Honor Flight Veterans

On April 30, four veterans from Bemidji were selected to be on the ND/MN Honor Flight to Washington DC. Army Vietnam veterans Dennis Clemenson, Michael Liapis, David Sjostrom, and Air Force veteran Don Delap departed Fargo to Washington DC with several hundred citizens, including Police, firemen and other military groups saw them depart. There are two Honor Flights per year that select veterans from ND

and MN to have this privilege. There were 185 veterans on this flight, that served in the Vietnam war, and some veterans from the Korea conflict aboard. Many historic sites were visited to include Vietnam Wall, Lincoln Memorial, United States Archives, Army Museum, and Fort McHenry where the Star Spangled Banner was inspired

Clearwater County board met May 16

The Clearwater County Board of Commissioners met on May 16, with all commissioners in attendance. This meeting had a short agenda with four department reports.

County Attorney – Kathryn Lorschbach requested permission to advertise for the hiring of an Assistant County Attorney. Motion by Larson/Titera, motion passed.

Sheriff Dept. – Sheriff Halvorson requested permission to hire William Alley as a part-time Communications Corrections Officer effective 5/16/23. Motion by Dukek/Nelson, motion passed.

Auditor – Allen Paulson submitted invoices for review. Commissioner Dean Newland made a motion to authorize the Auditor to pay submitted invoices of \$75,012.45 from the County Revenue Fund and \$3,571.92 from the Nursing Service Fund. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Mark Larson and was passed.

Maintenance – Derek Loiland has been busy planning multiple maintenance projects for the next few months and had several purchase estimates for the commissioners to review. Purchase of toilets and sinks from Goodwin Company for a cost of \$7,011.98. Funds will come from the Buildings and Grounds account. Dukek/Larson, motion passed. The next few requests were for upgrading the elevator in the courthouse to meet code. OTIS Elevator Company for parts and labor totaling \$82,500. Cost to be paid from American Rescue Plan Act

(ARPA) fund. Titera/Newland, motion passed. RJK Electric to be the electrical contractor for the elevator upgrade. Parts and labor totaling \$4,340, with cost to be paid from ARPA fund. Larson/Nelson, motion passed. Northland Fire Protection for elevator upgrade. Parts and labor totaling \$2,171.20. Costs to be paid from ARPA fund. Nelson/Dukek, motion passed. Clarity Glass to install automatic door closer and lever style self-locking lockset on the elevator mechanical door. Parts and labor totaling \$576.00. Costs to be paid from ARPA fund. Titera/Larson, motion passed. The next project is HVAC upgrade that will be started in 2023 and completed in early 2024. Proposal from TRANE for parts and labor totaling \$874,211. ARPA funds will be used to pay \$847,458.08 (this is the last of the ARPA funds) and Buildings and Grounds fund will be used for the remaining \$26,752.92. Dukek/Newland, motion passed. In conjunction with the HVAC upgrade, soffit panels on the 2nd floor of the courthouse will be replaced. Les Janssen estimated that labor and materials would total less than \$5,000. Building and Grounds fund to be used for this project. Commissioner Mark Larson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner John Nelson, to allow up to \$5,000 be spent. Motion carried.

Update from Congress – Ken Heinzman, a representative from Congressman Pete Stauber's office visited with the commissioners to ask questions and give a brief update on what has been going on in congress.

Commissioner Mark Titera asked about the status of removing Wolves from the endangered species list. Heinzman replied that Congressman Stauber was in support of these efforts, but

the final decision ultimately is in the hands of the MN DNR.

There being no further items on the agenda, the meeting was adjourned. The next meeting will be held May 30th.

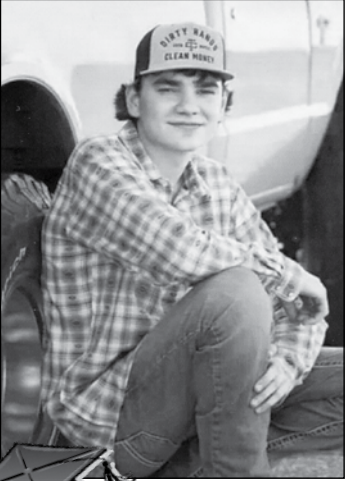

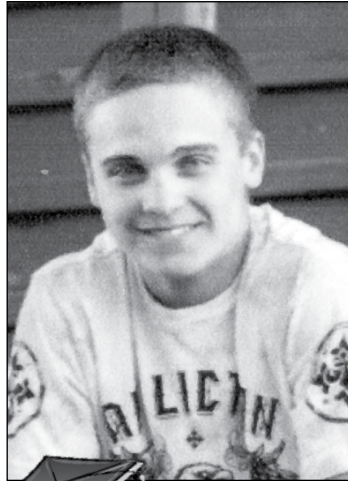

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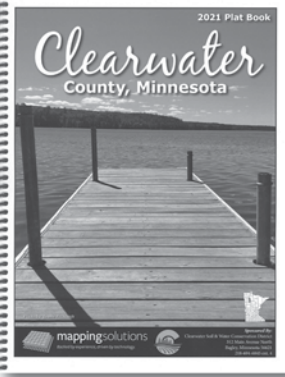

WHERE ARE THE TAX CUTS?
St. Paul, MN —

With only days remaining in the 2023 legislative session and no end in sight for a conference committee that will set tax policy in the state for the next two years, State Representative Matt Grossell (R – Clearbrook) is wondering if Minnesotans will see any tax relief. Minnesota has a \$17.5 billion surplus while residents are struggling to pay their bills.

