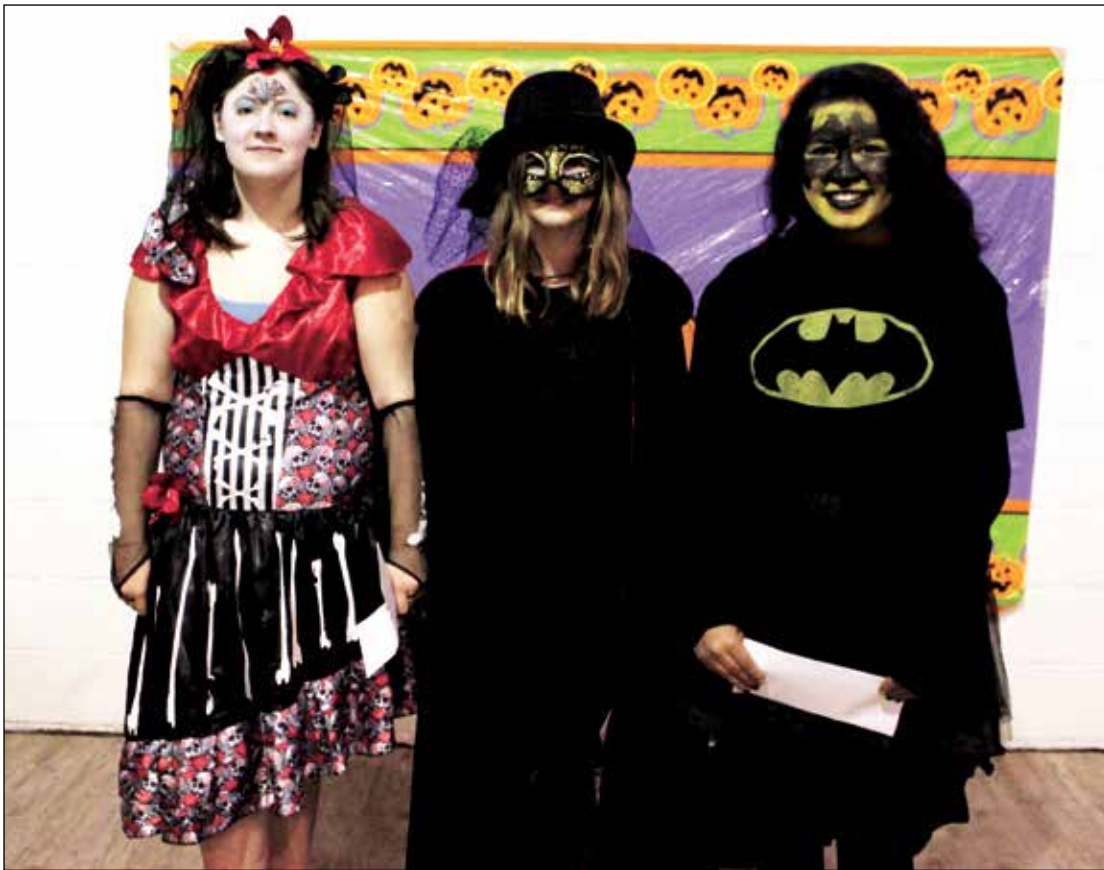

Remembering Veterans Friday, November 11



On Friday, November 11, 2016, the United States will celebrate Veteran's Day. On Monday, May 30, 2017, the United States will celebrate Memorial Day.
Both holidays are dedicated to Veterans; Memorial Day is to honor those Veterans that have died in the service of their country, while Veteran's Day honors all Veterans that have honorably served in the military, both in wartime and peacetime. In fact, Veterans Day is largely intended to thank the living veterans for their service, to acknowledge that their contribution to our national security is appreciated, and to recognize the fact that all those who served, not only those who have died, have sacrificed and done their duty to keep America free.

Clearbrook-Gonvick Veterans Day program November 11

The annual Clearbrook-Gonvick Veterans Program will be held on Friday, November 11th at 10:00 in the morning. It will be held in the gym of the Clearbrook-Gonvick High School.
Veterans are asked to sign up as they come to the program at the school. The Gonvick Legion and Auxiliary is in charge of the program this year.
Special speaker this year will be Candace Coulter a former Marine. She graduated from Clearbrook-Gonvick High School in 1998. She joined the Marine Corps in January 1999 and was honorably discharged in December 2011 as a Sergeant. Candace was stationed in San Diego, CA, Okinawa Japan with brief deployments to Korea and Thailand and North Carolina where she was deployed twice to Al Asad, Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF).
Coffee and donuts will be served after the program by the Gonvick American Legion Auxiliary.

