“Schoolhouse Rock, Live!” This Weekend at Bagley High School

When you mix catchy tunes, talented students, and a colorful set, you get a rockin' good time! The Bagley High School Drama students have been rehearsing daily to polish their spring musical show, “Schoolhouse Rock, Live!” It is set to stage this weekend – Friday and Saturday, April 14 & 15 at 7:00 p.m. and on Sunday the 16th at 2:00 pm in the Bagley High School Auditorium. Tickets are \$8/adults and \$5/students and will be sold at the door beginning 30 minutes prior to each performance.

This year, the cast is led by eighteen strong senior high students who are joined by eleven junior high students, and nine elementary students, making it a fun and energetic show.

The show is based on the educational cartoon from the late 70's and 80's, “Schoolhouse Rock” written George Newall and Tom Yohe. A young teacher, Tom, is nervous about his very first day of teaching school. As he thinks about his day, the creative thoughts in his head emerge as characters around him, reminding him that he has all the knowledge, creativity, and preparation to teach grammar, mathematics, science, and history, all through musical numbers like “Conjunction Junction,” “Three is a

Magic Number,” “Unpack Your Adjectives,” and “Interjections!”

Students have had fun creating a brightly colored, multi-level set with the help of director Marilyn Hood and set construction expert, Mike Malterud. Complete with a giant pencils, crayons, books, television screen, and a blackboard, the scene displays aspects of a classroom. Josh Gunderson is the assistant musical director, and

Andrea Neeland accompanies the show with drummer Andy Anderson keeping the beat.

The play adaptation is the creative genius of Scott Ferguson, George Keating and Kyle Halland with music and lyrics by Lynn Ahrens, Bob Dorough, Dave Frishberg, Kathy Mandry. It is licensed through Music Theater International, LLC.

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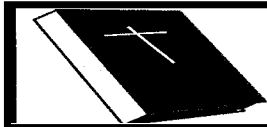
First Lady Tickets now available!

Thoughts from the Sheriff

Clearwater County
Sheriff Darin Halverson



This month, telecommunications (dispatchers) are honored during the week of April 9-15. Next month, correctional officers are being honored May 7-13. In Clearwater County, these two professions are combined into one and are called Communication Corrections Officers (CCO). The men and women who work as CCO's are essential to the overall success of public safety within our county. This month I want to let everyone know more about what a CCO does and what sacrifices they make on a daily basis.

So, what does it take to be a CCO for the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office? Here in Clearwater County, our dispatch center is located in our jail. All 911 calls and other emergency and non-emergency calls to the Sheriff's Office are answered here. We have a staff that is on duty 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, including holidays. When everyone else is enjoying a holiday with their family, CCO's have to be on duty to take emergency calls and to watch over and care for the inmates within the jail. They often have to miss birthday parties and other family functions as part of their job. When you are home sleeping at night, they are on duty.

Something as simple as eating a meal can be a challenge when you are a CCO. Since CCO's can rarely leave their work station, they often take their meal breaks at their station. If a 911 call comes in or an incident happens in the jail, their meal is put on hold. They cannot simply ignore their duties and take a break in a comfortable break room. Meals are often left to get cold.

The work environment is also challenging. CCO's work in close quarters as the dispatch center and jail control room are one. CCO's have to learn how to not only co-exist with their fellow workers on their shift, but also other law enforcement officers and the public. This can be a struggle at times as everyone wants something and they want it now. In this profession, patience is a virtue.

Another major function of a CCO is monitoring inmates

in the jail. It is not unusual for CCO's to be cursed at, ridiculed and sometimes spit at for something that is out of their control. The inmates may be mad at the arresting officer or simply at the situation they find themselves in and take it out on the CCO's. A CCO is expected to keep their emotions in check when faced with these circumstances. In addition, mental health and drug addiction are becoming more prevalent with inmates when they enter our jail. These pose many challenges to the staff and add additional workload to them.

