Westrum honored at Clearbrook-Gonvick school

Wes Westrum was honored with a shadow box at the Clearbrook-Gonvick School last week. Tim Westrum, a resident of Clearbrook, saw that an Adam Thielen jersey had been put up in the school so he wanted to honor his relative Wes. Adam is wide receiver today for the Minnesota Vikings from Detroit Lakes.

Wes was a professional baseball player, coach, manager, and

scout. Westrum started in minor league baseball and played for the Minneapolis Millers. He played for 11 seasons as a catcher in Major League Baseball for the New York Giants from 1947 to 1957. He served as the second manager in the history of the New York Mets, replacing Casey Stengel. He was a manager of the Giants and after that became a scout

for the Atlanta Braves until he retired in 1992. Wes was on the cover of the first Sports Illustrated magazine in August of 1954. He was the catcher for the New York Giants and Milwaukee Braves Eddie Mathews was at the bat. The magazine sold for 25 cents. Now a yearly sub is \$65 unless you can find subscription specials. He retired to Arizona and to Clearwater Lake near Clearbrook. He passed away May 28, 2002 at the age of 79.

Wes had two brothers and one sister, Harris and Lyle Westrum and Frances (Westrum) Goudge. Their parents were Harry and Mabel (Pallister) Westrum.

Lyle started in minor league baseball and played for the Joplin Miners. He was also a

catcher. The Joplin Miners were in the Western Association in 1950. There were 8 teams in that league. The batting stats show Lyle was second to Mickey Mantle in the Joplin Miners. Mickey Mantle led the league and Lyle was 7th over all 8 teams.

Lyle passed away in 1972, Frannie is 1981, Harris is 2001, and Wes in 2002.

All viruses collected and evaluated this season have been susceptible to influenza antivirals.
An annual flu vaccine is the best way to protect against flu. Vaccination helps prevent infection and can also prevent serious outcomes in people who get vaccinated but still get sick with flu. CDC recommends that everyone ages 6 months and older get a flu vaccine annually. Now is a good time to get vaccinated if you haven't already.
There are also prescription flu antiviral drugs that can be used to treat flu illness; those need to be started as early as possible. You need to contact your healthcare provider to determine if this is the right treatment for you.
