Deadline to remove ice shelters in NW MN is March 21st

Anglers should clean litter left on lakes.

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds anglers the upcoming deadline to remove ice shelters from lakes in the northern one-third of the state is quickly approaching. Heavy snow and slush in some areas means conditions on the ice might be challenging, so the DNR urges anglers to plan ahead to ensure they're able to meet the deadline.

instances of people dumping their sewage atop the ice.

"There is simply no excuse for littering our lakes," said Capt. Robert Gorecki, DNR Enforcement Division regional manager in northeastern Minnesota. "Anything left on the ice ends up in our waters and conservation officers will not hesitate to issue citations for littering."

The removal deadline in the northern one-third of the state which is defined as north of the east-west line formed by U.S. Highway 10, east along Highway 34 to Minnesota Highway 200, east along Highway 200 to U.S. Highway 2, and east along Highway 2 to the Minnesota-Wisconsin border is by 11:59 p.m. Monday, March 21. The removal deadline for Minnesota/Canada border waters is March 31.

If shelters aren't removed by the deadline, owners can be prosecuted, and structures may be confiscated and removed by a conservation officer. If conditions or other circumstances are making it difficult for people to meet the deadline, they should contact their local conservation officer to explain the situation.

Anglers are responsible for removing their shelters by the deadline and ensuring no trash is left behind. Commonly left items include bait, blocking material, bottles, cans, cigarette butts and plastic bags filled with waste. As use of wheelhouses has increased, there also have been additional

The removal deadline does not mean anglers no longer can use shelters on the ice. After the deadline, shelters may still be on the ice, but they must be occupied if they're out between midnight and one hour before sunrise. Shelters may not be left or stored at public accesess.

Anglers always should keep in mind that ice conditions vary widely and that ice is never 100% safe. For more information, check out the ice safety page of the DNR website (mndnr.gov/IceSafety).

Many St. Patrick's Day traditions are not from Ireland

St. Patrick's Day is made special by various traditions. Everything from dyeing major cities' rivers green to parades to enjoying green foods has become part of the pageantry of St. Patrick's Day.

The next time you raise a green beer to your lips, you may wonder which traditions are authentically Irish and which ones were created by regions with an abundance of Irish emigrants.

Surprisingly, many seemingly Irish traditions likely began elsewhere.

First parade

It would be accurate to assume that various elements associated with St. Patrick's Day began where St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland, once resided, including the first St. Patrick's Day parade. However, some of the first parades held in St. Patrick's honor took place in two North American cities, New York and Boston, that had high numbers of Irish immigrants. But historians say the first ever St. Patrick's Day parade was actually held in St. Augustine, Florida in 1601, a

year after gunfire blasts were used to honor the saint. The parade may have been at the request of an Irish priest living there at the time.

Corned beef and cabbage

What would St. Patrick's Day be without an authentic meal of corned beef and cabbage?

This dish is not so authentic after all, and actually is an American innovation. Ham and cabbage was widely eaten in Ireland, but corned beef was a cheaper alternative found in America by immigrants. Therefore, corned beef became a staple of poor Irish immigrants living in lower Manhattan. The salted meat was boiled three times to remove some of the brine and make it palatable.

Green beer

Green beer is not an Irish custom, but an American one. The most common beer consumed in Ireland is Guinness, which is dark brown to black in color, making green dye useless in Irish pubs since it would be largely invisible in the stout.

Golf tournaments

One would not associate golf with St. Patrick's Day unless they reside in Nome, Alaska. Golf is a popular Irish pastime, and each year the Bering Sea Ice Classic Golf Tournament takes place right around St. Patrick's Day. Bright green golf balls are used, and breaks are factored in between holes to warm up at local bars.

Wearing green

According to The Christian Science Monitor, individuals in the United States started wearing green to celebrate St. Patrick's Day in the early 1700s. They believed it "made one invisible to leprechauns." The official color for the holiday used to be a sky blue known as "St. Patrick's Day Blue," established during the reign of King George III.

