School Board passes resolution on Obligation Refunding bonds

The Clearbrook-Gonvick school board at their meeting on Monday, October 17 passed a resolution on the Refunding Bonds. The purpose of the resolution was to reduce future debt service payments and property tax levies through the current refunding of the 2018 through 2022 maturities of the School Building bonds for the original amount of \$6,760,000.

The lowest bidder for the principal amount of \$3,665,000 was the Stifel, Nicolaus Company from Birmingham, Alabama for 1.1733% interest rate. There were seven bidders for the project which will result in a savings to the district of \$267,591 for the remaining years of the bond.

Interest rates are lower than estimated in the Pre-Sale Report that was present to the board in August the true interest cost of 1.17% is lower than the Pre-Sale estimate of 1.42%. As a result of the lower rates, the refunding will reduce future debt service payments by \$267,591, compared with the \$234,676. This will cause a reduction in property tax levies payable in 2017-2021 by over \$30,000.

Principals' report

Principal Jeff Burgess gave his report on the Community Input Survey that was held during the registration at the school. There were 99 respondents. Most of them were concerned about the financial stability of the school and the lack of programs. Programs have been added to the district with Robotics, Team Internship, Riverwatch, Car restoration, Elementary music and One-Act play. Also being added have been the Cross County program and the Trap Club.

The School Leadership team is meeting together and they have added a para to the group. The next step would be to add parent involvement.

The Aftercare program for K-4 is progressing. Parents of children in that group are having trouble getting Day Care space for their children after school. Several children would be using the service. Burgess has been setting up guidelines, program activities, pricing guidelines, location, administration and personnel. The program would pay for itself and not come out of district funds.

Superintendent's report

Wayne Olson gave his report to the board. The Title funds amount to \$112,000 for Title 1 and \$27,000 for Title 2. The amount of money that the district receives is dependent on how many sign up for Free and Reduced meals.

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), rolls back much of the federal government's plan in education policy, on everything from testing and teacher quality to low-performing schools. This is taking over for the "No Child Left Behind" and will leave more to the states to run and less paperwork.

The Auditors have been at the school and they have a lot of different questions and are being very thorough. No date has been received yet.

Minnesota School Board Association winter conference is coming up the second week in January. Board members were

to let Olson know if they were going to attend.

Parent-Teacher conferences will be using the gym for the first conference. That seemed to work better than going to each individual room. They plan on using e-mail to set up times for meeting.

Consent Calendar was approved. Total cash and investments at the end of September were \$1,788,354.36. Payables included Stein's Bus Service LLC \$59,634.45; BRIC \$37,818.13; Eide Biley \$10,300.00; Clearwater-Polk Electric \$9,676.36; March \$8,857.12; Land O Lakes \$2,421.84 and Anderson Disposal \$1,809.70

The Superintendent

Evaluation was given by Chairman Jeff Westrum. The survey by board members was condensed and Olson is meeting the expectations of the board. He passed the operating referendum and has improved the financial condition of the district. Items to be improved on were seeking way to involve community people and to have a liaison between the two

groups and to participate in various community groups.

New business

The board approved the hiring of long-term sub Linda Brown in reading.

The district is still looking for a couple of basketball coaches for the season.

Andy Anderson Behavior Interventionist at the school gave a report on the "ALICE" program that he attended at Red Lake. "ALICE" is a model for an active shooter situation. It stands for A - Alert, L - Lockdown, I - Inform, C - Counter and E - Evacuate. The only cost to the district would be the instructional supplies and online training. More information on the program will be given.

The board approved the Assurance of Compliance that they were going to comply with state and federal laws.

The board approved the Step 1 on the salary schedule for the Cross-Country Coach. There were nine participants in the group. This was the first year experience and most of them were younger students.

Trick or Treat Safety



"Trick or treat!" That's the phrase shouted with glee by many a youngster across the country every Halloween night. But before your ghosts and goblins trick or treat this year, parents should keep in mind these trick or treating safety tips to make sure the only howls are those of fun.

Trick-or-Treaters Tips
Buy costumes and wigs labeled "flame resistant."
Never walk near lit candles or luminaries while wearing costumes.
Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags to help drivers see you.
Carry a flashlight.
Walk, don't run.
Don't go into a stranger's house.

Stay on Sidewalks.
Don't cut across yards or driveways.
Make sure costumes don't drag on the ground.
Shoes should fit
Avoid wearing masks while walking from house to house.
Carry only flexible knives, swords or other props.
"No sidewalk?" Then walk on the left side of the road facing traffic.
Wear clothing with reflective markings or tape.
Approach only houses that are lit.

Never accept rides from strangers.
Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult.

Parent Safety Tips
Ideally, an adult should accompany young children of any age.

If you buy a costume, look for one made of flame-retardant material.

Older children should know where to reach you and when to be home.

You should know where they're going.

Although tampering is rare, tell children to bring the candy home to be inspected - before consuming anything.

Look at the wrapping carefully and toss out anything that looks suspect.

