On July 4, 2021 at approximately 5:08 pm, the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office received a report of a one vehicle roll over on East Gonvick Road in Pine Lake Township. Deputies responded to the location and discovered the lone occupant of the vehicle, 41-year-old Travis Harbott of Thief River Falls, deceased at the scene. Harbott was traveling east from Gonvick approximately ½ mile when his vehicle left the roadway and hit an approach causing the vehicle to flip. The Clearwater County Sheriff's Office was assisted by the Gonvick Fire Department, Bagley Sanford Ambulance and the Minnesota State Patrol. The accident remains under investigation.

Legislative Update District 2A

GROSSELL RESPONDS TO PUBLIC SAFETY BILL PASSAGE

ST. PAUL — The Public Safety and Judiciary Omnibus bill passed the House Tuesday, having been stripped of all controversial or anti-police policy. The compromise bill that passed included the Officer Arik Matson Bill, which increases penalties for first degree assault of a criminal justice official. The bill also includes increased penalties for crimes related to child pornography from a bill (HF2100) authored by Rep. Matt Grossell, R-Clearwater, during the 2021 regular session.

"Since being elected in 2016, I have worked to protect victims and hold predators accountable for crimes against the most vulnerable in our society — our innocent children," said Rep.



Grossell. "I am glad the public safety bill included an increase to the penalties for the dissemination of child pornography. This increase is not enough but it is a start to toughen our weakest-in-nation child phonography laws. I will continue the fight for victims and to keep dangerous criminals away from the most vulnerable in our society."

The bill also included revisions to the criminal sexual conduct statute, which will bring justice to countless victims of sexual assault. It also lacked the harsh business mandates originally included in the Judiciary portion of the bill, such as the salary history ban and housing discrimination protections.

Seven months into construction on the Line 3 pipeline project and it is not hard to find a business, individual or town that has benefited from this project's impact on Northern Minnesota.

While some continue to oppose the pipeline project that was started by the Obama and Biden Administration because replacing it is a crucial need, it is clear the benefits far outweigh any potential concerns.

Enbridge has gone through years and years of delays as they conducted the lengthiest pipeline study in our state's history. They gathered dozens of permits, held more than 70 public meetings and were successful in a handful of court cases. And at the end of the day, the need for this project was upheld.

In small town Minnesota, we are grateful for this project being successful and moving forward. This project is helping to stimulate local economies, largely thanks to the more than 5,500 pipeline workers who have been hired. These men and women are not only helping their families because of their reliable, good paying jobs, but they are also spending money in the towns they travel to and through.

Additionally, Enbridge makes it a priority to work with companies in the communities along the pipeline route. Supplies, equipment leases, rock and lumber from Minnesota companies are being used on this project, boosting small businesses that were hit hard following the pandemic.

Earlier this month, the Minnesota Court of Appeals once again ruled in the favor of Enbridge, allowing construction on Line 3 to continue.

This decision affirms that the PUC took the necessary steps, fulfilled the required studies and research, and acquired the proper permits for the Line 3 pipeline project.

After six years of work, En-

bridge continues to prove that the Line 3 project is something we needed. They have proved it will benefit our state and region and can be done without a detrimental impact on our environment.

As pipeline opponents continue to fail at their attempts to stop the project in the courts, they are becoming more desperate every day to find other ways to stop progress.

In the past month, we witnessed thousands of out of state protesters traveling to Northern Minnesota for a "mass arrest" event. This protest was said to have been peaceful, but instead they caused nearly a hundred thousand dollars in damage, terrified pipeline workers and "occupied" Enbridge land in their quest to shut down this project.

At the end of the day, this

court ruling shows that common sense and facts continues to prevail - despite attempts from the radical pipeline opponents.

It has taken us a long time to get here, but we are proud to join the majority of Minnesotans who back this project and look forward to its eventual completion.

