Senior Jack McQuown Earns Trip to State XC Meet

The Clearbrook-Gonvick Cross Country Team traveled to Bagley last Friday, October 29th for the Section 8A Cross Country meet. The weather was beautiful which made for a great day to race. The Section meet qualifies runners to the State Meet with the top two teams and first 6 individual runners not on one of those two teams advancing to the State Meet at St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN. Qualifying for the state meet is a very difficult task in cross country with over 20 teams and over a 100 runners participating in each of the boys and girls races for a chance to advance.

Senior Jack McQuown ran the race of his life beating his personal best time by 20 seconds to place 10th with a time of 17:32 for the 3 mile race. Jack was the 6th and last individual to earn a trip to the State Meet. It was a very close race for the last spot with Jack having to pass 3 runners over the last quarter mile to secure his spot. Jack is the first run-

ner for Clearbrook-Gonvick to qualify for the State Meet since cross country began 6 years ago.

Also placing for the Bears were senior John DeVries who placed 61st with a time of 20:01. Junior Dwayne Knutson, 73rd, 20:41.

Junior Daniel Rankin, 106th, 24:00.

Senior Jayden Bergerson,

111th, 24:56 which was Jayden's best time ever!

The boys team finished 11th out of 20 teams.

The girls were led by 8th grader Amelia Machlitt who placed 19th, with a season best time of 21:19 for 3 miles. Amelia just missed qualifying for the state meet by finishing as the 8th individual. Amelia had a fantastic season and showed much improvement over the season. Also running for the girls was 8th grader Sarah Imle who did a great job in her first 3 miles race ever by placing 65th with a time of 24:23. Julie Lavin, junior, placed 79th with a time of 25:23.

Jack will run at the State Meet on Nov. 6th at St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN.

Congratulations to all the Bear runners on another great season of running and thanks to the parents and community for all the support.

Veterans Day program at Clearbrook-Gonvick School

The Veterans Day program will be held at Clearbrook-Gonvick School on Thursday, November 11th at 10:00 AM.

Parents, family members, and all community members are welcome to attend.

Veterans Day, observed annually on November 11, is a tribute to military veterans who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces. Not to be confused with Memorial Day, which honors those who died while in service, Veterans Day honors all military veterans, including those still with us.

HISTORY OF VETERANS DAY

Veterans Day, originally celebrated as Armistice Day, was first issued on November 11, 1919, by President Woodrow Wilson a year after the end of World War I. The purpose of Armistice Day was to honor the fallen soldiers of the Great War for their sacrifice and bravery. Seven years later, in 1926, Congress adopted a resolution requesting that President Calvin Coolidge issue annual proclamations on November 11, making Armistice Day a legal holiday.

In 1945, World War II veteran Raymond Weeks had the idea to expand Armistice Day to celebrate all veterans rather than just the ones who died in

World War I. He led a delegation to General Dwight Eisenhower, who was all for the idea. Weeks then organized the first Veterans Day celebration in 1945 in Alabama and every year since, until he died in 1985. In 1982, he was honored by President Reagan with the Presidential Citizenship Medal. Weeks was also named the 'Father of Veterans Day' by Elizabeth Dole.

In 1954, Ed Rees, the U.S. Representative from Emporia, Kansas, presented a bill to establish the holiday to Congress. Eisenhower, who was then the president and also from Kansas, signed the bill into law on May 26, 1954, eight and a half years after Raymond Weeks held the first Veterans Day. After having been through both World War II and the Korean War, the 83rd U.S. Congress — at the urge of the veterans' service organizations — amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word 'Armistice' and inserting the word 'Veterans.' With the approval of this legislation on June 1, 1954, November 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

The National Veterans Award was also created in 1954, first received by Congressman Rees for his support in making Veterans Day a federal holiday.

Though the holiday is currently and was originally celebrated on November 11, the day was moved to the fourth Monday of October in 1971 due to the Uniform Monday Holiday Act. Finally, on September 20, 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed a law that returned the annual observance of Veterans Day to its original date of November 11, beginning in 1978.

The holiday is observed by the federal government on a Friday, if the holiday falls on Saturday, or on a Monday, if the holiday falls on a Sunday. Federal government closings are established by the U.S. Office of Personnel Management. State and local government closings are determined locally and non-government businesses can close or remain open as they see fit, regardless of federal, state, or local government operation determinations.