"The Biden/Walz economy is crushing Minnesotan's pocketbooks." Said Rep. Grossell on the economy. "I come down to the capitol each week because I want to help constituents, not stick them with the bill for the Democrat's out of control spending."

Among the Democrats' broken tax relief campaign promises:

- Social Security Tax Relief. Despite nearly universal agreement among Democrat candidates to eliminate the unnecessary taxation on Social Security benefits for all of Minnesota's senior citizens, talks of following through on that promise disappeared almost immediately after the Legislature gavelled into session in January. Recently, talks resumed on increasing the number of seniors who might qualify for taxation exemption, but a full elimination for all elderly residents is almost certainly dead.
- Baby Products. Among the decisions the Democrat-controlled Taxes Conference Committee has made is to remove an overwhelmingly bipartisan provision that would eliminate sales taxes from baby products. This tax exemp-

tion provides meaningful support for all parents in Minnesota as they expand their families and is especially helpful for first-time parents who may be overwhelmed at the costs of bringing a baby home safely.

- Rebate Checks. Following Rest's comments about an "insatiable appetite to raise taxes" will talks of providing rebate checks disappear? Governor Walz began session by stating that he wanted \$2,000 rebates sent to married couples making \$150,000 or less and \$1,000 checks sent to single filers making \$75,000 or less each year. As it stands today, legislative Democrats are only offering \$550 for the same joint filers and \$275 for singles. Could this amount decline even more or be eliminated altogether as the surplus well runs dry?

- Gas Tax Increase? The Democrats found plenty of taxes and fees to raise in the transportation arena – including a ¼ cent Metro Area sales tax and increases on license tab renewals and the motor vehicle sales tax, to name a few – but raising the gasoline tax in the face of a mammoth budget surplus was supposed to be off the table. Now, in the waning hours of this session, Democrats won't rule out having the gas tax tied to inflation, which would further financially devastate drivers who are currently paying nearly \$4 per gallon.

The DFL has brought forward nearly \$10 billion in proposed tax increases despite the record \$17.5 billion budget surplus. These include deeply unpopular delivery taxes — already dropped by the Senate DFL — along with billions in sales tax increases, payroll taxes, fee increases, and additional unpopular and unnecessary tax and fee increases that take money out of the pockets of Minnesota families.

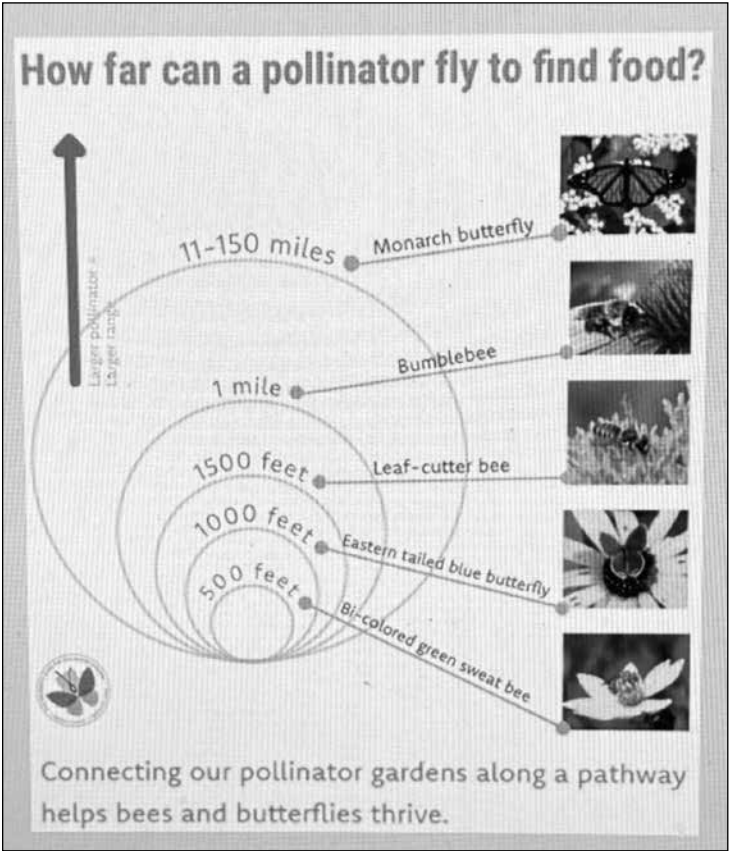
and the Monarch Butterfly.

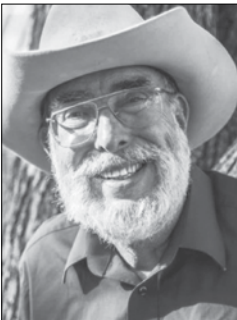

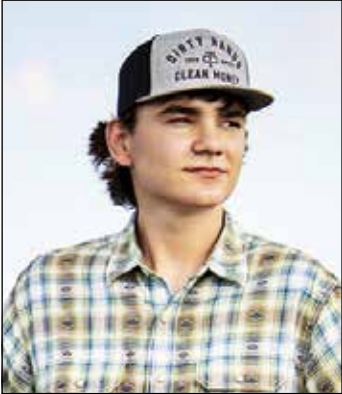
