Voting on March 5 in the county

Commissioners discuss State Senate land transfer bill

The Clearwater County Board of Commissioners met on February 20 with all members present. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the agenda and minutes from the last meeting were reviewed and approved.

Derek Loiland, Maintenance, brought an elevator service contract for the board to review. Commissioner Stuart Dukek made a motion, seconded by Commissioner John Nelson, to approve the 5 year service contract with Otis Elevator Company for \$1,500 per year. The contract would begin March 1, 2024. Motion passed.

Dan Hecht, Environmental Services, brought a proposal to purchase a replacement snowplow. A quote from Willberg's Auto Center for a Boss snowplow was \$4,822.41 with trade-in. Commissioner Dean Newland made a motion to purchase the plow at the quoted price, seconded by Commissioner Dukek. Motion carried. Hecht also stated that his department has begun the process of securing quotes for a new track loader as their current loader continues to have mechanical issues.

Allen Paulson, County Auditor-Treasurer, submitted invoices of \$47,095.49 to be paid from the County Revenue Fund and \$12,109.59 to be paid from the Public Health Fund. Commissioner Dukek made a motion to approve the payment of the submitted invoices, seconded by Commissioner Mark Larson. Motion carried. The next item

discussed was the renewal of a 5 year lease agreement with the Department of Corrections (Probation) for the use of space in the courthouse. Commissioner Newland made a motion to approve the lease renewal, seconded by Commissioner Nelson. Motion carried. Two recommendations from the Personnel Committee were reviewed. The first was changed wording in the Allowable Expenses policy 13.1.2 (A). Commissioner Nelson made a motion to approve the changed wording, seconded by Commissioner Dukek. Motion carried. The second policy recommendation was for adding the following wording to Severance Pay policy 16.5 Pay Out – If an employee retires, the severance pay will be put into a health savings account for that employee through the Minnesota State Retirement System. If the employee terminates employment and has given proper notice, their severance will be paid out to them with their last pay check. Commissioner Dukek made a motion to approve the policy wording change, seconded by Commissioner Newland. Motion carried.

Bruce Cox, Land Commissioner, addressed the board about a senate bill that has been proposed in the state legislature. The bill (SF 3480) has been submitted by State Senator Mary K. Kunesch (39, DFL) and includes the elimination of the White Earth State Forest and the transfer of that land to the White Earth Nation. Sec-

tion 2, subdivision 1 of the bill states that by August 1, 2029, the commissioner of natural resources must convey for no consideration all state owned land within the boundaries of the White Earth Sate Forest to the White Earth Band of Minnesota Chippewa Tribe, except for land that: (1) is school trust land, or (2) is tax-forfeited land held in trust for local units of government. Section 2, subdivision 1 of the bill states that by October 1, 2024, the commissioner of natural resources must establish a White Earth State Forest Transfer Task Force to make recommendations to the commissioner and legislature... The task force must include seven members appointed by the commissioner and must include representatives of the White Earth nation, Forestry Division of the DNR, local governments located near the White Earth State Forest and any other parties as determined by the commissioner.

Questions raised during the discussion included – Would the county be forced to sell tax forfeited land? Would the public have any access to the state forest land after if was transferred to the White Earth Nation? Would this affect deer hunting in the area and businesses that cater to hunters? Cox state that he will continue to watch the status of the bill and give updates to the commissioners.

With no further items on the agenda, the meeting was adjourned.

Let's talk crops! focused on what pays for soybean insect pests

For over 20 years, insecticides have been used to control soybean aphids (SBA) in Minnesota. "Keeping track of the available products has been something of a roller coaster ride," says Dr. Bob Koch, University of Minnesota Extension soybean entomologist, "particularly as it pertains to chlorpyrifos." Its tolerances were revoked in 2022; then in November, the order was vacated, allowing the Minnesota Department of Agriculture to conditionally register

chlorpyrifos for 2024. While chlorpyrifos is an effective tool, it's also associated with health concerns. Koch warns against immediate, widespread use, but instead suggests using it in rotation with other effective insecticides. Pyrethroid insecticides have also been used heavily to control SBA, resulting in an increase of performance failures. Lab assays with SBA have documented pyrethroid resistance, but they couldn't necessarily

predict product performance in the field. A comparison of insecticide field trials from 2005 to 2020 found that a pyrethroid effectively controlled SBA through 2014. However, control deteriorated rapidly after 2014, coinciding with the increase of lab-confirmed resistance. As a result, Koch doesn't recommend using a pyrethroid as the initial SBA control treatment. If aphids are resistant, not only would the insecticide be ineffective, it would kill the natural enemies that suppress SBA populations.

Can pyrethroid resistance be reversed? If aphids displayed a fitness cost when developing resistance, it might be possible for susceptible populations eventually to outnumber resistant ones if pyrethroid use ceased. Instead, the opposite occurred in Koch's study. This suggests that even if pyrethroid inputs were reduced, it's unlikely that populations could become susceptible again.

Managing insecticides to maintain efficacy is critical and cost-effective. In a regional study comparing seed treatments to scouting and using threshold-based recommendations, using the economic threshold (ET) of 250 aphids per plant provided a larger return on investment. Preventative applications are not only costly, they may affect beneficial insects and increase risk for insecticide resistance.

