Construction on Highway 1 planned

BEMIDJI, Minn. – A Minnesota Department of Transportation construction project on Highway 1 east of Red Lake will take place beginning July 25. It includes culvert replacements and turn lane improvements between Red Lake and Reservation Highway 18.

Motorists can expect staged detours, bypass lanes and lane closures.

Red Lake Builders is the contractor for the project. This project will also include resurfacing in 2023. Once complete, the benefits include a safer road, improved drainage, and safer intersections.

The project is expected to be complete by October. Start and end dates could change due to weather and other unforeseeable circumstances.

Foster Grandparents needed as mentors

Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota (LSS) is seeking volunteers for its Foster Grandparent program, in partnership with AmeriCorps Seniors, a national service agency, to offer guidance and encouragement to at-risk children and youth in the community.

Foster Grandparent volunteers are older adults who traditionally offer one-to-one mentoring in the classroom and other settings to children and youth who may be experiencing academic or social challenges. Their presence and reassurance can help children and youth improve self-esteem, social and emotional development and literacy and math skills.

"Children benefit from having another adult in their life who is genuinely interested in them, and who wants to spend time with them," shared Sue Wacek, a Foster Grandparent volunteer. "They learn that someone is interested in their future success."

And, the rewards go both ways, enriching the lives of Foster Grandparents as well.

"I feel an incredible sense of accomplishment. I get the opportunity to spend time with new people and volunteering keeps my skills sharp," Wacek said. "I also receive so much gratitude from the children, their families and even teenagers; being appreciated gives me a sense of well-being. I think everyone wants to feel appreciated and needed."

In Minnesota in 2021, 232 Foster Grandparents supported children and youth at 140 schools and other sites throughout the state. With the COVID-19 pandemic, the service was provided virtually over the past year. Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota will resume in-person volunteering for the upcoming school year. However, there is still the opportunity to volunteer remotely with partner sites that offer remote learning.

Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota is currently seeking volunteers who are age 55 years or older and can commit to at least 10 hours per week.

The Foster Grandparent service offers volunteers a tax-free hourly stipend, a chance to stay connected and a meaningful opportunity to make a difference in the lives of young people. Foster Grandparents receive preservice and ongoing training. More than 20 hours of training is provided and there are a limited number of iPads to loan to volunteers who don't have access to technology for remote volunteering.

Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota conducts background checks to ensure safety. The statewide organization serves all Minnesotans and welcomes volunteers from various cultures, backgrounds, traditions and stages in life to inquire. Serving Clearbrook-Gonvick & Area

Adult Education (ABE) has been a mainstay in our communities for decades. For the first few decades it was only for those who needed their GED, but ABE looks vastly different in 2022. There is something for everyone who is 17 or older and learning options abound. You can study from home with just a smartphone and internet connection to hybrid models where you spend some time in class and some online, or if you know that you just can't study independently, then the classroom in Clear Waters Life Center-Clearbrook (CWLC) is for you.

You can enroll in Fast Track classes that meet online four hours a week for eight weeks and cover everything from GED and TEAS Prep to Vocational Soft Skills and Manufacturer's Math. You can earn a Minnesota state-issued Adult Diploma by combining your high school credits, passing GED tests scores, and independent study to meet additional requirements under the guidance of a trained Adult Diploma Program instructor. You can attend to improve your vocational skills like digital literacy (computer skills), earn a ServSafe certificate, write a resume, or brush up on math skills to help your children with their school work.

What is required? Time commitment and motivation to accomplish your goals. No cost to you except actual GED testing costs. The first step is to all Sherry at 763-453-0317 to set up your in-person enrollment and assessment appointments or just for more information. You can start as early as July 12. In person classes meet

on the second floor of CWLC, 256 2nd Ave., SW, Tuesday evenings, 6:00-8:00 PM and Wednesday afternoons 12:30-3:00 PM. Adult Education is provided by the Northwest Service Coop ABE Consortium.

Last month, a scenario played out that is a parent's worst nightmare. A nonverbal five-year-old boy with autism, wandered away from his family's home south of Bagley. After a three-hour search, the boy was found safe by a Clearwater County Volunteer Sheriff's Reserve member and returned safely to his parents. But unfortunately, not all of these scenarios end as well as this one. To help in future cases like this one, I am proud to say that with the financial backing from the TEAM Foundation/TEAM Industries, the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office will become a partnering agency with Project Lifesaver.

What is Project Lifesaver? It is a non-profit organization that provides equipment and resources to law enforcement that helps protect and locate individuals with cognitive disorders prone to wandering. These could be young and older adults with autism, dementia, Alzheimer's disease, or similar conditions.

This program works by fitting individuals with a small transmitter on their wrist or ankle that emits an individualized frequency that trained first responders can use to track their location. At the end of this month, four deputies from the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office will be trained to use the equipment and become certified.

Once certified, we can start taking clients who wish to participate in this program. If interested, families will have the opportunity to enroll their loved ones in the program, and a deputy will assist them with this process. After enrollment, families will hopefully find re-

assurance that their loved one is going to be protected if they should wander from their home.

Project Lifesaver and their partnering agencies have rescued 3,930 individuals throughout the United States and Canada. Locally, Beltrami and Polk counties have this program. For example, one of the last people that went missing in Beltrami County only took about twenty minutes to find. Project Lifesaver will be a tremendous resource for our county, and I am proud to be able to help facilitate this for our county residents. I am also grateful to the TEAM Foundation/TEAM industries for their help in making this project a reality.

