Clearbrook Elevator holds annual meeting March 12

The Clearbrook Elevator Association held their annual meeting on Friday, March 12. Association President Richard Kroening opened the meeting and Nolan Eck gave the Secretaries report from March 6, 2020.

Les Westrum, Manager of the Association, welcomed those who came to the meeting. He stated that it was a pretty good turnout despite not having a free dinner, because of COVID, but there were many delicious rolls and cookies for those in attendance. He said that 2019 was a year to forget and 2020 was a lot better. There was a lot to put up with the weather. Feed sales were up. First of the year was lower for the business and they wrote off \$3,800 in accounts receivable. They also added \$10,000 to that account. Organic sales were way down last year and they have decided to only have soybean meal, and feed for chicken, pigs and calves in 50 pound bags. They will also have organic salt and minerals.

The Association gained 6 to 7 new accounts after the closing of the Gully Coop.

This past year the expenses were up with higher wages and business insurance.

They made some changes at the elevator and expanded the office area and cleaned it up to have more items to sell. They are also getting a Land Rover that they will be able to rent out.

They now have plenty of storage as they ran out of soy beans

for the first time in six years. They have plenty of seed but Les urged those in attendance to book seeds early.

Les went on to thank the customers and he hoped that next year everything would be back to normal.

Joel Piekarski from Carlson SV out of Fergus Falls went over the audit report.

Joel stated that cash and cash equivalents were from \$96,895 compared to \$23,651 last year. The association had \$163,865 in investments in other cooperatives including CHS and Land O Lakes. They have paid off all the notes payable and deferred payment contracts were better this past year with \$305,895 over \$89,650 the previous year. Total liabilities and patron's equities were up slightly this past year with \$1,269,703 compared to 2019 with \$1,202,363.

Sales were up with a gross margin of \$505,338 compared to 2019 of \$462,873.

Joel discussed the operating expense that were up about \$30,000 as payroll went up with cost of insurance and other items. There was also a feed truck that needed repairs.

Administrative expenses went down from \$30,981 to \$23,533. One of the biggest items was the association did not renew the Purina Contract. They also spent less on office supplies, postage, travel and other meetings.

The association received a

PPP loan for income which had the account go from a minus in 2019 of \$3,807 to a plus of \$36,974. The net margin for the year for the statement of operations was \$28,219 compared to a loss of \$31,438 the previous year.

Ending cash and cash equivalents for the year 2020 was \$96,895 compared to 2019 of \$23,651.

Total sales for 2020 was \$2,972,319 compared to 2019 of \$2,388,685.

New director appointed to the board was Scott Anderson with Richard Kroening remaining on the board. Mark Strandberg, the current vice president, has decided to retire from the board.

Increasing technology staff hours and technology services on board agenda

Next year's calendar, increasing technology staff hours, and technology services were among the topics covered at the regular meeting of the Clearbrook-Gonvick School Board. The board met on Monday, March 15, 2021.

The Agriculture Communications class prepared the March "Spotlight on Education" slideshow that was presented to the board by teacher Kim Anderson. Kindergarten students celebrated the 100th day of school. The elementary students decorated their classroom doors for "I Love to Read" month. Third grade students

put on a play called "Two Bear Cubs". Fourth grade students used jigsaw puzzles to learn about the United States in their social studies classes and studied the differences between chemical and physical changes in science classes. "Optical Art" created by sixth grade students was also featured. Students are using the home economics classroom in a variety of learning activities, including making King's Cake in Mrs. DeVries' Food and Literature class. FFA students held an agriculture carnival for elementary students and visited David Larson at Larson's Lost River Livestock to learn more about livestock

judging.

Principal Carl Dugstad reported that the county fair is scheduled to take place this year, and he expects that student projects will be on display in the education building. He is contacting distance learners to schedule MCA testing. Preschool screening was completed last week. Dugstad also reported that enrollment is at 431 students and he expected two more students to start attending soon. Five senior class students are at risk academically. They have all been con-

Spring work bids awarded

Environmental Services seeks equipment after Line 3 Project

The Clearwater County Board of Commissioners met on March 16, 2021.

Tom Riggs from the County Engineer office brought the motions to award bids for spring work. The Pavement Markings project bid is awarded to AAA Striping Service Co. of St. Michael, Minnesota with a bid price in the amount of \$66,682.

The Regravel bid is awarded to Vogt's Dirt Service of Bemidji with a bid price in the amount of \$283,013.

