Is anyone else feeling like we are running out of places to pile snow? After nearly a foot of new snow the City of McIntosh staff was busy on Sunday and Monday moving snow and clearing streets.

Now is a good time to think about flood insurance

Record snowfall increases risk of flooding, so now is good time to think about flood insurance.

With Minnesota's record snowfall and the potential for rapid melting when warm temperatures arrive, the risk of late winter or early spring flooding may be much higher this year.

The State Climatology Office with the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources posts a weekly map of snow depth throughout the state (dnr.state.mn.us/climate/snowmap). In addition to snow depth, other factors that affect flood risk include the water content of the snow, how quickly the snow melts and whether heavy rain occurs during the snowmelt.

In recent years, floods have caused many Minnesotans to suffer major property damage and serious financial losses due to a lack of flood insurance protection.

It is important for Minnesotans to know three things about flood insurance:

- Flood damage is not covered by a standard homeowners insurance policy.
- There is a 30-day waiting period after purchasing a flood insurance policy before it takes effect.
- Flooding can occur even outside of flood-prone areas.

The Minnesota Commerce Department encourages Minnesotans to review their specific risks and needs to determine whether flood insurance coverage makes sense for their property.

Flood insurance is available through the federally-backed National Flood Insurance Pro-

gram (NFIP) and can be purchased through many licensed property insurance agents.

Separate policies may be purchased for a building or its contents. The program also offers flood insurance for renters and businesses.

Flood insurance is worth considering even for Minnesotans who do not live in flood-prone areas.

Nationally, more than 20 percent of all NFIP flood insurance claims come from properties mapped outside of high-risk flood areas. The NFIP offers lower-cost Preferred Risk Policies specifically designed

for residential properties located in moderate- to low-risk flood zones.

More information about flood insurance is available at www.floodsmart.gov. As with any insurance policy, carefully review the details before purchasing. It is important to know both what is covered and what is not.

The FEMA Flood Map Service Center (msc.fema.gov) is the official public source for flood hazard information in support of the NFIP. You can use the service to find your official flood map,

Polk County 2019 Spring flood outlook

Local climate outlook indicates a later snowmelt, which could increase the risk for a rapid runoff cycle.

The Polk County Sheriff's Office is reviewing the forecasts as they become available, and are communicating with our local cities and their public works departments to discuss what is needed in the event of major flood stages.

The Polk County Sheriff's Office would like to remind the public to prepare for the following: Watch for road closures and detours. Alternative routes may be necessary; Township Supervisors should have their road closure and barricades

signs accessible for use, if needed; People with basements should double check that their sump pumps are working properly; Be sure you have ample food supplies; If you have a back-up generator, make sure it is ready for use; Plan ahead, and be prepared.

The PCSO will continue to monitor the weather and river elevations and will have updated forecasts and flood condition reports as Northwest Minnesota enters the spring runoff cycle.

Polk County septic system fix-up program

Polk County Environmental Services is pleased to announce the availability of a cost-share grant program that is available to property owners in Polk County that have an existing noncompliant septic system.

Funds are intended to fix septic systems that are currently failing codes or functionality. These dollars are made possible through a grant received from the Minnesota Clean Water Legacy Act.

There is a limited amount of funding available and preference for funding will be determined based on income status, condition of existing system,

and proximity to priority surface waters. The County will provide a cost share grant contributing 75% and up to 90% of installation cost up to a maximum of \$12,000.

Income restrictions will apply. Applicants will be required to pay any match requirement upfront if approved. Applications can also be found on our website at www.co.polk.mn.us under the Environmental Services and Planning and Zoning

Department pages. The deadline to apply for the Septic System Fix-Up Program is June 1, 2019. After this date, remaining funding will be available on a first come first serve basis.

Also, remember that Polk County Planning and Zoning requires building/land use permits for all construction projects throughout the County. If you are planning any building/land use projects please contact planning and zoning prior to construction to see what setbacks and ordinance requirements may apply. Unique ways to conserve fuel

Defensive driving has long been touted not only as a safe way to operate a motor vehicle, but also a cost-effective one. When driving defensively, drivers are less likely to make sudden stops or accelerate quickly, each of which can waste fuel.

But even the most conservative motorists might want to do even more to conserve fuel. Fortunately, there are many unique and simple ways to conserve fuel and save money.

• Park in the shade. According to Natural Resources Canada, using a vehicle's air conditioning system increases its fuel consumption more than any other auxiliary feature. In fact, NRC notes that air conditioning systems can increase fuel consumption by as much as 20 percent.

