Two weekends of recognition for Coach Wade Grinde

Spring Grove boys basketball coach Wade Grinde, named Class A Boys Basketball State Coach of the Year last spring, was formally recognized with a trophy plus a 25-year service award plaque at the October fall coaching clinic of the Minnesota Basketball Coaches Association and honored again in the Twin Cities on another October weekend with two plaques at the annual Awards Banquet of the Minnesota State High School League.

Grinde, who grew up in Plummer, Minnesota, began his coaching career in the opposite corner of the state as a basketball assistant at Spring Grove (1994-95) before assuming the head coaching post the following season.

He is now entering his 26th season overall and 25th at the helm after logging his 460th career varsity victory in last season's state tournament third-place game (.731 career winning percentage).

Grinde has been his peers' choice for Section 1A Coach of the Year four times before the current state coaching honor.

After only six league titles in the preceding 47 seasons, Grinde's Lion lads have won 14 conference championships (all in the last 16 years), including the last nine East Division titles while extending their Southeast Conference winning streak to 74 games. The Lions have won 103 of their last 104 conference contests.

Against strong area competition, Grinde has guided the guys to three sub-section titles (2008, 2016, 2019) and last winter's section championship and third-place state tournament finish.

The Lions have enjoyed eight straight 20-win seasons - 11 in the last 14 years - including last winter's 25-5 campaign.

Inter County Nursing Service celebrating 50 years of service

The agency began in September 1969 when a joint powers agreement was signed between Pennington, Red Lake and Clearwater counties. The counties saw that there was a need for home care and public health services. In January 1978 Clearwater county went on their own and the agreement between Pennington and Red Lake counties continued. The original offices were based in the courthouses in each county. The Red Lake county office was located on the top floor of the courthouse and later was moved to the lower level. Pennington County had various sites in the Pennington county courthouse. The office for a period of about 20 years was located at 318 N. Knight with Pennington County Social services. In 2016 the office was relocated back to the basement of the Pennington County Courthouse.

The agency is governed by a board consisting of equal representation from Pennington and Red Lake Counties. There are 5 members from each county which includes a county commissioner representing each county. There is a physician that is appointed by the board.

The agency began mainly in home care and branched out over the years into all aspects of public health. Maternal child health and health promotion was and continues to be a major component of the agency. Along with blood pressure and blood sugar clinics the agency began to do foot care clinics in the communities. The foot care clinics came about as a suggestion from one of the Pennington County commissioners. Immunization and influenza

clinics were a big part of the agency. The agency has grown over the years to include various staff members working in several programs including car seat checks, prenatal education, newborn visits, school health, emergency preparedness and working with the state immunization registry known as the Minnesota Immunization Information Connection thru the Communities Caring for Children program. Staff is also involved with Quin County Community Health Services to provide assistance with the Statewide Health Improvement Project.

Emergency Preparedness has been an ongoing plan. The prep and training to face the challenges of health threats to the public. This includes education, mass dispensing of medications and assisting other local, regional and state partners to meet these challenges.

Agency staff work closely with local, regional and state staff to provide the most current programs to residents of all ages in both counties.

How have we changed?
1979 - There was one director, 4 fulltime RN's and 1 part time RN, 1 LPN and 10 Home Health Aides, 1 business manager and 2 secretaries.

Manual typewriter for billings and hand written notes.

2019 - One director, 5 RN's, 2 LPN's, 5 Home Health Aides, 1 Business Mgr. and 1 Secretary.

Computerized system that has billing and charting all in one application.

Inter-County Nursing Service is a Medicare certified Home Health Care Agency.

Services are provided under the direction of a physician and provide care and support as people recuperate in their own homes. Home care has always been an important component of the agency. Skilled nursing is provided by a staff that has experience and dedication to improve and maintain the health of the residents of both counties.

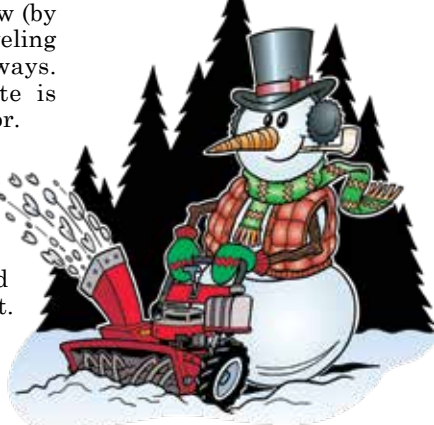
Do Not Deposit Snow On County Roadways

The Polk County Highway Department wishes to inform all residents of Polk County that in accordance with Minnesota Statute 160.27, Subd. 5, it is illegal to place snow (by plowing, blowing or shoveling etc.) onto County Highways. Violation of this Statute is considered a misdemeanor.

Polk County also cautions that the act of placing snow onto a County Highway can subject a person to a civil liability if a road hazard occurs and causes a traffic accident. The civil liability can extend to both the property owner and the person who actually placed the

snow on the roadway.

All citizens are asked to obey these rules, which are designed to keep our highways safe during winter months.

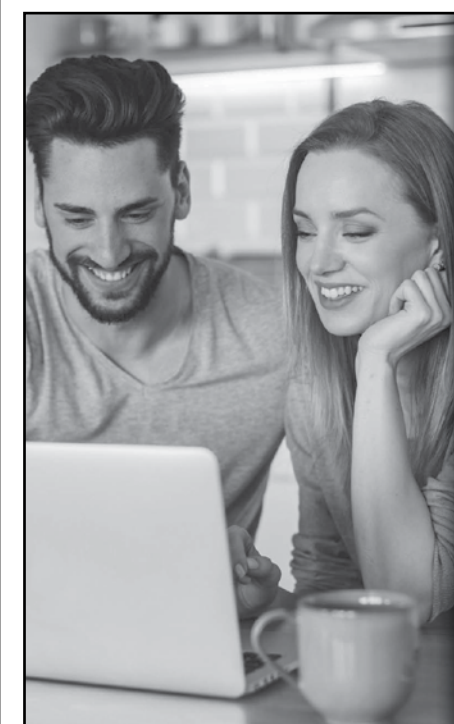

IMPORTANT PROPERTY TAX HOMESTEAD NOTICE

This will affect your 2020 property taxes and eligibility
for Property Tax Refund.

Have you purchased or moved into a property in the past year?

Contact your county assessor to file a homestead application if you
or a qualifying relative occupy the property as a homestead on or before
December 1, 2019.

What is a qualifying relative?

For agricultural property, a qualifying relative includes the child,
grandchild, sibling, or parent of the owner or owner's spouse.

For residential property a qualifying relative also includes the owner's
uncle, aunt, nephew, or niece.

When do I apply?

You must apply on or before December 16, 2019.

Once homestead is granted, annual applications are not necessary
unless they are requested by the county assessor.

Contact the assessor by December 16, 2019 if the use of the property
you own or occupy as a qualifying relative has changed during the past
year.

If you sell, move, or for any reason no longer qualify for the
homestead classification, you are required to notify the county assessor
within 30 days of the change in homestead status.