In addition to these traditions, specialty items, such as coffees and shakes, also are very popular. However, most of these do not have origins on the Emerald Isle, either. Yet, no matter where traditions began, there's no denying St. Patrick's Day has long inspired celebration.

Potato soup makes a filling meal



Many Irish dishes focus on simple, fresh ingredients that can be purchased close to home.

Potatoes long have been a staple of Irish cooking. Brought to Europe by Spanish explorers from the New World, the potato put an end to famine in regions of northern Europe, like Ireland.

Smithsonian notes that, by the end of the 18th century, roughly 40 percent of the Irish ate no solid food other than potatoes.

If that sounds like a boring diet, it's good to note that all that was necessary to make potatoes desirable and more versatile was a little creativity.

Potato soup is one way to experiment with potatoes.

There are many different takes on potato soup, but most classic Irish recipes feature potatoes, stock, leeks, and onions. But that does not mean potato soup can't be enhanced by other ingredients, like those found in this recipe for "Potato, Escarole and Country Ham Soup" from "The Culinary Institute of America Book of Soups" (Lebhar-Friedman Books).

Potato, Escarole and Country Ham Soup

Makes 8 servings

- 1 tablespoon unsalted butter
- 1 onion, diced (about 1 1/4 cups)
- 1 leek, white and light green parts minced (about 1 1/4 cups)
- 1 celery stalk, diced (about 1/2 cup)
- 1 garlic clove, minced (about 1/2 teaspoon)
- 1 quart chicken broth
- 2 yellow or white potatoes, peeled and diced (about 2 cups)
- 1 sprig fresh or 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- 2 cups chopped escarole (about 8 ounces)
- 1 cup diced country ham
- 1/4 teaspoon salt, or to taste

1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper, or to taste

Heat the butter in a soup pot over low heat. Add the onion, leek, celery, and garlic; stir until they are evenly coated. Cover the pot and cook until the vegetables are tender and translucent, 6 to 8 minutes.

Add the broth, potatoes and thyme. Simmer the soup until the potatoes are tender enough to mash easily, about 20 minutes.

Remove the thyme and discard. Puree the soup. Return the soup to the pot and bring to a simmer.

Add the escarole and diced ham and simmer, 12 to 15 minutes, or until all the ingredients are tender.

Season with salt and pepper. Serve the soup in heated bowls.

Tip: Country hams have an altogether different taste and texture from that of boiled hams. They have been cured for lengthy periods and have a unique salty, smoky taste. Ask your deli manager or butcher to help you find country ham or a suitable substitute.

Tips to organize your cluttered kitchen

Kitchens serve as the heart of many homes. Thanks to the popularity of open floor plans, kitchens also tend to be highly visible from nearby spaces, such as family rooms and even main entryways. A messy, cluttered kitchen can be an inefficient eyesore that's visible from various locations in a home. That makes getting organized in the kitchen a worthwhile goal.

The following are some tips to help homeowners organize their kitchens.

Start with the utensils

Utensils come in all shapes and sizes. Take inventory of your utensils, discarding or donating items you don't use. Next, designate drawers or



countertop storage solutions for the utensils you use most often. Place them within easy reach, and take into account your dominant hand for placement.

Categorize your pantry

Empty the pantry, paying attention to staples you regu-

larly use. Then figure out a system for categorization that works for your household. Perhaps place all baking essentials together, such as flour, oil, baking soda, and cocoa powder. Maybe you need to designate a "kids corner" in the pantry where you keep fruit snacks, granola bars and breakfast cereals. Use uniformly shaped containers to store packaged foods so you're not contending with oddly shaped boxes and bags.

Use extra wall or ceiling space

Large pots and pans can eat up cabinet space or clutter the inside of an oven for those who don't have any other space. While your decorative enamel Dutch oven might fit nicely on a shelf or counter, cast-iron pans and skillets can be hung from durable hooks over an island or near the stove.