Veterans Day program at Bagley

The annual Bagley High School Veterans Program will be held on Thursday, November 10th at 9:30 in the morning. The Bagley Schools are not in session on actual Veterans Day.
All local veterans are invited to attend. A complimentary lunch will be provided for visiting veterans and their families immediately following the program. Veterans are asked to arrive at least by 9:15 that morning to get registered for announcements during the program. The Veterans Day Guest Speaker is Craig Giddings, First Sergeant, and a fulltime soldier of MN National Guard (not just weekends) for 27 years 7 months and 5 days. He was a tank mechanic at Camp Ripley, MN. He did two tours of service in Iraq, first in 2005 and then 2008. Craig grew up in Onamia, and then moved to Little Falls. Upon retirement from the National Guard he moved to Laporte.

Clearwater County Veterans Memorial

The Clearwater County Veterans Memorial is dedicated to honor the Clearwater County Veterans that have died in the service to their country, and to also honor those Veterans that have served and are presently serving their country. The

Veterans that died in service to their country during wartime are honored on the black marble monuments. The Veterans that have served and are serving their country are honored with the etched field stones that have been placed at the Memorial. Presently, approximately 540 Veterans are honored with the etched field stones.

On the Saturday of Labor Day weekend, there is a motorcycle ride that also honors the Veterans of Clearwater County. This motorcycle ride was originated by, and continues to be promoted by, Jeff Schermerhorn, Bagley, a Vietnam Era Veteran. The 2016 ride, held on September 3rd, raised approximately \$3,217 in donations. These donations, along with an anonymous donation, were contributed to the Clearwater County Veterans Memorial to provide 17 etched field stones honoring Clearwater County Veterans.

The Clearwater County Veterans Memorial randomly selected 17 names from the combined list of Veteran's names that are read at Memorial Day Ceremonies at Rice Lake, Bagley, Clearbrook and Gonvick (this list is comprised of the names of approximately 1700 deceased Clearwater County Veterans from the Spanish American War to the present). The 17 Clearwater County Veterans randomly selected in 2016 are as follows:

ANDREW SJODIN – US Army Veteran that served during World War I, and is buried in the White Oak Cemetery, Hubbard County. Andrew Sjodin was a resident of the Lake Itasca area.

HENRY SWENSON – US Army Veteran that served during World War II, and is buried in Samhold Lutheran Cemetery, Clearwater County. Henry Swenson was a resident of the Gonvick area.

ARNST SOLBERG – US Army Veteran that served during World War II, and is buried in Shevlin/Moose Creek Cemetery, Clearwater County. Arnt Solberg was a resident of the Shevlin area.

PEDER KNUDSON – US Army Veteran that served during World War I, and is buried in Our Savior's Lutheran Cemetery, Polk County. Peder Knudson was a resident of the Clearbrook area.

EMIL GLEN WILLBERG – US Army Veteran that served and died during World War II, and is buried in Zion Lutheran Cemetery, Clearwater County. Emil Glen Willberg was a resident of the Bagley area.

ARNOLD F. HENDRICKSON – US Army Veteran that served during World War II, and is buried in the Camp Ripley Veteran's Cemetery, Morrison County. Arnold F. Hendrickson was a resident of the Shevlin area.

PAUL SCHUPACH – US Navy Veteran that served during World War II, and is buried in the Shevlin/Moose Creek Cemetery, Clearwater County. Paul Schupach was a resident of the Shevlin area.

OWEN JOHN JOSEPH-

SON – US Navy Veteran that served during the Korean War era, and is buried in the Bagley City Cemetery, Clearwater County. Owen John Josephson was a resident of the Bagley area.

ALVIN PETERSON – US Army Veteran that served during World War II, and is buried in the Ebenezer Lutheran Cemetery, Pennington County. Alvin Peterson was a resident of the Gonvick area.

OLAF J. WIDSETH – US Army Veteran that served during World War II, and is buried in the United Lutheran Cemetery, Clearwater County. Olaf J. Widseth was a resident of the Berner area.

FLOYD R. RONNING – US Army Veteran that served during the Korean War era, and is buried in the Forest Hill Cemetery, Pepin County (Durand, Wisconsin). Floyd R. Ronning was a resident of the Bagley area.

HALE GLEN GRABILL – US Coast Guard/US Navy Veteran that served during World War II and the Korean War era, and is buried in the Bagley City Cemetery, Clearwater County. Hale Glen Grabill was a resident of the Bagley/Ebro area.

