Getting ready for the first day of school starting September 7

Dear Clearbrook-Gonvick Families and Community Members,

After a year with multiple learning format changes, enhanced health and safety protocols, and other impacts to the school day, Clearbrook-Gonvick School is preparing to welcome students back to school for the 2021-22 school year on Tuesday, Sept. 7th, 2021.

I want to give you a quick update on the operations of the school as of right now and how we are preparing to operate this fall and start the school year. The district has been going through resources provided by the Department of Education, Department of Health, the Center of Disease Control, and Clearwater County Health to prepare for the safety of all students and staff while trying to offer the best learning environment for all students. Please be aware that if MDE/MDH requirements change our learning format and protocols, C-G School's plan will be adjusted to align to any mandates and requirements. The C-G School District will continue to prioritize protecting the health and safety for staff and students and providing the best learning environment for students. If changes are necessary, we will communicate with staff and families as quickly as possible. We appreciate your patience and understanding of the situation during this time.

For the 2021-2022 school opening, the determination of implementing recommendations for opening is under local, school board control. The procedures for Clearbrook-Gonvick School opening include the following:

All students will return to in-person learning five days a week. At this time, the district is not offering distance learning.

Face Coverings/Masks

•Masks are strongly recom-

mended for students and staff.

•Clearbrook-Gonvick School will not require face masks in the school setting. The district will support students, families, and staff in their choice to wear a mask.

•Masks, however, are required by the Federal Order on all public transportation including school buses; this also applies to extra-curricular buses. This is a federal requirement, not a rule under the authority of the school district.

Health and Safety Protocols

•Clearbrook-Gonvick School will maintain the HVAC system and enhanced air quality standards, encourage hand washing, and will continue quality cleaning methods as strategies to protect students and staff and reduce the risk of spreading Covid-19. The school will have hand sanitizer available throughout the building.

•When physical distancing is not possible, the district will utilize a multi-layered safety approach of proper hand washing, covering your cough, and staying home when symptomatic.

Positive Cases & Screening

•The Superintendent or school nurse will report all positive cases of Covid-19 to MDH and Clearwater County Health and continue any other required reporting processes.

•Clearbrook-Gonvick School will follow the MDH Decision Tree when a student or staff member presents signs or symptoms of Covid-19; this also applies for quarantine of close contacts. Students or staff members with a positive Covid test will need to isolate for 10 days.

•Students and/or staff who have Covid, will be sent home. Close contacts will need to quarantine for 14 days, or 10 days with a negative PCR test

after day 7. Staff will continue to provide education to all students in isolation/quarantine and communicate with those families.

•The district will conduct contact tracing and contact families of students who were in close contact. Quarantines will be based upon the MDH decision tree and the individual situation which can include factors such as: whether individuals were masked, vaccination status, the area individuals were in, activities being conducted, length of time, and if they are experiencing symptoms.

•The best practice is to stay home if experiencing symptoms of Covid-19. Symptomatic students can be sent home but may return with a negative PCR test or alternative diagnosis.

Vaccinations and Testing

Clearbrook-Gonvick School will support families in their choice to participate in a vaccination program. Vaccinations are available through our local clinics. C-G School is not requiring students or staff to be vaccinated. County health will be offering vaccinations on September 1st from 3:00-5:00pm at C-G School Open House to any students and families interested. Families may opt to provide vaccination documentation to the C-G School to expediate the contact tracing process and eliminate the need for their child to quarantine in the event of a close contact.

Clearbrook-Gonvick School will support our students, families and staff and encourages everyone to do their part to help reduce the spread of Covid-19. We are asking any community members who would like to share ideas and concerns to contact the superintendent or a school board member

The money for the loan was set up with grants to be used with low interest loans for local business places. It has been used by many in the city to upgrade various things.

Logan LeClair has been in charge of the upgrade of the basketball court. He has been getting donations and about \$7,000 has been given to do the court which he hopes to get started as soon as possible.

We have 26 active cases from 8-13 to 8-26-21 giving us a 14 day case rate of 29.51.

The Delta variant is the dominant strain of COVID circulating in Minnesota and it spreads twice as quickly. With the Alpha variant (which was the dominant strain prior to the Delta variant) one sick person would (on average) infect 3 others. One sick person with the Delta variant will (on average) infect 7 others.

The Delta spike which is what we are experiencing right now is being described as the "pandemic of the unvaccinated". Those that are not vaccinated include those that can't get vaccinated yet (children under 12).

During last year's fall spike, children under 10 made up 5% of cases and children ages 10-19 just under 12% of cases. In the last 2 months cases in children under 10 have almost doubled to 9.6% and ages 10-19 just a slight increase to 13%. The striking thing is that of the 5185 cases for children 0-19 since June, 2989 were detected in the past 2 weeks. (MDH 8-20-21). The Delta variant is changing things. As we look to school starting this is especially concerning!!!!

We need to decrease the spread! It is more important than ever to get your vaccine. The more the virus spreads the more it has a chance to mutate and change.

**Clearwater County has a high rate of transmission of COVID-19. Because of this masks are recommended indoors. CDC COVID Data Tracker

Schools in our county do not have a mask requirement. But masks are recommended.