That's because vehicle AC systems require engines to work extra hard, which in turn requires them to consume more fuel. By parking in the shade on hot days, drivers won't need to crank their AC systems in

order to overcome the summer heat.

• Listen to traffic reports. It's well known that idling greatly decreases fuel economy.

Before leaving for work or to run errands around town, tune in to local traffic reports in the hopes that you can avoid potential traffic jams that contribute to the needless consumption of fuel. If there's no way to avoid traffic during your daily commute, consider investing in a vehicle with stop-start technology, which shuts the engine off when your vehicle comes to a halt before restarting it once you take your foot off the brake. The Union of Concerned Scientists notes that this technology can reduce fuel consumption by as much as 5 percent.

• Make sure your gas cap is tight. A loose gas cap can adversely affect fuel economy. According to Napa®, a loose gas cap is a common contributor to poor fuel economy. Loose

gas caps allow fuel vapors to leak and that decreases your vehicle's fuel efficiency.

After filling up at the pump, be sure to close the gas cap tightly. Many caps will indicate how many clicks it takes to make sure the cap is closed as tightly as possible.

In addition, periodically inspect the cap for cracks or leaks, replacing it if necessary.

• Drive distraction-free. Today's cars are technological marvels. But all those bells and whistles can be distracting, and distracted drivers are less likely to pay attention to how they're driving. That can make for unsafe and fuel-inefficient driving. When driving, do your best to minimize distractions, turning off your smartphone and directing all of your focus to the road and how you're navigating it.

Conserving fuel is a goal for many drivers, and that goal can be achieved in a wide variety of ways

outstanding county resident, "King Agassiz", in honor of the vast glacial lake which once covered the entire Red River Valley. Most of us have heard of this great, extinct lake, but do we know why it first appeared and later vanished?

Six to ten thousand years ago, during the "ice age" the Agassiz glacier was formed. An uplifting of the land as extensive high plateaus, several hundred if not a thousand feet higher than today, caused the land to receive snow fall throughout the year.

However, under the vast weight of this ever-thickening ice sheet, the land began to sink to its present level-even somewhat lower. So it was that a more temperate climate, with hot summers, was restored.

Thus, this ice sheet began melting away. What remained was a vast inland lake 700 miles long and over 110,000 miles square: a body of water so huge that it exceeded the combined areas of the present five Great Lakes of the St. Lawrence.

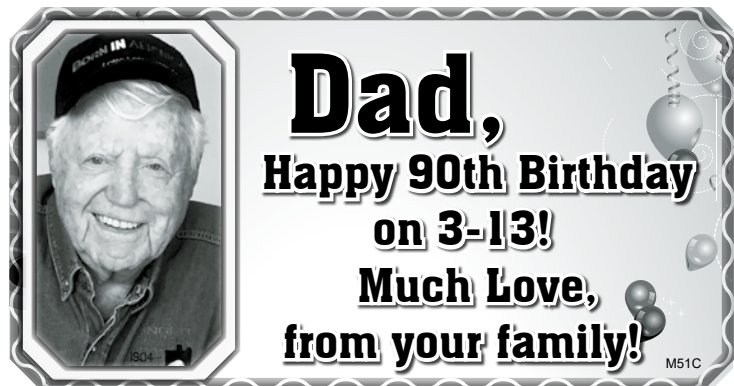
The ice sheet had melted from the south to the north. This, in fact, was the reason for the huge lake's existence.

Lake Agassiz was produced during the closing stages of the glacial period by the damming up of the continental ice sheet to the north: as the ice retreated north along the present Red River Valley, drainage from melting could not flow freely, as now, north to Lake Winnipeg and out into the ocean via Hudson Bay.

Instead, the melt-off was turned to the south all the way to Minnesota's present Brown's Valley area, 975 feet above sea level. From there to Lake Winnipeg, 710 feet above sea level, there is a very uniform and continuous descent of a little less than one foot per mile.

It was in 1879, in the 8th annual report of the Minnesota Geological Society that it was named Glacial Lake Agassiz in honor of Louis Agassiz, the first prominent advocate of the theory of the formation of the drift by land ice.

Lake Agassiz enjoyed a

On behalf of the Crookston, Climax, Fertile, Fosston, and McIntosh public libraries, I would like to thank Senator Mark Johnson for his role as the Chief Author of a bill (SF 1704) to support regional public libraries systems across Minnesota. I am proud to live in a district where my Senator understands the impact public libraries have on their communities and the ever increasing community demand for information and services.

