County roads (CSAH 6) for Red Lake and Polk are getting resurfaced this summer and they started at Hwy 92 moving north and are now moving west with their equipment. The first unit in the train of vehicles is the pre-heat unit. The second unit is the heating and recycling unit which has a spray bar to apply rejuvenator, scarifying teeth and auger to distribute and a screed to level the mixture.

CSAH 6 (Red Lake & Polk) getting recycled



The big radiant heaters on unit 1 & 2, softens up to 2 inches of asphalt. Normal operation there is no smoke or flames. The smoke and fire you may have seen is caused by tar patches to fill cracks.



You can see the oil applicator, the teeth to break up the asphalt, the auger that levels and screeds the asphalt so the vibrating unit can compress the heated asphalt flat and drivable.



The crew consists of heating unit 1 & 2, water truck, vibrating roller, and the foreman's truck.



Gallagher Asphalt was the company contracted in the Joint Powers agreement between Polk and Red Lake Counties. Gallagher's headquarters are in Thornton, IL and have been doing this type of recycling asphalt for over 60 years.

Red Lake County Commissioners Minutes

RED LAKE COUNTY Regular Meeting Held August 10, 2021

Pursuant to adjournment of its last meeting the Red Lake County Board of Commissioners duly met in regular session at the Courthouse in Red Lake Falls, MN on August 10, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. Chairman Flage called the meeting to order. All Commissioners were present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Jim Trojanowski, Director of the NW Regional Library, met with the board to review the current year budget and present the proposed library budget for 2022. The Regional Library is asking for a 1% contribution increase in 2022 from all the counties in its service area to offset operating costs and lower revenue. Trojanowski also reviewed library funding sources and provided an update on library activities and operations during the COVID crisis.

Chair Flage commented that the board will consider the request during the budgeting process.

Lynell Simonson Popowski, Regional Transportation Coordinator for the NWRDC was present to provide an overview of services provided by the transportation council. The mission of the Regional Transportation Coordinating Council is to support improved access and options for transportation services for individuals in northwest Minnesota by increasing coordination through communication and creative partnerships. Popowski mentioned that the next scheduled meeting for the RTCC will be held at the Brooks Community Center on September 23, 2021.

HR Director Lundeen was present to update on the job rating for the County Extension Office Manager position. Results received from Bjorklund Consulting has the position rated at a Grade 20 (420 points) with a beginning (Step-1) rate of \$18.68 hourly. Lundeen mentioned that the board might want to consider increasing the rate based upon the individual's educational status completed. The topic will be discussed in more detail at a later meeting.

Charity Brault, Director of the NW MN HRA in Mentor, met with the County Board to provide the annual report of the organization. Also present were Finance Director Heather Harbott and HRA board member John Lerohl. Brault provided information on the several projects under management of the HRA. Brault reported that the maximum HRA levy as authorized by state law is up to 25% of 0.0185% of the county's taxable market value. The levy dollars are used to provide funding for public and private sector investments in housing rehab and economic development in NW Minnesota. There was no action taken.

Auditor Schmitz presented a request from the Inter County Community Council in Oklee to be the program operator for the Family

Homeless Prevention Assistance Program (MHFA) in Red Lake County. Commissioner Gerardy moved, seconded by Remick and carried by unanimously to approve Resolution No. 08-01-21 "MHFA Program".

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency, State of Minnesota, has been authorized to undertake a program to provide funds for Family Homeless Prevention and Assistance Projects; and,

WHEREAS, Tri-Valley Opportunity Council, Inc. in the nine-county region of northwest Minnesota has developed an application for the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency Family Homelessness Prevention and Assistance Program; and

WHEREAS, Tri-Valley Opportunity Council, Inc. have demonstrated the ability to perform the required activities of the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency Family Homelessness Prevention and Assistance Program;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Tri-Valley Opportunity Council, Inc. is hereby authorized as an entity to be funded with the administration of funds made available through the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency Family Homelessness Prevention and Assistance Program in the County of Red Lake, in Minnesota.

Auditor Schmitz is authorized to sign as county representative. A complete copy is available at the Auditors Office.

Commissioner Remick moved and seconded by Dudycha to approve the minutes of the regular board meeting held on July 27, 2021. The motion carried unanimously.

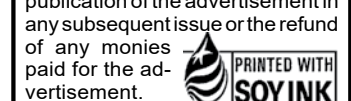

There are 4 new reported cases for Red Lake County, the individuals are in their 40's and 60's. We continue to urge the community to take precautions whether you are vaccinated or not. Wear a mask in indoor public spaces, social distance, stay away from crowds, stay home if you are sick, wash your hands frequently and get vaccinated.