We will have more information about this project at the Clearwater County Fair, August 3-7. Please stop by our mobile command post that will be parked near the main entrance to the commercial building. We will be happy to explain, in more detail, the project and how it can work to make families safer. I look forward to speaking with you at the fair.

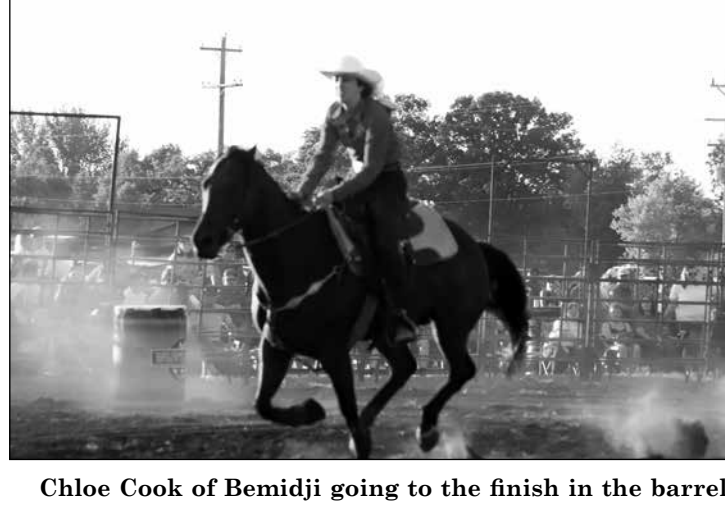

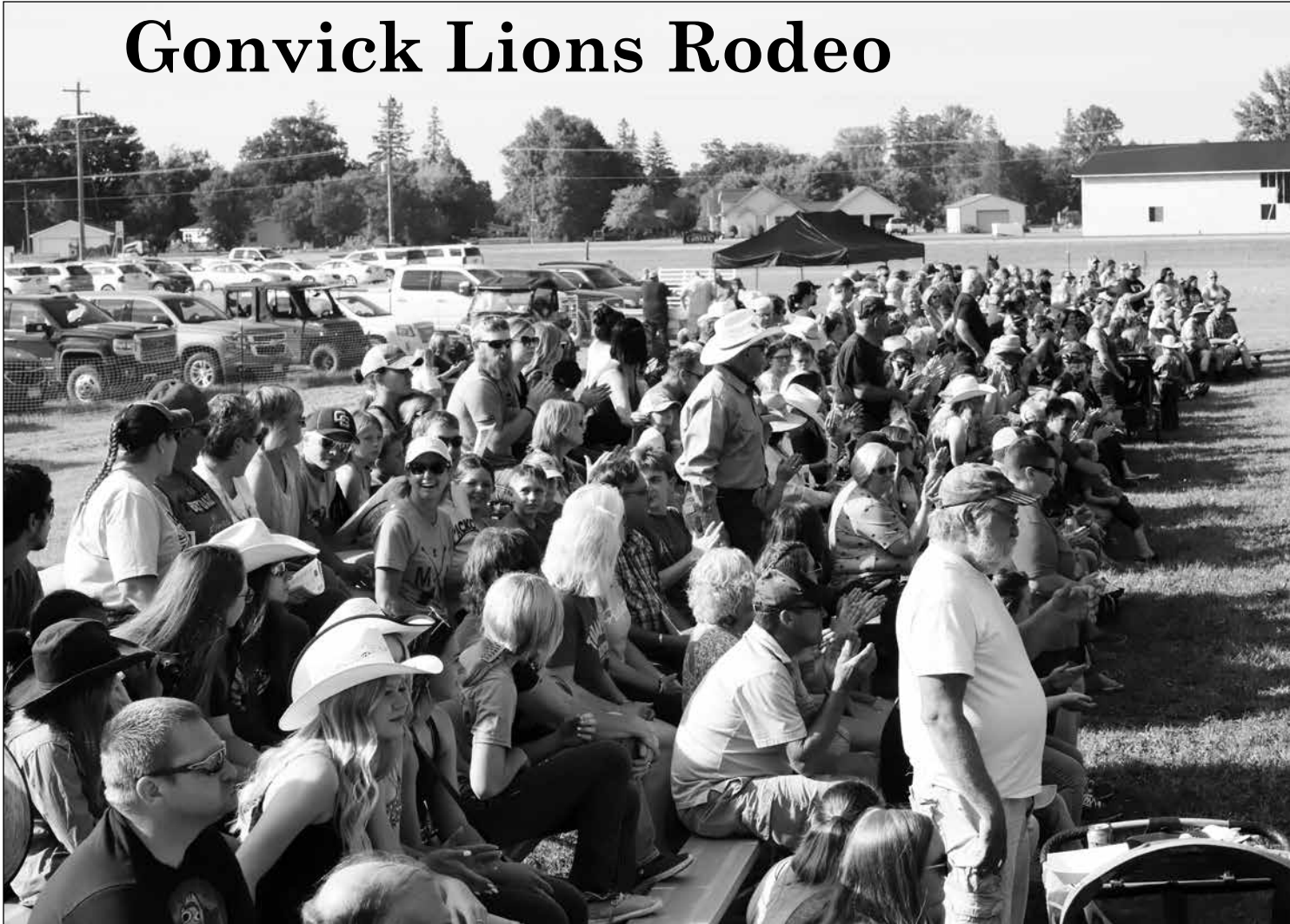
