There are several new exhibits to view in the main museum gallery.

Valuation assessments increasing in April

Average increase including all types of property in the county is 22%

Clearwater County Assessor, Terrie Johnson notified the Board of County Commissioners of changes to assessments for 2022. Value and Classification Notices will be in the mail by the first part of April to county property owners.

In her notification to the commissioners, Johnson stated "we currently have an appreciating market, and Clearwater County has seen the significant gains that other areas are also experiencing. The average increase in the county, including all types of property, is 22%. In our region, the average increases are 20-30%."

Johnson went on to explain some of the changes made to this year's assessment. "Tillable — the average increase is 15%, which is consistent with most of the other counties in our region. In addition, I made some changes to our border on the west to be in line with what Polk County has on their tillable values. Woods - the average sales price per acre on woods is approximately 1600/acre. We increased our woods (RVL) value to stay within that state acceptable range. Waste & Pasture - These land types

were also increased along with the other land. On average - 15-20%. Rural residential 1st acre building sites increased to \$20,000, this is before applying any needed adjustments. This is consistent with neighboring counties that are similar to Clearwater County. Other site values and lakeshore also will see an increase."

In addition, Johnson noted that her office had updated the cost manual level in Vanguard (the computer program that calculates valuation), as it had never been adjusted to reflect the current building costs. The map factors, which are the market adjustments for specific areas of the county, were carefully analyzed and adjusted.

Johnson continued by saying "I also identified several other areas in which to improve the assessment. Those additional changes will help with the overall assessment and the statistics that the Department of Revenue reviews."

Johnson shared that she wants to be transparent in the valuation process and if any taxpayers have questions, they are encouraged to contact the Assessor's Office. She also notes that property data records and sales information is on their website.

Aquatic Invasive Species mitigation and Solid Waste management among topics discussed

All commissioners were in attendance for the County Board of Commissioners meeting March 8 meeting with seven department heads giving reports.

First on the agenda was Bruce Cox, Land Commissioner. He explained that he had budgeted to purchase a new snowmobile. Due to supply issues, many dealers have set deadlines for ordering with delivery in the fall. Those deadlines had passed. Bemidji Sports Centre would still be able to take an order now, with delivery in the fall. After some discussion Commissioner Neal Illies made the motion to approve the purchase of a Polaris Voyager 550 FC 155" track snowmobile from Bemidji Sports Centre at the price of \$10,393 to be paid now with delivery in the fall. Motion passed.

Sheriff Darin Halvorson asked the board to approve the hiring of Noah Sheldon as a full-time Communications Corrections Officer, effective March 14 with pay at Grade 14, step 1. This position is currently vacant. Motion was made and passed. Halvorson next asked for authorization to advertise internally for the position of deputy Sheriff that is currently open. Motion was made and passed. The final item Halvorson brought before the board was a request to purchase scheduling and payroll software from Aladtec for \$2,995 annually. This would replace the current system of paper timecards and allow for better report generation. Motion was made and passed.

Brielle Prokosch, Program Technician for the Soil & Water Conservation District requested approval to contract with Always There Staffing for personnel services need for the 2022 Watercraft Inspection season. Motion was made and passed. There was then discussion about a project at Clearwater Lake. The Clearwater Lake Association had asked if Clearwater County could use available AIS funds to purchase a CD3 watercraft cleansing station that helps eliminate the spread of aquatic invasive species. Clearwater County would share the cost with Beltrami County. However, Beltrami County does not currently have funds available to participate in the project this year but would have funds in the next two years. Commissioner John Nelson was concerned that de-

laying the project would expose the lake to infestation. The board asked Prokosch to contact Beltrami County to see if they would reimburse Clearwater County for their portion of the project if Clearwater County went ahead with the project this year.

Lisa Syverson, Administrator for the Public Health & Nursing Services requested permission to hire Jennifer Condon, RN at step 10-full time. Condon has 13 years' experience as an RN and 6 years' experience working on homecare. Motion was made and passed.

Dan Hecht, Environmental Administrator reported that the county was not selected this year for the MDA Noxious Weed grant. The grant would have covered some of the cost of annual roadside spraying for Leafy Spurge. The spraying had already been budgeted for before the grant had become available, so it will be done as planned. Hecht reported that he will be attending the SWAB meeting in Fosston on March 9, along with Commissioner Mark Titera. Hecht also reported that the 9-county group that has been working on a long-term plan for handling demolition debris had applied for a Greater MN Recycling and Composting grant. Due to evolving state regulations, each of the county's facilities are running out of time to operate. Hecht was disappointed to report that the grant was not approved by the state, leaving the impression that the county's are on their own to address an issue that was created by state regulations.