WAYNE "BUTCH" BERTHOLF – US Army Veteran that served during the Viet Nam War era, and is buried in the Bagley City Cemetery, Clearwater County. Wayne "Butch" Bertholf was a resident of the Clearbrook area.

JOHN M. HOFF – US Army Veteran that served during World War I, and is buried in Landstad Cemetery, Clearwater County. John M. Hoff was a resident of the Shevlin/Moose Creek area.

ELMER OLBEG US Navy Veteran that served during World War I, and is buried in Silver Creek Cemetery, Clearwater County. Elmer Olberg was a resident of the Clearbrook area.

ARNOLD PALMER HIGDEM – US Marine Corps Veteran that served during World War II, and is buried in the Bagley City Cemetery, Clearwater County. Arnold Palmer Higdem was a resident of the Bagley area.

CLARENCE A. ANDERSON – US Army Veteran that served during World War I, and is buried in the Silver Creek Cemetery, Clearwater County. Clarence A. Anderson was a resident of the Leonard/Clearbrook area.

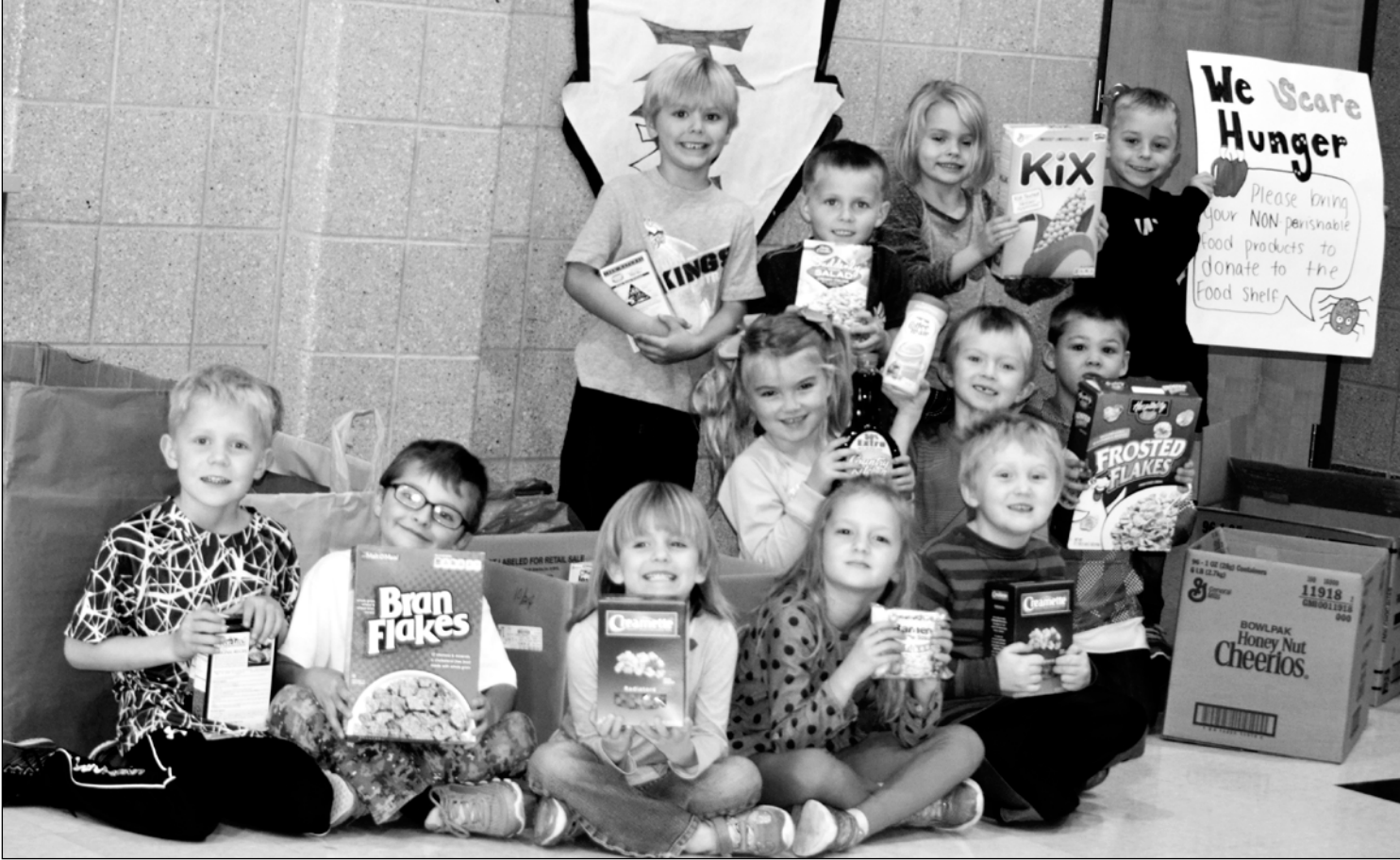
On a similar note, leftover candy can be used to stuff a pinata for a party.

