way is capping enrollment at 200 children. A waiting list will be formed after the program reaches capacity

and children on that list will be added to the program as other children "graduate" from the program. "We will be working strategically to ensure organi-

Scammers are pretending to be government employees. Scammers will try to scare and trick you into giving them your personal information and money. They may threaten you or your family and may demand immediate payment to avoid arrest or other legal action.

DON'T BE FOOLED!

IF YOU RECEIVE A SUSPICIOUS CALL:

1. Hang up!
2. DO NOT give them money or personal information!
3. Report the scam at OIG.SSA.GOV!

Social Security may call you in some situations but will never: Threaten you Suspend your Social Security Number Demand immediate payment from you

Require payment by cash, gift card, pre-paid debit card, or wire transfer

Ask for gift card numbers over the phone or to wire or mail cash

What to look out for:

The call or email says there is a problem with your Social Security Number or account.

Someone asking you to pay a fine or debt with retail gift cards, wire transfers, pre-paid debit cards, internet currency, or by mailing cash.

Scammers pretend they're from Social Security or another government agency.

Caller ID or documents sent by email may look official but they are not.

Callers threaten you with arrest or other legal action.

After reading literature about and studying the celebration of Mardi Gras, Mrs. DeVries' Food and Literature class at Clearbrook-Gonvick got a taste of this centuries-old celebration by baking a King's Cake.

According to The Oprah Magazine, "King cake is one of New Orleans' local delicacies, an oval braided confection smothered with white icing and sugar sprinkles that salute the official colors of Mardi Gras: Green for faith, purple for justice, and gold for power. There's a trinket, usually a plastic baby, hidden inside each one." Students learned that the person who gets the piece of cake with the baby in it is expected to provide the cake at the next Mardi Gras celebration.

The students first researched King's Cake recipes, created shopping lists, and did price comparisons on ingredients, and planned what steps of the recipe they could get through each day in class.

The students worked in groups to bake their



cakes. Some of the lessons they learned while baking is to double the amount of frosting and to research more about the dough rising process when it needs to be split over several days. The students thought the hardest part of the process was braiding the dough. Their favorite part, of course, was decorating and eating the final product!

Gonvick Record Newspaper In February of 1955, Mrs. Edna (Ole C.) Bjerke became the newest rural correspondent, writing the Leon- Sinclair news for the Gonvick Record Newspaper. Under a headline "Menu Magic" a regular "Record" feature, her recipe for Bacon Potato Soup was printed as an introduction to her new position on the newspaper.

"Cut 3-4 strips of bacon into small pieces and render until crisp, using a heavy aluminum kettle. Take out bacon, pour off some of the fat, add: 1 tbsp. flour and 2 cups of milk. Heat and add one-quart potatoes cut fairly small, 1 onion finely diced and 1 cup diced celery if desired. Simmer until vegetables are tender. Mash in more milk to thin to desired consistency. Add salt to taste. Garnish with crisp bacon. Amounts are an approximate and can be increased or decreased to meet the family taste and need. The soup keeps well if mealtime is irregular. Any leftover can be reheated."

Thoughts from the Sheriff

Clearwater County
Sheriff Darin Halverson

Warmer weather and melting snow signal to us that spring is just around the corner. This time of year, we usually see an increase in traffic on our roads due to more people getting out of their houses and enjoying the nicer weather. This year, we have even more traffic on our local roads due to construction in our area. I want to take a moment and let everyone know what traffic safety issues we are seeing and what other precautions you should be taking to ensure your safety.

The first issue that we have been seeing more of is people speeding. This is happening throughout the state and high speeds, in excess of 100 mph, are becoming more common. We have made 282 traffic stops so far this year compared to 147 during the first two months of last year. Speed has been the reason for most of these stops. Aggressive driving and speeding are a concern as the greater the speed, the greater the distance needed to stop and the increased chance of loss of control. Chances of avoiding a crash, such as a deer running out in front of you, diminish as your time to react is much less. With more traffic on the roads also increases your chances of being in, or causing, a motor vehicle crash. Many times, we are told on a traffic stop that the person is speeding because they are late for an appointment or work and they were trying to make up time. Please take the time to plan ahead and allow yourself the necessary time needed to reach your destination.

Another traffic infraction that we are seeing more of is violating the hands-free law. The Minnesota hands-free law went into effect on August 1, 2019. The law states that it is illegal to use a cell phone to make and receive calls unless you are able to activate it by voice or a

one-touch activation. You cannot hold your cell phone while on a call or send and receive text messages or surf the web while your vehicle is in traffic. This includes being stopped at a stop sign or stop light. People are becoming more complacent and we are seeing this occur more often. Remember, if you are in an accident and injure or kill someone and it is proven by phone records that you were using your phone in violation of this law, you can be charged with felony criminal vehicular operation or homicide. With warmer weather, we have also seen an increase in car-deer accidents. Just as more people are out traveling, deer are doing the same. Deer are starting to move more due to the decrease of snow and are looking for more food to eat. This poses an increased risk to drivers, especially during low light hours, when deer are harder to see. Be sure to slow your speed at night and drive with your high beams when possible. If a deer runs out in front of you, do not swerve. You are more likely to either go into the ditch where you might roll your vehicle or go into the oncoming lane of traffic and cause a head-on crash. Accidents with deer are dangerous, as sometimes the deer will come through the windshield and can kill any occupants inside. Please use caution and stay alert when driving to avoid one of these crashes. Deer are very unpredictable and many of these crashes are nearly impossible to avoid, but with decreased speed and limited distractions you will be less likely to be involved in one.

