Two very deserving former Clearwater County Fair board members were named the 2021 outstanding Senior Citizens at the Clearwater County Fair. Betty Johnson of Clearbrook and Alton Walker will represent the county and be honored at the Minnesota State Fair.

Betty has worked with many organizations; Director on the Clearwater County Fair Board. Member and coordinator at Clearbrook Senior Center. Member who held several offices for the Clearbrook American Legion. Member of the Clearwater County History Center. Auxiliary President and volunteer for the Good Samaritan Center after working there for 31 years. Coordinator of church dinners and volunteer at Good Shepherd Church. Many offices and volunteering at Good Shepherd Ladies Aid. Volunteer for special events at Clearbrook-Gonvick School and grandparent volunteer for the Clearbrook-Gonvick 4th Grade. Worked on committees for fund-

raising for the Clearbrook Depot Restoration project.

Betty was the first to volunteers to be an honor guard to march for the Legion Auxiliary and to serve goodies for local events. She was in charge of the Seniors campsite at Relay for Life where they marched all night. Her "Soul-Mate" husband since 1954 serves right along with her. He was given the Outstanding Senior Citizen award for the County in 2004.

Betty and Duane served as bread gleaners for the Clearwater County Food Shelf. Once a month they volunteered to drive to Bemidji to pick up bread and bakery goods. And when reimbursed for their mileage they turned it back to the food shelf.

Alton has been involved as President and Vice President of the Clearwater County Fair Board and director for 25 plus years. He has served with others in the development in the development of the Cow/Calf project which allows ranchers and farmers to show a pair of animals in the pen classes. Criminal Behavior results in citations and arrests

As Enbridge's Line 3 replacement project continues, there has been an increase in protest activity. On July 29, 2021, several individuals attempted to block access to a water pump used by pipeline workers at the Mississippi River on 230th Street in Bear Creek Township. Dispersal orders were given and five people remained at the site. Those five were issued citations for public nuisance and told to leave the area. Two remained and they were arrested and brought to the Clearwater County Jail. The two women were from Wisconsin and Wash-

ington states. Both were booked on the public nuisance charge and one was also charged with obstructing legal process.

On August 3, 2021, a group of approximately 12 people gained access to the fenced-in easement of Enbridge and occupied the temporary bridge going over the Mississippi River also in Bear Creek Township. Dispersal orders were given to the group that had gathered and three left on their own. Seven remained and were escorted off the easement and were arrested and transported to the Becker Coun-

ty Jail. Of the seven arrested, two were from California, two from Minnesota and the remaining were from New Mexico, North Dakota and Washington. Charges varied on these seven from public nuisance to Misdemeanor trespassing.

As the construction continues, every effort is being made to handle these situations peacefully and have them resolved without incident. We respect the right for people to exercise their first amendment right to peacefully and lawfully protest.

Report from county nursing service

Clearwater County: 903 cumulative cases. We have 13 active cases (up 9 since last Thursday) making our 14 day case rate 14.76. Age ranges for COVID cases from July 24, 2021 to August 6, 2021

Age 0-19: 3
Age 20-39: 3
Age 40-59: 1
Age 60-79: 4
Age 80+: 2

Cases continue to rise in our county and in the state as well as hospitalizations and ICU admissions. The Delta variant is the dominant strain..... it is as contagious as chicken pox!!

Our community is very vulnerable. Our vaccination rate is the lowest in the state. We need to get more people vaccinated! Vaccine: The vaccine is safe and effective.

Many of the rumors that are circulating about the vaccine in our community are myths. Misinformation regarding the vaccine is circulating just like the virus is circulating!

We understand how this may make some hesitant to get the vaccine. Please give us a call if you have questions.

*Get vaccinated not only to protect yourself but to protect others. Do it for your parents, grandparents or neighbors or other family or friends that may be more vulnerable to COVID. The more the virus spreads the greater the chance they have of getting it.

The vaccine is the best weapon to end this pandemic and it is a race. As the virus spreads it mutates and changes. Right now the vaccine is effective and the rate of breakthrough cases (people who get COVID and are fully vaccinated) is less than 1% but as the amount of Delta variants rises and the virus mutates that may change.

We will be offering vaccinations at our office next week on 8-12-21 from 2p-3:30p. You can call ahead to arrange a time or you can come anytime from 2-3:30p.

If that day does not work please call our office or your primary care provider to set up an appointment to get vaccinated.

On August 4, 2021, Neil Dolan was sentenced in Clearwater County Court on several criminal files by the Honorable Eric Schieferdecker.

Dolan plead guilty to 1st degree criminal sexual conduct in violation of Minn. Stat. 609.342, subd. 1(b). Dolan received a prison sentence of 168 months. The sentence was executed forthwith. The Judge sentenced Dolan to lifetime conditional release after incarceration.

Additionally, Dolan plead guilty to 2nd degree criminal sexual conduct in violation of Minn. Stat. 609.343, subd. 1(b). Dolan received an executed sentence of 119 months. A lifetime conditional release after confinement was also pronounced on this file.

In addition to the punitive consequences, Dolan will also face registration as a predatory offender. Clearwater County would like to thank the BCA and Minnesota Attorney General's Office for their assistance in this matter.

This year, there has been a lot of tension and conversation surrounding the Line 3 pipeline project that is currently underway. While it's a controversial issue for some, a recent letter in the Park Rapids Enterprise by a pipeline opponent left me irked.

For months, many of us have been aware of the increased police presence that has been required at Line 3 construction sites due to unruly protesters harassing workers, blocking roads, and chaining themselves to equipment.

But now, we have reached the point that people who are responsible for needing additional law enforcement presence are ironically complaining about the need for the additional law enforcement.

If these protesters followed the rules and respected the laws, there wouldn't be a need for extra law enforcement. Because I can assure you, these police officers would rather be in the cities and towns they are supposed to work for instead of being at a protest site with protesters hurling swear words and vulgar language at them for hours on end.

So, the solution is simple. Pipeline protesters should go home, stop disrupting construction, and stop breaking the law. Until that happens, they should accept the fact that law enforcement will be there to protect the pipeline workers and other citizens from a potentially dangerous, lawless situation.

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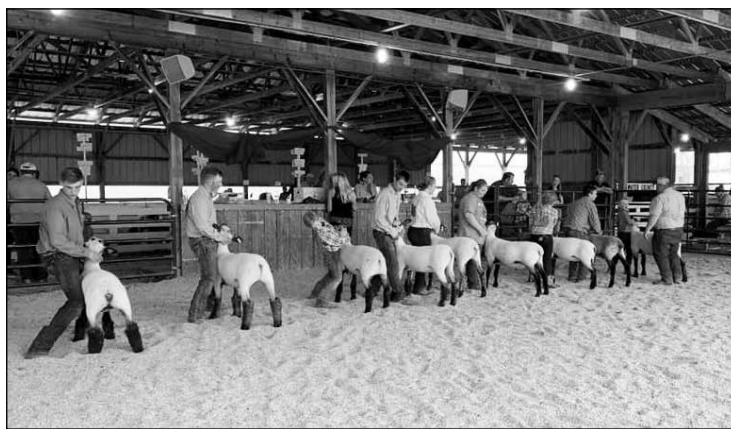
