Clearbrook-Gonvick board holds last meeting of the year

The Clearbrook-Gonvick School board held a Truth and Taxation meeting at the beginning of their board meeting on Monday, December 19. Superintendent Ryan Grow went through a visual presentation of collected information. The per pupil unit for students has been \$1,263 since 2003. Most districts are underfunded. He gave projected estimates of \$8,554,117 with expenditures of \$8,183,310 for a net of \$370,807. He went over property classifications for the coming year. Long term facility maintenance with the roof and interior surface for the floors being the biggest issues.

Mr. Bettin gave the Spotlight on Education for December activities and Santa's visit to the ECFE room was a big hit. Some of the many things going on were Robin Proffitt, Food Services Director had Christmas cookie decorating and ornament making. That put K to 12 together to get the project done, which Bettin said was a good thing. The fourth grade had a chess tournament. The fifth grade had students going to a Creativity Festival in Bemidji. There was also a building snowman competition.

Principal's report
Josh Tharaldson gave a shout out to Tammy Ragan for putting together another fabulous elementary Christmas concert with the K-3 grade student. Mrs. Ragan has only 25 minutes with each class and does an outstanding job.

The music departments with Mrs. Ragan and Mr. Huppert will be preparing for contests at the end of February when they get back to school.

Tharaldson attended the MN School Violence Prevention Symposium that was held in Waite Park. Much information and ideas related to school safety were given by great speakers.

Scott Schafer, school guidance counselor has been working with the Direct Admissions, MNPilot Program. The goal is getting seniors to start thinking about attending college after high school. Three seniors participated in the program by sending their information to colleges of their choice based on their GPA and other academic information.

K-6 teachers will be completing the winter FastBridge screening January 9 to 13 in their classrooms. This includes math and reading and will have behavior screenings included this time.

Tharaldson received information from the Department of Education that both the Agriculture and Industrial Arts Five year Program Approvals were approved by the state. Both Jack Johnson and Monica Johnson had possible partnerships with local businesses and other relevant information about the Career and Tech. Ed courses that the school offers.

School will resume on January 2 after Christmas Vacation. There will be no school as on January 16 as there is a Teacher In-service. The end of the semester will be January 20.

Superintendent report
Ryan Grow informed the board that Brittany Lefebvre has joined the staff as a Special Education Paraprofessional. To be a Special Education teacher is her goal. They have two candidates for the full time custodian position which they will be interviewing.

The district is working on the World best Work Force and they are meeting their goals.

Ryan and Vern Wittenberg, school board member, will be attending the MSBA Leadership conference in January.

At the present time snow days will not have to be made up. Hope there aren't that many for the rest of the year.

The new legislative session will be starting up and wondering how the money will be dispersed. Grow urged board members to voice their concerns to legislative representatives about funding for school districts.

They were able to get ride of more excess furniture.

The district should be looking at estimates for sanders for sanding the parking lots, The Bagley school district helped out and they want to avoid the risk of falls on the slippery ice.

Robin Proffitt and Janice Anderson, owner of the Drive In in Clearbrook are working on details for having ice cream sold at the concession stand.

Enrollment for the district is up one more to 542.

New Business
The board hired Brittany Lefebvre as a Paraprofessional; approved the lateral job class move of Danielle Derby from Food Service to Paraprofessional; approved the final levy and certification of 42,567,102.38.

The district had to change the polling place from the school to the City of Clearbrook, City Hall as request from the county.

The board passed a motion to use Vaaler as the District's Employee Insurance & Benefits Advisor/Broker for the 23-24 school year. Cost for that is built into the employees plan and not the school district.

The board approved the contract with the Nursing Service for \$31,305 from \$28,476. They are available each week day from 8 to 3:30 in the building but not on Wednesday.

The board set up a work session date for January 4 at 6:30 p.m.

The next regular school board meeting will be on January 23 as the 16th is Martin Luther King Day.

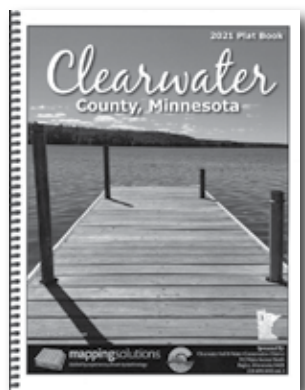

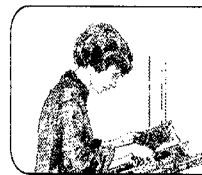

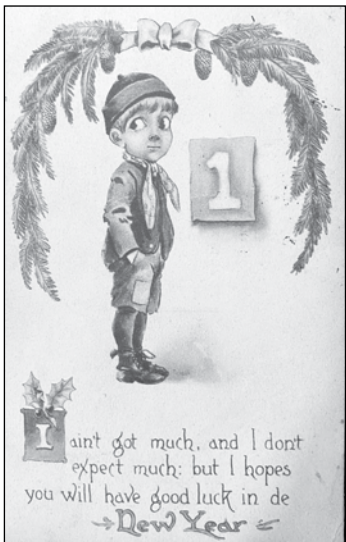
Curling is back again.