Organize under the sink

It can be difficult to keep cleaning products tidy and within reach. Try installing a short tension rod inside the cabinet and use it to hang spray bottles, rubber gloves and cleaning cloths.

A shortage of storage space in cabinets can be remedied with rollouts. They provide additional capacity to cabinets and make it easier to find items, instead of having to dig at the back of dim cabinet recesses.

It's tempting to save all of those take-out containers or empty margarine tubs for leftovers. But if there's an av-

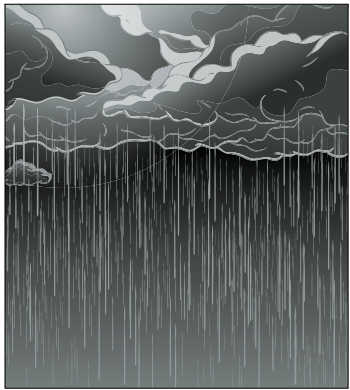
Rainfall monitoring network seeks volunteer members

Reports provide important data about rainfall amounts, climate trends.

The State Climatology Office is looking for volunteer rainfall monitors for the Community Collaborative Rain, Hail and Snow Network (CoCoRaHS). The network includes more than 20,000 volunteers nationwide who measure precipitation in their backyards using a standard 4 inch diameter rain gauge and submit reports online.

Climatologist Pete Boulay said the data from backyard rain gauges are helpful and important in many ways.

"These volunteers help to verify high rain totals after big events, monitor drought and flooding, make our precipitation maps more accurate and provide needed guidance on Minnesota's changing climate," Boulay said. "This is



also a great educational activity for families with kids and a rewarding hobby for anyone interested in weather or climate."

Volunteers are particularly needed outside the immediate Twin Cities metro area. Volunteers receive training on how to observe weather trends and submit their precipitation and weather event reports. All

training material is available online. They must purchase or provide a standard 4 inch diameter rain gauge (available at discount through CoCoRaHS) and have internet access to submit reports.

For the past two years, Minnesota has won the "CoCoRaHS Cup" for recruiting the most new volunteers of any state.

"We're hoping Minnesotans will again come through in 2022, to keep the Cup in Minnesota and, more importantly of course, to improve our state's precipitation recording," Boulay said.

Rep. Fischbach introduces the Landowner Easement Rights Act

This week, Representatives Michelle Fischbach (MN-07) and Kelly Armstrong (ND) introduced the Landowner Easement Act. This bill would prohibit the Department of the Interior (DOI) from entering into a conservation easement with a term of more than 50 years. It would also give owners of existing easements the option to renegotiate, renew, or buy out the easement.

"This legislation would stop permanent landgrabs while providing a mechanism for landowners to resolve easement disputes, giving producers agency in protecting their property from federal bureaucrats," said Congresswoman Fischbach. "I thank my colleague, Congressman Armstrong, for his support and look forward to ensuring private property rights for Minnesotans and North Dakotans are protected."

"Our legislation will put power back into the hands of farmers and landowners, giving them the ability to renegotiate or buy out U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service easements created before 1977. I am proud to work with Congresswoman Fischbach to end the practice of permanent easements and give North Dakota's producers the tools and leeway they need to make sound conservation

decisions," said Congressman Armstrong.

This bill also has the support of the corn growers associations:

"The Minnesota Corn Growers Association is pleased to support the Landowner Easement Rights Act introduced by Reps. Michelle Fischbach and Kelly Armstrong. This legislation is important to protecting private property rights by ensuring that government easements are transparent, even-handed, and temporary while adequately compensating landowners and preventing them from being effectively deprived of the full fee simple value of their property. The legislation is based on a bipartisan bill introduced last Congress and we thank Reps. Fischbach and Armstrong for their good work."

