Allen Paulson grew up in the Bagley and Shevlin area. He is the son of Alvin and Elvora Paulson, who also ran the Shevlin store. Al still lives on the third generation farm they owned.

Al, as he is often called, went to school in Bagley, graduating in 1972.

College took him to the University of Minnesota, where he majored in Animal Science and Extension Service. Early in life he considered a career as a veterinarian.

When he returned to Bagley, Al became the Deputy Assessor for Clearwater County, using his skills appraising agricultural lands.

"Agriculture, timber, and crops are very important to the way of life and the people in this area. Especially people who homesteaded in Clearwater County," Al says.

In 1980 Al was selected for a unique opportunity to become a MAST exchange student and travel to Australia. He was one of three from Minnesota selected to attend MAST -- Minnesota Agricultural Student Training. He lived with two host families during his year there, during which the County gave him a leave of absence from his job here.

"My job there was to study data, farming, ranching, the climate, crops, lifestyle, and compare it to what we have here."

"I have Australian 'sisters' and their families as a result of going there. We still keep in touch."

When Al came back to Clearwater County, he moved into the position of Assistant Assessor, then spent 12 years as City of Bemidji Assessor, which involved more commercial property.

He held one term as Coun-

ty Commissioner in the early 1990s, and at the same time was on the Board of Directors for the American Dairy Association. A job for them opened up as the Area Program Director for Minnesota, and North and South Dakota, which was too large a district for him to continue as a County Commissioner. Then he became the Program Consultant for the Minnesota Farm Bureau.

In 2002, the Clearwater County Recorder retired, and Al was appointed to the position. Then he was encouraged to run for the office and was elected for two more terms.

When Dan Stenseng retired as Auditor, Al was elected to that position, and is in his tenth year, the last two being a combined position as Auditor-Treasurer.

"I learned a lot by changing jobs, especially during my term as a County Commissioner. I learned more about Human Services, highways, the hospital, and Nursing Service. I got a greater understanding of the funding mandates and requirements we have to meet."

"Every two years the election is a major project," Al says. "It is time consuming, there are changes and new laws and regulations. We have to make sure we are doing the best we can and doing it right. There is satisfaction in compliance with the elections."

"In the budget process we work with the county department heads to budget for our needs, and not a lot of extras. The public has a lot of opportunities to voice any concerns."

"We are blessed to have really good employees, and I'm blessed with an excellent staff who knows what needs to be done -- which makes it great to be in the management side."

Al has been very involved with the County Fair, as trea-

surer or secretary-manager since 1976.

"I get to meet lots of people and have fun. We think the Clearwater County Fair is the best in the area."

The dates August 2-6 have been set for this year's fair. The 2016 County Fair Raffle calendar was dedicated to him.

Because of his involvement with county fairs, Al spent 16 years with the Minnesota Federation of County Fairs, and held offices as Director and President. He was elected to the Minnesota State Fair Board where he spent 12 years working with others to enhance the Minnesota State Fair. He was elected to a life membership by the Board of Managers and Delegates to the State Agricultural Society. He serves as a chairperson, and conducts business such as input on budgeting items, and public relations opportunities for the State Fair.

Al is very involved in the Clearwater Lutheran Church in Shevlin, and has served on their Council, holding every office except treasurer. His wife Julie and sons Levi and Erik are also involved in the church. Al and Julie, who have been married 28 years, enjoy time on the farm south of Shevlin where they raise cattle, horses, donkeys, ducks and chickens.

"It's kind of a 'McPaulson Farm'," he says. They enjoy the farm life, vegetable gardening, and opportunities to travel.

"We love Yellowstone, the Grand Tetons, and Colorado. And soon we'd like to go to Sweden."

Julie works with first graders in "Reading Recovery" and Special Education after spending 30 years as a classroom teacher.

Their sons were very involved with 4-H, sports and school.

Levi is a math major at the University of Minnesota and works for Cenex Harvest States as an analyst. He was recently accepted to Carlson's School of Management and is working on his Master's Degree.

Erik is a junior at the U of M, and is interested in Earth Science and Economics.

In his spare time, Al likes to study genealogy and search his Swedish and Scottish ancestry.

"When my mom's grandfather immigrated to the United States from Scotland, he was married in 1713 in the Old North Church in Boston 65 years before the lantern was hung there for Paul Revere," he tells of this interesting bit of history he has learned in his studies. He also found out that the house still stands where his grandfather lived in the Smöland Province in Sweden on his grandmother's side.