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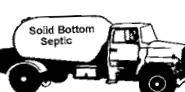
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Good Samaritan-Clearbrook installs CO detectors

Have you purchased or moved into a property in the past year?

Contact your county assessor to file a homestead application if you or a qualifying relative occupy the property as a homestead on or before December 1, 2016.

What is a qualifying relative?

For agricultural property, a qualifying relative includes the child, grandchild, sibling, or parent of the owner or owner's spouse.

For residential property a qualifying relative also includes the owner's uncle, aunt, nephew, or niece.

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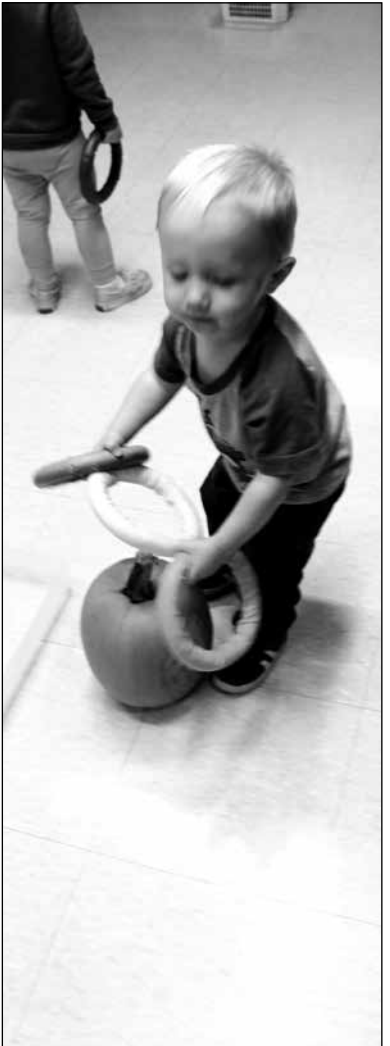