"The North Dakota Corn Growers Association applauds Representatives Armstrong and Fischbach for recognizing that the wetlands easement process has been wrought with problems from day one. This legislation will strengthen farmers ability to control the future of the land they live on and protect for future generations. It would be a tremendous tool to advance our growers' private property rights."

It also has the support of farmers who are directly af-

ected by these easements. Richard Syverson, a grain farmer in Minnesota's 7th District, said "As a farmer who has issues with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), I fully support the Landowner Easement Rights Act. Farmers I have talked to never intended to sell the rights to their land forever. By capping easements at fifty years and providing an opportunity to dispute existing agreement, this bill will allow the USFWS to focus their efforts on lands that actually support wildlife and ease the conflict with farmers on lands that are wholly agricultural. This achieves long term conservation goals without an easement that goes beyond the planning horizon of a human life."

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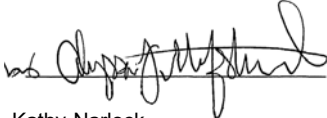
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Polk Notice - Polk County Delinquent Tax List

NOTICE OF DELINQUENT TAXES

TO: ALL PERSONS WITH A LEGAL INTEREST IN THE PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN THE FOLLOWING DELINQUENT TAX LIST.												
A list of real property in Polk County on which delinquent property taxes and penalties are due has been filed with the district court administrator of Polk County. This list is published to inform all persons that the listed property is subject to forfeiture because of delinquent taxes.												
The property owner, taxpayer, or other interested persons must either pay the tax and penalty, plus interest and costs, or file a written objection with the district court administrator. The objection must be filed by April 22, 2022, stating the reason why the tax or penalty is not due on the property. If no objection is filed, a court judgement will be entered against the property for the unpaid tax, penalty, interest and costs.												
For property under court judgement, the period of redemption begins on May 9, 2022, and ends three years later. The period of redemption means the time within which taxes must be paid to avoid losing the property through forfeiture.												
You may qualify to enter into a confession of judgement as an alternative method to paying off the delinquent tax amount and avoiding forfeiture. This allows you to pay the delinquent balance in equal annual installments, with a down payment due at the time you enter into the confession. The length of the installment plan varies: five years for commercial-industrial/public utility property; 10 years for all other properties.												
It should also be noted by property homesteaders that you are ineligible to receive the Property Tax Refund while you owe delinquent property tax.												
To avoid forfeiture, taxes on property must be paid by May 9, 2025.												
To determine how much interest and costs must be added to pay the tax in full, contact the Polk County Taxpayer Service Center, Government Center, 612 North Broadway, Suite 207, Crookston, Minnesota, 56716-1452. The telephone number is (218) 281-2554.

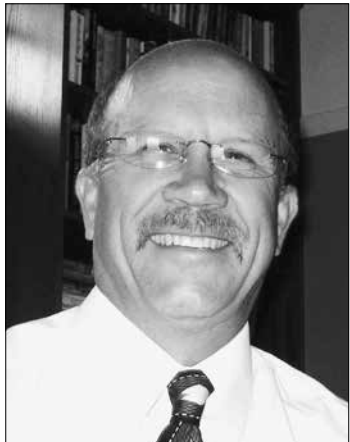
The program would again consist of some Plans that could be purchased separately, or you could access any or all of the program Plans. This is open to all students.

Win-E-Mac Schools

Win-E-Mac school is operating on the edge of reductions



due to lost student enrollment caused by COVID19, reduction in Free and Reduced Meal applications and annual inflationary expenditure increases. We will not cut any positions this year but will do some internal adjustments to cut some costs in our budget and use part of our general fund balance to balance our end of year expenditures. Our Federal ESSR money is given once and will be used to pay for positions we should have cut due to enrollment loss and for internal remodeling due to space configurations and social distancing in locker rooms.

We need your help to identify those Pre-K students who did not attend our program this year but will attend Kindergarten this Fall. Please call the District Office to sign-up your child for the Pre-School Screening, Fall Pre-School Program or Kindergarten this

Fall if you have not already done so. We need this information ASAP to begin planning of staff, space and materials for next year.