Engineer's Certificate of Performance for Regravel Contract Project CP 20-200 for aggregate

crushing and surfacing work on various roads in Clearwater County was accepted by the Board. It is in the amount of \$197,992 which reflects a \$2,700 deduction from the original amount of the contract due to a three day delay in completion of the project.

Environmental Services Director, Dan Hecht inquired as to whether he might look into securing equipment from the Line 3 Enbridge project when they are done. He discussed with the Commissioners some equipment that might be useful and may be obtained at a savings.

"I thought it was worth ask-

ing, because sometimes they don't want to haul away the equipment (ie. a skid steer) afterward," he said.

"Dan should talk to all the contractors, tell them what our needs are, and run it by who you work with at the Land Fill," said Commissioner John Nelson. "This is absolutely a good idea."

Briel Prokosch, Program Technician of Soil and Water Conservation District brought a motion to approve the Always There Staffing General Agreement for personnel services

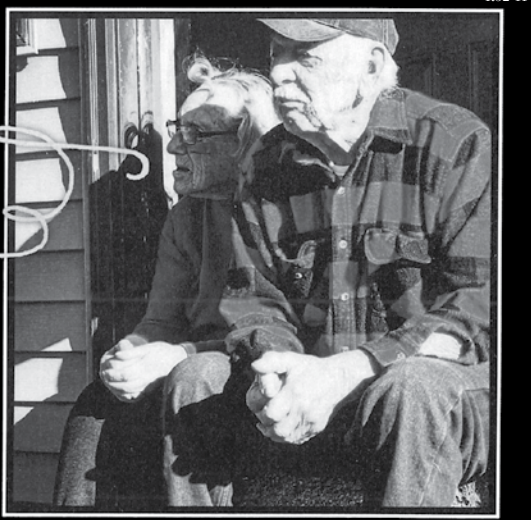

"The only change in the agreement is the hourly increase of \$1.00 (one dollar)," Briel stated. There is an ad in the paper currently for inspectors.

Commissioners inquired about the Itasca Park staffing. She said they will be staffing their own this year and some of the grant funds will be sent there for that purpose.

County Auditor Allen Paulson was authorized by the Board to pay submitted invoices of \$69,056 from the County Revenue Fund and \$14,391 from the Nursing Services Fund.

A motion to approve a step increase for Jamie Halverson, Human Services Director was made by Commissioner John Nelson, seconded by Commissioner Mark Titera, and was

We continue to vaccinate (first and second doses) along with partners in our county.

Presently: 2165 residents of Clearwater County have received at least one vaccination dose-24.5 %. 1428 residents of Clearwater County that have completed the vaccination series-16.2%.

66.8% of Clearwater county residents age 65 and above have been vaccinated.

The statewide vaccination goal of vaccinating 70% of the 65 plus population has been met.

We are vaccinating per the priority groups set forth my MDH and presently are working in Phase 1b tiers 2 and 3. We also have a call list for last minute call ins if we have a dose or doses that we need to use up etc. **If you are over 18 years old and would like to be vaccinated please contact our office at 694-6581 to sign up. tacted by school staff. Dugstad concluded his report by thanking Superintendent Jeff Burgess who will be leaving the district at the end of June.

Superintendent Jeff Burgess shared a building maintenance plan that looks at the school's needs for the next five to ten years. Immediate concerns include replacing the lawn mower and upgrading the controls for the ventilation system. ESSER funds can be used for ventilation issues.

Burgess informed the board that the state anticipates a budget surplus of \$1.6 billion due to declining enrollment in schools. He expects funds from the new federal stimulus package but there isn't any information out yet on when these funds will come in and how schools will be allowed to spend the money.

The board approved increasing the hours for a technology specialist from three days to five days per week. The district currently employs two technology specialists, one is already at full-time status. Superintendent Burgess explained that the increased hours are needed to cover the additional technology

the district has now. Increasing the hours for the second employee would allow the technology duties to be realigned between the two employees. It would also provide for additional duties to be added, such as broadcasting games. The district could also look at adding opportunities for students such as a summer reading program or robotics.

The board discussed options for broadcasting school events. Garden Valley's system is one possibility the board considered, with Garden Valley providing equipment and school staff running the cameras. Another possible system comes from Huddle. Questions the board members brought up included who would be responsible for equipment maintenance and what fees would be required to watch the broadcasts. The board also discussed the possibility of students operating the camera under the supervision of one of the technology specialists. The decision was made to wait and look into the various options for broadcasting before choosing a company.

The board also looked at two proposed IT service agreements. One was provided by Marco, the service currently

used by the district. The other, coming from Corporate Technologies, came at a considerably lower cost. Board members asked administration to try to get feedback from schools that are using Corporate Technologies and bring that information back to the technology committee.

