Snowmobile trails on private land can now be used

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR), Parks and Trails unit, have issued a public reminder to all winter trail users that pre-season use of snowmobile and cross-country ski trails in rural areas may be a violation of state and local trespass laws.

The Clearwater Trail Blazers Snowmobile Club Inc. along with the DNR, would like to remind the public that much of Minnesota's winter recreation trail system is actually built on private land, except for those trails within state parks and public forests.

Most snowmobile trails are Grant-In-Aid Trails and are de-

veloped and maintained as cooperative, cost-sharing projects between the DNR and private snowmobile clubs or local trail associations.

Minnesota's Grant-In-Aid Trail legislation allows trails to be designated for public use by licensed snowmobiles between December 1 and March 31 each season.

The rest of the year—from April 1st thru November 30th—any trail segment on private land is not considered a public trail; and use of the trail by unauthorized persons is a violation of state and local trespass laws. Unauthorized use occurs

primarily on agriculture land in our area when we receive early season snowfall, anyone using a snowmobile trail in off-season should make sure they are on public land and not trespassing on private property. If you ever wonder why we have trails in the ditches, this is the reason!

Please remember the trails are open for use after December 1, if and when snow permits and grooming can begin. We must respect the rights of our landowners or we may lose our right to use their lands. Thank you for your cooperation.

Commissioners meeting held November 29

All commissioners were present for the November 29 Clearwater County Board of Commissioners Meeting.

Following the approval of the agenda, the minutes from the last meeting were reviewed. In the minutes, the wording in one of the motions was discussed. The word in question was "eventually" and was used in the sentence "to approve the board chair as signing authority to eventually enter into a lease agreement with the DNR for the CD3 at Clearwater Lake." Since it has not yet been decided to sign a lease agreement, the commissioners asked that the word be replaced with "potentially".

The Soil & Water Conservation District, represented by Lori Buell & Brielle Prokosch, was next on the agenda to discuss the 2023 budget. At a previous board meeting, the commissioners had asked for the budget to include increased compensation for boat inspectors more in line with surrounding counties. Prokosch presented three different versions of the budget, that included different increases in starting wages. After some discussion Commis-

sioner John Nelson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Dean Newland to approve the 2023 Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Plan and Budget for Clearwater County. The motion passed. The approved budget included an increase from \$13 per hour to \$15 per hour starting rate for boat inspectors.

Deputy Auditor, Trudi Alberg was next on the agenda with three licenses to consider for renewal. Commissioner Newland made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Mark Titera, to approve the application from Knutson's Store for the renewal of their 3.2 beer license. The motion passed. Commissioner Newland made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Neal Illies, to approve the renewal application from Rock Creek General Store for an off-sale liquor license. Motion passed. Commissioner Mark Larson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Nelson, to approve the renewal of an off-sale, on-sale, and Sunday liquor license for Sportsman's Lodge, pending continuance of insurance. Motion passed.

Environmental Services Director, Dan Hecht presented two price quotes for snowplow attachments. At a previous meeting, Hecht had indicated that county staff would be handling snow removal at the remote collection sites this year, since Jerry Illies is no longer able to do so. This would require a snowplow to be purchased at attached to a county owned pick up. Commissioner Titera made

a motion, seconded by Commissioner Larson, to authorize the purchase of a snowplow, including installation, from Willberg's Auto Center, according to Order #74836 dated 11/15/22 in the amount of \$7,804.33 to be paid from recycling account #299-6615. Motion passed.

Sheriff Darin Halverson was next on the agenda. Halverson explained that now that the Sentence to Serve program is in operation again, there is a need for two pieces of equipment. The commissioners approved the purchase of a Stihl backpack leaf blower from Willberg's Auto Center for \$529.99 and a Bobcat ZT3500 61" zero turn lawn mower from North Country Hardware for \$8,694.00.

The final item on the agenda was a closed session for the commissioners to conducted annual department evaluations.