The last thing I want to mention is please pay close attention when driving on not only the main roads, but side roads as well. There is a lot of traffic on side roads due to construction in our area and you may encounter vehicles in areas

where you wouldn't normally. Don't assume you are the only one on the road and be sure to stay to the right on any hill or curve if you are on a gravel road. These roads are also becoming softer and the shoulder of the road may be unstable so please use extra caution when meeting other traffic.

Let's all do our part to make our roads safer. I hope you take notice to what I have said in this article and drive with caution so you remain safe and help keep others safe as well. We like to visit with members of our community, but we would rather not meet you on a traffic stop or accident.

Grieving Complicated Relationships

When it comes to grief, we often think of the loving relationship we had with the person who died, and the deep sadness and longing we feel when they are gone.
But what happens when the relationship was not so good? What happens when we don't feel sad or long for the person who has died, but instead feel nothing or a sense of relief?
Grief is a companion to loss, and it's experienced in a variety of forms. One may feel they are not grieving or don't have a right to grieve a complicated relationship. This is not the case. You have a right to grieve even if the relationship was difficult. Your grief may feel confusing and as complicated as the relationship that was lost.
If the relationship with the person involved both good and difficult times, the survivor may experience a range of emotions, including sadness, relief, numbness or even gratefulness. Complex feelings, such as anger, disdain and guilt, may also surface for you.

All these grief reactions are natural and have their place in the healing process. It's important to acknowledge them and allow yourself to feel all the emotions. Consider the reality of the situation and the factors you could and couldn't control in your relationship. If the person who died hurt you, relief may be the natural reaction to their death. At times, the feeling of relief leads to feelings of guilt. Feeling relieved after someone has died doesn't mean you're a bad person; it means that bad things have happened within your relationship. Give yourself permission to feel all of the emotions. Often, this is what is needed and will help begin the healing process.
When grief is complicated by our relationship with the person who died, forgiveness can be an important component to one's grief. We don't always get the opportunity for forgiveness prior to someone's death, but that doesn't mean the chance for forgiveness is lost. Forgiveness is often about bringing peace to our own hearts, and this may be just as, or more important, after the person dies. One way to approach this is to write a letter to the person or go

to a place of memorial, like the gravesite or a place unique to the person, and read the letter out loud.
In other circumstances, you might need to communicate something you were unable to say while the person was living. Death can present the opportunity to share these feelings. The process of expressing your emotions even after the person died can be healing.
It's helpful to find a good outlet to share how you're feeling, such as a trusted friend, family member or grief professional. You may also consider journaling about your grief experience.
It can be difficult to know how to support a friend or family member who is grieving a complicated relationship. Many sympathy cards may not seem appropriate, and we may feel at a loss for the right words. It may feel easier to just avoid the situation altogether but doing so can leave the bereaved feeling alone and disenfranchised from their grief. I recently had a close family

member who lost someone with whom they had a complicated relationship. We opted to skip the sympathy card. My siblings and I sent the person a bouquet of flowers and a card letting her know we were there for her. You don't need to have the right words to support someone who is grieving. Simply hearing you care and are there for the grieving person, if needed, can be enough to help them in their grief.

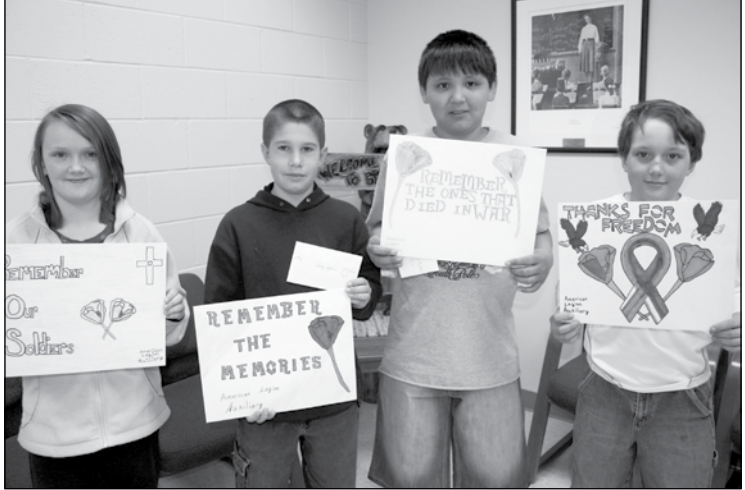