A motion to adopt an e-learning calendar for 2020-2021 was approved with a split vote of 4 to 2. The new calendar will not include traditional snow days that can be used if the district needs to make up time for days lost due to weather. Instead, the school will have a plan in place to have distance-learning days if weather conditions cause school to be cancelled. These e-learning days would count as instructional days. The e-learning calendar allows the district to have a more definite calendar, a plus for families and staff who want to plan vacations. The limits of e-learning days, such as decreased personal contact with teachers and staff, caused concern for some board members. Superintendent Burgess emphasized that the school's e-learning plan must be approved by both the school board and the Minnesota Department of Education.

The board approved the early budget. Superintendent Burgess met with the finance committee and the building committee to review the budget. Once the legislative session concludes, the budget can be finalized. The district is waiting for more information on possible funding increases and how ESSER funds will be allocated. The preliminary budget provides for a surplus of \$97,000.

The board changed the COVID-19 quarantine period to ten days. This change lines up with the new department of health guidelines to reduce quarantine periods, provided certain conditions are met. The school safety team met to discuss the change before it was presented to the board.

Burgess informed the board that he and Principal Dugstad are working on a preliminary distance learning plan for next year. They are waiting for guidance from the state legislature as to if and how the state will allow districts to set up new distance learning programs. Schools around the state are dealing with the distance learning in many different ways. Burgess added that the school districts would prefer to have a normal school calendar without adding the extra burden of distance learning students to classroom teachers. Clearbrook-Gonvick, like many districts in the state, currently has the students in school four days per week. Students learn from home on the fifth day, allowing teachers time to prepare for the students who are distance learning on a full-time basis. If a distance plan can be created, classroom teachers could focus on students who are attending school in person.

The next school board meeting will take place on Monday, April 19th at 7:00 p.m.

Clearwater County pays tipping fees by the ton for trash hauled to the Fosston Incinerator. As the tonnage increases, the costs also increase. A state-of-the-art Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) recovers recyclables from trash, but the MRF operates more efficiently if it's separating mixed recyclables only, rather than recyclables from trash. Some of the recyclables aren't pulled out and end up in the landfill. Not only that, but the tipping fee for mixed recyclables is ZERO, which saves the county money!

You can reduce the volume of rubbish by recycling your paper, cardboard, plastic food and beverage containers, steel cans and, of course, aluminum and glass containers!

CLEARWATER COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

District 15

District 15 was located northeast of Leonard in section 35 of Sinclair Township. It was referred to as the Blix School and later as Pine Grove School.

In 1918- 1919 Constance Hofacre taught there and later wrote a remembrance of her days teaching at the Blix School:

"I was 17, armed with a high school diploma, a summer course in school management, psychology, child development and not much else except a desire to teach, when I first entered that little old rural school house northwest of Leonard.

My first problem came up the first day on the first hour in school. The children began calling me by my first name. To me this was unthinkable. How could I possibly keep any kind of discipline if my pupils didn't have anymore respect for me than that! I told them my name was "Miss Lorents." They smiled and called me Constance. I finally realized that I was not much older than my eight graders and probably not so mature, so I decided that maybe dignity did not sit so well on me so I did not press the issue.

My children gave me few if any discipline problems. They were an active group but eager to learn. Their parents were kind and cooperative.

I do not remember first names- only that Mr. Hulquist and Mr. Blix were board members. The schoolhouse, as I remember, was much like most rural schoolhouses I have seen since and were not so different 20 years later. The floors were oiled and dark, the desks were

scarred and the old bookcases were filled with library books more fitting for adult reading—few if any children's books. Textbooks, encyclopedias, maps and globes were beat up and long since outdated. County Superintendents were always working for better teaching equipment. The big-jacketed stoves did a good job of heating the top half of the schoolhouse when the teacher would remember to replenish it. Good wood was always furnished.

This was the year of the Spanish Flu, when so many people died. Naturally people

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did everything possible to keep it down. The school board decided to discontinue school for a week when a family in the vicinity came down with something. However it was three weeks before I was called back to teach. The Eric Rhen family had come down with it. Fortunately they all recovered. I roomed and boarded with them and they were like my family, always sympathetic and helpful

Being a short term, we closed in March or April. Mr. Sommer-vold was the superintendent when the school year started but Mae Barness had taken over before school closed."

In 1947 it was reported that Dist. 15 had 13 students. The Blix/ Pine Grove School closed in 1954.