Regarding the future, "I like what I'm doing, working with the County," Al says. "I like helping people. And the people are friendly in the community."

Instead of the often quoted "Murphy's Law" which suggests that anything that can go wrong will, Al lives by the "Maxwell Law" which he believes is a much more fulfilling outlook on life:

Everything is more rewarding than you expect;

And if anything can go right it will - And at the best possible moment.

Long Lost Lake Board objects to 'Border to Border Trail' going through their Township

The Clearwater County Board of Commissioners met on February 21, 2017, with all commissioners in attendance.

Long Lost Lake Township: A letter containing a resolution from Long Lost Lake Township Board was received by Board Chairman Dean Newland, and stated that they "object to, and do not endorse any aspect of the project described by the MN DNR, National Off Road Vehicle Conservation Council, and the Minnesota Four-Wheel Drive Association as the 'Border to Border (B2B) Trail' within Long Lost Lake Township."

A list of their objections to

the trial were attached. Among their objections:

-The process for public input was flawed. Timely notice was not given to the Long Lost Lake (LLL) Township so the Township could study the proposal and present comments.

-The supporters of the B2B Trail think there is a mandate from Minnesota State Legislature to develop a B2B trail. Actual reading of the cited Minnesota Statute does not support any such mandate.

-Use of public roads, enforcing legal and responsible use of public roadways; road cleanup needs; history of accidents and documented dangers of ATV use; and land sacred to mem-

bers of the White Earth Nation were among other concerns listed.

Commissioner Illies stated that the DNR has allocated \$150,000 for planning for the Border to Border Trail. B2B indicates from eastern to western Minnesota borders.

"They have never presented the proposal to the LLL Township, or the Clearwater County Board," Chairman Newland stated.

Resignation Resolution: Commissioner Neal Illies bringing to the attention of the Board the need for a resolution to accept the resignation of retiring Attorney Richard Molin, who is an elected official.

Never Let Them Set Seed

Have you ever wished you could grow vegetables without hours of weeding? If you are like most gardeners; you have moaned and groaned when you are overwhelmed by weeds. The good news is that with a bit of dedicated effort, you can reduce the weeding you do year by year until your garden is virtually weed free!

The key is to know a bit about something called the "weed seed bank" and how to manage it. Most people don't realize that a weed can produce literally thousands-or even millions of seeds per plant. Robert Norris, retired professor of plant science at the University of California at Davis says he conducted research to document the number of seeds coming from even a single

weed plant. The accompanying chart shows the results were stunning. All those seeds fall to the ground and become part of a "seed bank" that fuels new weed growth.

EXAMPLES of WEED SEED PRODUCTION per PLANT

Weed Name, Seeds per Plant, Where the Plant Was Located

- Barnyard grass, 750,000 Davis, CA
- Purslane, 2,000,000, Davis, CA
- Black nightshade, 800,000, Rosemount, MN
- Puncture vine, 100,000, Pullman, WA
- Powell amaranth, 268,000, Freeville, NY
- Shepherd's purse, 40,000, Sheffield, UK
- Chickweed, 25,000, Rothamsted, UK

Most of the perennial weeds that plague flower gardens and lawns need more than the "never let 'em set seeds rule for effective control. Many perennial weeds grow from underground roots or tubers-making the path to weed free perennial gardening much tougher. Not only should you prevent seed production, but you need to control the roots and tubers also. Frequent removal of the shoots of perennial weeds will eventually starve and kill the underground tissues. You'll need to be especially persistent and use a variety of control methods to reach your goal. If necessary, this can also be achieved with the careful use of appropriate herbicides.

To hasten the path to a weed free garden, use a two pronged strategy: drive down the number of viable seeds in the soil and quickly intervene when those that remain sprout. Professor Norris says he grows 70% to 80% of the vegetables that he and his wife eat. Now he spends almost no time weeding the garden. Professor Davis has managed to drive down the weed seed bank using solarization, mulching, hoeing and hand pulling. In case you haven't heard of solarization; it involves covering the soil with a clear plastic tarp for several weeks in the summer to heat the soil and kill weed seeds. It may sound crazy, but it works.

While there is never a 100% guarantee in the natural world; but if you follow a "never let'em set seed" strategy, you will soon be doing a lot less weeding in future years.
