Clearwater County Historical presents

Poster Exhibition Exploring the Diversity of American Religious Life through Sound

Clearwater County Historical Society Presents Smithsonian Poster Exhibition Exploring the Diversity of American Religious Life through Sound Choirs singing. Monks chanting. The reading of religious texts. These are religious sounds. But so too are the creaking of church pews and the clanking of pots during the preparation of a communal meal. Sounds of Religion is a Smithsonian poster exhibition that explores how rituals and gatherings of religious communities create a complex soundtrack of religions in America that teaches how people behave, how they're different, and how they're alike. The posters will be on view at the History Center in Shevlin, in the Church Building exhibit, now through the end of October.

Through the 12 posters, the exhibition examines what religious sound is, how it can define a community, and where it can be found- from houses of worship and the home to public

spaces and in acts of protest. It also looks at how it can be affected by events like COVID-19. Viewers are invited to listen for sounds that have religious content, religious context, or can be heard in religious communities, and to think about how religion permeates the everyday experiences of American life.

Since 2014, students and faculty in Georgia, Michigan, Missouri, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, and elsewhere have worked together to document the sounds of local religious life. The poster exhibition features recordings and images collected during their work. Through QR codes on the posters, viewers can listen on their smart phones to eight contemporary recordings that serve as an audio portrait of the rich and dynamic differences that make religious life in the U.S. unique.

Americans practice a lot of different religions—Christian-

ity, Judaism, Islam, Hinduism, Buddhism, Sikhism, Wicca, Native American traditions, New Age traditions, and many more. Every tradition creates its own unique blend of music, prayer, voices, and silence, which together help define the beliefs and practices shared by the members of churches, synagogues, mosques, temples, and other places of spiritual devotion. The sounds of faith make some feel they belong, yet they may cause others to feel excluded. The American Religious Sounds Project suggests that listening for the sound of religions in America can help people understand the country more deeply and provides insight into religion itself.

Dahl is 9th District Poppy Poster winner

Becca Dahl, a Clearbrook-Gonvick 5th grade student, was the overall winner in Class II for her Poppy poster entry.

The judging was done at the Minnesota District 9 American Legion Auxiliary convention on Friday and Saturday June 9 and 10. The winning posters will advance to the state competition and winner of that will go on to the Nationals.

Becca received a ribbon, money and a the Christensen-Hoie plaque from Lou Ellen Christensen, the Poppy Chairman.

\$21,727 was raised with the 6,847 poppies that were sold. Poppies were distributed to veterans and used in various displays for Memorial Day and Veterans Day.

Three winners in the three classes were Class II Becca Dahl, Clearbrook Legion Auxiliary Unit #256; Class III Max Erickson, Roseau Legion Auxiliary Unit 24 and Class V Kydee Volker, Fisher Legion Auxiliary Unit #242.

Other placement winners in Class II were 2nd Mason Sotterham Argyle #353 and 3rd Sylis Line-man, Bagley #16. Class III 2nd place Gage Otto, Roseau #24 and 3rd Christine Hanson, Karlstad #445.

Cheryl Grover of Bagley is now the past president of the District Auxiliary, Becky Olson of Moorhead is the incoming president and 1st vice president is Donna Ray Jacobson of Clearbrook.

Can you say “Quasquicentennial” ?

In recent years, we have all become very familiar with the word “Centennial”, commonly used to name a 100th Anniversary. That word rolls off our tongues pretty easily by now. Many area towns, farms, churches and businesses have celebrated a “Cenntennial” within the last couple decades. And, that’s a pretty big deal. But, now as we carry on, we are starting to see a few references to “125th” Anniversaries.

You probably have been wondering what the official word for a 125th Anniversary is.

It’s “Quasquicentennial”. Now you know! And it’s a mouthful, that’s for sure!

About 60 years ago, Merriam-Webster and Funk & Wagnall dictionaries decided this fancy new word was seeing enough common use to officially become a word. The story goes that in 1961, a town in Illinois was going to celebrate their 125 year Anniversary and needed to describe it. They wrote a letter

to the Funk & Wagnall Dictionary people suggesting a word to describe a 125th Anniversary. Their word suggestion was “Cen-quad-tenial”.

Mr. Funk, of Funk and Wagnall, wrote back and said they would be happy to come up with a word for the 125th. However, the Illinois town’s word suggestion didn’t meet all the proper Latin derivative requirements for such a word. Funk and Wagnall folks felt the word should be a modified version of “Sesquicentennial” which was already in place to mean 150th Anniversary. (Sesqui means half). So, they fiddled around with it and came up with “Quasqui”, to put in front of Centennial. “Quasqui” comes from the idea of “quarter or fourth”.

There are varied details of how the word “Quasquicentennial” actually came to be, but in 1965, the word “Quasquicentennial” became an official word in the Funk and Wagnall dictionary, defined as “Pertaining to or marking 125 years”

and “Celebrating 125 years”. It soon was added to Merriam-Webster and other important dictionaries, and became a real word.

On July 16 in Gully, the Lund Lutheran Church congregation will host a grand “Quasquicentennial” (125th Anniversary Celebration). Planning is underway and details are being tuned. Lund Members, Friends, Neighbors and Family are heartily invited to share in this event. So far, you can schedule for a 10 a.m. worship service with special programming and presenters, followed by gathering at the Gully Hall for dinner. So far, the meal is planned to be “something on a homemade bun” (bar-b-que) and Potluck dishes to fill our plates with. Of course, there will be Anniversary cake and ice-cream.

