Gonvick City Council purchases new lawn mower

The Gonvick City Council at their meeting on Thursday, June 9, purchased a new Bobcat lawn mower. They took the bid from North County Hardware in Clearbrook for the 72 inch equipment. Money for the purchase has been donated through the Gonvick Jubilee Committee. The city will be keeping the old lawn mower to be doing the ditches and this would be for the straight line work. Two more requests were brought to the council for the remaining lots on the old railroad bed. They have three total and after discussion the city has decided to keep the remaining lots for use for the pumpkin patch and free space at this time. Police report Ryan Solee gave the police report. He informed the council that the training that was to be held has been canceled. They will be looking at other places that they will be able to use the funds that were to be used for the project. There were 18 incidents for the month. They included:

Animal Related 2, Assist 1; City Ordinance 2; Disturbance 1; Information Only 1; Medical 3; Office Detail 1; Suspicious Activity 2; Traffic Stop 2; Vehicle Lock Out 1 and Welfare Check 2. The Council passed the resolution 22-04 for appointing election judges. Named were Eileen Lien, Shirley Graftas, Cheryl Mollin and Stacy Halvorson. Cody Rude gave the Gonvick Fire Department report. Since the last city council meeting the following calls and events have taken place. 2 fire calls one involving a car and camper, the other a grass fire, 8 medical calls, 1 motorcycle accident, 1 severe weather watch, 3 work nights, 2 regular meetings, 4 training's, two pumper operation training, one storm spotter training and a live burn exercise performed with Clearbrook Fire Department, Spring Fundraiser held May 7 and they voted in one new fire department member. The Gonvick Fire Department will be receiving the new extraction tools by the end of July and are planning an in-service training with the Genesis Representative that they will do at the city shop. There is a department interested in the Freight Liner fire truck they got back from Great Plains Fire Equipment last week. The 100 year celebration is set for June 18 and they will be having a pig roast at the fire hall with kids games and washer tournament at the Trap. Whiskey River will be playing under the tent at The Trap starting at 9 p.m. The Fire Department will be letting vendors put up displays with the traveling Vietnam Memorial wall. They will be in the fire hall over rodeo day from the 7th through the 10. Bills were paid for the month for Water and Sewer \$6,387.97, General \$17,213.92 and Fire \$12,004.56.

Board of Commissioners meeting

By Darin Steindl At the Clearwater County Commissioners meeting on May 31, Environmental Services was first on the agenda. Director Dan Hecht explained that a contract draft was discussed at the May 17 meeting for rural garbage dumpsters and hauling with Listrom's Disposal. Anderson Disposal has requested termination of its contract and has been notified of the board's intent to consider termination at the May 31 regular meeting. This terminates both of the existing contracts and combines both into a new 10-year contract with Listrom's Disposal.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mark Titera, seconded by Commissioner John Nelson to approve and authorize the County Board Chairperson to sign the draft Contract for Service of Rural Waste Collection Sites and Recyclables Collection Sites between Clearwater County and Listrom's Disposal, Inc., Bagley, MN for service dates June 1, 2022, through May 31, 2032 and terminate the existing contract of the same name with Listrom's Disposal and the Contract for Service of Rural Solid Waste Collection Sites with Anderson Disposal with effective dates from January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2025. The motion passed with Commissioner Neal Illies abstaining. Stuart Lien, Director of Information Technology, discussed the software and imagery of Clearwater County by multiple county departments and the general public through the county's website. A motion was made Commissioner Illies and seconded by Commissioner Titera to renew the software contract to utilize EagleView Pictometry Connect and Connect View not to exceed \$2,212.50 to be paid from the County Equipment fund. Motion passed.

Dan Sauvé, County Engineer was the next to report. Sauvé submitted Highway department bills totaling \$6,441.31 for approval. Commissioner Dean Newland made the motion to approve payment of the bills, seconded by Commissioner Nelson. Motion passed. Sauvé then shared quotes to replace culverts after the recent flooding. Suavé was authorized by the board to purchase culverts for CAR 121 washout over Lost River from True North Steel of Fargo in the amount of \$34,942.86. Other quotes will be presented to the board for additional projects as they are received. Sauvé then presented a supplemental agreement for Sate Aid for Local Transportation regarding project SAP 015-599-022 which would allow Triple D Construction to delay giving the contract bond until September 2022, while keeping the project completion deadline of September 1, 2023. The agreement was approved. A final motion regarding highway projects was made by Commissioner Nelson, seconded by Commissioner Mark Larson, to accept the quote and authorize Reiersen Construction Inc. of

Bemidji to complete project CP 22-0500 on CSAH 4 to install culvert, granular backfill, aggregate base, bituminous removal and bituminous surfacing in the amount of \$73,090.00. Motion passed. The final item of the meeting was the hiring of Trudi Alberg as Deputy Auditor/Treasurer at Range 14, Step 2 effective May 23, 2022. Motion passed.