Bill SF 1704 addresses the need for an increase in funding to regional public library systems and the need for a formula adjustment. Unfortunately, regional library systems have only seen one increase in state funding in over 20 years. This bill proposes a \$4 million increase to the twelve regional library systems, including Lake Agassiz Regional Library, which provides public library service in 22 communities, including Crookston, Climax, Fertile, McIntosh and Fosston. Since 2009, Lake Agassiz Regional Library has lost over \$250,000 in state funding due to the volatility of the formula used to allocate the funds to the twelve regional library systems. The proposed formula change would provide year-to-year funding stability.

Last week, my colleague and I had the honor of meeting with Senator Johnson to thank him for his service to Minnesota

and his support for public libraries. I encourage my fellow community members and library supporters to give him a call or send him an email to thank him for authoring and supporting SF 1704.

Thank you again, Senator Johnson for being a champion for early literacy, library services, our citizens, and our communities.

First 2019 Dairy Safety Net Payment

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farm Service Agency (FSA) announced this week that the January 2019 income over feed cost margin was \$7.99 per hundredweight, triggering the first payment for eligible dairy producers who purchase the appropriate level of coverage under the new but yet-to-be established Dairy Margin Coverage (DMC) program.

DMC, which replaces the Margin Protection Program for Dairy, is a voluntary risk management program for dairy producers that was authorized by the 2018 Farm Bill. DMC offers protection to dairy producers when the difference between the all milk price and the average feed cost (the margin) falls below a certain dollar amount selected by the producer.

Agriculture Secretary Sonny Perdue announced last week that sign up for DMC will open by mid-June of this year. At the time of sign up, producers who elect a DMC coverage level between \$8.00 and \$9.50 would be eligible for a payment for January 2019.

For example, a dairy operation with an established production history of 3 million pounds (30,000 cwt.) that elects the \$9.50 coverage level for 50 percent of its production could potentially be eligible to receive \$1,887.50 for January.

Sample calculation:
\$9.50 - \$7.99 margin = \$1.51 difference

\$1.51 times 50 percent of production times 2,500 cwt. (30,000 cwt./12) = \$1,887.50

The calculated annual premium for coverage at \$9.50 on 50 percent of a 3-million-pound production history for this example would be \$2,250.

Sample calculation:

3,000,000 times 50 percent = 1,500,000/100 = 15,000 cwt. times 0.150 premium fee = \$2,250

Operations making a one-time election to participate in DMC through 2023 are eligible to receive a 25 percent discount on their premium for the existing margin coverage rates.

"Congress created the Dairy Margin Coverage program to provide an important financial safety net for dairy producers, helping them weather shifting milk and feed prices," FSA Administrator Richard Fordyce said.

"This program builds on the previous Margin Protection Program for Dairy, carrying forward many of the program upgrades made last year based on feedback from producers.

"We're working diligently to implement the DMC program and other FSA programs authorized by the 2018 Farm Bill."

Additional details about DMC and other FSA farm bill program changes can be found at farmers.gov/farmbill.

Farmers encouraged to participate in annual survey

Wheat and hay growers should anticipate calls in March/April.

The Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) is encouraging farmers to take part in its annual pesticide and fertilizer use survey. This year the phone survey is directed at wheat and hay growers.

The data helps the MDA track the use of agricultural chemicals on Minnesota farms and provides guidance to educational and research programs.

The survey should begin March 18 and be completed by April 5. Questions will focus on the 2018 growing season and survey farmers on pesticide and fertilizer applications on wheat and hay grown in Minnesota.

The annual survey is completely voluntary and producers are not asked any personal questions.

The survey is conducted for the MDA by the U.S. Department of Agriculture National Agriculture Statistics Service out of their regional offices in Missouri.

Minnesota farmers may



be getting calls from multiple agencies and companies conducting a variety of surveys this time of year, but the information gathered from this survey is critical for research purposes.

Beyond the Bell: Summer Activity Program

We are in the process of putting together a great summer program including summer recreation under the 'Beyond the Bell' program. This program will allow children to be supervised in a school setting giving them access to technology activities, academic based activities, arts and crafts, physical education activities, as well as access to summer recreation activities such as baseball, softball and swimming lessons.

The program would again consist of some different plans that could be purchased separately or one could choose to access any or all of the program Plans.