Important; F & R application forms

I know you read and hear this announcement time and time again, but I cannot stress enough how important these forms are to the school district to access funding for our school. Our school is losing \$90,000 a year in compensatory funding and will lose an additional revenue each year because our F & R eligibility has dropped due to less applications.

If you are the parent of a child and know you may meet the eligibility requirements of the program, please fill them out online or a hard copy can be requested. The forms are confidential, and it does not mean you need to take advantage of what the form has to offer, but we still ask you to fill it out. It does affect our funding for our school, free or reduced meal money for kids, 0% interest on QZAB loans, reduced phone and internet bills for our school, Title 1 funding, Federal funding, computer, technology and equipment grants, and learning materials. At the beginning of the year or anytime during this year, we ask parents or custodial parents to fill out the free and reduced request forms. You can access the form online @ wemschools.org.

Essentia Health to host free webinar featuring ‘Dopesick’ author

For the second time in three months, Essentia Health will host a virtual webinar about America’s opioid crisis featuring acclaimed journalist and author Beth Macy.

The free webinar titled “Dopesick: America’s Opioid Epidemic” will take place from noon to 1 p.m. on Friday, March 18.

Following her presentation, Macy will take questions from attendees.

It will focus on America’s decades-long battle with opioid addiction, how it started, how it spread, how to help those impacted and what can be done to end the epidemic.

Macy gave a similar presentation in mid-December, which also was hosted by Essentia.

Macy’s work includes the book “Dopesick: Dealers, Doctors, and the Drug Company That Addicted America,” a New York Times best-seller that was adapted into a highly regarded Hulu series starring Michael Keaton.

The webinar is funded by a Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) grant, totaling \$200,000, 100% funded by the HRSA/HHS. The contents are those of the

author and do not necessarily represent the official views of, nor an endorsement by, the HRSA, HHS or the U.S. government.

In addition to Macy’s pre-

sentation, the grant will help create a plan to implement prevention, treatment and recovery programming over the next three years.

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USDA highlights 2021 accomplishments in rural MN

U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Development State Director for Minnesota Colleen Landkamer today highlighted 2021 accomplishments in helping rural Minnesota.

USDA Rural Development invested nearly \$792 million in Minnesota during Fiscal Year 2021, helping nearly 3,700 families, communities and businesses.

The projects will help create better market opportunities for rural businesses, their suppliers and their customers; combat climate change and increase resiliency throughout rural America; and ensure that rural residents and businesses have equitable access to housing, health care, economic development and other essential services.

Examples of investments include:

Through the **Single-Family Housing programs**, Minnesota Rural Development helps approximately 2,620 individuals and families find safe, affordable housing or make safety modernizations to remain in their current homes. In 2021, these investments amounted to more than \$467.5 million.

Multi-Family Housing Programs support safe, affordable rental housing for rural residents across the state, investing a total of \$29.6 million. For example, more than 370 individuals and families received rental assistance to ensure affordability.

The **Community Facilities programs** supported 79 projects to provide buildings, vehicles and other crucial support to rural communities for a total investment of \$59 million.

For example, Prairie Pines Childcare Center received \$75,000 to help establish a childcare facility in Fosston, Minn. This investment will specifically be able to renovate a former veterinary clinic to incorporate an infant room, toddler room and preschool room. Additional spaces will be created for reception, staff offices, great hall, kitchen, laundry and multiple bathrooms. The basement will be renovated to provide after-school and summer care for school-age children.

Minnesota Rural Development invested nearly \$68 million through Water and Environmental Programs to assist 36 rural communities with access to safe, clean drinking water and sanitary wastewater disposal. For example, the city of Rushmore received a \$2.2 million loan and a \$749,000 grant to address health and sanitary concerns caused by poor water treatment resulting in poor water quality for the city’s 342 residents. This investment will allow the city to connect to nearby Lincoln Pipestone Rural Water system as a water source, build a new water tower and modify the distribution system.