Thoughts from the Sheriff

Clearwater County Sheriff Darin Halverson



The Clearwater County Sheriff's Office recently conducted two youth ATV safety courses. Even after completing the course, many still have questions about where people can ride their ATV/UTV. I want to refresh everyone on the laws so you can be better prepared when you go out riding.

The most common question has to do with the difference between a Class I and Class II ATV. In order to answer that question, I will first define what an ATV is. Beginning on July 1, 2015, the classification system for ATVs changed. To be classified as an ATV, the vehicle must have a dry weight less than 2,000 pounds, have three to six low-pressured tires and have a total width that is less than 65 inches measured from outside of rim to outside of rim. A Class I ATV has a width of 50 inches or less and a Class II is defined as having a width greater than 50 inches, but less than 65 inches. Any motor vehicle with

a width greater than 65 inches is classified as an off-road vehicle (ORV). Other examples of common recreational vehicles that are not considered an ATV include golf carts, dune buggies, go carts or a vehicle specifically used for lawn maintenance, agriculture, logging or mining purposes.

Where can Class I and Class II ATVs be driven? The answer to this question depends on which one you are riding. A Class I ATV can be operated in the ditch or the outside bank or slope of trunk, county state aid, or county highway. You can apply for and receive a permit from our office that will allow you to operate on the shoulder or extreme right side of township or county roads. The permit is free and the only thing you must provide is proof of insurance and current registration.

A Class II ATV can be operated on the shoulder or extreme right side of any township or county road without a permit. State law allows for this type of operation. You can also ride on the bank, slope, or ditch of any trunk, county state-aid, or county highway if you are accessing a business or making a connection to a trail. You cannot operate a Class I or Class II ATV on any Minnesota trunk highway. Trunk highways in our county include MN Hwy 92, MN Hwy 223, MN Hwy 200 and US Hwy 2.

With this said, if you are operating an ATV on or within a public road right of way, you must have a valid driver's license, unless the right-of-way encompasses a trail administered by the commissioner and is designated for all-terrain use or multiple use.

Another common question we get is, "Can youth legally operate an ATV?" Youth age 12-15 can operate an ATV in the ditch, bank, or slope of a public road right-of-way if they possess a valid ATV safety certificate and are accompanied by a parent or legal guardian that is on a separate ATV. The youth rider must abide by all the riding requirements mentioned above. Any person under the age of 15 cannot operate a Class II ATV, whether on a public road right-of-way or private property.

A few other safety reminders are that any person under the

age of 18 must wear a helmet if they are operating an ATV or riding as a passenger. Additionally, a person under the age of 18 is also required to wear a seat belt if operating or riding in a Class II ATV. If you are operating an ATV, remember that you cannot have an open container of alcohol with you on the machine if you are on any public road or land. DWI laws are applied just as if you were operating a car.

There are many other laws related to ATVs that can be found in Chapter 84 of the Minnesota State Statutes or on the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources website, www.dnr.state.mn.us. I would encourage you to check them out. Remember, these laws are meant to keep you safe and reduce accidents and injuries. It is up to you to keep the image of ATV riders positive. Using common sense, being courteous to others and respectful of the roads and lands on which you ride are ways to accomplish that image. If you are out riding, have fun and be safe.

Home Country

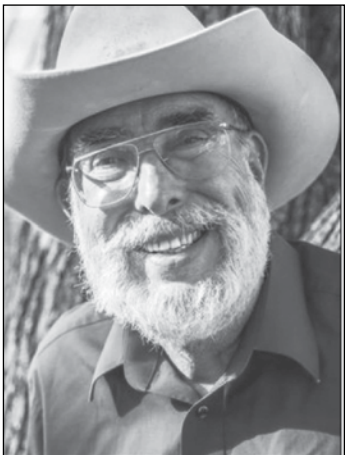
Delbert McLain was seen going into Marvin Pincus's house the other evening. We wondered on it a bit, because those two were less likely to become friends than any other two people in the valley.

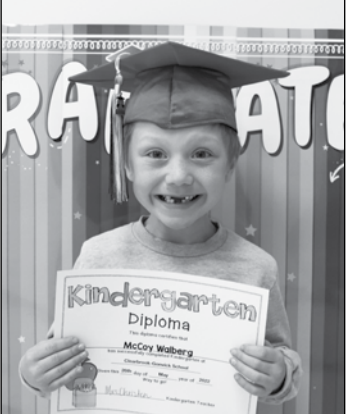

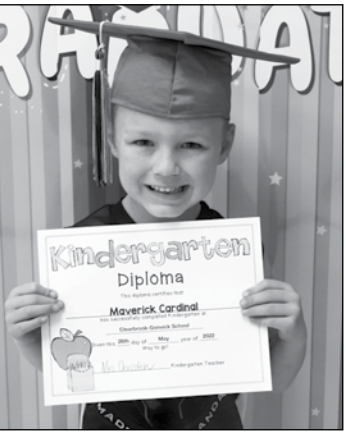