County Engineer, Dan Sauvé presented monthly bills totaling \$87,524.77 for approval to pay. Motion was made and passed.

Auditor/Treasurer, Allan Paulson requested authorization to pay submitted bills. \$119,791.79 would be paid from the County Revenue Fund and \$24,892.40 from the Nursing Service Fund. Motion was made and passed. Paulson asked the board to ratify the professional service agreement between Tri-Men Systems Inc. and the Minnesota Counties Computer Cooperative for the maintenance support of IFS from January 2022 through December 2024. Motion was made and passed.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:25 am.

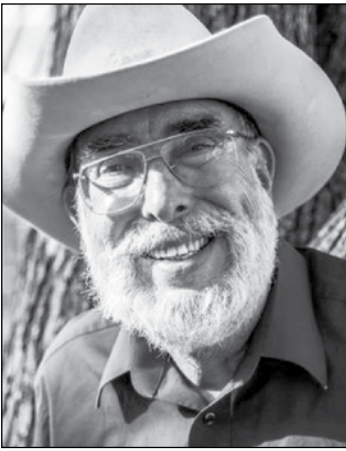

We packed in a lot of legislation last week. I filed legislation to fully prosecute criminals who create child pornography. This is an ugly topic, but these criminals must be punished to the fullest extent of the law.

The Unemployment Insurance Fund has still not been funded. House Democrats are holding this bill up. This is a bill that the Governor, the Senate and House Republicans support, and we must have it passed by March 15. As of this writing, no movement has been made to bring it to the House floor for a vote. This is a massive slap in the face to our Minnesota business owners who have already gone through so much during the Walz shutdown. The Mankato Press wrote an editorial agreeing with my stance. We also voted on a Home-

Representative Matt Grossell (R-Clearbrook) is maintaining his commitment to prosecute those who prey on children, by authoring legislation that would place mandatory minimum penalties for creating, distributing, receiving, and possessing sexually explicit materials involving children.

"Protecting children is my highest priority while I am your representative," Grossell said. "Those who prey on and violate children must be penalized to the highest degree for their crimes."

In HF 3881, anyone who creates pornographic work involving a child will be sentenced to no less than 10 years and no more than 25 years in prison, and a fine of up to \$20,000.

Those with previous convictions for sex offenses will be imprisoned for no less than 15 years, and no more than 30 years, and be fined up to \$40,000. In other words, these predators would receive the punishment they deserve.

Clearwater County Remembers

Richard Bergland 12/6/30- 1/11/51
Richard Darrell Bergland was born December 6, 1930 in Clearbrook to parents Leonard and Dorothy Mildred Huff Bergland of Clearbrook, Minnesota. Both Leonard and Dorothy had come to Clearwater County as small children and had lived there most of their lives. Richard had two sisters, Elaine and Gloria, and one brother Robert. Leonard was a WWI veteran who worked as a rural mail carrier his entire career. Dorothy was a teacher in the county's rural schools until her children were born and then again during the teaching emergency of 1944 – 1947. She was teaching at the time of her death in 1947. Leonard and Dorothy were active members of the First Lutheran Church in Clearbrook, as were their children.

Richard was an outdoor boy at heart and spent as much time as he could in the open, where he became known as an expert trout fisherman. Fly-tying was one of his hobbies. He loved trapping and hunting and was an expert rifleman. During school vacations and in his spare time he worked at the McReynolds Honey Farms. He graduated from Clearbrook High School in 1948.

Richard joined the Army on October 7, 1950 and became a member of Company A, 38th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division.

The 2nd Division deployed to Korea in late July of 1950. The division became the first unit to reach Korea directly from the U.S. The call to Korea had come so unexpectedly that training and equipment upgrades had been neglected and even ammo was in short supply. The 2nd Division was committed as a unit to relieve the 24th Infantry Division at the Naktong River Line. In mid-August they were the first unit to break out of the Pusan Perimeter and drive to the Manchurian Border. There, the Chinese entered the picture and they became one of the targets of the Chinese "Winter Offensive." When the 2nd Division was within 50 miles of the Manchurian border, the Chinese attacked at the Battle of the Ch'ongch'on River. The 2nd Division had been given the task of protecting the rear and right flank of the Eighth Army as it retired to the south. It became surrounded and had to



fight its way through "the gauntlet," a Chinese roadblock six miles long. This fighting around Kunu-ri cost the division nearly one third of its remaining strength.