Homeowner Safety Tips
Make sure your yard is clear of such things as ladders, hoses, dog leashes and flowerpots that can trip the young ones.

Battery powered jack o'lantern candles are preferable to a real flame.

If you do use candles, place the pumpkin well away from where trick-or-treaters will be walking or standing.

Make sure paper or cloth yard decorations won't be blown into a flaming candle.

Driver Safety Tips
Go slow, slow, slow all evening.

Adult Halloween party goers should have a designated driver.

Don't Drink & Drive.
Have a safe and a Happy Halloween!

Teal Pumpkin Project
With the Teal Pumpkin Project, Halloween gets less tricky for allergic kids.

Back in 2012, a Tennessee mom named Becky Basalone had an idea: What if Halloween could be made a little less tricky for kids with food allergies?

Her idea became what is now the Teal Pumpkin Project, a nationwide effort to encourage families - whether their own kids have food restrictions or not - to offer up some non-food treats on Oct. 31. Participation is simple: You just put a teal-colored pumpkin or sign outside your door and offer trick-or-treaters glow sticks, spider rings, Halloween stickers or other non-food goodies, along with or instead of the traditional candies.

This year, the group is thinking bigger, Gregory says: "Our goal is to have a home on every block in America with a teal pumpkin. We hope that it becomes a new Halloween tradition."

There's Still Time to Dormant Seed Your Lawn
Below is an article by U of M Assistant Extension Professor Sam Bauer in turf grass management. Many times there is a small window of opportunity, about a week in early November in the northern part of the state, right before freeze up and snow cover, to finish those last of the season yard jobs. If planting lawn grass has been on your to do list, there's still a window of opportunity.
For over a month now I've been receiving questions that go something like this, "I know I missed the best time for seeding my lawn which is mid-August to mid-September. Can I still seed even though it's October and temperatures have been mild?" My response is always the same, "Just wait, dormant seeding in November will be your best option." It is

very true that if temperatures are warm during the month of October, you could get some seed to establish prior to winter, but temperatures are unpredictable and could change drastically within a day.
So, what do/did you risk by seeding in October? Well nothing really, except the cost of seed. Chances are that a good majority of this seed will germinate prior to winter, and complete loss of seedlings is possible over the cold winter months. Because of this, your time and money are better spent waiting for the appropriate dormant seeding time which is generally mid- to end-November.
Dormant seeding can be conducted with any turfgrass species. This practice involves seeding when temperatures are too low for the seed to germinate prior to winter. Germination prior to winter is bad and seedlings will generally die if they haven't matured. Sometimes it is a bit of a waiting game at this time of year. The trick is to find the time when soils are unfrozen so that seed can be worked in slightly, yet air temperatures must be cold enough so the seed won't germinate. Wait for high daytime temperatures of 35-40 degrees before seeding. You still should be waiting at least two weeks to seed based on the long range forecast for the Twin Cities. Regions of northern Minnesota will be able to seed much sooner, possibly even next week.
Is there an advantage to dormant seeding versus spring seeding? Yes and no. A dormant seeded lawn could mature as much as one month faster in the spring than a spring seeded lawn. This is because some of the germination process actually starts prior to winter in a dormant seed situation, although the shoots still haven't emerged from the seed. When temperatures are adequate in the spring, complete germination occurs. In this case the seed actually dic-

tates when temperatures are warm enough to grow. Just like late-fall, temperatures and weather patterns can be unpredictable in the spring. For this reason, the best timing for spring seeding is difficult to predict, which can delay the timing to actually sow seed. Still, there some negative aspects of dormant seeding to consider. First, because of the spring temperature fluctuations, it is possible to have good seedling establishment initially, but a cold spell during this time will injure these seedlings. Also, there is a greater potential for seed loss over the winter due to erosion and water movement, predation, and decay. These positive and negative aspects should always be considered during this process.

Staff Sergeant Thomas was a Green Beret assigned to Company B, Second Battalion, Tenth Special Forces Group (Airborne), at Fort Carson in Colorado. He joined the Army in 2008 and deployed to Iraq in 2008 for 12 months and to Afghanistan in 2011 for 9 months. Staff Sergeant Thomas was awarded the Bronze Star Medal and Purple Heart Medal, among other commendations. Staff Sergeant Thomas passed away on Tuesday, October 4, 2016, at thirty-one years of age in Nangarhar Province, Afghanistan. He is survived by his wife, Mackenzie, and his parents, Dr. Will and Candace Thomas, of Marshall, Minnesota. 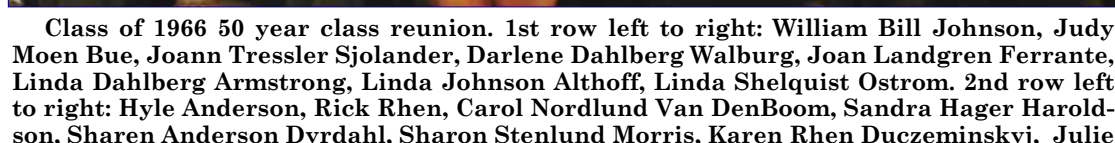