Plan A: This program would consist of access to the Summer Activity Block. Students could be dropped off at the school at 7:30 a.m. and could be picked up at 2:30 p.m. or earlier if more convenient to your schedule. The students would work through different activity blocks throughout the day which would consist of technology, arts and crafts, physical education, the Summer Recreation program, and academics to name a few. All summer recreation practices would take place at the school and students would access their practice or games from the school. Summer Facility Improvements

The normal life time of heat pumps is around 15 – 20 years and now it's time to upgrade with new pumps. It takes 2-3 months to order and install if one would fail in the school, meaning no heat in the classroom.

We will replace all of the old pumps with a new pumps with ECM motors for high efficiency operation.

The District has had a number of qualified installers review the site and give their bid on the replacement. The chosen company will work with the District so we can keep our summer programs running efficiently.

St. Patrick, pointing to the three leaflets united by a common stalk, used this visual analogy to spell out the mystery of Christianity's doctrine of three entities making up one Lord: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Therefore, for all of the purported good luck finding a four-leaf clover may bring - based on mythology imparted by ancient Celts called Druids - it cannot be passed off as a shamrock.

Early-blooming spring flowers

The arrival of spring is a welcome occurrence for many people. Budding flowers are among the harbingers of spring. Spring flowers can revitalize winter-weary people just when they need it most - and provide reassurance that brighter, warmer and longer hours of sunlight are just around the corner.

Cold-tolerant flowers are hardy enough to start blooming before the last frosts have dissipated.

Other flowers will begin to fill in as days warm a little bit more, according to Better Homes and Gardens. Home gardeners looking to warm up their gardens with early blooms can use these flowers in their early-season containers, window boxes and planting beds.

Pansy: Pansies prefer cool weather, which can make them one of the best flowers to plant in early spring and late fall. Pansies come in a variety of colors, so there's bound to be an offering that will blend with any homeowners' landscape design.

Creeping phlox: Also known "moss phlox," creeping phlox is a short ground-cover that is a herbaceous perennial. Phlox produces small, fragrant flowers in dense clusters, which can attract wildlife, such as butterflies, to their mats across the soil surface.

Snowdrops: Snowdrops

can peek out even when there is snow still on the ground - sometimes as early as January and February. But their name is actually a reference to their appearance, as snowdrops have three white petals that hang down like drops dripping off the stem.

Violets: These flowers are closely related to pansies and, as a result, prefer cool seasons. Violets are generally slightly smaller than pansy blooms, but they can be just as beautiful. But as with pansies, violets will start to fade when the heat arrives.

Crocus: Crocus plants are relatively small, only reaching three to six inches in height. However, their grass-like leaves are some of the first sprouts that can be seen among bulb and corm plant-

ings. Preferring full to partial sun, these gold, purple, lavender, white, or yellow flowers can be enjoyed during the earliest days of spring.

Daffodil: Daffodil bulbs produce cheerful, yellow flowers in early spring. They're one of the most recognizable flowers thanks to their familiar shape and fragrant aroma.

Lenten rose: Hellebores, also called the Lenten rose or Christmas rose, can tolerate light frosts. These blooms get their name from the time of year when they bloom, which is typically around the Christian Lenten season. Despite their name, these delicate flowers are not actually related to roses, however.

Safeguard roofs against snow damage

Snow may delight young children itching for a day off from school. But for many homeowners, the sight of snow means their time will soon be spent clearing paths and plowing driveways rather than building snowmen and sledging with friends.

The sight of falling snow also may inspire some homeowners to think about the roofs of their homes. The Insurance Institute for Business & Home Safety warns that it is important to understand the risk of roof collapse due to the weight of snow on the roof. Roof structures that are in good condition

can support roughly 20 pounds per square foot. IIBHS says this equates to around four feet of new snow before a roof will become stressed.

Total snowfall is not the only factor to consider. Homeowners also must check the type of snow that has fallen. According to House Logic, six inches of wet snow is equal to the weight of about 38 inches of dry snow. That means it may take much less sodden snow to weigh down a roof.

Roof condition and the shape of the roof bear consideration as well. Popular Mechanics says the ideal pitched

roof is smooth and steep so that the snow slides off. Closely spaced rafters improve the strength of the roof. A flat or slightly pitched roof may accumulate snow more readily.

Homeowners are urged to inspect roof rafters to see if they are cracked from previous snowstorms or damaged from insects or rot. Snapping or popping sounds while snow is on the roof is not a good sign.

House Logic also says that homeowners can tell if the snow load on the roof is too much by paying attention to interior doors. If such doors begin to stick, that may be a signal that there's enough weight on the center of the house to distort the door frames. Houses that had improper renovations or homes in which load-bearing walls were removed may be more susceptible to this problem.