Masks are not fun..... Really don't know anyone who enjoys wearing them. BUT they are one of the tools that we have to decrease the spread. We urge you to do so while indoors and have your children do so in school.

School tips for parents, teachers, students.

The first day of school is always an anxious one—new faces, new friends, new rules, new everything. What can teachers do to make the first day and the rest of the year less anxious, more rewarding and enjoyable?

Please say the name of each of your students at least one time. If you have them all day or part of the day, say their name more than once. Students want to feel valued and when you say their name, that shows that they are somebody. I have had teachers in college that never said my name—not even once. What terrible teaching and what a disgrace to the college.

Tell the students about yourself. You also are somebody and the students want to know something about you. You don't have to go overboard telling about yourself but sharing some things is probably the best first step to building trust. Tell them about where you went to school, about your family, what you do when you are not teaching and maybe even your favorite kind of book or even pizza. Seems like common sense but many teachers overlook this simple strategy.

Try to make them laugh—even just a little. I am big on telling riddles. Even though most are pretty corny, there is always someone who will chuckle or crack a smile or moan or groan. Just the fact that you told a funny story is good. Make it a habit of putting humor into your teaching. Your kids will love you for it. Try to leave your kids smiling every day.

Tell your students why they are learning whatever you are teaching. Make this a habit; make this a trademark of your teaching. Students need to know why they will be learning what they are learning. If you are good at it, that's all the motivation they will need.

Do some get acquainted activities. I wrote a book full of some of the best. We have all done ice breakers and they do help us to get to know one another better. We become a team, which is what you are striving for.

Above all, be sure and remind your students that everyone is capable of graduating and that each has special gifts. Every student has value.

Volleyball-Blackduck O at Clearbrook-Gonvick 3 (25-19,25-22,25-10)

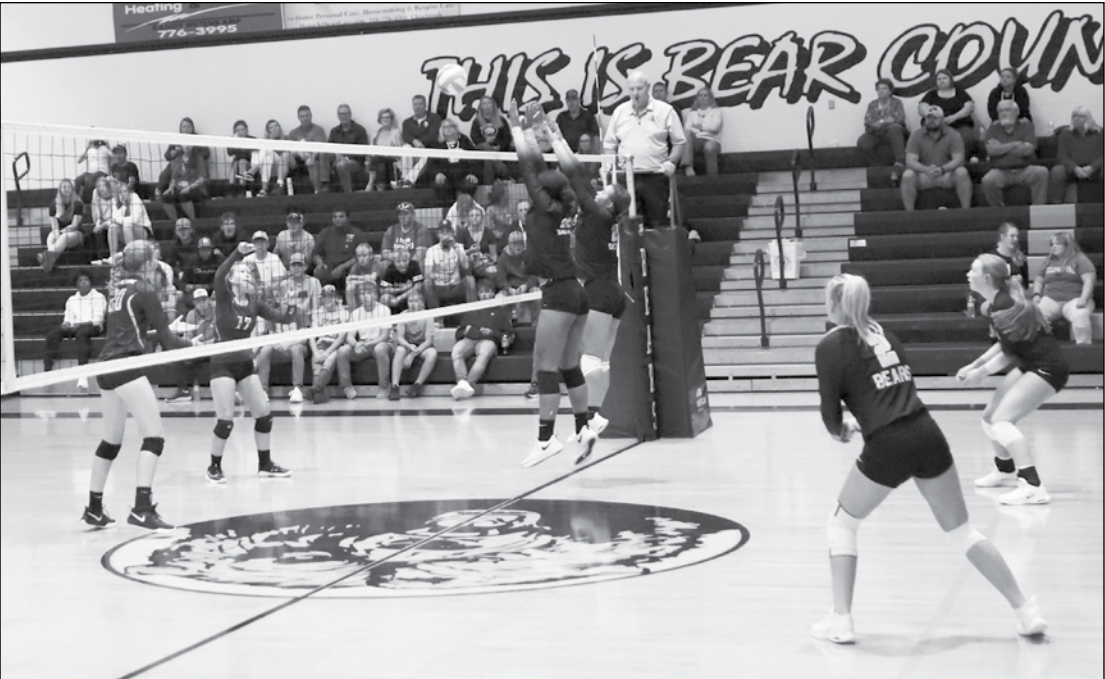
The Clearbrook-Gonvick Bears opened their season with a 3-0 sweep of the Blackduck Drakes Thursday night at Clearbrook-Gonvick.

Dana Melby led the Bears with 11 kills as Clearbrook-Gonvick opens the season with a record of 1-0. Melby is one of 8 seniors on the Clearbrook-Gonvick roster this season. Maci Wagner and Ella Engen each added five kills for the Bears.Kalli Gross and Sadie Stroening each had 3 kills for the Drakes as Blackduck starts the season at 0-1.

Clearbrook-Gonvick fell behind 5-1 in the first set but closed it with a 10-4 run to win 25-19.

There were ten ties in the first set. The second set was also close with the Bears pulling away for the 25-22 win. The Bears closed the third set with 15-5 run to win 25-10. Both teams return to action on Tuesday, August 31st with Clearbrook-Gonvick playing at Win-E-Mac (96.7FM). Blackduck will host the Bigfork Huskies on Tuesday, August 31st.
