Dyrdaahl races went on last weekend

The Gerald Dyrdaahl Memorial Pine Lake 200 races for December 17th and 18th 2022 had to be postponed to New Years weekend, December 31st and January 1st. The races had an excellent turn out despite the change in dates.

Gerald was born March 19, 1948, at Bagley, the son of Eugene and Wanda (Eck) Dyrdaahl. He attended Gonvick School. He died at the age of 49 in November of 1997. He was a specialist 5 in the United States Army in Vietnam from June 1967-1969. He received the Purple Heart, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal and the Good Conduct Medal.

Gerald was known for his mechanic ability and knowledge of high-performance snowmobiles. He loved snowmobile racing and was the 1995-1996 I.S.O.C. mechanic of the year. He loved racing and the race at Pine Lake was named after him.

Over \$62,000 was given away as prizes both from the many sponsors that they had and a percentage of the entry fees that the racers paid to ride.

Besides the money, plaques were given to the winners and other drawings were held.

Kristy Larson of Oklee won the Argo 4-Wheeler; Ethan Larson of Fosston won the Winchester Upland Field 12 gauge Nickel Walnut gun; Lonnie Carda of New Ulm won the \$500 Arctic Cat Certificate; Maria Pake of Felton won the Ski Doo Certificate and Donnie Hamrick of Warren won the Polaris certificate.

states including Grand Lake, CO; Green Bay WI; End Well, NY; Sioux Falls, SD; Brookings, SD; Kindred, ND; Van Dyne,

WI along with the many racers from Minnesota.

The family has kept the tradition going for these 25 years.

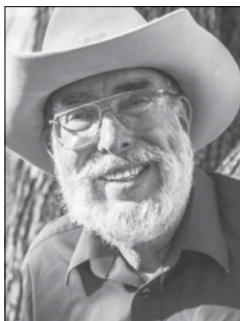
Doc was just getting up to leave the philosophy counter as Herb walked in. Herb was grinning and flexing muscles and had the look of eagles in his eyes. We stared.

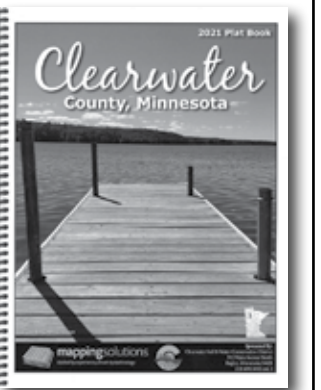

A Year in Review, 2022
Letter to the Editor
1/3/2023
2022 was a good year for Clearwater County and its Veterans. Clearwater County saw more Veterans in 2022 than it did in any other year since 2012. The Veteran Service Office keeps track of all the statistics regarding the VA and Clearwater County Veterans. The good news is that this office is seeing more and more activity. In 2021 there was 299 face to face visits with Veterans in the county. In 2022 this number was 374 face to face visits. I am so very glad that the community allows for us to serve it and very happy to see the numbers increasing. This tells me that the public trusts our office more and more and that is exactly what we want at Clearwater County. Currently this office has 120 active claims to the VA for Veterans.

The other great thing for Clearwater County is that the federal dollars coming into the county are the highest they have ever been. This money coming into the county either gets paid to Veterans directly or spent on other categories. These include healthcare, education, life insurance, etc. These expenditures are published 5 months after the year end. The last reported numbers we know for the federal dollars coming into the county were for 2021. These are the highest they have ever been. Clearwater County Veterans received \$9,931,000 in year 2021 which is a \$734,000 increase from 2020. This may sound like bragging, that's because it is. We at the county want to continue seeing both the number of face to face visits and dollars to Veterans increase. I want the public's help in doing this. This means pestering your Veteran friends to look into their VA benefits. Please help us in our endeavor to better the county and its Veterans. Happy New Year.

Solveig "Sally" Gunning 1922-2011
Solveig or Sally was born on September 20, 1922 in Hemne Norway. She came to America with her parents, Johan and Jonna Kvande, and five brothers and sisters when she was three years old. The family lived in New York for a while, then St. James Minnesota and then came to the Bagley area in 1927.



Sally attended school in Bagley, but did not graduate. She earned her GED in 1970 at age 48. Sally and her mother owned several restaurants, including Kvande's Café in Bagley. Sally married Earl Gunning on July 6, 1945 in Bagley while he was home on furlough during WWII. They farmed north of Clearbrook on the Gunning Family farm. They raised 4 children: Carolyn, Patricia, Ronald and Steven. Besides farming, Earl also worked on the Great Lakes for 21 years. They retired to Parkview Apartments in Bagley in 1984 and Earl died in 1993. Sally worked as the activity assistant at Good Samaritan Home in Clearbrook and was

also the volunteer director of the Good Samaritan Kitchen Band. Sally played the "Omni chord" an electric synthesizer. Music was very important to her. A member of Elim Church, Sally was the assistant director of the Sunday school, and involved in Vacation Bible School and release time. She was also active in the Mission Friends. Later she became a member of the Faith Hill Assembly in Bagley and volunteered at the Christian Book Store. She also volunteered to drive people to doctor and rehab appointments. Sally died on May 17, 2011 at the Cornerstone Assisted Living in Bagley. She is buried at Elim Cemetery in Clearbrook.