The United States Senate Resolution 143, which was passed on August 4, 2001, designated the week of November 11 through November 17, 2001, as National Veterans Awareness Week. The resolution called for educational efforts directed at elementary and secondary school students concerning the contributions and sacrifices of veterans.

Bears advance in tournament action

The Clearbrook-Gonvick Bears defeated the Northome/Kelliher Mustangs 3-1 on Thursday night to advance to the Section 8A Quarterfinal Round.

The story of the game was the performance from C-G Senior Dana Melby who had a game high 20 kills. Melby, who had seven kills in the first set alone, was the catalyst to the

dominant first set where the Bears won 25-13. The second set was a bit closer but C-G had the lead for the majority of the game and let a few points slip at the end giving the Mustangs some life but eventually closed the door to go up 2-1. Northome/Kelliher with their backs against the wall in set three would take any early lead and would never relinquish winning 25-19 to draw closer at 2-1. In set four the Mustangs played well to grab an early lead but C-G would take the lead late and would balloon to 25-18 giving them the match 3-1.

Clearbrook-Gonvick will play the top seeded Ada-Borup-West Cougars tonight in Ada. For Northome/Kelliher, their season comes to an end at 10-11.

Make a plan for deer hunting season

As 400,000 hunters prepare for deer hunting this firearms opening weekend, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds them to plan ahead for the 2021 hunting season.

"A safe and enjoyable hunt starts with good preparation. To assist hunters with that preparation, we've put a wealth of general and area-specific information on our website," said DNR Commissioner Sarah Strommen. "We hope these tools contribute to a safe and successful deer season with family and friends."

A successful hunt requires planning no matter which deer permit area hunters are in. All you need is your DPA number to use our online make a plan tool, which provides a comprehensive list of information hunters need to consider before heading to deer camp.

1. Buy a license. It starts with deciding which deer permit area you will be hunting so you can

buy the appropriate license.

2. Get your deer tested if required. Invest in the health of Minnesota's wild deer by participating in chronic wasting disease. If you'll be hunting in a CWD surveillance, control or management zone, sampling is mandatory opening weekend Nov. 6-7 for all deer one year of age or older.

3. Know the regulations. Read up on the regulations for your deer permit area, including how to register deer and how harvested deer must be handled and transported in certain areas to help prevent the spread of disease.

4. Know where you will have your deer. If you plan to use a meat processor, contact them ahead of time to be sure they're accepting whole deer from hunters this year. If you plan to butcher your own deer, you must properly dispose of the carcass (head and spinal column). We have videos to help you process your own deer and

assist those hunting in a CWD control or management zone.

5. Be safe. Practice the four tenets of firearms safety, know how to set up and use the tree stand safely, wear a safety harness and wear blaze clothing.

DNR: It's up to every hunter to ensure safe-hunting trend continues

Minnesota has enjoyed two firearms deer seasons and nearly three years without a hunting-related firearms death—that's the longest stretch since the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources has been tracking these tragedies. And when the firearms deer season opens Saturday, Nov. 6, every hunter needs to prioritize safety to keep the trend going.

“Our goal is that every hunter make it home safely at the end of every hunt,” said Col. Rodmen Smith, director of the DNR Enforcement Division. “That doesn't happen by chance; it happens when all hunters understand what's at stake when they head out for the day.”

While the number of hunting-related firearms fatalities has dropped significantly since the 1960s and 1970s, when it wasn't unusual for 10 or more

hunters to die each year, safety officials say even one incident is one too many. In the past 10 years, a total of 14 people have died in firearms-related hunting incidents. Many of them happened during the firearms deer season. By following the basic rules of firearms safety, hunters can avoid most hunting-related firearms incidents:

- Treat every firearm as if it's loaded.

- Always control the muzzle.
- Be sure of the target and what's beyond it.

- Put finger on the trigger only when ready to shoot.

In addition to safe firearms handling and wearing blaze orange or blaze pink clothing, hunters also should keep safety top of mind when it comes to hunting from a tree stand. Accidents involving tree stands are the leading cause of injury among hunters.

According to national data, as many as one in three hunters who hunt from an elevated stand will fall and sustain a serious injury. The following tips can help hunters stay safe while using elevated hunting stands:

- Check the stand before the season to ensure it remains in good working order.

- Climb into and out of the tree stand before the season begins, so that you remember what it feels like.

- Inspect the safety harness thoroughly, and use it when in the stand, as well as when climbing into and out of it.

- Maintain three points of contact with the steps or ladder at all times.