Soybean gall midge (SGM) is a newer pest in Minnesota found throughout much of the southwestern part of the state. The bright orange larvae feed under the outer layers of the stem tissue, causing dark lesions at the base of the plant. Damage can lead to plants breaking off,

Also, pandemic relief programs largely ended in 2022 and early 2023. With the end of these extra sources of income, our local food shelf is where people turn for help.

The wonderful lady who made that parka for me and ran race headquarters and was my wife at that time was named Pam. She died on Christmas Eve.

For the next five years, I

served as a race official. And, after that first year, the minimum-sized team was expanded to nine dogs. I was the only fool, ever, to start that race with only seven dogs.

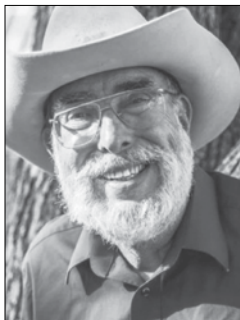
Here, let me bow and introduce myself ... Seven-Dog Slim from Seven-Dog

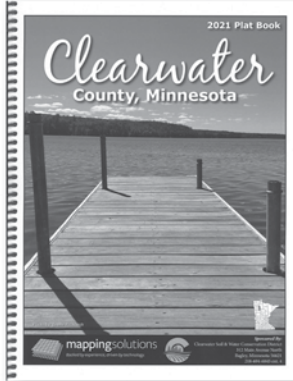

Measles is back in Minne-
sota. A laboratory-confirmed
measles case has been identi-
fied in a hospitalized 16-month-
old resident of Dakota County
who recently returned to the
U.S. after international travel.
The child had not received any
doses of MMR vaccine. The
case was not infectious during
travel.

If you or your children are
not adequately vaccinated, now
is the time to update this vac-
cine. Measles is easily spread
and can lead to serious illness,
even death. Some complica-
tions include pneumonia, very
high fevers to 105.8 and en-
cephalitis which can cause per-
manent brain damage. If you're
pregnant, you need to take
special care to avoid measles
because the disease can cause
premature birth, low birth
weight and fetal death.

Health care providers rec-
ommend that children receive
the measles-mumps-rubella
(MMR) vaccine between 12 and
15 months of age, and again
between 4 and 6 years of age
— before entering school. Most
insurances cover MMR vaccine.
If your insurance does not it
is also available through the
Minnesota Vaccines for Chil-
dren Program. The Minnesota
Vaccines for Children (MnVFC)
program is Minnesota's ver-
sion of the federal Vaccines for
Children program which works
to make all vaccines accessible
and affordable for all children.
Contact your Healthcare Pro-
vider or your local public health
office if you have questions.

The MMR vaccine's two
doses are 97% effective in pre-
venting measles and protecting
against it for life. The percent-
age of 2-year-olds in MN who
had received at least one dose
of MMR vaccine by 24 months
has declined from 83.8% in
2019 (pre-pandemic) to 78.7%
in 2023.

Since the introduction of the
measles vaccine, measles has
virtually been eliminated in the
U.S., even though not everyone
has been vaccinated. This effect
is called herd immunity. But
herd immunity may now be

weakening a bit, likely due to a
drop in vaccination rates. The
incidence of measles in the U.S.
recently increased significantly.

In the late 1990's there were
widespread concerns about
a possible link between the
MMR vaccine and autism.
However, extensive reports
from the American Academy
of Pediatrics, the National
Academy of Medicine, and the
Centers for Disease Control and
Prevention (CDC) conclude that
there is no scientifically proven
link between the MMR vaccine
and autism.

Measles is a highly conta-
gious illness. This means it's
very easily spread to others.
Measles is caused by a virus
found in the nose and throat
of an infected child or adult.
When someone with measles
coughs, sneezes or talks, infec-
tious droplets spray into the air,
where other people can breathe
them in. The infectious droplets
can hang in the air for about
an hour.

The infectious droplets may
also land on a surface, where
they can live and spread for
several hours. You can get the
measles virus by putting your
fingers in your mouth or nose or
rubbing your eyes after touch-
ing the infected surface.

Measles is highly contagious
from about four days before to
four days after the rash ap-
pears. About 90% of people who
haven't had measles or been
vaccinated against measles will
become infected when exposed
to someone with the measles
virus.

Measles causes a red, blotchy
rash that usually appears first
on the face and behind the ears,
then spreads downward to the
chest and back and finally to
the feet. Measles - Symptoms

A total of 58 measles cases
were reported throughout the
United States in 2023, with
an additional nine cases re-
ported already in 2024

the period of redemption begins on
May 7, 2024, and ends approximately
three to five years later, depending
on the type of property and where it
is located. The period of redemption
means the time within which taxes
must be paid to avoid losing the
property through forfeiture.

and costs must be added to pay the
tax in full, contact the Clearwater
County Auditor's Office, Clearwater

1 cup apple cider vinegar
1 T salt
Combine all ingredients in a large pan. Bring to a boil, turn to simmer. Simmer 2-3 hours or until desired thickness. If you want to can this, pour into sterilized jars and water bath for 15 minute for pints or 20 minutes for quarts. The number of jars you get will depend on your thickness. You can probably figure on 3-4 pints.