On top of all the duties of a CCO, stress is ever present. They must keep up on all the new technology that is rapidly changing and master those changes in a short period of time. Policy and procedure changes often occur and they must keep up on those as some are changes mandated by the state. Add in a 911 call where someone's life is hanging in the balance, you can only imagine the stress a CCO endures.

It takes a rare breed to work in this environment and I am very proud of the CCO's we have in our county. The professionalism and dedication shown by the CCO's is what sets them apart. The job is not cut out for everyone. What I've written about in this article is just a snap shot of what a CCO has to endure, but you get the idea of what they go through and what it takes to do the job.

So next time you call into the Sheriff's Office, take a moment to thank the person on the other end of the line for the tough job they do. They work behind the scenes to keep all of us safe. It can be a very thankless job, so I just want to say thank you for your service to this office and to the entire county. Your work does not go unnoticed.

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Minnesota’s moose count down; population remains relatively stable

This year's population estimate of 3,290 moose marks a decade of Minnesota's moose population remaining relatively stable, according to the results of the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources' 2023 aerial population survey.

Although the estimate dropped from 2022's estimate of 4,700, the change continues to reflect the population stability observed in previous years. After a decline from a population estimate of approximately 8,000 in 2009, Minnesota's moose population appears to

have stabilized at about 3,700 animals in recent years.

Stabilized doesn't mean the population is constant, said John Giudice, DNR wildlife biometrician. Instead, annual changes since 2013 appear to be relatively small on average and random, with some years showing a population increase and others a decrease.

Although survey results suggest a decrease in the moose population from 2022 to 2023, those estimates are better used to understand long-term trends. Factors such as visibility of

moose from the air, challenging weather conditions and moose avoidance of aircraft create moderately high sampling uncertainty. That uncertainty makes it difficult for researchers to make confident statements about the magnitude of annual population changes unless those changes are relatively large.

But data collected recently by researchers with the Grand Portage Band of Lake Superior Chippewa suggest the magnitude of this year's decline could be more than an artifact of

sampling. They have reported high mortality rates on collared moose and similar decreases in aerial surveys around Grand Portage and Isle Royale. Continued comparisons in coming years will help answer that question.

The 2023 DNR survey results showed that calves comprised an estimated 16% of the population and the estimated calf-cow ratio was 38 calves per 100 cows. Those estimates are slightly lower than last year's figures but are comparable to values observed during the last 10 years, especially considering moderate-to-high levels of sampling uncertainty. Both factors are key indicators of reproductive success.

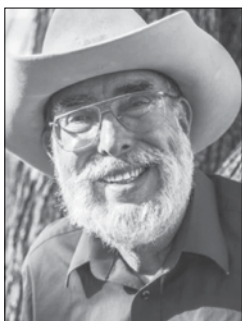
While estimates suggest continued stability in the population and reproductive success, DNR researchers point out that Minnesota moose remain at risk given long-term trends

Nora Norquist
1905-2006

Nora Lily Esther was born in Weme on July 27, 1905 to Lars and Sophia Nordlund. She was the youngest of 13 children. Lars and Sophia had come to Clearwater County in 1897 and homesteaded in Eddy Township.

Nora married George Norquist on Nov. 27, 1930, in Bagley. George owned and operated the City Meat Market in Gonvick, and she assisted him when needed. When they first married, Nora and George lived in an apartment behind the meat market until they built a new home in the 1940's.

They were lifelong residents of Gonvick. George served as mayor, and he served on the council and was very involved in

the fire department. They were active participants at Samhold Lutheran Church and involved members of the Gonvick community.

Nora and George raised three children; Richard, George and Marilyn. Nora was primarily a homemaker. She was creative and enjoyed many pastimes, including sewing and quilting, gardening and reading.

George died in 1982. Nora lived another 24 years, later moving to Chisago City MN to a nursing facility there. She died on Thanksgiving Day Nov. 23, 2006 at age 101.
