Become trained to administer fit testing in the morning, and practice fit testing others in the afternoon under the supervision of respirator experts from 3M. *Lunch will be on your own from 11am-11:45am.

Get fit tested for free!
Come with your own respirator to be fit tested for free. Alternatively, come and try on respirators to find one that fits you. Respirators will be available for purchase. Additionally, learn to do user seal checks, to clean your respirator properly, and more. This will take ~1 hour; please register ahead of time to schedule a time slot and avoid waiting time. Space is limited and will be available on a first come basis. Advance sign up is requested.

Note: A person must be healthy enough to wear a respirator. Passing a medical evaluation is LEGALLY REQUIRED before one can obtain a respirator fit test. While some family physicians provide this service, there is also an option to complete an online medical evaluation. If you choose to have your medical evaluation done online, one option recommended by 3M is www.respexam.com. Evaluations are \$29, but there is currently a promotion offering 2 free evaluations when you create a new account with your farm's business name. Note that while 98% will pass the online exam, some medical conditions like asthma or high blood pressure may require an in-person follow-up appointment.

Guarding the nation's Capitol: Alexandria grad leaves Sunday for training has local ties

When Gretchen Revering was figuring out what she wanted to be when she grew up, her mom, Jennifer, told her she would make a good police officer.

"I thought about being an EMT or a nurse because it was more fast-paced," said the 2015 Alexandria Area High School graduate. "I thought being a police officer would be super boring. Riding in a car all day, writing tickets. It didn't sound fun."

Although she won't be riding in a car writing tickets, Revering is on her way to a career in law enforcement – but on a much different scale.

On Sunday, March 4, Revering, who graduated from Concordia University in St. Paul with a criminal justice degree, is heading to the nation's Capitol in Washington, D.C.

After taking just two-and-a-half years to earn her degree, instead of the usual four, Revering was hired by Homeland Security as a U.S. Capitol Police officer. She is now a federal agent.

What changed?
It wasn't until she did a ride-along with a Minnesota State Trooper that Revering agreed with her mom that she might want a career in law enforcement.

Revering said she loved her ride-along with Sgt. Jesse Grabow and that the thrill of something happening and being able to help people is what changed her mind. Because of Grabow, her interest in law enforcement was definitely piqued.

The summer after she graduated, Revering was able to attend the State Patrol Summer Camp at Camp Ripley near Little Falls.

"After that, I knew in my heart and mind what I wanted to do," she said. "The camaraderie and the friendships I built in that week confirmed my decision."

Police internship
In her last semester of college, she ended up being able to do an internship with the St. Paul Police Department, working in areas including sex crimes, human trafficking, the gun unit and the gang unit.

"I saw all types of crimes," said Revering, adding that she mainly worked with investigators and sergeants, but did do some ride-alongs with the officers. "I did a broad range of jobs and talked with the officers to find out what they like and didn't like. The officers were all so genuine and you could tell they loved their jobs."

Finding her way to the Capitol

A chance meeting in Alexandria between Revering's mom and Chad Sellman, a construction contractor from the Twin Cities, led to more opportunities.

Sellman, who said he is "very connected to law enforcement and criminal justice system,"

became a mentor to Revering. "I guess my mom networks for me," laughed Revering, who said she believes it wasn't just a chance meeting for her mom and Sellman. "I think it was more of a God-thing. I give more credit to him."

Revering said it is sometimes tough for kids who dream big to follow through with their dreams.

"I wanted to go big. I dreamed big," said Revering. "I never thought it would happen this fast, but he (Sellman) gave me the confidence I needed. It was all about the mindset."

Sellman said it is "very special" to see her get to this point.

"To see her succeed, it's amazing," said Sellman. "It's great to be able to help young kids find their path and learn there is a whole world of opportunities for them."

Getting the call
Revering applied for the federal agent job in December and flew out to D.C.

After an initial round of interviews, the field of applicants was narrowed down from 300 to fewer than 100, Revering said.

A second trip to Washington consisted of medical exams, psychological exam, panel interviews and more. In addition, there was more background work to be done, including interviews with her mom, Jennifer, and her dad, Jim Revering, who both live in Alexandria, along with neighbors, teachers, coaches and her boyfriend.

Centennial Recipe Corner

Best Banana Bread Doris (Wallace) Nelson

1-3/4 cups flour
1/4 tsp salt
1 tsp baking soda
1-1/2 sticks margarine or butter, softened
2 eggs
1-1/2 cups sugar
1/4 cup buttermilk
1/2 cup nuts, chopped
1 cup mashed bananas

Combine flour, salt and soda. Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add flour mixture and buttermilk alternately. Beat batter for 2 - 3 minutes. Stir in vanilla, nuts and bananas. Spoon into 2 greased loaf pans and bake at 350 degrees for about 50 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean.

Despite all the debate about health care policy in Washington, D.C., last summer, Congress did not come up with a solution. Rather, it ended up being another round of finger-pointing and arguments about repealing and replacing the Affordable Care Act.

That means the family farmers who had been struggling with high premiums, some up to \$40,000 a year, had no reprieve. Others are forced to go uninsured. This is not acceptable for those who do one of the most dangerous jobs there is.

The Minnesota Legislature has a chance to ease that burden for the farmers in our state. In 2017, Gov. Mark Dayton proposed adding a "buy-in" option to the MinnesotaCare program, which allows eligible working families a way to get more affordable health insurance premiums. He has revised the proposal and re-introduced it earlier this month.

Several of our members use MinnesotaCare now. Others, such as Brian and Therese Romsdahl of Watonwan County, could benefit from being able to buy into it. The Romsdahls, who raise grains and beef, said in our meeting with Gov. Dayton, that they owed \$33,000 in health care costs in a year. Moved by their story, Dayton invited them as guests to his recent State of the

Red Lake County Notice of Delinquent Taxes

STATE OF MINNESOTA
COUNTY OF RED LAKE

TO: ALL PERSONS WITH A LEGAL INTEREST IN THE PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN THE FOLLOWING DELINQUENT TAX LIST

A list of real property in Red Lake County on which delinquent property taxes and penalties are due has been filed with the District Court Administrator of Red Lake County. This list is published to inform all persons that the listed property is subject to forfeiture because of delinquent taxes.

The property owner, taxpayer or other interested person must either pay the tax and penalty, plus costs or file a written objection with the District Court Administrator. The objection must be filed by April 10, 2018 stating the reason why the property tax or penalty is not due on the property. If no objection is filed, a court judgment will be entered against the property for the unpaid tax, penalty, interest, and costs.

For property under court judgment, the period of redemption begins on May 14, 2018. The period of redemption means the time within which taxes must be paid to avoid losing the property through forfeiture. The period of redemption is three years, with a handful of exemptions. The redemption period is one year for most properties located in a targeted neighborhood, as defined in the Minnesota laws, and for municipal solid waste disposal facilities. The redemption period is five-weeks for certain abandoned or vacant properties.

You may also enter into a confession of judgment as an alternative method to paying off the delinquent tax amount and avoiding forfeiture. This allows you to pay the delinquent balance in equal annual installments with a down payment due at the time you confess judgment. The length of the installment plan varies: 5 years for commercial-industrial/public utility property; 10 years for all other properties.

If you have homesteaded property, you may be eligible for a Senior Citizen's Property Tax Deferral, which enables seniors to pay just 3% of their household income and allow remaining amounts to become a lien on the property that may be deferred for later payment (perhaps upon eventual sale of the property).

It should also be noted by property homesteaders that you are ineligible to receive the Property Tax Refund while you owe delinquent tax.