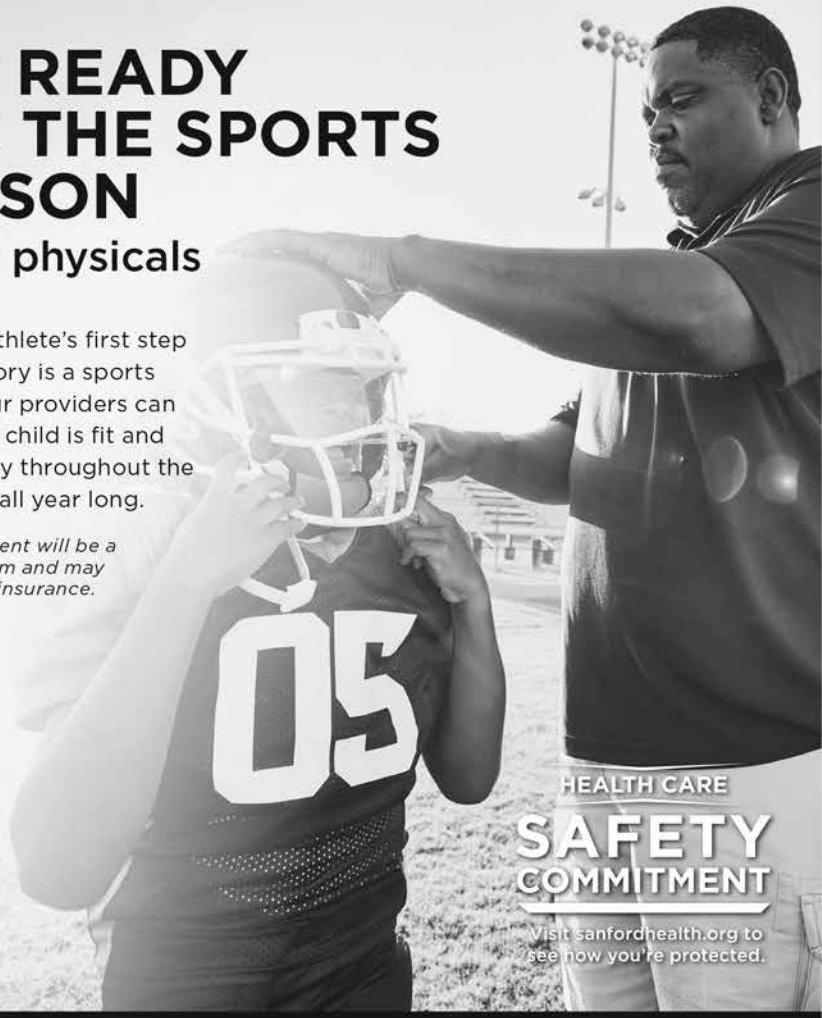

Women of Clearwater County Louella Darst Cease

Louella was born on April 14, 1911 to David and Hattie Darst, near Parkers Prairie Minnesota. Her uncle named her, suggesting she be named after the brand of butter the local creamery made: so she was named Louella Mae. The Darst family lived in Parkers Prairie and Spring Valley before purchasing a homestead in Copley Township near Bagley in 1920.
Louella attend school in Copley as well as Shevlin and graduated from Bagley High School. She was valedictorian for the class of 1929. While in high school she lived with the Dr. Larson family, working at the local hospital in exchange for her room and board. After high school she continued to work for Drs. Larson and Sw-

enson. In 1932 she completed training to be a teacher. She taught for two years at District 44 near Itasca State park until her marriage to Kenneth Cease on April 11, 1935. Kenny had been her sweetheart since 4th grade.
Louella and Kenny operated Kenny's Oil Company and then Kenny's Sales and Service in Bagley for almost 50 years. While Kenny served aboard the USS Battleship the Massachusetts in WWII, Louella used her crafting skills to make blankets, socks and caps to send to the soldiers overseas. She and Kenny raised two daughters, Kay and Charlene.
Kenny died in 1982 and Louella sold the business in 1984 and retired.
An active person, Louella was a member of the Calvary Evangelical Church in Bagley. She served on the REA board, and was a volunteer at the nursing home for many years. Louella was named one of Clearwater County's Outstanding Senior Citizens in 2001. Louella was an annual exhibitor at the county fair, having been an exhibitor since she was 10 years old. She was a talented crafter and her homemade fudge was well known (and much sought after at the annual Historical Society Bake Sale.)
Louella passed away on September 3, 2013 at the age of 102. She is buried at the Bagley City Cemetery.



Notes on District 13:
District 13 was located in Leon Township but we do not have a written history of that school. The school district doesn't show on the 1912 plat book as #13 but as District 18, a typo since the Winsor school is listed as Dist. 18.
The Historical Society has one very fuzzy, out of focus photo of District 13, and on the back of the photo is says the school was built in 1905 and that W.D. Marmorine was its first teacher.
Also in the collection is a letter written in 1917 to Mr. H.C. Widness, who was the clerk, asking for payment of \$7.05 from "The Improvement Bulletin" company for an advertisement for bids on the school. CCHS also has in its collection a report card for Olaf Nysveen for October 3, 1910- January 29, 1911. Olaf was a good to excellent student, scoring between 89 and 96 on average.
In the report on the consolidation of county schools published in 1947 it notes that there were 16 students in District 13 and they had \$294.07 cash in hand.

How are Tribes being involved in this project?

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A Tribal-led Cultural Resources Survey was completed along the project route. With representatives of nine Tribes doing direct survey work, and more than 30 Tribes involved via government-to-government consultation with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, this has been the largest such survey ever attempted in the energy industry.
Most importantly, we've been listening. From the start, we respected the wishes of the Leech Lake Band of Ojibwe to route the new Line 3 around their reservation. We've also signed a 20-year easement renewal with the Fond du Lac Band and made further route changes based on the Tribal Cultural Resources Survey results.
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