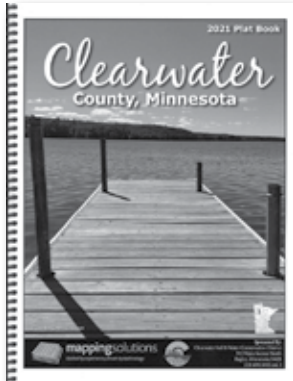
Among those killed was PFC Richard Bergland, who was killed in action on January 11, 1951. His family received a telegram from the Adjutant General of the Army telling them of their son's death. Memorial services were held for Richard at the First Lutheran Church in Clearbrook and he was buried in Silver Creek Cemetery near Clearbrook. He was awarded the Combat Infantryman Badge, the Korean Service Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, the Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation, the Republic of Korea War Service Medal and the United Nations Service Medal. Richard Darrell Bergland was 20 years old.

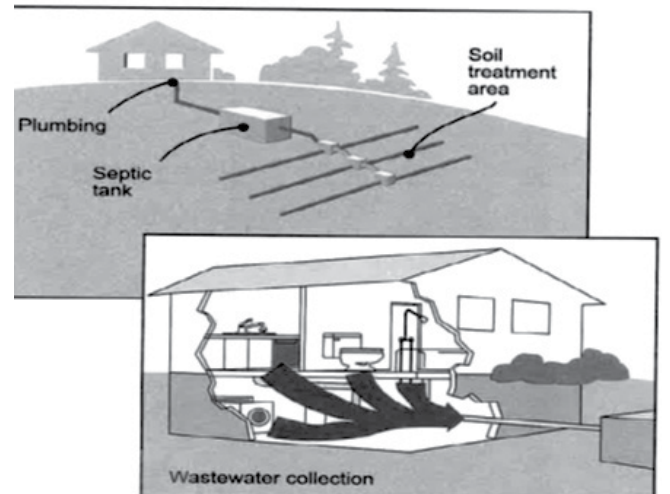

This group of people are called the Clearwater County Volunteer Sheriff's Reserve. This dedicated group operates solely on dona- tions and contributions from organizations and individuals to fund their operation. On March 26th from 5-7 pm, there will be a fundraiser held at the Bagley American Legion to help this group with funding necessary for training and equipment needs. Come out and enjoy a meal and get to know these volunteers and find out what they are all about.

Those not familiar with the Clearwater County Volunteer Sheriff's Reserve, I will give you a little background. For- mer Clearwater County Sheriff Denny Trandem can be given the credit for starting this group. He saw the need to establish a non-profit volunteer group that could assist the Sheriff's Office in the areas mentioned above. The first group of volunteers formed in 1997 and has served contin- uously for the past 25 years.

The number of members ha difficult to find members who can commit the time to be mem- bers. It seems everyone is get- ting busy and finding the time to volunteer is next to impossible. The group of Sheriff's reserve members shows the commitment and dedication necessary to set them apart from others. I ap- plaud the sacrifice they make in taking time out of their own day and from their families to serve in this capacity.

The Sheriff's Reserve oper- ates under by-laws and a policy and procedure handbook. They have a Captain that is in charge of meetings and works closely with the Chief Deputy of the

Sheriff's Office in coordinating trainings and equipment pur- chases needed for the members. In addition to the Captain, a sec- retary/treasurer takes minutes at the monthly meetings and is responsible for distributing payments.

So how do you become a mem- ber of the Clearwater County Volunteer Sheriffs Reserve? The first step is to call or speak to the Sheriff's Office and speak to Chief Deputy Vern Wit- tenberg. You will then be given an application to fill out and a background check will be done on you. The background check is done to confirm nothing in your past could cause a problem in serving in this capacity as you will be working closely with law enforcement and may be exposed to sensitive information. Once the background check is com- pleted, your name will be pre- sented to the current members to vote you onto the group. If the majority of the members agree to accept you, then you will become a member.

After becoming a member, you will be issued standard equipment such as a two-way ra- dio, compass, safety vest, flash- light, etc. You will be expected to regularly attend monthly meetings held the first Monday of every month starting at 6:00 pm. Regular business is dis- cussed and decisions are made that steer the reserve unit. Your participation is important so you remain up to date and the more members that are present allows for a broad array of ideas and brainstorming.

If this is something you think you might be interested in being a part of, I would encourage you to contact Chief Deputy Wit- tenberg and begin the process. I would also encourage everyone, whether you are interested in joining the group or not, to come to the fundraiser on March 26th and show your support. This is a great opportunity to talk to cur- rent members and say thank you or if you are interested in joining to get a little more information. We are always looking for new members to fill the role of a Clearwater County Volunteer Sheriff's reserve member.

CERTIFIED GRAVEL PITS

Clearwater County has a voluntary program to certify that gravel pit
owners/managers are controlling noxious weeds in the material they are selling. Listed
below are gravel pit owners/managers who are concerned about controlling the spread of
noxious weeds on roadsides and on property belonging to other residents of the County.

Pit Owner (property owner)	Property description