Removing snow from a roof is not an easy job - and may be a task best left to professionals. The safest way to remove snow from the roof is to use a snow rake with an extension arm that enables users to push and pull off the snow while standing on the ground. One should not climb onto a snowy or icy roof to remove snow. Shovels, which can damage roof shingles, should never be used.

IIBHS says that hiring a professional roof contractor is one way to safely remove snow from the roof. Licensed and insured contractors will have the experience to get the job done correctly and safely. Homeowners can expect to pay between \$250 and \$500 for this job.

Roof snow removal is a priority for those who live in mountainous or extremely snowy areas. If unsafe amounts of snow are left on rooftops, leaks, damage and collapse may result



Birds need extra assistance in winter

Cold weather can be particularly taxing on many of the birds individuals discover in their backyards throughout the year. Although some species migrate to warmer climates each winter, many stay put and attempt to ride out winter in their normal habitats. Birds that tend to stay put include finches, sparrows, titmice, jays, woodpeckers, chickadees, and cardinals.

The Cornell Lab of Ornithology says that, in much of North America, winter days can be windy and cold for birds, and nights are even more challenging. In winter, birds no longer have berries and lush vegetation to consume and insects have died or gone underground. Since finding food can be especially difficult, and shelter may be scarce, many birds can benefit from a little help from their human friends.

Shelter
Wild Birds Unlimited says shelter for birds is hard to

come by in winter. Trees have shed their leaves, and evergreens may not be as abundant or protective. As a result, birds frequently seek man-made structures that can provide refuge from the elements.

People can provide shelters for birds, which may include traditional birdhouses, windbreaks and snow shields. Even a brush pile can simulate the natural shelters of trees and shrubs that birds prefer. Roost boxes are another option and one that can accommodate small flocks that will group together and share their body heat.

Use leaves and branches to provide natural camouflage and help attract birds to the shelter. Offer yarn, fabric scraps, cotton, and other insulating materials that birds can use to help make their shelters more comfortable.

Food
Birds require high-calorie and high-fat foods in the



winter so they can keep up their metabolism to generate warmth. Also, since birds' feeding habits vary depending on the type of bird, it may be necessary to place feeders at varying heights to maximize access.

Feeders should be located out of the wind and in an area that offers safe refuge from predators. The National Wildlife Federation also says individuals should put out sizable feeders and/or use multiple feeders to provide ample food during snow and ice storms. Feeders should be checked regularly and kept full.

Consistency is also important because birds will grow accustomed to being supplied

with food and may depend on such supplements to survive.

Bird Watcher's Digest suggests a variety of foods for birds. Black-oil sunflower seeds, peanuts, suet, cracked corn, millet, thistle seed, safflower, and various fruits can help many birds thrive. It's also suggested to include mealworms, which can be purchased at bait stores or pet stores. These larvae of beetles can be presented in a shallow dish with slippery sides so the worms cannot crawl out.

Birds typically need extra support to survive harsh winters. Offering food and shelter during these bleak months can help.

The origins of the leprechaun myth

One popular image associated with St. Patrick's Day, has proven a little elusive. Leprechaun imagery is ubiquitous during St. Patrick's Day celebrations, but even the most ardent Paddy's Day revelers may know little about these mythical creatures.

Now widely depicted as tiny, bearded and mischievous men clad in coats and hats, leprechauns have been traced to ancient Ireland.

The precise etymology of the word "leprechaun" is unknown, though many scholars believe the word we use today is derived from the old Irish "Lú Chorpáin," which means "small body." Some scholars point to the 8th century word "luchorpán," meaning "sprite" or "pygmy," as the origins of the word leprechaun. Another word, "lubrican," which first appeared in the English language in a 1604 play written by Thomas Middleton and Thomas Dekker, also has been

linked to the modern word leprechaun.

Some historians believe the myth of the leprechaun has origins in ancient Ireland, when people believed the tiny creatures were among the various inhabitants of fairy forts and fairy rings throughout the Emerald Isle.

Another take on the source of the leprechaun myth is that these tiny creatures were modern incarnations of the Euro-Celtic god Lugh, who was the sun god as well as the patron of arts and crafts.

Manuscripts from the 12th to 15th centuries suggest leprechauns lived underwater and were not all male (modern leprechaun depictions are all male).

In fact, the resource AncientOrigins.net states that female leprechauns were depicted during this time as figures devoted to luring human men away for various adventures.
