Clearbrook-Gonvick School receives U.S. News & World-Best Schools Report

A note from Ryan Grow, Clearbrook-Gonvick Superintendent. "We just received some really good and positive communication that Clearbrook-Gonvick Secondary placed among the top 40% of middle schools across the state of Minnesota, making it a U.S. News Best Middle School. Clearbrook-Gonvick Secondary ranked #162 out of 412 schools ranked in Minnesota. Schools are ranked on their performance on state-required tests, graduation, and how well they prepare their students for high school.

Clearbrook-Gonvick Secondary is a public school located in Clearbrook, MN, which is in a remote rural setting. The student population of Clearbrook-Gonvick Secondary is 211 and the school serves 7-12. At Clearbrook-Gonvick Secondary, 27% of students scored at or above the proficient level for math, and 42% scored at or above that level for reading.

The school's minority student enrollment is 27%. The

student-teacher ratio is 25:1, which is worse than that of the district.

The student population is made up of 52% female students and 48% male students. The school enrolls 46% economically disadvantaged students. There are 8 equivalent full-time teachers and 1 full-time school counselor.

The student body at the schools served by Clearbrook-Gonvick School District is 74.5% White, 0.4% Black, 0.4% Asian or Asian/Pacific Islander, 2.2% Hispanic/Latino, 14.5% American Indian or Alaska Native, and 0% Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander. In addition, 7.8% of students are two or more races, and 0% have not specified their race or ethnicity.

Also, 52% of students are female, and 48% of students are male. At schools in Clearbrook-Gonvick School District, 43.4% of students are eligible to participate in the federal free and reduced price meal.

Bagley Arts Council receives Region 2 Arts Council Award

The Region 2 Arts Council Board of Directors awarded \$173,502.00 in Arts and Cultural Heritage Funds to 10 organizations following a community panel review of 15 Season/Series Arts Support Grant applications. Each awarded organization will offer two or more activities that benefit the people of Beltrami, Hubbard, Lake of the Woods, Mahanomen, and Clearwater counties. The funded arts activities must either be designed to remove barriers that audiences may have to accessing arts activities; develop knowledge, skills, and understanding of the arts for all ages; represent the diverse ethnic and cultural arts traditions in our state; or specifically be designed to build bridges between Minnesotans

through arts and culture.

The Bagley Area Arts Collaborative (BAAC) in Bagley was awarded \$18,000 in funds to provide arts activities including workshops for individuals, a two-week artist residency with school age children and community members; and a monthly Arts Studio opportunity at the Bagley Library.

Members of the BAAC gathered on Saturday, December 2, 2023 to receive their "Big Check" from Region 2 Arts Council. The Bagley Area Arts Collaborative will offer the first of a series of Free Saturday Arts Studio opportunities on Saturday, January 20, 2024 with Ruth Ann Nordlund. Cream butter, vanilla, lemon juice, lemon and orange rinds and sugar. Beat in egg yolk. Sift dry ingredients and add to the creamed mixture, mixing until well blended. Drop by ½ teaspoon into egg white that has been slightly beaten. Roll in

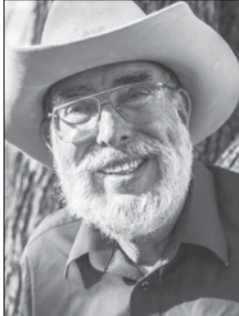