More than 22,000 people will benefit from the \$236,200 **Distance Learning and Telemedicine Grant** to expand access to new services at primary clinic sites and expand telehealth services in underserved or remote rural areas. Additionally, Consolidated Telephone Company received a \$2.3 million Community Connect Grant to provide 1,102 residents and 20 businesses with up to 1 Gigabits per second (Gbps) of broadband speed

by constructing a 67 mile fiber-to-the-premises system. This will expand access to economic, educational, healthcare, and public safety opportunities to underserved areas.

USDA invested in nearly 140 rural businesses, ag producers and entrepreneurs to aid them in recovering from the effects of the COVID pandemic and help continue to create economic opportunities, like new jobs and value-added products, in rural communities. For example, Minnesota’s food supply chain continues to thrive through investments like the \$250,000 Value-Added Producer Grant that Fresha LLC received to expand marketing and production opportunities for locally grown carrots and other goods in Morris, Minn.

USDA has taken several extra steps to expand the communities and populations it can reach, including:

USDA recently unveiled a resource guide that features information on how rural entrepreneurs can use USDA and other Federal programs to access financing and other assistance to help start and expand their businesses. It includes tools to help them:

- expand their access to capital to create small business incubators.
- create value-added agricultural products.
- access high-speed internet to connect their businesses to national and global markets.
- cut energy costs.
- access health care resources to enhance the quality of life for their employees.
- access workforce development and training opportunities to improve their skills,

products and services, and more.

Providing up to \$150 million available in grants to fund startup and expansion activities in the meat and poultry processing sector. Funding is being made available through the Meat and Poultry Processing Expansion Program.

In December, USDA launched a program to make more than \$1 billion in loan guarantees available to help businesses in the food supply chain process their products and get them to market. The new Food Supply Chain Guaranteed Loan Program will help meat and poultry processors and other food businesses that are active in the middle of the food supply chain: manufacturing, storage, transportation and distribution.

Also in December, USDA Rural Development announced new investments to increase significantly the sales and use of higher blends of bioethanol and biodiesel through expansion of the infrastructure for renewable fuels derived from U.S. agricultural products. USDA plans to announce the application window for \$100 million in grants in the coming months.

Offering priority points to projects that advance key priorities under the Biden-Harris Administration to help communities recover from the COVID-19 pandemic, advance equity and combat climate change. These extra points will increase the likelihood of funding for projects seeking to address these critical challenges in rural America.

Unveiling a Disaster Resource Guide detailing assistance available to rural people, businesses and communities impacted by disaster and support for long-term planning and recovery efforts.

Great musical instruments for beginners

Playing a musical instrument benefits people of all ages, including children.

Young children may take to music education more readily than adults, acquiring skills in record time.

While many instruments are beneficial to kids, certain choices are best for children just starting out.

Piano

The piano is a great instrument to learn because it enhances fine motor skills and often serves as a foundation for music education. The good news is one doesn't have to purchase a piano to get started. Digital keyboards and even online piano keyboards can replicate piano sounds quite well and provide an inexpensive way to learn piano.

Ukulele

Ukuleles are affordable and their small size makes them ideal for kids. It's easy to learn a few chords and play familiar songs. Plus, parents may ap-

preciate that the ukulele is a relatively quiet instrument.

Recorder

A recorder often is one of the first instruments introduced to children in music classrooms. A recorder is an ideal introductory wind instrument because it is easier to play than a flute or clarinet. Nonetheless, it still requires students to learn coordination and breathing techniques.

Drums

Drums teach children rhythm, which is an essential component of all music. Drums are attractive to kids because they can be great fun to play and help reduce stress by getting out all that nervous energy. Electronic drum kits are available as quieter alternatives and are great options when space for a regular drum set is unavailable.

As children acquire skills on these instruments, they can continue or move on to more complicated alternatives.