Clean up for Rodeo Days discussed at Gonvick City Council meeting

The Gonvick City council met in regular session on Thursday, June 8 at the community center.

Pledge of Allegiance and minutes were approved from the May 11 meeting.

No visitors were present.

Police report

Ryan Solee gave his report with 19 records for month. They included: Animal Related 1; Animal Trespass 1; City Ordinance 1; Disturbance 1; Information Only 1; Juvenile Misc. 1; Medical 1; Motor Vehicle Crash 1; Pursuit 1; Suicide Related 1; Threats 1; Traffic Stop 5; Trespass 1; Vehicle Lock Out 1; Welfare Check 1.

Blight issues were discussed. Council wanted to remind residents that lawns would need to be mowed. City needs to be cleaned up for Rodeo days that will be coming up July 14 and 15. The council asked the City maintenance department to clean up the concrete slab from the former Vandy's Store before Rodeo time.

The blading of the alleys has been done by Kev's Blading Service. Jorgenson Construction and Backhoe will be bringing in finishing gravel for the area.

They will be ordering rocks from Strata to finish up some of the work that will be done by the city. Funds for this was received from FEMA.

Fire department report

Fire Chief Cody Rude gave his report since the last city council meeting. They had 2 Medical Calls; 0 Fire Calls; 2 Meetings; 0 Work Activities; 0 Mutual Aid Given; 1 Training Burn with Clearbrook on 5-20-2023; Meat Raffles; and one roll over on East Gonvick RD on 5-28-2023.

Rude also presented information on the \$300 million public Safety Aid package and Adult use Cannabis bill.

The adult-use cannabis bill, after months of committee hearings and negotiations, was passed by the House and Senate and signed into law by Gov. Tim Walz. This new law legalizes and decriminalizes adult-use cannabis, expunges prior convictions, and establishes a statewide regulatory framework for the new industry.

With this bill the State of Minnesota is giving \$300 million to local governments for

public safety. The money does include a few limitations on how it can be spent.

The funding has to meet public safety needs. The amount given to each local government is based on its population, with Minneapolis receiving just over \$19 million. Area town figure amounts to \$1,707 for Trail, \$2,669 for Gully, \$11,990 for Gonvick, \$20,173 for Clearbrook \$1,794 for Leonard, \$5,951 for Shevlin and \$56,626 for Bagley.

Monies may not be used to purchase armored vehicles, chemical weapons or tear gas, or spend it on legal fees for officers accused of misconduct.

Rural Service District benefit ratio was set at the same amount of 70% for taxes. This is for residents that live north of the Fire department building on the hill who are residents of Gonvick. The lessor amount is because they have their own water and sewer arrangements.

City Maintenance Dan Johnson informed the council that he had purchased a new meter tester for fluoride, chlorine and other chemicals with a grant of \$2,800 from Enbridge.

Nathan Weems qualifies for State Track meet

Nathan Weems, son of Andrew & Ashley Weems, just completed his Junior year at Clearbrook-Gonvick High School, placed at the 2023 Section 8A Track meet in Roseau this past week, in the 200 meter sprint with a time of 23.6 seconds, advancing his to State. Competing again at the State level on June 8 & 9 at St. Michael-Albertville High School. A huge comeback after his ACL tear during the football season of 2021.

Top three placers in the 200 meter sprint at the 2023 Section 8A Track meet in Roseau. first place 10 Ayo Ogundeji, 23.34a (-0.4) from Nevis who qualified; second place, 11 Nathan Weems, 23.60a (-0.4)PR; from Clearbrook-Gonvick who qualified and 12, Nathan Sedlacek, 23.64a (-0.4) West Marshall who did not qualify.

Nathan came into the meet as an 8th seed, and finished 2nd in the 200 meters

At the State on June 8 Tate Nelson of Two Harbors had a time of 21.94 for first place, Ayo Ogundji from Nevis was 3rd with 22.23 and Nathan Weems from Clearbrook-Gonvick was 14th at 23.28.

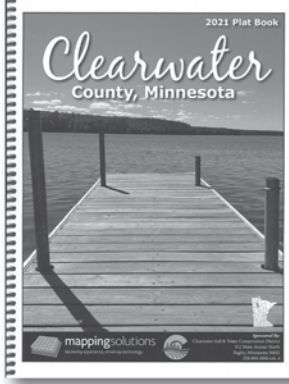

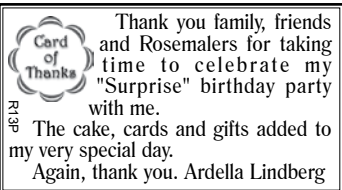

Hunters can choose from two license options. One license is for an antlerless elk, which can be a female or a young male. The other license option is for either a bull or antlerless elk. Hunters should review the elk season structure on the DNR website (mndnr.gov/hunting/elk) prior to entering the lottery to ensure they apply for the license they want.

New this season, the DNR expanded the boundaries of Elk Zone 20 near Lancaster to bet-

ter encompass areas where elk have been during elk hunting seasons. The zone expanded by about 6 miles to the west and 3 miles to the south.