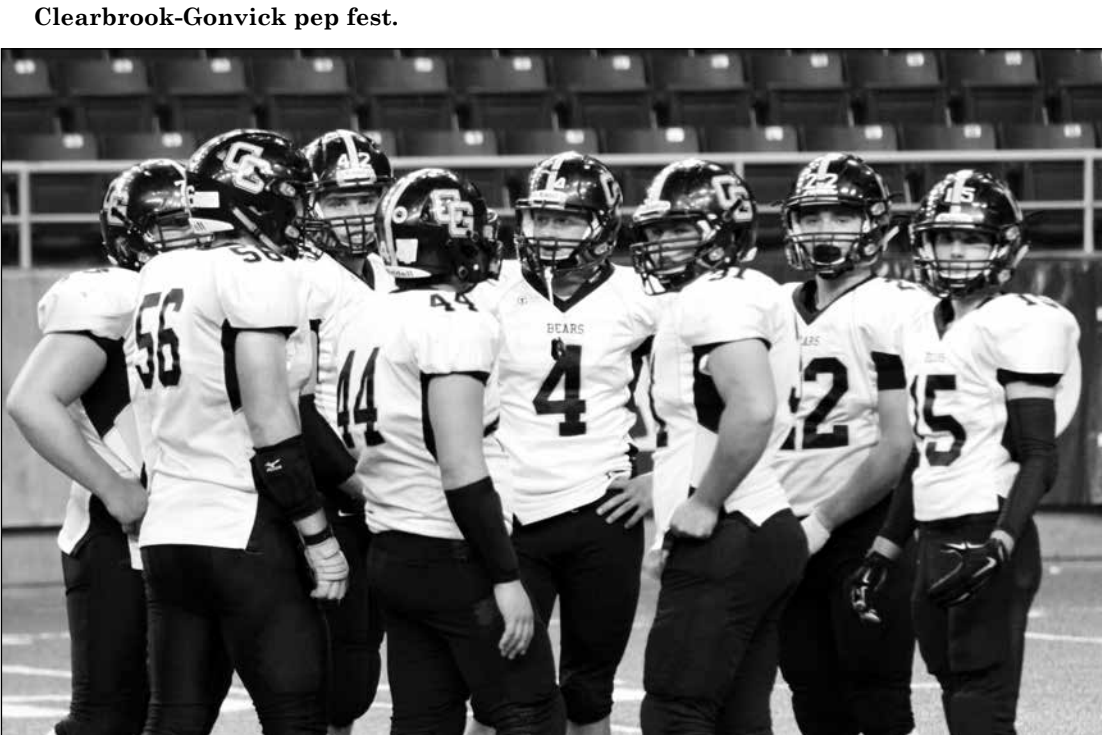

Be Aware for the Potential of Carbon Monoxide Poisoning

Late fall – early winter is statistically the highest risk season for carbon monoxide poisonings. This is the time of year when residents or visitors to our state, take advantage of deer hunting, ice fishing, cross country skiing, and other outdoor recreational opportunities. It is also the time of year when the temperatures often dip below freezing, with the need to shutter buildings tightly, along with the need to use primary and auxiliary sources of heat to stay comfortably warm. It's also a time when residents might start and run vehicles, tractors, trucks, recreational vehicles, etc. for a warmup period in enclosed garages and sheds before use outdoors.

Carbon monoxide is a toxic,

odorless, colorless, and tasteless gas. It is produced by incomplete burning of any fossil fuel or organic fuel source. Breathing the gas displaces oxygen in the blood. It can come from and buildup to dangerous levels in enclosed areas, due to poorly functioning appliances, unvented and or improperly vented appliances, and any internal combustion engine. It's especially dangerous this time of year and throughout the winter season when homes, garages, sheds, barns, shops, trailers, cabins, campers, deer stands, fish shacks are tightly sealed up.

Residents and out of state visitors should be aware of the warning signs of CO poisoning. Symptoms are similar to having the flu but without the fever. They include dizziness, confusion, shortness of breath, nausea, headache, fainting, and tightness in the chest. If you suspect CO poisoning get yourself and or the victim(s) to fresh air and call 911, as high levels of inhalation and or long exposure to CO usually needs medical attention to prevent brain injury and or death.

Besides providing for proper ventilation/exhaust of combustion gases, proper maintenance of appliances, and proper use of portable heat sources, one of the best defenses against

CO poisoning is to have a properly installed and working CO detector. Home owners should have them installed on every level of the house. Hunters/fishermen are encouraged to bring battery operated detectors with them for use in their temporary living space. Hunters/fishermen may also consider purchasing models of portable heaters that have oxygen depletion sensors and carbon monoxide detectors that also include a propane or explosive gas sensor.

Some of the potential situations that can lead to CO poisonings and where care should be taken to prevent CO inhalation exposures include: Deer hunting stands and shacks, campers, fish houses, tents with portable heat sources, garages/sheds where charcoal grills and or generators might be in use; enclosed trailers/sheds where recreational vehicles and snowmobiles might be running and or being repaired; generators running near openings/windows to a camper, fish house, or cabin; generators running in a small shed as a

temporary electricity source when storms cause power failures to the utility grid system; cars, pick-ups, tractors, skidsteers, trucks in sheds warming up before being used; malfunctioning appliances such as water heaters, furnaces, fire places, stoves; improperly vented(both new and existing) appliances, and/or plugged venting of appliances due to insects and wildlife placing obstructions in exhaust vents and chimneys; snow and ice causing obstructions to combustion vents for home appliances; the use of any portable combustion heat source in a home or garage/shed such as grills, propane heater, or keroIn summary, be aware of the potential situations where one might expose oneself or a group to a carbon monoxide poisoning situation, know the symptoms, get individuals to fresh air, and get medical help if a carbon monoxide poisoning may have occurred, and install and use carbon monoxide detectors in the home or in temporary living spaces

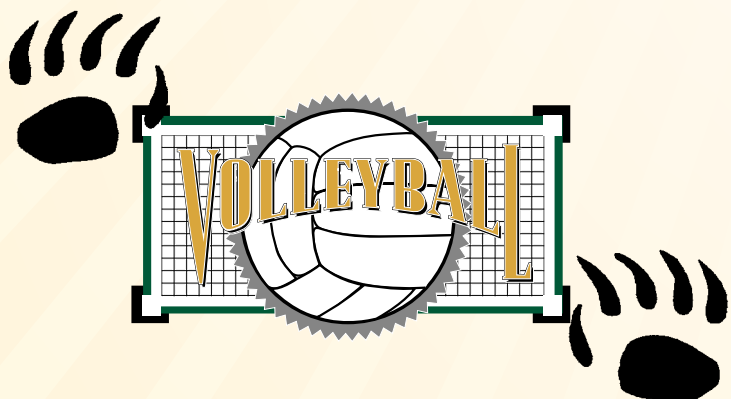
