4-H YELLO leadership workshops held

(06/20/2022) - In June, youth from across Minnesota gathered in Bemidji, Minn. for the annual 4-H Youth Exploring Leadership and Learning Opportunities (YELLO) conference. All five regions came from across Minnesota to be a part of YELLO. The conference was facilitated by youth leaders from the Minnesota 4-H State Ambassador program, and supported by a team of adult chaperones. Clearwater County had three youth representing our 4-H program.

This year's workshop theme was "Your Destination Awaits," which taught young people how to choose a destination and develop goals to help them reach that destination. The youth engaged in small group activities so that they could meet others from across Minnesota, educational workshops and large group activities. They also learned about food insecurity and did a hunger simulation to learn more about it and how they could help their communities.

With YELLO being held in Bemidji this year, youth from all around the state were able to make an impact on our area. Youth participated in multiple service projects which included volunteering at local food shelves, Ruby's Pantry, Community Table Soup Kitchen, and cleaning up Diamond Point Park. Youth also had the opportunity to visit Ter-Lee Gardens and HoneyBerry USA to learn more about where their food comes from.

YELLO focuses on youth from middle school to one year past high school. It helps youth hone their skills as leaders and take a deeper look into their leadership journeys.

Using a youth teaching youth model, the 4-H YELLO leadership workshops are developed and led by 4-H State Ambassadors and Minnesota 4-H youth who have been selected to serve as spokespeople for 4-H. Their purpose is to educate youth and adults about the importance of youth development, leadership, citizenship, service, teamwork and other invaluable life skills.

Lutheran Social Service seeks Foster grandparents

Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota (LSS) is seeking volunteers for its Foster Grandparent program, in partnership with AmeriCorps Seniors, a national service agency, to offer guidance and encouragement to at-risk children and youth in the community.

Foster Grandparent volunteers are older adults who traditionally offer one-to-one mentoring in the classroom and other settings to children and youth who may be experiencing academic or social challenges. Their presence and reassurance can help children and youth improve self-esteem, social and emotional development and literacy and math skills.

"Children benefit from having another adult in their life who is genuinely interested in them,

and who wants to spend time with them," shared Sue Wacek, a Foster Grandparent volunteer. "They learn that someone is interested in their future success."

And, the rewards go both ways, enriching the lives of Foster Grandparents as well.

"I feel an incredible sense of accomplishment, I get the opportunity to spend time with new people and volunteering keeps my skills sharp," Wacek said. "I also receive so much gratitude from the children, their families and even teenagers; being appreciated gives me a sense of well-being. I think everyone wants to feel appreciated and needed."

children and youth at 140 schools and other sites throughout the state. With the COVID-19 pandemic, the service was provided virtually over the past year. Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota will resume in-person volunteering for the upcoming school year. However, there is still the opportunity to volunteer remotely with partner sites that offer remote learning.

Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota is currently seeking volunteers who are age 55 years or older and can commit to at least 10 hours per week.

The Foster Grandparent service offers volunteers a tax-free hourly stipend, a chance to stay connected and a meaningful opportunity to make a difference in the lives of young people. Foster Grandparents receive preservice and ongoing training. More than 20 hours of training is provided and there are a limited number of iPads to loan to volunteers who don't have access to technology for remote volunteering.

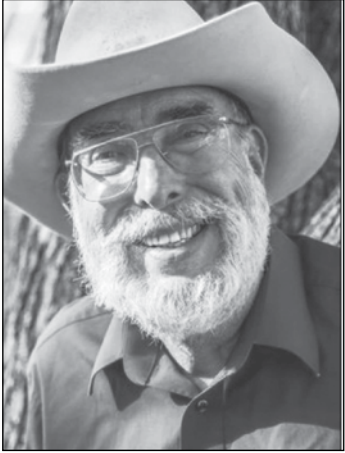

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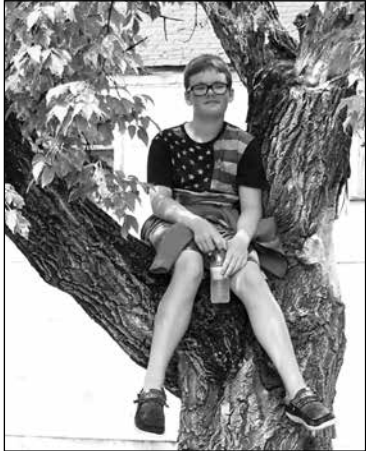
